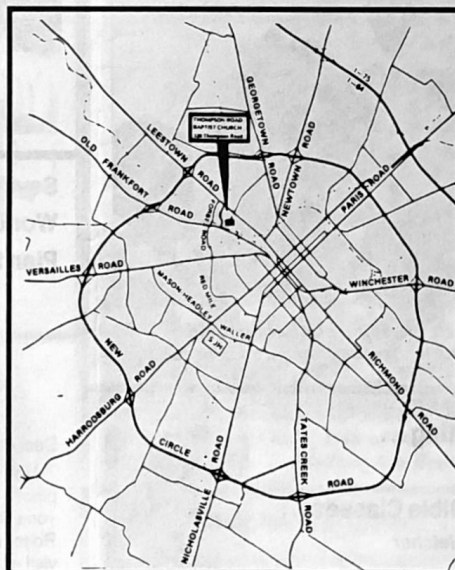

Dear Brethren:

The wonderful Lord blessed us greatly this first month of the new year of 1993. To Him we give all praise and honor.

The first Sunday of January there were 370 present, and I had the privilege of baptizing 11, one of those being our own 9 year old, Marcia Luciana. We thank Him for this marvelous blessing. The following Saturday, our mission at Armando Mendes celebrated their 5th anniversary and I baptized 5 more.

My 37th birthday, January 4th, was celebrated royally throughout the week by several departments of the church. I received many nice gifts including a tie set from the ladies, and a fishing rod from the young people.

Our average Sunday School attendance in January was 301. In February our low

was 220 on a rainy Sunday and 301 last Sunday. The Lord has blessed this month with over 25 professions of faith, and several other decisions.

School starts again at the Bible Institute on March 1st. Also Saturday, March 6th, we will be organizing our Armando Mendes mission into a New Testament Church and at the same time ordaining Brother Paulo Moises, our evangelist there, to the gospel ministry.

Do continue to pray for us as all four of us have been sick with several ailments, mainly the flu. Also Brasil continues its downward slide both spiritually and economically. Actual inflation is over 100% a month. But the Lord is still on His Throne!

standing at the head of the casket and blood was coming out of her mouth. I was glad that I have a strong stomach.

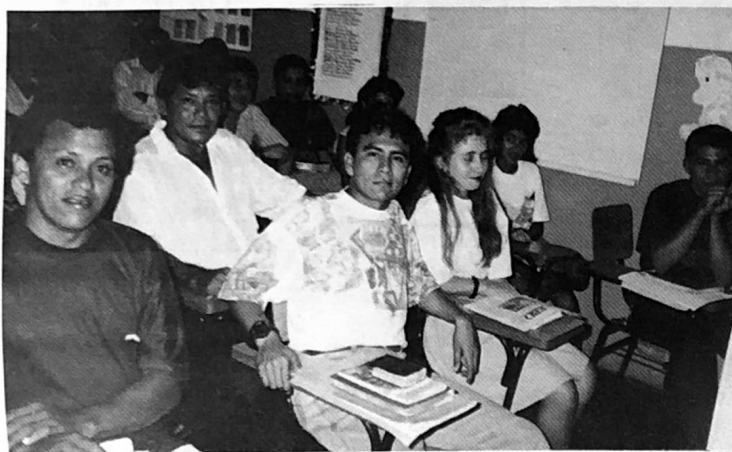
I have preached one time at Living Hope Baptist Church and have made one trip and preached at Anajatuba Baptist Church. The new pastor is working out real well there.

During the past month God has blessed us with good health and many opportunities to witness of Christ. Our weekly program of work includes two Bible studies for adults, two Bible classes for children, three services regularly in Cornelio Procopio, on Saturday night and Sunday. Many years ago I often heard about two places in the interior from Cruzeiro do Sul - one was Saint Antonio and the other Saint Rose, but I never had the opportunity to visit either of them. Since then some of the men of the church that Mike pastors opened preaching points in each of these small towns, going there each Saturday night. Several times they have invited me to go with them, which I have done several times. Two weeks ago I went with them to Saint Antonio and for some reason the crowd was smaller than usual, but we had good services with three professions of faith. Mike went there the following week and there were four that came asking for baptism.

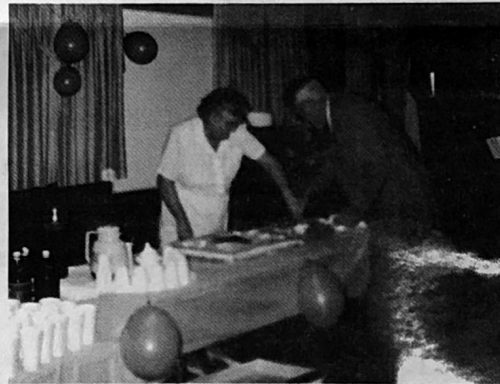
The Baptist Church in Mancio Lima had a youth meeting last Sunday night and I was invited to do the preaching. When we lived here many years ago it took us about six hours to get to this village, but since then there has been built and paved a road that only takes minutes to get there. Although the service was two hours long, it

was a good service and I preached to over two hundred young people. We arrived home in a good rain and the next twenty hours gave us plenty of rain with some of the city being flooded.

We have been working very hard trying to get the first wing of the school built to be ready for classes to start this month. Classes were to have started on February 10 but since we did not have the building far enough along for them to use, school will not start until the 25th. The building will not be finished even then, but classes will start anyway.

While Mike was in the states he bought an airplane in kit form that we plan to put together here, in fact that is the real reason I came here. The plane has not arrived yet, but should be here by the first of March and will take us about four months to have it flying. This will be a great help in the work here. This is something I dreamed about thirty years ago. We trust the Lord will use it for His glory.

Dear Brethren:

The rainy season has finally hit Cruzeiro do Sul. It has rained every day for the past 2 weeks, and the last 2 Sunday nights we have had truly tropical rains. Our attendance dropped to well under 200, which is only about a fourth of our usual crowd. Even so we have continued to have folks saved every week for the past 2 months.

We had excellent services during the holiday season. The crowds were up around 800 people. On New Year's Eve I baptized 14. That night we also had reports from our missionaries. The number of trips made on the many rivers, number of people preached to and the number of souls saved was outstanding. We also took up an offering for the school, which came to over \$1,000.00.

Since my last letter there have been 14 professions of faith, 11 requests for baptism, 14 others baptized and 4 new members came by letter. Two very faithful families moved away to other cities last month, which is always discouraging. Nevertheless we are still growing a little.

Brother Raimundo Vieira and family are up the Tejo River. He has been there every other month for the past 2 years. This time he decided to take his family to help in the work. I just talked to the new mayor of Taumaturgo and he tells me that he plans

to build an airstrip at the headwaters of the Tejo River. This should be a help to our work there.

Two more river trips were made during the past month. One was to the Valparaíso River. Several more were saved there. Our building is already framed up and being worked on right now. The other trip was to the Ouro Preto River. This is another one of those little rivers, hard to reach, yet with several hundred people along the way. Our men preached to over 400 people and 23 were saved.

We have been working on our school building over the past few weeks. Last week we put the trusses up and this week we will put the roof on. The new school year is scheduled to begin on February 10. Dad, Paul and I have been jumping around from job to job, trying to keep all the projects moving. It isn't easy. If you think that just because we live in the tropics the pace is nice and easy going - think again! Really the hardest part though is trying to scrounge up the money to keep things going. I bet you have heard that line before!

Time to close. Thanks for all of your help, through your prayers and financial support. God bless you for it.

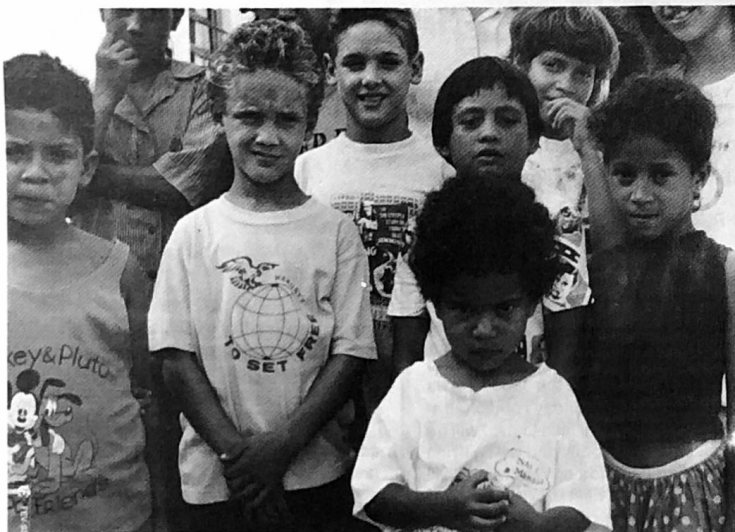

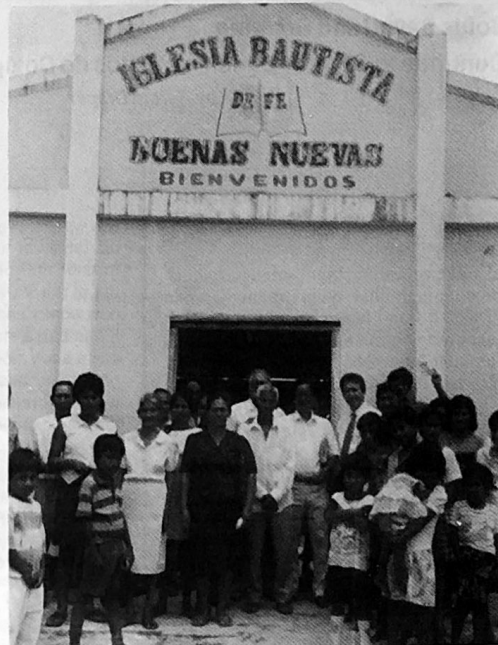
