Dear Brethren:

This is the last Mission Sheet letter that I will write this year of 1993. May the Lord bless us all throughout the year of 1994. During this Mission Sheet Month I preached 12 sermons in six different churches.

Sunday morning, the 21st of November, I preached to the 22 people present at the 29th of March Baptist Mission, Manaus. That night I preached at the Monte das Oliveiras Baptist Church where Osvaldo Melo Rodrigues is the pastor. A former member of the 14th of December Baptist Church made a rededication.

Friday afternoon, Marie and I with Dona Janete Gomes Nunes (Stephen's mother-in-law) journeyed by commercial boat to Codajas. We were on the river almost 20 hours. Saturday night I preached to the 92 people present, celebrating the church's birthday - the 25th of December Baptist Church, Codajas, Amazonas. 79 people heard my Sunday morning message (there were 2 professions of faith) and an estimated 100 that night. Ortan Freitas Barbosa is the pastor. Sunday, December 5th found us back in Manaus. That morning, I preached to an estimated crowd of 170 at the Monte Horebe Baptist Church where Levir Perea Merlo is the pastor. That night on the mountain again, Monte Ararate Baptist Church, there were 78 present. The pastor is Kenneth Ray Loucks.

Wednesday morning found us again traveling on the river downstream to begin a 5 day meeting with the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, Itacoatiara, Amazonas. This interior church was celebrating the 5th anniversary of its organization. I am the pastor there and Ediberto Ribeiro da Silva is the evangelist. The attendance was 54, 57 and 47 the first three nights. Saturday night before the service, supper was served. Pastor Edilson of the Beautiful Garden Baptist Church preached to 332 people. Around 100 could not get in. Sunday morning, December 12th, I preached to 74 and then I baptized three young people, ages 9, 11 and 16. That night we finished the meetings with the smallest

MISSION STUDY

A Special Call

Missions is the essential work and purpose of the church. Previously, it has been shown that the work of the three persons of the Godhead is that given to the church - the redemption of sinners through the preaching of the Gospel to the glory and honor of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The plan of God in this respect is not a haphazard one, either in heaven or on the earth. It is planned in detail. God gives each member of the body a particular work. It is vital to that member's usefulness and happiness to know and do his job, "to work out his salvation with fear and trembling". This means to know the Lord's will and be diligent about doing it.

doing it.

As to the leadership in the church and the ministry of the Word, there are special gifts or callings. It was for this reason that the Apostles found it necessary to have the church elect seven men to take care of the job which concerned the widows and orphans. In the Old Testament certain men were called to go to certain places or people. The parable of the talents will bear out the fact that God gives gifts to men according to His good pleasure. James 3:1 indicates that those with greater responsibility shall receive greater judgment. This is borne out in Hebrews 13:17, "Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account ..." A few examples from the Old Testament will suffice: Jonah went to Ninevah with the

message of repentance; Amos went to Bethel with the message of judgment; Hosea went to Israel with the message to backslidden Israel; Isaiah and Jeremiah went to Judah with the message of rebuke and warning; Daniel and Ezekiel went to the captives of Babylon with messages of consolation.

Likewise, in the New Testament the Holy Spirit calls men to special service and gives special gifts to equip them. Let us note a few examples. The apostles were specially chosen. Luke tells the sixth chapter of his account of the life of Christ, that He called unto Himself the disciples and chose out of them twelve which He named apostles. These were given special gifts as Paul seems to clearly indicate, in the book of II Corinthians 12:12, "Truly the signs of an apostle were wrought among you in all patience, in signs, and wonders, and mighty deeds." Paul and Barnabas are two that were called. In the thirteenth chapter of the book of Acts, it is recorded that there were teachers and prophets in the church at Antioch and "the Holy Spirit spoke whereunto I have called them." Paul constantly referred to the fact of his calling - "called to be an fact of his calling - "called to be an apostle;" "called, not by the will of man. Timothy was also chosen of the Lord as Paul's second letter to him declares: "No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please chosen him to who hath soldier." In the book of Acts. 21:8 Phillip is called by the Holy Spirit, the Evangelist. This no doubt referring to his calling and gift of God.

How God Calls

Now the gifts of God have reached men through His Word whether written or spoken. In the Old Testament, the "Word of the Lord" comes to the prophets of God. This is still the method used by the Holy Spirit to call men to special service. Note in I Timothy 4:14, the writer says, "Neglect not the gift that is in these which was given by prophecy (preaching), with the laying on of hands of the presbytery." The Word of God exhorts that everything should be established by the mouth of two or three witnesses. This very teaching seems to be held in the matter of the call of God to the ministry. The Holy Spirit speaks to the individual just as He does in the matter of salvation. The validity or verification of this call is to be witnessed by the church through the examination of the individual's life in accord with the qualifications set down in Timothy and Titus. Thus the witness of the individual and the witness of the church testify to the call and the called.

You will remember when Samuel went from place to place preaching the Word of God, men were not only saved but also called of God, and as a result several "schools of the prophets" were established by the prophet. The great effects of the "schools of the prophets" upon the spiritual life of Israel are usually underestimated. There is no doubt that among the called were the "lemons". There was the boy, Gehazi, who coveted gold and silver. But the fact



Youth activities are still going great. We keep having more and more young people coming out on Saturday night, which always means more unsaved teens to hear the gospel. Even though we are in the rainy season we are having good crowds; last week we had 40 young people come out in a pouring rain, and 90% of them have to walk to church. We had 3 more young people

The prophet Elijah spoke the message of God. One day he came in contact with Elisha and the "voice" of God spoke to him the Word of God, bidding him to follow. The call caused him to break up his plow, roast one of his oxen, bid his people good-by and follow the prophet. He abandoned all. It cannot be overem-phasized that when God calls, your responsibility is to take hands off of self. Some preachers say, "Well, all I want is just a little cottage or home for my family and me, enough to eat, plenty to wear and good health." Well, who does not want such? That is just about all any old reprobate would want. The servant of God must be willing to yield himself to the Lord that he may be used in the way that the Lord has for brighing bonce and that the Lord has for bringing honor and glory to Himself. The way may not be a house, but a cave. It may not be plenty, but poverty. The children of Israel were made slaves, "vessels of dishonor", that God might show His mighty power to save. Earthly and personal ambitions must be relinquished in full. that the Lord has for bringing honor and

Assurance of the Call -Important in Battle

it is vitally important to make sure of the call lest in the midst of the battle you

turn back. The Holy Spirit will speak to your heart in the call to service as He did in salvation. The same Spirit by which you are able to cry, "Abba, Father," calls men to the ministry. The Holy Spirit does not work in contradiction to the Word of God. As you find assurance in the scriptures of salvation, so you will find assurance in the scriptures as to the Lord's will for your life. It seems quite possible that in the time of prosperity many have let the lure of the romantic call them to the fields of service only to find upon arrival they did not possess an assurance with which to overcome ob-stacles. Here I mention a few of the obstacles that have come to our lives in the service of the Lord.

Our family had been in Brazil about we months. These had been spent in five months. language study and work that kept me close to home. My wife did not speak the language as yet. My first trip was planned into the interior. The duration of the trip was indefinite due to the fact that river travel is very slow and uncertain. There are no means of communication in most places with the exception of radio. On many trips, therefore, you have no contact or word from home and they have no word from you until you arrive home. Knowing this, I said to my wife on the day before the trip, "You understand that if anything should happen to the children and one of them should die, they must

be buried on the same day (they do not embalm in Brazil except in rare cases). So if such would happen you can call Brother Santiago and he will make all the necessary arrangements."

I do not know all that passed through her mind and heart, but she has indicated that it was a pretty lonesome and gruesome feeling. Circumstances must not and cannot govern your serving the Lord.

Another time, just after our fifth child had been born by Caesarean section I felt it was the Lord's will for me to go to Faro. It was a trip of at least two weeks. My wife was still bedfast, having come from the hospital only a few days before Upon returning from my trip, after two weeks, my wife could not rise from the chair. She had almost died during those days. Brother Paul Calley and his wife had arrived from the United States just two or three days after my departure. When he saw me, with tears in his eyes, he said, "Brother, we're glad you are back. We did not think that Mrs. Hatcher would live until you returned." Neither did the doctors or neighbors think so. On that trip there were four professions of faith. Do not make the mistake of trying to determine God's will by circumstances
