## Report on Trip to States . . . Get Airplane for Work . . . Four River Trips and About 50 Saved . . .

### Dear Brethren:

Greetings from lovely, tropical Cruzeiro do Sul. I have just arrived from the United States, where I spent a number of very cold days. A few cold days in the States always makes me really appreciate the wonderful hot weather here in Brazil.

My trip to the U.S. lasted over 2 months. That is why you have not heard from me for some time. There were 2 reasons for this trip. My oldest daughter, Monica, went back to the States to begin college. She is already 18 (hard to believe), is working and will be starting college next semester. She is with my oldest son, Adam, in Napa, California. The other reason was for me to learn how to fly.

For 2 months I was in Bolivar, Tennessee at Bolivar Aviation, working day and night, sometimes 7 days a week to learn how to fly. My boys said I was taking a "crash" course, which I don't think the school would appreciate.

While in the U.S. I purchased a 2 place kitplane suitable for bush flying. On my way out to California, I stopped and visited the factory and flew one of their demonstrators. My plane was already crated and shipped the next day. It is on a ship, somewhere between Miami and Manaus right now. Dad is going to stay with us a few months to assemble the plane.

Special thanks to Pastor Sherman Smith and Napa Valley Baptist Church who helped get the loans to be able to buy the plane. Those of you who are just finding out about this project, please take note of the word "loans" in the former sentence! The plane is a long way from being paid for. I still do not have all the radios and 2 of the essential instruments, for lack of funds. Pray and think about it (mostly pray).

When I left to do my training our preachers were up river working in some of the villages that we intend to serve with the airplane. When I got back another team was up there. In fact, we have 2 more teams up river right now. In my absence our workers went into 4 rivers, preached to over 2,000 people and about 50 were saved. We are in the rainy season which makes the most remote villages accessible. In the dry season we plan to use the airplane to get into the large, more distant villages. Once it has been thoroughly tested, we hope to be able to shuttle our workers, supplies, medicines and even doctors.

I have prayed and known for years that some day our work would expand to the point that we would have to use something other than boats. The time has come and the Lord is opening the doors. Please pray with us and help financially, too.

Next letter I will tell you more about the river work and here in town, too. But before I close: the 3 Sundays I have been back home there have been people saved, 2 more yesterday. God continues to bless with this the greatest blessing of all. May He do the same for you.

Dear Brethren:

On Sunday this month, Betty and I visited the Assis Brazil Baptist Church that just the week before had celebrated their thirtieth birthday. This was the first church we organized in Brazil and at that time it was located on the banks of a lake where there were only nine houses. We never expected the church to grow very much because of its location, but a few years ago they moved to a growing area just about a mile away and that Sunday morning I preached to about two hundred people. They, with their own money, built a large brick church building that will seat about four hundred and I will not be surprised that they will fill it sometime in the future. We enjoyed a good lunch with one of the families of the church and that afternoon returned to Cruzeiro. It was good to rekindle old friendships and make some new ones.

The Faith Baptist Church here in town celebrated their thirty-sixth birthday this month and they asked me to preach a five day meeting for them. By the pastor's request, I preached a series of messages

on the subject of "Why Preach the Gospel." The services were well attended with over four hundred present on Wednesday night. Two came asking for baptism and there were two saved. This Church has also built a new temple within the past few years that will seat about four hundred and with the way the city is growing they could outgrow their building within a short time, if they set their minds and bodies to the task.

Betty and I have both been a little under the weather this month, but we keep on truckin', even if it is only in low gear. Betty gets in high gear even when she doesn't feel well, but not I.

Mike returned from the States a few weeks ago and has taken over his duties once again at the church. I enjoyed doing most of the preaching while he was gone, but all are glad to have him back and the Lord continues to bless the work.

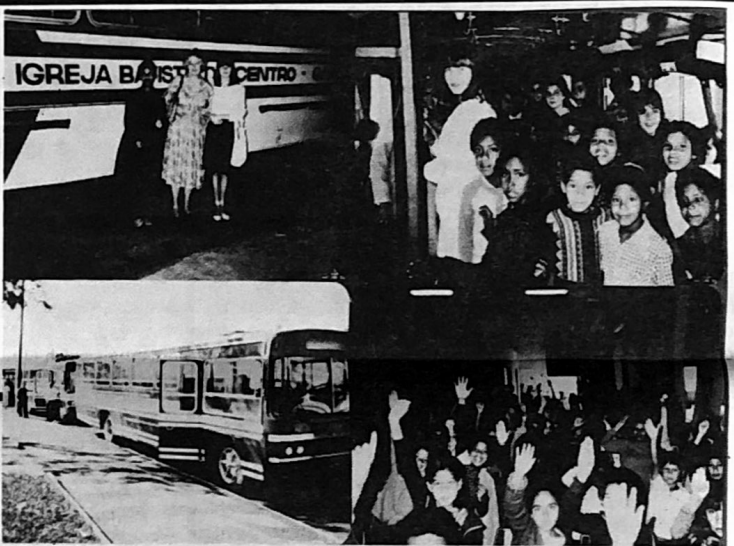

## MISSION STUDY

### WHAT IS MISSIONS?

Missions is the obedience of Baptist churches to the Great Commission in carrying the gospel of Jesus Christ under the leadership of the Holy Spirit for the purpose of calling men unto salvation, which can only be accomplished by the Word of God and the work of the Holy Spirit.

The story of missions through the pages of the New Testament scriptures, and secular history as well, is one that will thrill the very soul of any devout child of God. During His earthly ministry, the Lord Jesus organized or built His church and commissioned it to do His work in the earth with His authority (ekousia) Matt. 28:18) and accredited it by special gifts of His Spirit (Acts 1:8). He set first in the church the apostles. Having taught them all things needful, the hour having come, Jesus went to the cross for sinners, giving His life for His church. After His resurrection He called the church together and instructed it to wait in Jerusalem until they had received the power of the Holy Spirit, after which they would be witnesses of His grace to the ends of the earth.

The church waited as instructed, and on the day of Pentecost the Lord Jesus baptized His church in the Holy Spirit. Gifts were given to the church. Special gifts were given to accredit His church just as He had accredited the Temple and the Tabernacle, and permanent gifts for the ministry of the church until His coming.

Let us hurriedly pass through the sacred pages of the Acts of the Apostles to see the church working in obedience to the Commission of her Lord. The apostles bravely declare the gospel of Jesus of Nazareth in spirit of trial and hard persecution. Stephen, one of the seven deacons, is a mighty man in the scriptures and his stinging message of truth is such a rebuke that wicked men stirred by guilty consciences bury him beneath a heap of stones. Great persecution scatters the church then numbering in the thousands. Paul unleashes his devastating persecution and thousands of Christians are scattered throughout Palestine and Syria. As they are scattered they go preaching, and so the gospel is the more spread. Phillip the Evangelist is down to Samaria preaching with great power and multitudes are being saved. On the way to Damascus, the persecutor is saved and the churches have peace.

Persecution and scattering is an abnormal mission method. When the churches enjoy peace, they are once more found busy at the job of spreading the gospel in the normal manner. Peter visits all the churches and goes into Joppa to confirm what God has done among the Gentiles. In Antioch the work of the Lord increases, and when the church in Jerusalem hears about it, they send unto them Barnabas, who rejoices in what the Lord has done. Going to Tarsus, he finds Paul and they tarry at Antioch teaching the church. Peter and John go into the region of Samaria to confirm the work of the Lord: Thus it is clearly seen that the early church was zealous in the matter of confirming new work. The Bible establishes its own principles and then exemplifies them in practice. The church in Antioch of Syria serves as a perfect example for the method and authority of doing mission work.

### The Significance of Missions

If there is one subject the churches of the Lord Jesus ought to know about, it is that of taking the gospel message of the death, burial and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. This is missions. A clearer understanding perhaps can be reached by a simple study of the words in the New Testament which refer to or denote the work of going and sending the gospel.

The words missions and missionary are not found in the English translation of the Bible. They are found, however, in the Scriptures, both in meaning and practice. Our words "mission" and "missionary" come from the Latin as do such words as "missile" and "emissary". The verb "to send" in Latin is *mittere* and "sent" is *missus*. In the Scriptures the word "apostle" actually means "sent one". The words, in the Greek, meaning "to send" or "sent" come from three different words. One of these is from where the word "apostles" comes, meaning "sent one". Now the Latin translates these with words from which our language derives terms as: mission, missionary, missile, and emissary. Even though not

We have gone through a number of political changes in the last month. We have a new mayor and city council in Manaus. The President of Brazil resigned during the impeachment proceedings and the vice-president was sworn into office. The people are hoping for the best and that tomorrow will bring better days for the Nation. The minimum wage was about \$30.00 U.S. dollars (which is what most earn) at the end of December. The population of Manaus is estimated at one and one half million. The industrial park in Manaus, which employed 100,000 people two years ago has collapsed. In December only 18,500 had jobs. The great illusion is that change can take place without Christ in their lives.

We are certain that God saves individual lives. God gives certainty to His people in the midst of uncertainty. Pray for the Christians in Brazil to look to the Lord, trust in Him alone to meet the needs of their lives. Pray that God will continue to encourage His children to share the Gospel of Christ in these times of great physical and spiritual need. We are asking God to give us the wisdom to make the best use of the resources that He give us. We are asking Him to maintain the doors open for the spread of the Gospel in Brazil.

We are grateful to God for your prayers and support for the work here in Brazil.

found in the Bible in the written forms, "mission" and "missionary", their meaning comes directly from the Scriptures.

In the fourteenth chapter of Acts, Paul and Barnabas are called "the apostles", meaning "sent ones". The Scriptures use a word, from which comes "apostle", meaning "send". Jesus, in the account by Luke, sent (apostled) the twelve by twos (Luke 9:2). In chapter 10:1, Jesus sent out (apostled) 70, two by two. John was sent (apostled) from God.

### The Apostleship - A Special Office

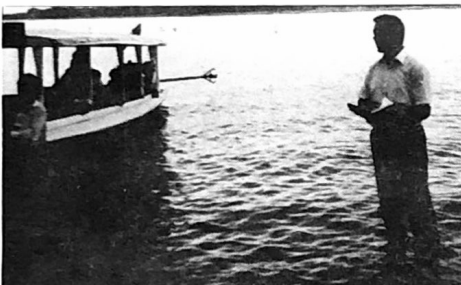
It should be clearly understood that the twelve apostles had a special office or ministry which is not successive as some would have us believe. So let it not be thought that the mission work of a church is carrying on the work of the special office of the Apostles. A detailed explanation of the work of the Twelve cannot be handled here.

What is necessary for a correct understanding of the work of the church is the realization that God has always sent (apostled) men to deliver his message to the people. This is true whether in the Old Testament or in the New. This is not a haphazard plan of "who-wants-to-can" but rather a definite plan of God in choosing men and preparing and sending them in the manner He was ordained. By missions then is meant the work of fulfilling the Commission given by the Lord to His church before ascending into heaven. Missions is the going and sending into all the world to make disciples, to baptize them, and to teach them all things that God has commanded to be observed. He has promised to be with His church until the end of the ages for realization of this work - Missions.

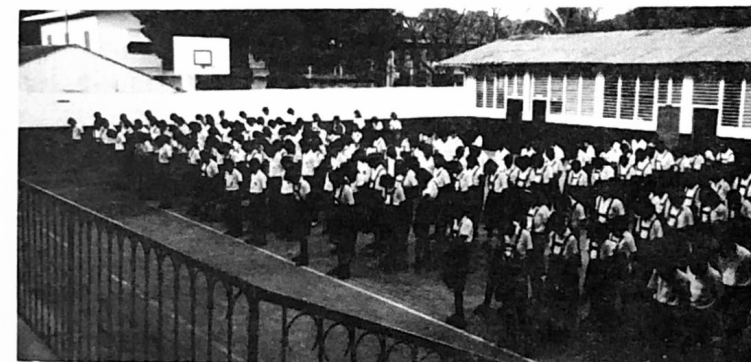
The Scriptures declare, "How shall they hear except they preach, and how shall they preach except they be sent (apostled)."

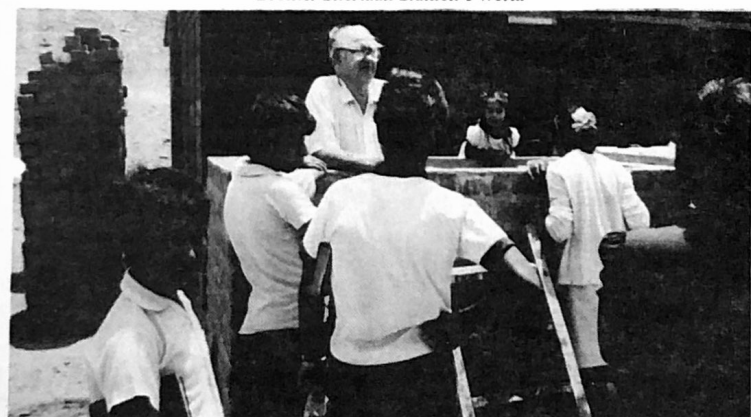
