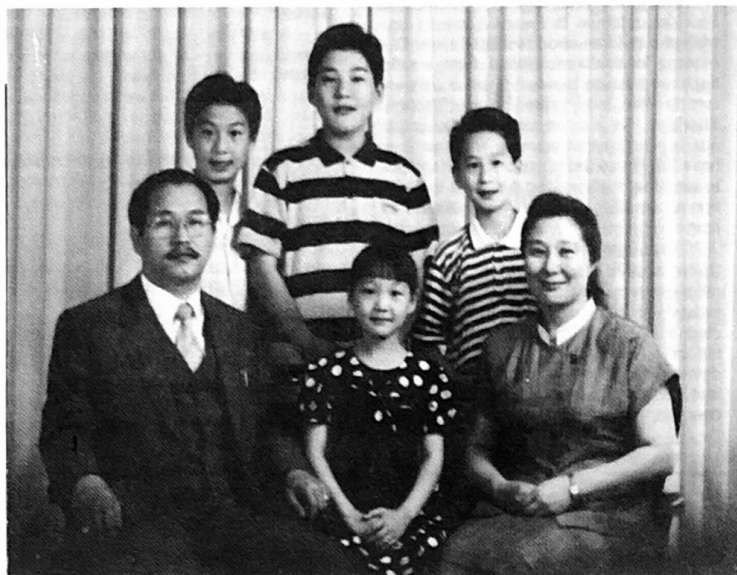

REPORT ON KOREAN WORK

Brother Seo Ku Lee and family have come from Korea to the Chicago area to increase the support for the work in Korea. He has continued the work that Brother Louis Carver began in Korea some years ago. The churches continue to serve the Lord. Missionaries have been sent out to several countries including the Philippines and Red China. A Bible School continues to train workers in Seoul, Korea. Brother Lee continues to lead this work and will be making regular trips to Korea to oversee the work.

He has a vision for reaching the countries of the Far East with national workers. While in the Chicago area he will be working with Pastor Louis Maple and the East Maine Baptist Church. There are many people in this area of Korean and Far Eastern descent. He is seeking to reach these people in particular to build a base that will share his burden for Korea and the Far East. He is visiting churches in the United States to tell of our work in Korea and his vision for future mission work in the Far East. Brother Lee is also Dr. Lee, a dentist. Because he believes God has led him to do this mission work in the Far East, he has given up his practice to devote full-time to this work. Find Place to Live ... Family Comes ... Student Kidnapped ... Need \$6,000 for Building ...

Dear Friends:

Five weeks seems like five years when you're separated from your family. My wife, Anita, the kids, and I hugged and cried on Sat. July 11th as I left Sanford, Florida on my way to Peru. They went back to Lexington, Kentucky to wait for word from me. Our finances would not allow the four of us to return together and live in hotels and eat meals out while we looked for a house. It takes time to look and then clean and move in, so I came alone. (According to the latest United National Survey of world cities, the cost of living in Lima, Peru is much higher than New York City. Gasoline is now down to \$2.50 per gallon, 1 loaf of white bread is \$1.75 and 5 lbs. of flour now cost \$3.50.)

Well, I found us a house, and then came the task of painting and cleaning. You ladies will be interested to know that I personally waxed and buffed every floor in the house, on my hands and knees, with a flannel cloth. I remember when I started waxing how happy I was that I could do this initial waxing so Anita wouldn't have to do it. But after buffing the third room (actually more puffing than buffing!) and still on my knees, I began praying for an electric floor buffer! I'm still waiting for a "yes" from the Lord on that one. Anyway, it was a good, humbling experience and I did lose ten pounds!

Anita and the kids arrived on the 16th of August and they all liked the house. After 18 years of marriage, Anita finally has a big kitchen with more cabinet space than she has things to put in them. My daughter, Leah, (just turned 15), is happy with her own, large bedroom complete with a telephone extension (that's important when you're 15). And my son, Joshua (soon to be 14), is happy with his room and the little cocker spaniel dog I acquired. And last, but not least, I'm happy with my own spacious study, 10 ft. by 17 ft. It's been a week since they arrived and the house is now a home. Thank you so much for your prayers for me and my family while we were apart. I really felt your prayers.

The news out in Pucallpa is good. The school had a break-in and several things were stolen, but two days later, most of the things were recovered. The same day as the break-in one of our students from the Pucallpa Baptist School, a 12 year old boy in the 6th grade, was kidnapped from a local restaurant and held for ransom. He was held captive for a week until the police located the kidnappers, shot and killed one of them and the other is in jail. The boy is physically well and unharmed but traumatized emotionally. Needless to say we had a serious week of prayer! God intervened and we praise HIM for HIS great mercy.

Last night the Jordan Mission here in Lima had a "Welcome Back" reception for us. Everyone had a great time. Speaking of this work, they're back inside the building, instead of meeting in the street as before.

It's winter time here, cold and drizzly, and most of the visitors that came when they met in the street, don't attend now that we're back inside. This leads me to tell you of the special opportunity you have to help us. We are within Six Thousand Dollars, \$6,000, of having what we need to purchase this building we've been meeting in. IF EACH CHURCH THAT I VISITED WHILE ON FURLOUGH WILL GIVE AN EXTRA \$200.00 TOWARD THE "STANTON NEW WORK FUND", WE WILL HAVE ENOUGH TO PURCHASE THE PROPERTY AND PUT A ROOF OVER HALF OF IT. The money is needed within the next two months so please don't put this off if you're able to help. Pray and give as the Lord leads.

Three souls have trusted the Lord in the short time I've been here and 15 more have repented of sin and gotten back on the "right path". It is still the most exciting work the Lord has ever given me to do! I've started a series through the book of Romans, a real spiritual treat for me. Pray for this work and pray for us as I know you do. Next month I will write with details on the clothing that so many of you donated for the people here. The shipment still has not arrived.

Dear Brethren:

We have completed six weeks back on the field and we are about settled into our work routine. Michelle just started back to school. I am dividing my time right now between 3 of the works. Two of them have Brazilian workers who do a good job but need a little guidance yet. The other in Diamantino is without a pastor. I have been able to send someone for the last 2 weeks and I will drive up there this week. The church in Varzea Grande is trying to supply the preacher part of the time and the expense has to come from our work fund. Please pray that we will be able to find a good pastor for that work. Brother Creiglow and wife did a tremendous job there and we want to see it continue to go well. The main problem there is the financial situation. There is hardly any way for a family to make a living there. Jobs are difficult and pay hardly anything

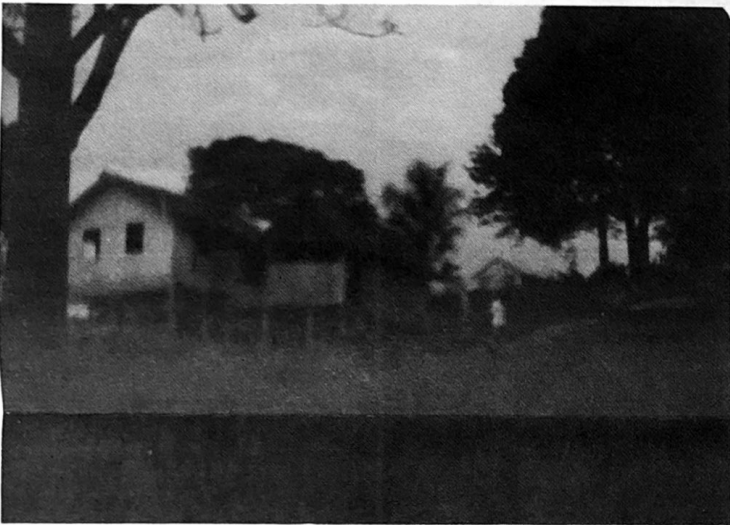

and food and clothing is extremely high due to it being a good distance from the city. We are sure the Lord has somebody who will go there.

We were blessed in a special way in the Tijucal work this month. We were able to purchase a building which will serve for parsonage, Sunday school, and auditorium all under one roof. We paid about one-third of the current value on the market. Our total cost was \$17,000. We had \$8500 saved up toward our building there, so we now owe \$8500 on it. Will you pray and please help us pay this debt as soon as possible? Also we need help on building some church benches (pews). Could someone make this a project in your church? I know that money is tight and not easy to obtain during this recession. The recession has hit here even harder than here along with about 24% inflation PER MONTH. Many are unemployed here. For this reason it is hard for the brethren here to go it alone on these projects. We need your help. We paid \$17,000 for a building that we could not build for \$70,000. Is not God still on the throne? I will send a picture of it in the next letter. Rejoice with us.

From the 10th through the 16th we were with Stephen again at the Bethel Baptist Church where we helped in a Vacation Bible School and I was the evangelist in a seven day revival.

On the 18th of August, Marie and I moved in at 2028 Dorset Drive, Lexington, KY. This will be our address while on

furlough. Wednesday night we visited and I gave a report of the work at the Glen's Creek Baptist Church, Versailles, KY where Dr. Ken Underwood is the pastor. The church gave us, as always, a royal welcome. On the 21st we returned to Mrs. Moore's home where we will be staying until the 31st.

Sunday we began an eight day revival meeting with the Calvary Baptist Church here in Richmond. That night before the revival service, I spoke to the men's class while Marie spoke to the women's.

We express to each one of the five churches and pastors where Marie and I have visited and I've preached, our appreciation for the offerings given us. To the Bethel and Glen's Creek Churches, we thank you for the food and Glen's Creek for the kitchen items as well. To Pastor Bobby Greene we express our appreciation for his being our chauffeur during the days we were without a car. To one of his members, Mrs. Ellen B. Casey, our thanks for the good gifts she has given us. We thank Pastor Wallace York for selling us his car at a reduced price. We thank Baptist Faith Missions for loaning us the money to buy the car.

We thank you, prayer partners and fellow stewards, for your prayers and financial support through B.F.M. Continue to give, please, to give and to pray. A few days ago we talked by telephone to Asa Mark Bratcher in Manaus. He reported that all goes well there.

If we can be of service to you, please contact us by letter or telephone or "face to face". We are ready to serve you in the service of our Saviour.

Dear Friends:

At the writing of this letter, the children and I are eagerly anticipating our reunion with Sheridan and also the return to Peru.

Many of you may not know that Sheridan returned to Peru five weeks ago while the children and I remained here. Our reasons for this were twofold. First, we did not have a house to return to since we were renting the two years before furlough. Sheridan has located us a house, gotten our furniture out of storage, and seems to have the house set up quite well. Needless to say, that's all exciting news for me! We are all counting the hours until we arrive home.

The second reason we remained in the States was a medical diagnosis for my mother. In early June, only four weeks before our scheduled departure, she was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. This left us very little time to take care of many details for her. She can no longer drive and that complicates matters also. We would deeply appreciate your prayers for her.

According to Sheridan's reports by

phone, the works in Pucallpa and Lima are doing very well. He is pleased to find things in order and progressing well on their own.

The political climate seems to be worse than last year. There are daily bombings leaving many homeless, injured or dead. Pray for Peru and its people! There is now a 9 p.m. curfew in Lima which will hamper our work to some degree. We are trusting the Lord to bless the work and protect us. We still feel we have work there to do, and know God is in control of all situations.

We again thank all of you for the love, support, and encouragement you have been to us this year. We count it a privilege to serve as your missionaries.

At the present we do not have a mailing address. We must wait to get a post office box. Watch the mission sheet in the near future for our mailing address.

Remember us in your prayers as we will you. May God bless each of you and your works for Him.

So much has happened since I wrote to you last that I'm not sure where to begin. We are staying very busy and God is blessing the work here.

I have been so busy working with the youth and traveling this month that I have neglected my most important job here . . . language study. But beginning tomorrow I'm getting back on track. There is a man here in town who is going to be coming over 3 days a week to teach me Portuguese. I know the importance of learning the language, but it is very easy to get side-tracked because there is always so much that needs to be done.

The youth ministry is doing great! We have had 4 more young people make professions of faith this month. One of them was our neighbor, Aulicelio. His sister, Islandia, made a profession of faith last month. Mike's son, Andrew, has become a good friend to him and had been witnessing to him for several weeks. Another young man named Jose Maria, who had begun coming to youth night and to church with us last month, made a profession of faith last night in the evening service. Again, Andrew

has witnessed to him several times and I thank God for his boldness in witnessing for our Lord.

Saturday was an exceptionally busy day. We began our Olympiad at 7:30 a.m. with a torch run through the city of Cruzeiro do Sul. We had flags made for the different countries and about 54 young people ran behind the flags with the captains taking turns carrying the torch. We then went to the track to begin running our events. That night we had a party for the winners of the "Gincana" or scavenger hunt, which lasted for 8 weeks. Each week the young people had to search through their Bibles for different things as well as bring different items to receive points. We had two of the teams work very hard throughout the gincana so we gave a combined party. We served a dinner of spaghetti, pizza and hot bread, and then to top it all off, we had a 10 ft. banana split. It took a lot of cooking for Brenda to feed 31 teenagers, but it was worth it. The kids had a great time and got to eat things they have never had before.

The high point of the month for me was going up river for a week with Mike and 2 of the Brazilian missionaries. I got a first hand look at what real river mission work is all about. It gave me an even greater burden for this area and especially for the people who live along the river.

Please continue to pray for the different ministries here in Cruzeiro do Sul.

Last night we closed out a new members' class which included 21 young people saved at our Youth Rally a couple of months ago.

This coming Friday, we will begin a weekend camp retreat with about 200 of our youth. We have just completed another dorm at the camp, which is a blessing since this weekend will be a full house.

The Seminar classes are doing well. We praise the Lord for the good students

and teachers he has given to us. This semester I am teaching a class on evangelism. The mission chapels in and out of town are doing well.

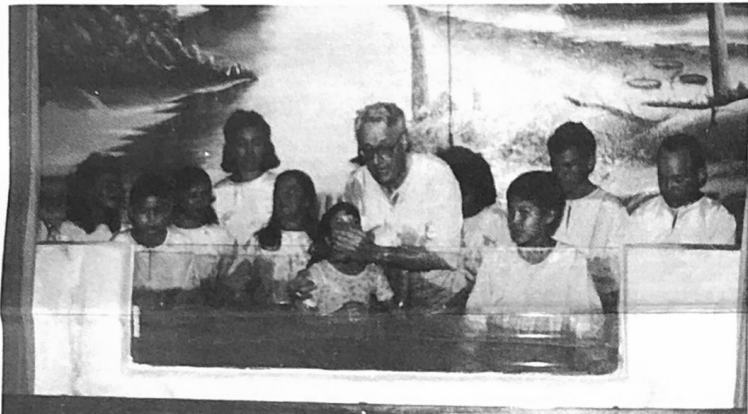

I left Miami on August 2 and arrived in Sao Luis the next day. There were several brethren to meet me, some from Faith Baptist, some from New Hope Baptist, and also some friends. It was hard to leave June and Fran and also our other children who live in Alabama. We all decided that it would be best for me to return to Brasil even for a short time.

I have been busy getting tags on my car and buying material for the roof of the building at Cantanhede. I have made four dusty trips to Cantanhede, one trip to Peritoro, one trip to Anajutuba. I have preached three times at New Hope Baptist, one time at Cantanhede, one time at Anajutuba and also one time at Living Hope Baptist Church. I have been in contact with a preacher to come and preach for the church at Anajutuba and I hope the church can call him and also that he will accept the church to be their pastor.

I will return to Alabama September 5. June reports that Fran stays in bed most of the time. Fran is paralyzed on the right side and the doctor said it could be on the left side at any time. May God bless in our prayer.
