Dear Friends:

We are already three months overdue on our return for furlough and we still have no definite date in sight. All of the negative factors involved in Jessie's adoption process have been eliminated, but the red tape takes time to be finalized. We are praying that we'll be home by Thanksgiving.

Although this delay is a little discouraging to us, it is not without its positive benefits. The new church that we began a few months back is getting stronger every day. We are especially thankful that we could still be here as the many visitors come in. Several of them have come in with the notion that they would make the church like the ones where they attended before. (As you may remember, we built this work in a brand new neighborhood where there are very few churches). Often this spells trouble, and our being here has helped the younger church members to resist these divisive elements. The greatest difficulty has been with church-hopping charismatics. They seek no responsibility, yet in its place they are looking for a continuous spiritual high and incite others to join them in this silly quest. God in His wisdom has allowed us to remain a few

more months in order to guide this infant church through some shaky first steps.

Not all of our new visitors are a hindrance though. We have had (and still have) some folks who are genuinely seeking a place to serve God in accord with His Word. We are especially excited about one man who was studying to be a Catholic priest. A member from our church invited him several weeks ago and he has been coming regularly ever since. He told me that he sees the inconsistencies in his church's doctrine and will continue to attend ours to learn God's word more clearly.

We have another project underway which we hope to inaugurate in January of next year. Our faithful sister, Iolene, is a trained school teacher and hopes to begin a kindergarten for non-church families. We believe this will be an excellent opportunity to reach the children and their parents with God's word. Charlene will be doing further studies while home on furlough in order to assist in this new ministry.

We will see you all in God's appointed time.

Dear Brethren:

We are enjoying one of the best summers we have had in some time. The weather has been great and the blessings on the work even greater.

Paul and I went back to Rio Branco to visit the congregation and work on the building. While there we were able to get the slab poured for the floor and left detailed instructions for the continuation. Since then they have put up all the walls and sawed the lumber for the trusses. About mid September I hope to return to put on the roof. They are scraping every little bit of cash they can to try to buy the roofing. It will cost about \$1,000. While there I held services almost every night. One night we held services in the home of a justice department official. Just last week one of the couples that attended that service was saved along with his mom. We had a big crowd for our Sunday evening service with the congregation. Everyone is excited about finally getting out of the school building and into the new building. They have been holding prayer meetings at the job site even though there isn't even a roof. We have grown almost all we can at the school, so pray that we can get them moved soon.

I must mention one more thing about the trip to Rio Branco. The day we arrived, a cold front came through. Paul and I did not take jackets or blankets. The second night the temperature got down to 42 degrees! That may not sound cold to you, but believe

me, down here that is very cold. The wind was blowing hard and we were sleeping in a house with no ceilings. It was a brisk experience.

The last trip that Brother Raimundo Vieira made to the Tejo was a success. He took his pastor, Brother Gilberto, from Faith Baptist Church. Brother Gilberto baptized several of the young Christians. A few more were saved.

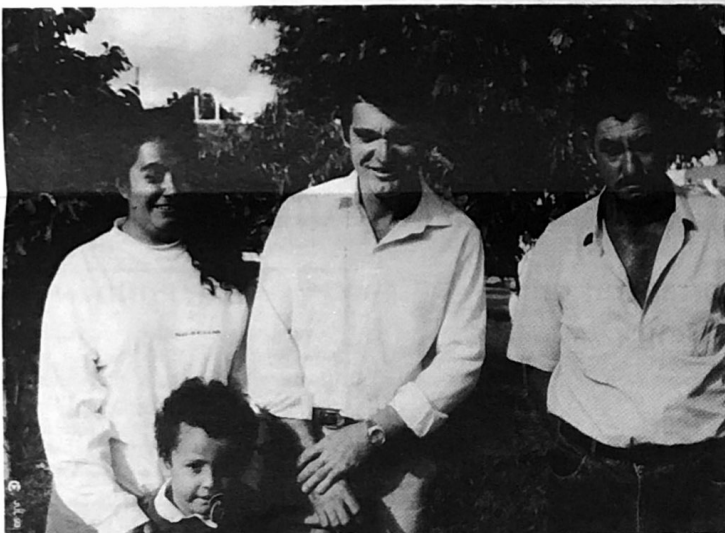
Brother Antonio Nery has completely finished the building at Tartaruga. One of the young men, who lives a couple hours up river holds services regularly. Our home church is helping several of the couples to get legally married. This will be the first group to be baptized. On his last trip, 7 more were saved.

All continues well here in town. There have been a number of professions of faith. Some of these were at church and a few others in homes. Attendance is good.

A couple of weeks ago I got back into the construction business. I am building a combination garage and the studio for the video work. This always takes a big chunk out of my time. We were supposed to start building at Rodrigues Alves this week, too. The truck didn't come to haul the materials though. In a way I'm glad we didn't start yet. Things could get beyond control!

Well, I must close. God bless all of you. Thanks for all of your faithful help.

Dear Brethren:

June will see her doctor on September 20. If he releases her she should return to Brasil some time in October.

This month has been one of a steady grind. I went to Sao Mateus August 22; that was the last time there in our preaching point. We had conducted a four month test. After much prayer, we thought it better not to continue.

There is a Baptist Church in Sao Mateus started by Brother Sostenes. This church was stolen from us by a large Baptist group. They stole church building, preacher's home and all. There is a bird here in Brasil that will not build a nest for itself; it will look for a nest discarded by some other bird and then use it. The problem is that we had not discarded the church. When I see those responsible for this, they turn their heads in shame. I have told them I would

never consider taking over one of their churches.

Villa Riód: Saturday, Sept. 4, Dr. Tanha, who is a member of a Baptist Church in Sao Luis, has donated her time as well as six young ladies from New Hope Baptist Church. Brother Netto from New Hope Baptist Church arranged getting the medicine from the government. Before she started to treat the children, I preached to the mothers and those present. The poor have the Gospel preached unto them. There have been six professions of faith at Villa Riód.

I have made on trip to Cantanhede and all is well there. I had some stomach problems, but I have taken medicine for amoeba and I am much better.

Brother Sostenes has been in the hospital with blood clots in his legs. He is much better now that they have discovered his problem. May God bless all is our prayer.

The rivers and lakes drop their water levels about 40 feet. As the water levels go down, the fishing gets very good. Usually, if things go well, my brother David and I get to go bass fishing two or three days. This season is already special because my father, two brothers and my son and I fished together for three days. The fishing was good and the fellowship was greater. Thank God for allowing us to get together.

The church camp has been busy in September. The youth department camped

the first week - they had nine baptized as a result of the retreat and also inaugurated the new swimming pool - a very welcome feature in all this heat.

The intermediates had camp the second week, and the last week, the mission pastors had a camp/seminar. The speaker for the seminar was Pastor John Hatcher, Emmanuel Baptist Church, Evansville, Indiana. Thirty-five mission pastors were present. The fellowship was encouraging. Dear Brethren:

On August 12th we loaded up more than 40 young people in the back of a truck and headed off to camp. As usual, the Lord blessed us with good weather and everyone had a great time. There was lots of singing, new games and activities, plenty of food, interesting Bible studies, and best of all, since coming back we have had one person make a profession of faith and two others baptized.

On September 7th, 40 ladies went to camp for the first "Women's Retreat". They left their kids and husbands at home and spent the day enjoying themselves with games, Bible study, and swimming. A few of them were even brave enough to ride the zip line at the pond. They have all said that next year they want a 2 day camp and most are looking forward to the couples retreat planned later this month.

Last month we made another trip to Rio Branco to work on the building there. Things went well and we were able to get all of the sub-floor poured. After we left they put the walls up and are now ready for

us to go back next week and put the roof on. They have already begun using the building for mid-week services, even though all they have is a rough concrete slab and unfinished brick walls. But the Lord has blessed their effort and faithfulness and they have already had neighbors attend the services. Please continue to pray for the congregation in Rio Branco - they have a long way to go before the building is finished.

Youth Night is still going good and we are now averaging close to 60 young people each week. We have a film festival planned for December in which the young people will divide up into teams, write their own scripts, do the acting and directing, and we will video tape the results. After the films are completed, we will have a mini film festival at the church for family, friends and whoever else is interested.

Our family is doing fine and we are all staying busy. The language learning is progressing, faster for the kids than for Brenda and I, and we keep hearing and learning new words and phrases every day. Please continue to pray for us and the different ministries here in Cruzeiro do Sul.

Dear Brethren:

During this Mission Sheet month, I preached 14 times - four times (two Wednesday nights and two Sunday nights) at the 14th of December Baptist Church, where, with Asa Mark Bratcher, I serve as pastor. He is the first pastor, I, the second. I preached four sermons at the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, interior, where I am the pastor. Two Sunday mornings I preached at the 29th of March Baptist Mission, of the 14th Church in the suburb of Manaus known as "Multirão".

The four other sermons were delivered in the far away city of Parintins, Amazonas. We spent 17 hours on a boat to get there and 26 hours to arrive back in Manaus. Three of the sermons were actually lectures delivered to the approximately 30 students of the "Seminar for the Lay Leaders of the Interior Churches".

On Sunday morning, September 5, I preached at the First Baptist Church of Parintins. The pastor is Josué Souza da

Silva. On July 22 the pastor there for 40 years went home to be with the Lord. I knew Eduardo Franca Lessa at Georgetown College in KY during the late 40's and then at the Seminary in Louisville during the early 50's. He was a great servant of the Saviour. May the Lord bless his wife and three children. His wife and two sons are active in the church there.

During the weekend revival at New Jerusalem, three youths asked for baptism. The Sunday night (August 29th when I preached at the 14th Church) three people (adults) responded to the invitation - one profession, 1 rededication and 1 asked to be received by letter.

It is now almost two months that we have been back in Brazil. We are once again bearing the burden of "Brasil". Your prayers and offerings will continue to help us bear up under the load. Thank you for all you are doing for us. May the Lord bless you in your prayer.

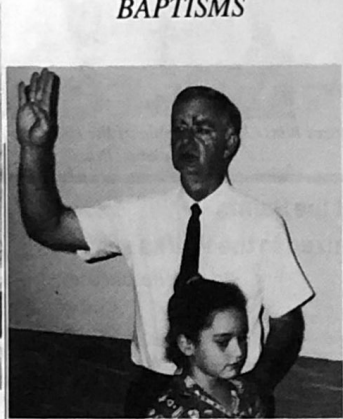

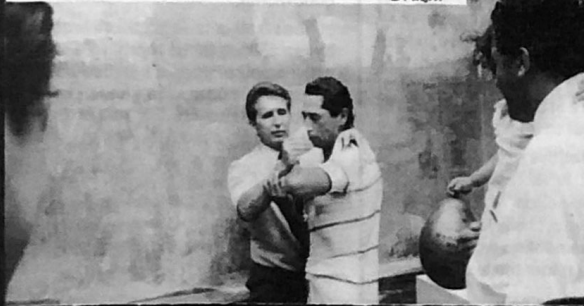
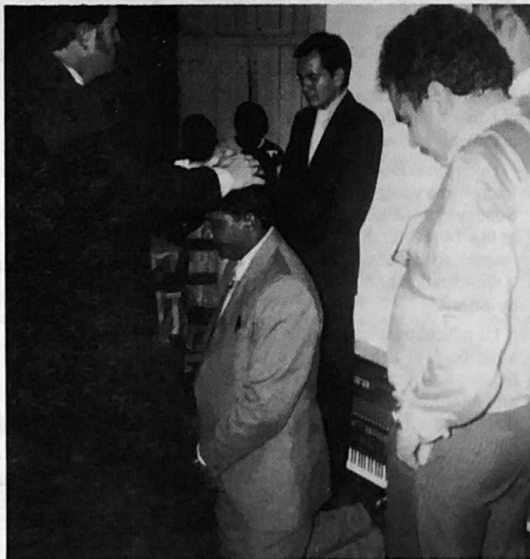
