MISSION STUDY

You have not gone to another country to make little Americans. Remember, American civilization is not synonymous with Christianity. Your business as a missionary is not to change the customs and everyday habits and dress of the people. Your business is to preach Christ and, when people are saved, the principles of Christianity taught faithfully from the Word of God will produce the desired effect in their lives irrelevant of language and customs. The job of the man of God is not the promulgation of Americanism, but the gospel and principles of Christianity. Many have erred here and, as a result, the work has had no lasting effect. Missionary compounds as in many oriental countries and in Africa have not done the job. This has been due to the fact that the natives were considered incapable and only the American ways and customs were worth anything.

Our Job is Spiritual

It is well to remember that the gospel promises and guarantees spiritual freedom but never freedom from trials and bondage in this life. In the seventh chapter of I Corinthians we read: "But as God hath distributed to every man, as the Lord hath called every one, so let him walk. And so ordain I in all churches, is any man called being circumcised? Let him not become uncircumcised. Is any called in uncircumcision? Let him not be circumcised. Circumcision is nothing and uncircumcision is nothing, but the keeping of the commandments of God. Let every man abide in the same calling wherein he was called. Art thou called being a servant? Care not for it: but if thou mayest be made free use it rather. For he that is called in the Lord, being a servant, is the Lord's freeman: Likewise also he that is called, being free, is Christ's servant. . . . Brethren, let every man, wherein he is called, therein abide with God." (7:17-24)

You will find people living in deplorable conditions and

your heart will yearn to better their living conditions. This is not the task that God has given you to do. Preach Christ, help where you can, but remember that a man is not helped one iota until he received Christ, and when he has done this, we have nothing better to offer. With Christ indwelling a person's heart, the living standard and health conditions will strangely grow better.

Greetings from Brazil. We have had another good month. Our church here at Altos do Coxipo has improved considerably in Sunday School attendance. The night services on Sunday and Wednesday are always well attended. I am teaching the book of Galatians on Wednesday and preaching out of the book of Daniel on Sunday nights.

We had the privilege to speak at the church in Varzea Grande once last month. Also we preached at the Primavera Mission out of that church one Sunday night. We were thrilled to see how the Lord has blessed that work. The house was full. They are wanting me to teach them Bible classes on one night of the week.

The church at Novo Diamantino is about the same. We had the young preacher who takes care of this work preach for us at our "Watch-Night" service. He did a good job. He told me that they probably will just stay there until the end of 1996. They have been there for two and a half years already. How time flies!



We are making plans to come home on furlough this year. It looks like I will be available to visit the churches there from the middle of August until the first of January. We plan to return to Brazil by the 7th of January. It seems like a long way off, but we'll be there before you know it. I would like to be able to visit as many churches as possible. If we could be in the West Virginia area in September or October and Ohio-Michigan in October and November, it would be easier because of the weather, etc.

We want to thank each church and friend who gives and makes our ministry possible.

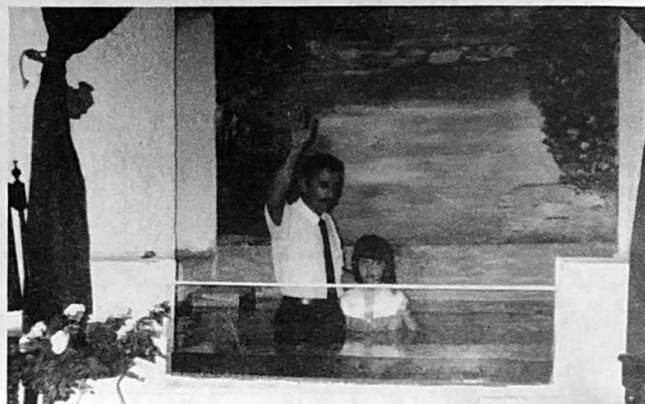

It is an honor and a privilege for Pam and I to be able to serve our Lord under the "ministry umbrella" of Baptist Faith Mission. All the board members have been most kind to us as we have been preparing to go to the field of Kenya, East Africa. Personally, we would like to be out there now, but the Lord has a reason for this period of waiting on Him.

The waiting does not mean just sitting around and doing nothing. We have been busy in meetings in different churches in the past. Now for a little family news. My wife, Pam, continues to work as an R.N. for Hospice. Please pray for Pam, because her eyes seem to be extra sensitive to the glare of the sun, especially in the last few months. She has gone to several eye doctors and they do not detect any problems that need treatment.

Sara, my step-daughter, is now doing her student teaching. Lord willing, she still plans to graduate from Cedarville College this coming June. Pray for Sara as she decides where the Lord would lead her to work next year.

Nathan, my step-son, continues to do well in his sophomore year at Cedarville College. Recently he was in a school-wide talent show. Nathan was the only one to perform with ventriloquism. He competed again 16 other acts. There were over 1800 people in attendance. The Lord blessed, because Nathan won First Place! Pam and I got to attend the contest. We thank the Lord for His help. By the way, Nathan also won First place in last year's contest too. We are glad that Nathan has been using his talent to minister in over 50 churches this past year. He always tries to present the Gospel in his ventriloquist presentations.

Dear Friends:

In my last letter I stated that we had 30 church members and 12 were enrolled in Seminary classes. Update: There are 14 attending Bible classes. I mentioned that our church had opened three new works: two in other parts of the city of Cornelio and one in another city. On the 24th of January there were a total of 217 present in the three works. Needless to say, we are getting some strong opposition. In Casa da Familia (where the attendance was 60 in the second service and 66 in the third), the man who has charge of the key for the building we are using said the people did not want us there anymore. This building is a community center so it is used by others for community events. Last Saturday night they had a dance and left the building in a real mess. When Marcos and Silvio arrived to have Sunday services, they discovered the man with the keys had locked up our benches in a back room. So the morning service was a standing event all the way. This man and his wife are strongly against believers and it is his arbitrary decision that the people do not want us there. So we are going back and see what happens. It seems that the attendance of 60 and 66 is proof that somebody is in favor of the work.

In the city of Leopoldo the attendance

reached 40 and the man across the street who has an ice cream shop decided to install a loud speaker system with loud music. Needless to say that has not helped our services. The marvelous thing about all this is the attitude of those who are working in these areas. Their spirits are high and defeat is not in their thinking. We had rented a small building in Leopoldo and yesterday I received an offering from a lady - enough to pay the rent for a year.

From the new area of Santa Terezinha, 35 persons are being transported to Sunday School. Pray for this area, that God will provide us with a lot to build or suitable property we can rent.

The Lord willing, Alta and I will be in the States for a six week visit. We hope to see many of you at the Spring Mission Conference at Thompson Road Baptist Church, Lexington. I will have a few dates for visits to churches. If interested you can call our son John Mark in Evansville, IN at the following number - (812) 867-7066. I will get in touch with you as soon as we arrive in the States.

Dear Brethren:

"I have good news for you . . . I've read in a book (The Bible) there is life in a look (to Jesus) . . . I have good news for you." The gospel is God's good news for lost sinners.
Yes, we (Marie and I) have good news for you - news or notices that will cause you, if you love the Lord, to rejoice. We also will have to share with you at least one sad notice.

In last month's Mission Sheet letter, we wrote of our plans to visit the Lake Sampaio Baptist Church. We visited the church as planned. We left Manaus, Evando (member of the New Jerusalem Baptist Church - interior), Marie and I at 18:00 on the 19th of January. We arrived in Nova Olinda do Norte at 7:30 the next day. After some delay we left at around 10:30 in a small boat with around thirty members of the Nova Olinda church aboard. It was a slow boat but we arrived at the Church at around 13:30. The boat stayed at the church but we three went in a canoe to the home of a faithful member - a widow - Dona Raimunda Rodrigues da Costa. In the same house, we learned, lives a married son with his wife and three small sons and an 18 year old son (her youngest of 9 children), unmarried. His name - Alan Rodrigues da Costa. This dear widow woman with a daughter that came from Manaus, Dona Sandra, member of the 14th of December Church, made us feel welcome and quite at home. That night I preached to more than 100 and there were two rededications. The Church was celebrating her 73rd anniversary having been

organized with the presence and as a result of the evangelization of Missionary E. A. Nelson on the 23rd of January of 1923. The next morning after preaching to an estimated 70, I baptized the 7 believers awaiting baptism. The lay pastor's name is Rildo Gentil França. It was a blessing to me to baptize in the same lake that years ago Brother Nelson baptized Brazilian believers. We arrived home on Tuesday morning, the 23rd.

Friday afternoon, the 26th, Marie and I left home again. This time in our car with Oseias (14th Church) as our driver. That night we caught a boat that took us to the New Jerusalem Baptist Church where I am the pastor. There we made visits (Oseias and I) Saturday morning and that night I preached to 44 and the same number on Sunday morning. We planned to hold services Sunday night in the home of one of the members. Lo, later on another invitation came from a family of non-members, so we began the first service at 18:00 and then the second service at 19:30.

Thursday, February 1st, again Marie and I and this time, Albano, left the city for the country. We arrived that night by boat at São José de Amajari. Friday night I preached to 43 at the Mission - Saturday night to 35 - Sunday morning (good news again), in spite of the rain, we had 63 people present and 7 (all females) made a profession of faith. The youngest was 9 years old and the oldest 35. That night I preached to 76 people present. Two ladies made rededications.

Wednesday, the 7th, we received the sad notice that the 18 year old of Dona Raimunda (see above), Alan, died Sunday, the 4th. He died in his mother's arms as they were close to Nova Olinda after traveling some three hours in a canoe. He took sick some 24 hours before. Dona Raimunda came to Manaus after he was buried in a cemetery, Lake Sampaio. We visited here in the home of one of her daughters who lives close to the 14th Church. The boy, his mother told us, often declared during family devotions that he was a believer in the Lord.

Last Sunday I preached at both services at the 29th of March Baptist Mission, Manaus. 31 were present Sunday morning and 16 at night.

We thank you, all of you dear folks of the Father, dear daughters and sons of the Son, for your prayers and gifts and offerings for us given through Baptist Faith Missions. Let us all remember the hymn: "We'll work until Jesus comes, and we'll be gathered home." Pray for us, we pray.

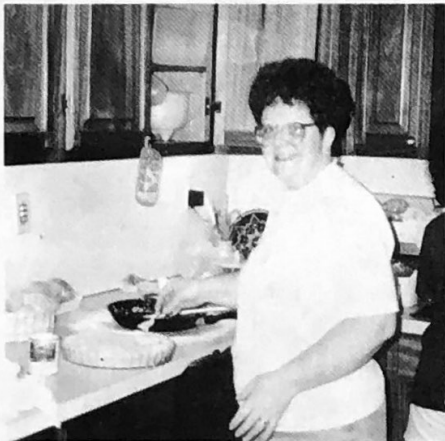
were children. We pray that many of these young people will see their need for Christ as their Savior and trust Him.
