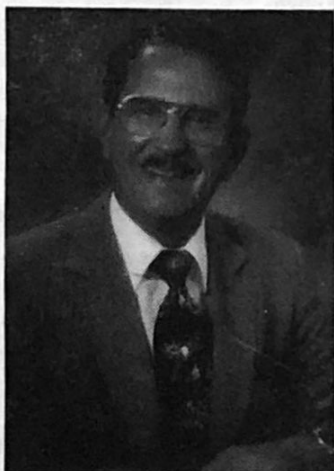

Brother Mike Writes Of A Tragedy and A Miracle . . .

Dear Brethren,

It is a little difficult to decide what news to tell you about. There is plenty of good news from the work, but we also had a near tragedy in the family. I suppose that it might be the best to share the latter.

One of my adopted sons, Carlos, has been in training over the past couple of years to become a pilot. He had finished his training and started flying about 2 months ago. He has been in the right seat (co-pilot) of a twin engine turbine air freight plane. He broke in at a very young age and has been having the time of his life. He is now 22.

Unfortunately these freight lines are not the safest things in the world. They convert passenger planes to cargo, but then don't use cargo nets and, what's worse, overload the planes. They also fly long hours and are careless with the maintenance. The pilots work as much as 16 hours a day, which is also dangerous. The whole idea is to make as much money as possible.

He was coming in on the last flight of the day, 10:30 P.M., in the middle of a rain storm, when things started to go sour. Two of the four air traffic controllers are members of our church. One of these, Osvaldo was on duty that night. All radio contact was normal through the report of the downwind leg, then silence. A small plane was sent out immediately to start the search. In the mean while, the army and fire department started a ground search. All of them gave up after a short search, concluding that there were no survivors.

I was in Manaus on business and Bev decided not to call me until she had some kind of news. She knew that all the flights this time of year are booked up and that there would be no way for me to get back here to help. Once again she showed her wisdom. The family here went through the anguish of the unknown and the phone ringing every 5 minutes.

When the landing gear came down that night something went very wrong. The plane started to drop off to one side and lose thrust. The pilot told Carlos to put in full flaps to try and come down as slowly as possible and said, "We are going to die!" The plane was far too heavy, no altitude to play with, raining and dark. They just did all they could do, which was to come down as slowly as possible and level.

Well the Lord was there for Carlos. They came down between hills in a small river. The river bed was heavy jungle and they took out a bunch of big trees. The plane came to rest in the river. The fuselage finally stopped in the fork of a huge tree. There was 10 feet of water

below them at the time. The river was coming up though because of the rain. The cargo came crashing through the wall from behind and took out the front of the plane. Carlos was pinned in his seat with cargo holding down his head and his right leg pinned underneath his seat. The water was waste deep when they came to a stop. It came all the way up to his nose, then the Lord said, "That's far enough." He spent 9 hours in that position. He had some bad cuts on his right arm and was bleeding. There are crocodiles and piranha in the river, but God kept them away. The pilot was dead at his side and help did not come until the next morning. A bunch of our church members were the first to arrive there to rescue him.

Other than cuts, bruises, and a fractured cheek bone, he is recovering. He was sent to Rio Branco to have his cheek repaired. We are expecting him back in today to spend the new year with us.

Well the plane is completely under water now, that is, what is left of it. It is a miracle that Carlos survived. We are very grateful to our great God who spared his life. Thank God with us, too, please.

We are getting anxious to go back to our people there. We are enjoying God's people here too. We were with the Bible B.C. in Harrisburg, Ill; Thompson Rd. B.C. of Lexington, Ky; Faith B.C. of Versailles, Ky; Bible B.C. of Plant City, Fla.; Jordan B.C. of Sanford, Fla.; and the Colonial Hills B.C. in the Atlanta, Ga. area. I'm getting ready to leave for the Winter Conference in Gotha, Fla., at the Park Ridge Bapt. Chr. Thanks to all for your faithful support.

Dear Friends,

Our year has already begun with a quick start. Here is a brief update of our ministry. We are now in the senior class of language school, and are working hard to finish our studies by February 20th. Please pray for us as we take our oral and written final exams.

This past month, the language school required us to take a field trip to another part of Kenya, for the purpose of practicing Swahili. We chose to go to a small village called Taru. It is one hour north of Mombasa, which is Kenya's second largest city. It is located on the coast of the Indian Ocean.

Since we didn't have our own vehicle, we traveled by African bus, and visited with an African pastor friend. Because their house was small, we stayed in an African hotel. This hotel would not rate as a "5-star hotel!" To be honest, it wouldn't even rate as a "half-star hotel!" Our room had only one window, a table, two chairs and a small bed. Also, there was

no electricity, running water, or adequate ventilation in this hot tropical climate. There was only one toilet for everyone to share. This toilet was just a hole in the floor, and at night, it was infested with roaches. It was more like a prison cell than a hotel room, but in reality, this is what conditions are like for the average Kenyan.

We had the opportunity to eat African food, which consisted primarily of fruit, vegetables, bread and tea. Our pastor friend, Ezekiel Ndoro, took us around to many African homes to meet people on visitation.

That Sunday, Pam and I had the opportunity to minister in Pastor Ezekiel's church. Pam taught Sunday School and I preached, all in Swahili, for the first time. We were both brief as our knowledge of the Swahili language is still limited.

We left the following day to return to language school by bus. Prior to leaving, Pam's eye problem flared up again, and she lost her balance and fell across the hotel toilet and hurt her thumb. At the end of our 8 hour bus trip, we arrived back in the capitol city of Nairobi. As Pam was leaving the bus, she misjudged the steps and fell down on her back. Praise the Lord, she didn't hit her head or break any bones. Please pray for Pam as she heals from her sores and bruises

We thank the Lord for the many things He taught us, and for His protection during this trip. We understand much better now how Africans live, and we are more aware of God's faithfulness during times of testing.

In closing, we would like to thank you for your prayers and support of this ministry. We praise the Lord that He has provided funds for us to order a good used 4-wheel drive vehicle for the ministry here. Please pray that this vehicle will come into the country without theft or damage, and that we will not have to pay a high import tax.

Well enough for now. May our Lord's richest blessings be upon you.

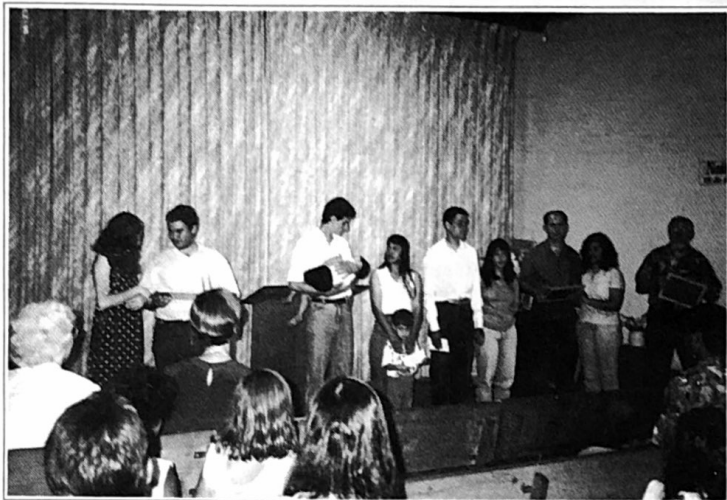


Dear Friends,

"Senhora Alta, do not ever invite me to your services nor talk to me about Jesus. I am a Buddhist and do not pretend to leave my religion. They healed my son and we are prospering." Last night the lady who said this two years ago came to services with her two grandchildren, nine and twelve. They were the only ones who came. The lights had been off for an hour. It was raining. Still they came. About a month ago her husband left her. He is retired with a good income. He advised her she would have to fight hard in the courts to get anything. Her Buddhist friends refused her help in a very needy moment. Her granddaughter told her, "There is one person you can trust. You can trust senhor John and done Alta."

"True," she replied, "go and get senhor John." I was just getting home from Cornelio. She saw my car and came running. I told her to go home and I would get a taxi to take her grandmother to the hospital. In a few minutes I helped her get into the car and she was taken to the hospital.

She has found that her first religion left her without hope. Now she has discovered that Buddhism had left her without hope.

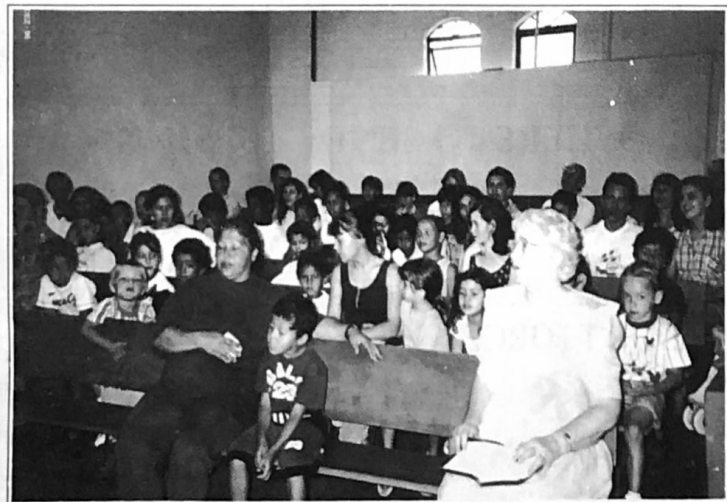
The two grandchildren have attended our Bible Hour for several years and both have trusted Jesus as Saviour. In her despair, she came to services while David and Pennie were here in December. She has decided to trust Christ and she is being put to the test. She asked me if she should get a lawyer and take her husband to court. "No, I do not think you should. Trust Jesus; he will never leave you nor forsake you and that is enough." But she was seriously thinking of going to law. God intervened and her husband appeared last week to say that he would not come home to live but she would get her part of his salary each month. She is reading the Bible each day with her granddaughters. Everything about her has changed. She has a long way to go but she is on the right road.

This morning Alta and I went to the funeral of Maria, the mother of a young man in our church. About a year ago some students of the Seminary went to her house and told her and her husband about Jesus. Both made professions of faith. In the month of December she was taken to the intensive care unit with kidney failure. I went to visit her and after much insistence was permitted to see her.

I asked her about her profession of faith. She was embarrassed because she had not been obedient to Christ. I explained that Jesus had not abandoned her and read Scriptures showing the promises of God. She understood and she was changed in a moment. Her face radiated joy, she wanted to talk about spiritual things. Maria never left the hospital. She got better and was able to be visited by her family. Her joy in Christ continued and she recommended her children to serve Jesus. Yesterday, at six o'clock in the morning, she went to be with the Lord. At seven-thirty this morning I preached her funeral and at eight o'clock her body was deposited in the cemetery. Her husband shows no signs of being saved. Her children who are all grown and most of them married are not saved with the exception of the one who is a member of our church. Pray for this family, or families, that we may reach them with the Gospel while their hearts are tender.

Work in the missions is going well. Sunday night two persons from the Santa Terezinha Mission are to be baptized. PRAY FOR US.

First Letter of 1997 . . . Many Souls Saved . . . Forty-Second Wedding Anniversary . . . Man Murdered . . .

Dear Brethren:

Today is January 17, 1997. Thus we are writing the first Mission Sheet letter of the new year. We appreciate the some thirty of you in the U. S. A. that sent us a X-mas card. We thank you and love you in the Lord. "We know that we have passed from death unto life because we love the brethren. He that loveth not remaineth in death." (1 John 3:14).

The first sermon that I preached this "Mission Sheet Month" (Dec. 19), was at the "Vessel of Blessing" Baptist Mission. It was a damp night and we only had 8 present. The people in their hill side shacks find it difficult to walk in the mud. The next time I preached there it wasn't such a rainy or damp night and we had 60 (sixty) people present to hear my message and everyone was served food and drinks afterwards. It was the 26th of December. On the 2nd of January, 25 were present and two married ladies asked for baptism.

On the 5th of January, 18 were present with one profession of faith and one rededication. Last night Ediberto and I walked in the mud down a slick hill to Brother Manuel's house (our lay leader of the Mission) and we held an early service with 8 present. It had been a rainy afternoon. I preached about the same number of sermons with about the same attendance at the 29th of March Baptist Mission.

At noon on the 20th of Dec., Marie and I left Manaus on the "R. B. Lima" boat. We arrived at 22:30 at São José de Amajari. Saturday night I performed the wedding ceremony for Joedisen Portela Tuanama, 19 and Marcia da Silva Tuanama, 16. Sunday I preached at both services.



Carolyn Sue Porataheo (my niece) and Marie in the home (Paraña da Eva) of Evandro & Elinete & Misael & Priscila. Evandro & Elinete are faithful members of the New Jerusalem Baptist Church.

At the first service we had 36 present with six decisions. After the early night service we flagged down the "Comandante Paiva II" bound for Manaus. It was a big boat but it was very crowded.

On the night of the 24th and the 31st Marie and I attended the special services at the 14th of December Baptist Church where we are members and where our son, Asa Mark, is the pastor. On the 27th of December Marie and I celebrated our 42nd Wedding Anniversary by attending the wedding of a young preacher. On the night of the 28th we attended the 50th Wedding anniversary of "Josias and Olivia." It was different from any that we had ever attended. Dear Brother Josias Evangelista, faithful follower of the Father, is suffering from a disease that has left him bed fast and unable to talk. He heard the service from his bed. Brother Josias and Dona Olivia are the parents of 17 living children and all 17 (10 sons and 7

daughters) were present. I was called upon to offer the final prayer. I prayed that the family circle would be unbroken in the "sweet by and by" because not all of the 17 are saved.

During 1996, I preached 208 sermons. The visible results were 24 professions of faith, 24 other decisions, and 17 baptisms.

On the 7th of January, Marie and I left Manaus to go back to Borba - an interior town of the Amazonas with a population of perhaps six thousand. We arrived the next afternoon at around 15:30. We stayed in the home of the lay leader (Mauro Souza Gomes - 34 years old who hopes to be ordained soon) of the Ebenezer Baptist Mission. He, with his wife, Luzia, were very kind to us during the 5 nights we were in their home and helping them in the labors for the Lord. The night attendance was small. We preached to more sinners in their homes than in the services.

The morning after we arrived, Brother Mouro and I walked (we walked morning, noon and night) to another division of the town. On the 31st of March, 1996, on our visit in Borba, we held a service in the home of an elderly man by the name of Manuel de Jesus. A nephew of his and a neighbor attended the service. Not a one of the three made a profession of faith. Many times since I prayed for the three to believe. To our sorrow and shock we learned that
