## AN EYE-OPENING EXPERIENCE

Recently I was privileged to travel to the mission field of Peru, South America, with Pastors Jim Orrick and Glenn Archer. Having never been to a mission field before, I was really astonished at what I experienced while there. I saw things I had never seen before, ate things I never ate before, heard things I had never heard before, and smelled things I had never smelled before! It truly was a unique experience.

We went to visit Sheridan Stanton and Homer Crain, both based in the capitol city of Lima. They were very gracious hosts to us as we visited them and their works in Lima and the outlying areas. I was honored to teach and preach in Brother Stanton's mission in the city of Lima. Most of our three week visit was spent in the cities of Pucallpa, Iquitos, Huanaco, and Tingo Maria.

The first few days we went to Pucallpa in the jungle region of Peru with Brother Stanton. The "Colegio Particular Bautista" (Independent Baptist School) is located in this city. What a joy it was to see this great work. Approximately 650 Peruvian boys and girls attended this work that was originally begun by Brother & Mrs. Del Mayfield. I was extremely impressed with the tremendous potential to reach these young people with the gospel and baptize them into the churches of Pucallpa. What a mission field! While in Pucallpa we met the Peruvian pastors of four churches begun by the missionaries of BFM, and saw their buildings. We also took a trip down the Ucayali River in a motorized canoe and visited the church at San Francisco de Asace, in the Amazon jungle (110 degrees in the shade!) The elderly pastor met with us there.

The next several days were spent with Brother Crain. We flew some 500 miles to the city of Iquitos on the Amazon River. Brother Crain had arranged services every night in a different church in Iquitos. The three of us took turns preaching in the services. There are approximately 19 churches and missions in this area that have their roots in BFM missionaries! I had the opportunity to preach at the First Baptist Church, which is the very first Baptist work in all of Peru (begun in 1935). The Peruvian pastors in these churches are very mission-minded. The buildings their churches meet in are in varying stages of construction and are in constant need of funds to continue the work. Our missionaries help them as funds are provided by churches in the U.S. They are a very grateful people for what we provide them.

From Iquitos we flew back to Lima to visit Brother Crain's work there in Ventanilla. Then we began a long journey over the Andes Mountains to see the works in Huanaco and Tingo Maria. The 12 hour trip over the mountains was a most amazing experience. An entirely different culture of people live in the Andes. Herds of llamas, high altitudes, snow storms, etc. all contribute to this very different part of Peru (not to mention the sickness Bro. Orrick and I experienced!).

Upon arriving in Huanaco, we were met by several area pastors and services were held that night in Huanaco Baptist Church. The next day we continued our trip in the mountains and visited a mission high in the Andes in the town of Paucar. From there we went to Tingo Maria, which is known as the "Gateway to the Jungle". Here we had services at the Gethsemane Baptist Church.

The most impressive part of this journey of several thousand miles were the people of Peru. The boys and girls, men and women, in the churches were very loving and kind and responsive to us. We were graciously received by the pastors. We enjoyed the singing and the opportunity to preach through an interpreter to these precious people. Also extremely impressive is the need for more mission work to be done in Peru. We have just "scratched the surface" in the city of Lima (population 7,000,000) and the hundreds of other towns and villages in the outlying areas of Peru.

I would encourage every mission-minded Pastor here in the U.S. to take a trip to Peru and "see for yourself" the great work going on in Peru and the tremendous need to do more. The letters and photos we receive from our missionaries are good, but they cannot relay the "whole picture" of what it is like on the mission field. There is nothing like being there in person to know what it is really like. Why don't you consider a trip to the field?

Dear Brethren:

As we approach the end of the month and the year, we can only look back and express our gratefulness to our Lord for the many, many blessings.

He continues to bless us at the 14th of December Baptist Church. Sunday, there were 333 in Sunday School and some 6 decisions throughout the day. This coming Sunday we plan to baptize more than 10 and observe the Lord's Supper.

All of the other works are being blessed. Both Brother Leonir from the town of Coari and Brother Ortan from Codajas brought in good reports last week. Also, we are wrapping up this semester of studies both at the Bible College and the Institute. This semester I taught Expository Preaching,

Pastoral Ministries and O.T. Theology. On Friday the 10th of December, the annual graduation exercises of the Bible College will be held and I will be the commencement speaker. In June, we hope to graduate our first class of the Bible Institute before we return to the States on furlough.

Do continue to earnestly pray for us here as practically all of us have been sick with one thing or the other. I have had respiratory problems (coughing, spells of severe shortness of breath, etc.) for over six weeks. I have been to 3 doctors and am better, but not over it yet. Also do continue to pray for Brazil, as the economic situation continues to worsen and the cases of corruption in all levels of government appear daily.

Dear Friends:

In some respects I could say that not much has changed since I wrote last month. That really depends on what we consider change. Referring to Jessie's adoption process, "no change" is an evident truth. We still have nothing concrete to report. When we refer to the prospects of returning home any sooner, "no change" seems to be the most applicable term. If we consider great numbers of conversions to Christ, "no change" continues to apply. But, when we stop to examine each case individually, "no change" would be a terrible understatement and in some cases a complete lie! Take Eder's case for example. Since last month he became, instead of a backward, shy directionless teenager, a devoted and confident preacher of the gospel. He still has much training to do, but a changed heart has placed him on the road to faithful service to God. If we consider two neighbors of our church, then "no change" would be a great improvement to what they are probably experiencing right now. You see, they left this world not knowing Jesus Christ as their Savior and the change for them can only be described as unimaginable!

The reason I'm writing on this subject of no change is because of my difficulty some months to know what I should write to you all. Sometimes I think to myself, "Oh, they've already heard that same boring stuff a hundred times." You know what I'm

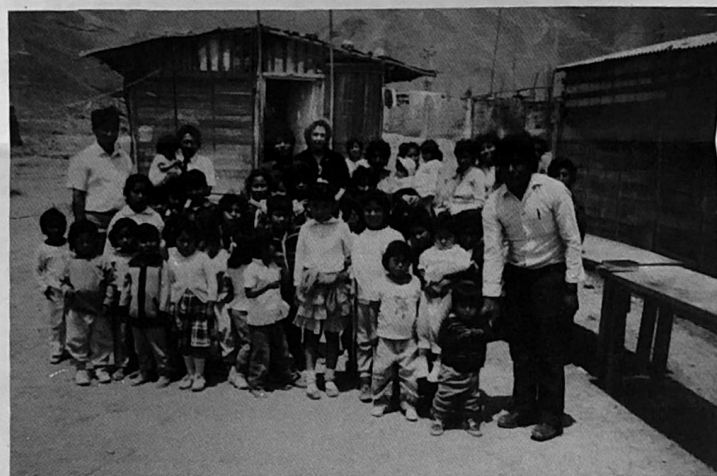

The first news for this month is we have purchased a building in the city of Cornelio Procopio. The next news is that we need five thousand dollars by the end of January to make the final payment. If you could or would like to have a part in this, your help will be greatly appreciated.

Our monthly visitation continues and we are reaching almost 5,000 homes each month. Each month there is new interest shown on the part of those receiving the Gospel message of our church paper. In Urai there have been new persons attend-

ing the Wednesday night preaching service. One lady came with a friend after receiving our paper in her home. She has not missed a service since. There are two young mothers who have shown great interest in salvation.

Please continue to pray for the work in Cornelio Procopio and Urai. The purchase of the building and new interest on the part of many persons are evidences that God is hearing and answering your prayers.

Our short stay in the States is due to the fact that our time is short, the needs are great, millions of Brazilians are lost and there are none to fill in the gap. Are there none who care enough to go?

## Who Has the Authority for Missions?

The answer to this question must be searched out and based upon the Bible. Professing Christianity does not always follow. "Thus, saith the Lord." But this fact does not relieve men of the responsibility to do so. Obedience to the Word of God is vital if He is to be pleased. Much is heard in our day about Christian unity. Such could only be had with the Bible as a basis, that is, all the Bible. Men today are willing to use the Name of Christ and at the same time disregard His Word. "We are all saved," they say, "so let us put aside our differences and become one." If these were our differences perhaps they could be put aside. The differences, however, are God's and come from His Word so we must follow Him.

In order to answer the question before us, the source of all authority must be discovered. Jesus declared, "All authority is given unto me in heaven and in earth." There it is. The Son of God is the source of all authority. If He possesses all authority, then only those to whom He delegates authority for His work will have it. Look at Matthew 28:19-20. Who is the YOU in this passage of scripture? Some say that this is a commission given to every believer. Others say that it is given to the apostles, and that it is continued through a succession of apostles. Others maintain that the authority is given to ordained men. Yet still others believe that Jesus gave this authority to His church, founded during His earthly ministry and for which He gave Himself on the cross.

The group to which Christ spoke was His church. To her He gave the authority and instruction to do His work. It is important here to explain that the Bible only knows one kind of church. Christ was visibly and bodily resurrected from the grave, and in Mt. 28:19-20 speaks to the church. When God created man, He formed but one body, in number and in kind. All other persons including Eve came from that body. When Christ formed His church (the body of which He is the head) it was one in number and kind. All men have proceeded from Adam. All churches of the kind Christ built have come from the first one. Christ is the

head of every man and Christ is the head of every church. Adam is not the head of apes, giraffes, nor donkeys. Likewise Christ is not the head of man-made organizations that under the guise of Christianity call themselves churches when in reality they are pseudo-churches and religious parasites.

Adam became a living soul and he produced. The church that Christ left on the earth is a living body and has produced like churches for over nineteen centuries and shall continue to do so until His return. These are the churches which have the authority to fulfill all the Great Commission, and only these.

### You

Let us look at the YOU in Matthew 28:19-20. YOU go, YOU baptize, YOU teach and I am with YOU until the end of the age. And, Christ has been with the church through the ages to keep His promise just as He has been with the race of Adam to keep His promise made to Eve in the book of Genesis, chapter 3 and verse 15. If your ancestry stops anything short of Adam, you are not of his race. If a church stops in its ancestry short of the Jerusalem church, it is not Christ's kind. Baptist churches are the churches of Christ on the earth and so it follows that they are the churches which have the authority to do scriptural mission work.

The YOU in Matthew 28:19-20 is a kind that can be traced through the pages of the New Testament. In Chapter 8 of Acts, the YOU has become plural, in Samaria and as far as Antioch. YOU in Chapter 13 of Acts is the church at Antioch sending out Barnabas and Paul. The YOU is the church at Cenchrea (Romans 16:1); the churches of the gentiles and the church in the house of Priscilla and Aquila (Romans 16:4-5); the churches of Christ (Romans 16:16); the church at Corinth (I Cor. 1:2); the churches of Macedonia (II Cor. 8:1); the churches of Galatia (Gal. 1:2); the church of the Thessalonians (I Thess 1:2); and the seven churches which are in Asia. The churches are tangible and located to do the job that God has given them. The YOU of Matthew is no invisible monster as many would have us to believe. The YOU, are Baptist churches

throughout the centuries from the earthly ministry of the Lord Jesus until His return.

### Personal Witnessing

It must be clearly understood that the matter of witnessing of the Grace of the Lord Jesus Christ is the responsibility of every Christian, personally. This is clearly seen in the first century when the thousands of members were scattered abroad because of the terrible persecution of which Saul played a major part. Acts, Chapter 8, tells us that Saul "made havoc of the church (the only one in existence at that time) entering into every house, and hauling men and women, committed them to prison. (It would certainly be hard to make havoc of an invisible church). Therefore, "they who were scattered abroad went everywhere preaching the word" (announcing the good news). As a result many were saved who received the message of the resurrected Jesus. We have in the eighth chapter of Acts an interesting contrast between the words translated "preaching" and "preached". In verse 4 the scattered (men and women, supposedly) announced (Gr. euaggelizo) and Phillip in verse 5 went down and preached (Gr. kerusso - heralded publicly). It is noteworthy that the scriptures indicate that it is every Christian's job to announce the gospel, but in a special way God has called and placed in the church apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers. (Ephesians 4:11). These are those who are recognized in the church by the scriptural qualifications and ordained and sent out to do the work of ministering the Word. Thus, we have Phillip the Evangelist with authority to baptize. In the same way, the apostles realizing the authority of the church were careful to go down to Samaria to see that all was as God had ordained. When men went up to Antioch and preached (not men and women here) many Greeks believed. This news was received by the church in Jerusalem, and it was careful to send Barnabas to see that all was in order. Note that it is not referred to as a church until after his visit. The doctrine of baptism as to its scriptural authority certainly indicates beyond doubt the need of church authority in those sent out to do the work of the Commission.

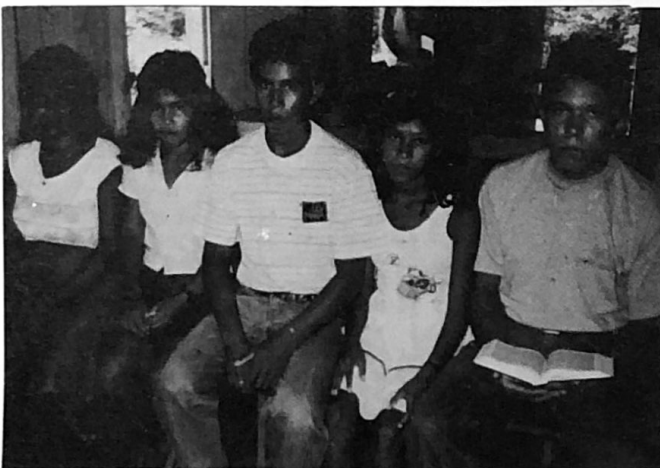

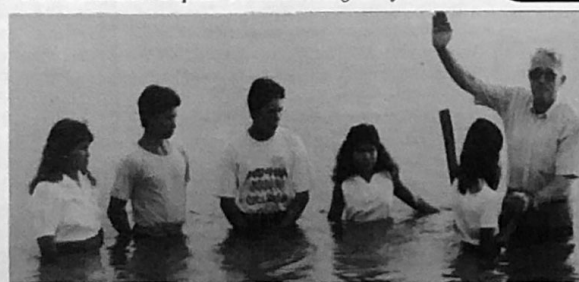
