If we are obedient to the conditions of His word, and pray believing, God will bless us and perform miracles in and through our lives according to His will.

Pam and I are very thankful for the "miracles" that our Lord has worked in and through our lives. We praise the Lord for the opportunity to be used in His service. Our prayer is that we will do our best to labor for Him wherever He should call us. We do count it a great honor to be called as missionaries to serve in Kenya, East Africa. Charles Surgeon, that great preacher in England in the past century, said, "If God has called you to be a missionary, why stoop to be a king?" So we are thankful to our home church for sending us out to serve in this high calling as missionaries working with B.F.M.

We thank the Lord for the many seemingly small "miracles" He has done in our lives. God continues to give us safety in our travels as we share our ministry from church to church. Recently, we have slowed up our traveling because of being very busy packing our things, and doing a lot of paperwork in preparation to leave for the field in July.

However, we did participate in one

mission conference in a church near our home. We are thankful to pastor Doug McComas and the good people of Winfield Baptist Church for their desire to assist in our regular monthly support.

There is a lot to do in preparing to go out to the field. This past week, we went to our local public health department and got four vaccination shots - two in each arm. I won't go into further detail, except to say that we had sore arms after that experience for a few days.

In our last letter, we asked you to pray for Pam's eye problem. The Lord is working, because she has seen some improvement and this has been encouraging to us. But please continue to pray for complete recovery of her eye problems before we leave.

So far, we have about one-third of what we need to purchase a reliable 4-wheel drive vehicle for our ministry. The roads in Kenya are not very good, so it is very important to get a rugged vehicle that will hold up to the challenges of "turbulent roads". We are praying that God will burden several churches or individuals to help us with this need.

Also, please pray for Pam and I, that God will continue to use us as we go out to our place of service. Our prayer is that the Lord will use us to reach the hearts of many of the people of Africa with the wonderful, good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

May the Lord perform "miracles" in your life and ministry according to your faithfulness in prayer.

Baptist Faith Missions is one of the finest missions to work with. We thank God for the generous service of each

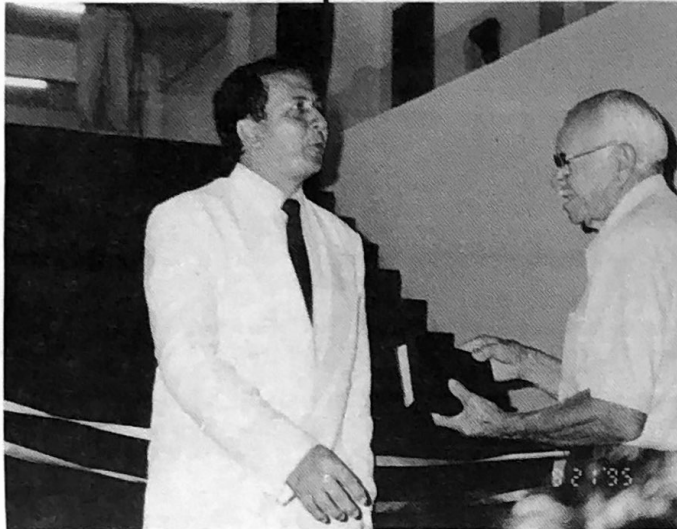


Paul and Wanda Hatcher present at the inauguration of the new Chapada Baptist Church Building.

MISSION STUDY - by John Hatcher**The Influence of the Missionary Family**

Timothy was exhorted to be an example to believers. This is certainly the exhortation for every servant of God. We are to be an example unto believers. "Husbands, love your wives" is to be taught to the people by the practice of such in the life of the servant. "Wives, obey your husbands, for this is right in the Lord" is a truth that can best be taught by a faithful wife. "Fathers, provoke not your children to wrath", "Children, honor thy father and mother" and "given to hospitality" are spiritual lessons and truths that must be taught by the illustrated sermons of the lives of the preacher and family.

Attending Services

The scriptures teach that we should not forsake the assembling of ourselves together as the manner of some is: but exhorting one another: and so much the more as we see the day approaching. (Hebrews 10:24) In many lands this is interpreted, at least by practice, that the man of the house should always go to church, but the wife and most of the children only if it is rather convenient. This is an outgrowth of paganism which considers the family and wife of the man as really unimportant. In most countries the largest market day is Sunday. In many places it is the only day of the week that meat can be bought. It is the wife's job to go to market and buy the food on Sunday morning. Lack of refrigeration gives rise to problems that Americans have long forgotten. The man of the house expects a big meal on Sunday. The result is that the wife and most of the children will stay home on the Lord's Day morning in service to the god, Belly. Some missionaries' families

have made the mistake of falling into the same practice. With lack of transportation and small children who have to be carried, the temptation is great to neglect "the assembling together." This is where the example of a faithful family can surely inspire or shame others to be faithful in this respect.

Your way of life in the homes will be very different from the people you will serve in most foreign countries. For instance, in most countries all members of the family do not eat at the same time. The men eat first, then the children and lastly, the mothers and women. There are many reasons for this. Most of the families are large. The families are poor and usually will not possess enough plates to go around to all the family at one time. Food is scarce and the father is respected because he has to work the hardest physically. So do not insist that all sit down and eat when you go to their homes. They will watch how you speak to your children and to your wife. They will especially watch how you treat and speak to any native that happens to work in your native.

The discipline of children in most countries is different from the American way of life. Although the matter of home discipline in America seems to be waning, it is still more strict than in pagan countries. Here the missionary has an excellent opportunity to be an example to believers.

When you are more or less established in a new place, the people will look to you for help of every nature. This is especially true of the saved people. When they are about to buy something, they will seek your advice. They will think that you have been educated in every field of education. They will come to a faithful servant of God for the same reason that men came to the Master.

Some will want free handouts. Some search for health and physical needs. Others want to gain prestige. But many will come because you brought the message of Christ, the means of their salvation, and so they respect you and have great faith in you as God's servant. Be careful that you never betray that trust.

Watch Your Money!

Perhaps the common thought of every person in a foreign country is that every American is very, very rich. This idea has been spread by the American movie industry and tourists. The truth is, however, Americans are rich in comparison to the standards of ninety percent of the world. No missionary has escaped the problem of people who want to borrow money. DO NOT LOAN! If you loan to one person, the word will get around and you will soon be very unhappy in the situation. You will find yourself resenting all the people. If you loan to one and not to another, you are in hot water. When people are in need for medicine or food and you want to help, buy the food and medicine and give it, but do not give money.

Reactions of the People

To the family that really serves the people, for the glory of God, will come great blessings from the reaction of the people. Those who are saved will love you. As they grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord, they will love you deeply. Remember, they are poor and most have only enough for an existence.

A "ten cent" expression of their love may be equal to a ten dollar one on our part. In Faro, an old man wanted a Bible

and had no money. I gave him one. (Usually it is a bad practice to give free Bibles or books. It is better to sell cheap than to give.) The old man did not have any money, but he wanted to show his appreciation. The next evening when he came to service he had a chicken under his arm. I offered to pay for it, but it was not for sale. It was a gift. Many of the people who have fruit trees in their yard will bring a small basket to us when the fruit is gathered. Others from the interior will bring something to show appreciation. Never, never do anything to give the idea that you do not appreciate their tokens.

Family influence is important not only from a christian viewpoint but also in view of the fact that communism and catholicism is constantly making its bid. Only light will dispel darkness. "Let your light so shine." Just after a communist leader came into town in Manaus for a political campaign, there was painted, by night, in large red letters on our front wall, the following: DOWN WITH AMERICAN IMPERIALISTS. Remember that the Master said, "I came not to be ministered unto but to minister. GO THOU AND DO LIKE WISE."

Exciting Trip to Porto Walter . . . National Worker Hard at Work . . . Satan is Alive and Active . . .

Dear Brethren:

Last month at this time I was way up the Juruá River at Porto Walter. This is one of the villages that we have a full time missionary, Brother Mário and his family. They have been there for less than 2 years, but have done a really great job. My partner on this trip was a young man (very young, 9 years old) from our church, named Maicom. He is a very serious Christian who witnesses always and efficiently. We went in a small aluminum boat with a 15 HP outboard motor. This motor, by the way, was provided for us in 1985 by the Elliott Baptist Church, of Elliott, Mississippi. Thanks again. It is getting pretty old, but it gets us around. The river had dropped a lot and it was not possible to use the bigger boat. It took us 5-1/2 hours of hot sun and cold rain storms.

The town of Porto Walter was closed to the gospel for years. The Catholic church has had an iron grip for years. The first missionary here, Brother Joe Brandon (founder of First Baptist Church), tried to land there many years ago. The priest sent a mob to the river bank armed with shotguns and machetes to make sure that the small group of Baptist missionaries didn't even get off of the boat. Later a small church was born just up river at a place called Campo de Santana. For a

long time I visited that little church and to get there I had to pass by that other large town with the big Catholic church sitting high on a hill overlooking the town and river. Hundreds of souls were held captive for years. In the meantime, the little village up river died and as the people moved away so did the little church. Only a handful of people live there today.

The visit was exciting. Since we still haven't put up our church building, week day and night services are held open air at different locations. Sunday morning is dedicated to teaching at the parsonage. Our first service had an attendance of over 80 people. One woman was saved. Strange as it may seem, this lady came from up river, from Campo de Santana. She and another lady heard I was going to be there and got in a canoe with their babies and came down river for the weekend. The Sunday morning service saw all 32 new believers present. Yes, I said 32. This young congregation already has a large group of adults and children, with a smattering of young people.

Two different groups of charismatics started works at Porto Walter. One has already failed and the other, although a little older than our work, has less than 10 people in attendance. Meanwhile the Catholic convent has only a tiny group of girls, the seminary has closed and they do not even have a priest living there anymore! Last year a young, popular

socialist priest got fresh with a young girl. Two women came into his quarters and murdered him. The older priest packed up and moved out. The pentecostal church that failed was because of the pastor falling into adultery. While all this was going on, our missionary, with a wonderful personal testimony, has been winning souls. What a victory!

All is well at church here in town too. We had 7 saved 3 Sundays back, 9 the next and 2 more women last Sunday. I don't remember exactly how many were saved the weekend I was at Porto Walter.

Four of our missionaries have returned to the Juruá Mirim River to saw lumber for our first building on that river. They also held services with over 500 people during

the 15 days and 38 people were saved.

Remember that I am reporting to you the good stuff. Don't forget that we have a constant battle with problems and Satan's attacks. In fact, right now our church is struggling with some huge problems and battles. I personally am under fire from all sides. I try to keep my reports focused on the brighter things and blessings, but please don't forget to pray for us as we deal with the hard realities of serving our Lord.

Thanks for all your prayers and support. God bless.

Dear Brethren:

During this Mission Sheet Month (April 20-May 15), I preached some 16 times in three different churches and three different missions and in one home. Besides the sermons, on Saturday afternoon, April 27, I attended a service at the Monte Horebe IV Baptist Mission. I served on the council and was the examiner of the 26 members asking to be organized into a church. The following Wednesday night the Missions became the "Go" Baptist Church.

Saturday night, April 20, I preached to the 20 people present at a mission of the Chapada Baptist Church. The name of the mission is the "Heavenly Brightness" Baptist Mission. Paulo Moises is the pastor. Sunday morning, April 21, and again at both services on Sunday, April 28 and May 23 and all three Wednesday nights, I preached at the 29th of March Baptist Mission. Ediberto Ribeiro da Silva and I share the pulpit there and at the New Jerusalem Baptist Church in the interior. The smallest attendance at the mission was 13 and the largest was 51. Sunday night, April 21, I preached to 70 at the Novo Amanhecer Baptist Church where João Nonato is the pastor.

Saturday morning, May 4 - "Our boat is very full of people and baggage." However, the closer we got to our destination - the New Jerusalem Baptist Church, Paraná da Eva - the emptier the boat became. At 16:00 Marie and I and Albano

arrived safe and sound. That night I preached to 56, Sunday morning to 87 and Sunday night to 55.

Thursday night, May 9 - In response to the request of a faithful couple, Manuel and Marina Bezerra, we held services in the open air at the side of Bro. Manuel's house in a new suburb of Manaus. The last mile of the way was a muddy road full of ruts. The last 100 yards we walked in the slippery mud down a hill. Down in a valley we held the service. The attendance was 28 people and one dog that didn't disturb us. I believe that night we began a new mission. Bro. Manuel with 6 others from there attended the Sunday morning service at the 29th of March Mission. He was to hold services there Sunday night. "Behold I have set before you an open door." Help us to build a small building on the small lot where the service was held in the new suburb - Nossa Senhora da Conceição. Mark your offering for "New Works" for an old couple of missionaries - Harold and Marie.

Last Saturday night I preached at the Celestial Baptist Church, Nova Floresta suburb to an estimated 100. Gilmar Moraes is the pastor.

Thus we have shared with you saints of the Saviour about our 16 sermons preached during this Mission Sheet month here in the land of eternal summer. Pray for us and accept our thanks for your prayers and praise on our behalf. "God be with you 'til we meet again."

Dear Brethren,

In Hebrews 10:25, we are told to forsake not the assembling of ourselves together, and so much the more as we see the day approaching. Surely the day must be approaching! As we see on every hand violence, immorality, lukewarmness among God's own people and many other things. We don't have too much time left before this age of grace will be history. This is a sobering thought. It also should make us remember that we as the Lord's ambassadors must be busy proclaiming the gospel.

I believe I mentioned in the last letter that the church at the Chacara dos Pinheiros celebrated their 5th anniversary. When we started this work I wondered if it would ever really develop. Now I wonder at the way the Lord has blessed! They have their own pastor, they have about 50 in attendance with 30 members, and they are self supporting although the pastor has to work to provide for his family. He has really matured during these last 4 years. All of this has been made possible by your faithful support.

I made a quick trip to the church at Novo Diamantino this month. The young preacher there is discouraged and plans

to leave there the end of the year. We tried to encourage him and his wife. They have been faithful for the past 3 years but seem not to have a real vision for the work. We pray that the Lord will provide in this situation.

Our church here at Altos do Coxipo is growing in grace and a little bit in number. This month a young girl about 16 years old was saved on Sunday night. A young married lady whose husband is a member is talking about submitting to Scriptural Baptism. She was immersed in another kind of church and did not agree with our position on this until now. There aren't many Baptists who hold the line on this today here in Brazil.

I will be coming to the U.S.A. on August 17th to stay until January 8th. I would like to visit churches in the Ky-Tenn-Ind. area in September, in the Ohio-W.Va. area in October, in the Mich-Ohio area in November. I am flexible on this but our time will be limited.
