
We hope you are all doing well and enjoying the blessings of the Lord. The Lord has certainly been blessing us, and we are so thankful to Him.



Many Students Saved and Sharing the Gospel ... Gang Leader Saved . . . By Paul Hatcher





Many Trips Made On The River... A Month Of Weddings... Pray For A Young Boy Needing Surgery...

Dear Brethren:

Yesterday and today, February 20th, I have reviewed the happenings of the days since January 19th.

During this "Mission Sheet Month" I preached 21 times. On more than one Sunday and each Wednesday night I preached at the 29th of March Baptist Mission-a total of 8 sermons. Four sermons were preached at the

Sáo José de Amatari Baptist Mission where João Portela Tuanama is the lay pastor. Marie, (my wife), and I arrived there by boat (an 8 hour trip down the river from Manaus) Thursday night, January 30th. The next day we celebrated the 13th birthday of Keliane Moreira da

Silva. A few hours after her birthday dinner we walked to the river where she and Jaciane Fernandes Araujo, 12, and Dona Raimunda Viana Vieira, 52, were baptized by me. "Buried with Him in baptism, raised to walk in newness of life." That night I preached to 40. Saturday night 61 and then Sunday morning 40 and Sunday afternoon 20. There were some 6 rededications in the Sunday services.

And now a word about the weddings-four of them! On the 19th of January at the 29th of March Mission, I performed the wedding of two believers from the interior, Januauca. On the 24th of January another couple from Januauca were united by me in matrimony at the 14th of December Baptist Church. On the 11th of February at our home another wedding-a widower, Ednildo Dantas Atem, 37 and Silvane Ferreira da Silva, 20, single. Two days later at the Vessel of Blessing Mission, 51 people present, Antonio Rocha da Cruz and Maria Julia Goocalves, 31 and 30, were united in marriage by me. The three year old son of the newlyweds is needing an operation that the doctors here in Manaus have refused to perform. In November of last year a doctor from Alabama, Dr. Goode, examined the child and told us that he would arrange for the boy to be operated on in the U.S.A. He promised to pay the plane fare, etc. Pray that we will be able to obtain permission from the Federal Police for the mother and son and infant daughter, Moises and Miriā, to make the trip and that the operation will be successful. An American missionary, Mrs. Doris Jean Bellington, will accompany them.

On the 25th of January I preached at the 23rd of July Baptist Church. At the request of the pastor, João Bosco Brasil de Sousa, I preached on the Second Coming of the Lord. An estimated thirty people were present.

On Sunday morning, February 9th, I preached in the absence of the pastor, Asa Mark Bratcher, who was traveling, to the 222 people present. The attendance was down due to "carnaval" when many believers leave the city.

One more trip and we'll call it quits. Marie and I with a young man. Edson, from the 14th of December Baptist Church, left Manaus on the "Cicade of Coari" boat at 15:45 on the 14th of this month and 23 hours later we arrived in Coari. There at the Faith Baptist Church I preached to 41 people present Saturday night and 25 Sunday morning and 55 Sunday night. Pray for the health and safety of the pastor, Atadeu Ribeiro dos Santos. I saw more young men drinking strong drink there than in any of the other towns and cities of the interior where we have visited and preached.

We once again have shared with you the blessings that the Bratchers (Harold and Marie) have received here in "Brasil." We thank you dear saints of the Saviour for your prayers and your offerings to Baptist Faith Missions. Oh, folks of the Father, continue to give to the Regular Fund especially. We will continue to trust the Lord and through our monthly Mission Sheet letter, tell the people of the Lord about our needs. We need the prayers of those that we love in the Lord and that love us in the Lord. Pray for us.

I am not the man I was when I wrote you the last time. On the 5th of February Alta and I drove to the Cancer hospital in Jau, about 500 miles round trip to have a place on my left ear examined. We arrived the afternoon before the appointment and I went to the hospital to see where I should be the next morning. The girl at the office said, "The doctor can



see you today if you would like." He did and the next day at eleven in the morning he was hacking away at my ear. It was a piece of pie. That is, he cut out a wedged shaped piece of my ear about one-half of an inch wide and three quarters of an inch long then pulled the top and the bottom of the ear together and sewed it up. The ear has healed well and I am sure the skin cancer will not be missed.

New Work in Nova Fatima - The work is going well. Sunday before last in all of our works there was a total attendance of 200. A new work has been started in the city of Nova Fatima, 20 miles from Cornelio. We began with a six day evangelistic campaign. We are looking at property and hope to buy soon.

Primavera - Tonight Valdir has the weekly service in Primavera. These services have been held in a home. Last week he was advised of a property that is for sale. Hopefully, tonight we will be able to buy the property, the Lord willing.

Nine Persons Baptized - On the morning of February 23rd, I baptized three young people in the morning service. That same night I baptized six more young people.

We need your prayers; we need your financial help and we need some godly dedicated missionaries. There is much more to tell but I will save it for next letter.

The high point this month though was our annual mission conference. This year we brought Brothers Sulivan and Marcos from our church

in Rio Branco to share in the preaching. We also brought Brother Esli and family from Manaus to help with the special music. There was a good group of members from our church in Rio Branco for the 5 day meeting. Of course, we had many of our preachers and workers from the other sister churches, from near and far.

Some of the best news from this meeting was the ordination of my associate, Brother João Vicente. He has been working side by side with me for literally years, but had been hesitant about his ordination. The interrogation was quite thorough and he passed with flying colors. We also had some more folks saved, which is always good news, but is really great when it happens when you are working directly with your church on missionary zeal and vision.

Thaumaturgo since my visit there in May. José has managed to purchase a fixed frequency radio to communicate with the Missionary Aviation Fellowship base here in town. By doing this he is serving the community with communications that the local authorities have not provided. By being able to call the plane in for emergency flights he has saved lives. Brother Mario's report from Porto Walter was just as good. Besides more professions of faith he has won the confidence of the mayor and other city officials. In fact his testimony is so good that these people are backing away from the priests and listening to what Mario has to say. This is a great victory is the most Catholic village on the Juruā River. We heard reports from some 20 other preachers and had over 40 preachers and lay workers present for these meetings.

Our church is trying to set the pace for missionary zeal and vision in this part of the state. Fortunately it is spilling over to other parts of the state and country.
