## Move To New House ... Report On Pam's Eyes ... Preach A Wedding ...

Harbari Rafiki Zetu (Swahili for "Dear Friends"),

Greetings in the matchless name of our living, loving, great and gracious Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ! We hope today finds you well and enjoying Him.

Pam and I wanted to write to let you know that we have finally moved to our place of ministry in Western Kenya. I am typing this letter from Kitale. We have been very busy for the past month trying to get into our new home. We wanted you to know our new address, so we can better keep in touch with one another.

The Lord has blessed us with a nice house (it is small, but suitable). We are thankful for a good Christian Kenyan landlord. There are also several other missionaries in Kitale who live there, but minister in other areas. We fellowship and help one another.

I must say that Pam is not with me now, because I left her with friends in Nairobi, so that she could go for a series of 18 treatments to help with her eye problem. This past month Pam saw 4 different doctors. She had a blood test and a 'CAT' Scan done. The neurologist said the tests were 'normal'. Praise the Lord! But from the doctor's examination of Pam's eye problem, he has decided that she has blepharospasm- a condition in which the eye droops because of spasms, which puts pressure on the cornea, thus distorting her vision. We saw 3 other eye specialists and they all confirmed the diagnosis of blepharospasm. There is no cure, but temporary relief can be obtained by injecting botulinum toxin into the eyelid to help her eyelid to stay open. We found out that the botulinum toxin is not available in Kenya, and if it were, there is no one who has the expertise to do these special injections. They said that Pam may have to go to England or back to the States to get this done. Pam & I decided to try another doctor that was recommended to us who has another method of treatment. Please pray for Pam's eye problem as she goes through this series of treatment. Pray especially, that the Lord would give us wisdom in dealing with this problem, that has been going on now for the past 15 months.

We recently went to the wedding of one of the pastors in our fellowship. They asked me to preach in the wedding. It was a very simple wedding, because they are so poor. There were no decorations, flowers, wedding cake, or exchanging of rings (things we are accustomed to in the States). But they are a very sweet couple who really love the Lord. Please pray for Pastor David Wekesa and his new wife, Mary, as they begin their life together.

We plan to minister in every one of our churches in the month of May. Two of our six churches are in the neighboring country of Uganda. Pray that the Lord will bless in all the services and use us to glorify Him.

You may be wondering how we are going to get to all these places? Well, we still do not have our vehicle because of problems with our shipper. But our agent here has loaned us a car to use until our vehicle comes at the end of the month, Lord willing. It has been nice not to have to use African transportation, which can be dangerous! It is always an 'event' to ride on an African matatu! Please come and see us and we will let you ride on an African matatu! You will never forget the experience! Most of these vehicles are ready for the junk yard, but for some reason they are still able to run! Pam & I rode on these vehicles for a good part of the past 9 months. So we do thank the Lord for at least this borrowed vehicle.

Many of you have prayed concerning the drought in Kenya. The Lord heard, and it has rained a lot lately! Bwana asifiwe (Praise the Lord)!

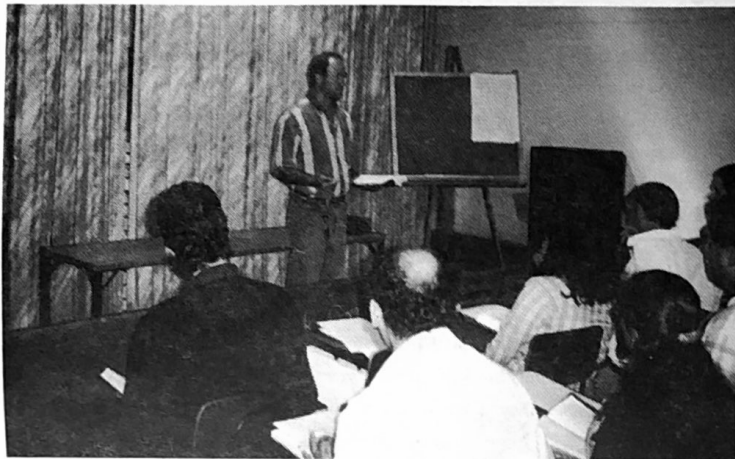

Saturday night I received some wonderful news! During a period of about three years I was trying to disciple a group of "headbangers." These were teenagers who just loved Heavy Metal music, a version of Rock. They were saved and listened to Christian Heavy Metal which is called, "White Metal." 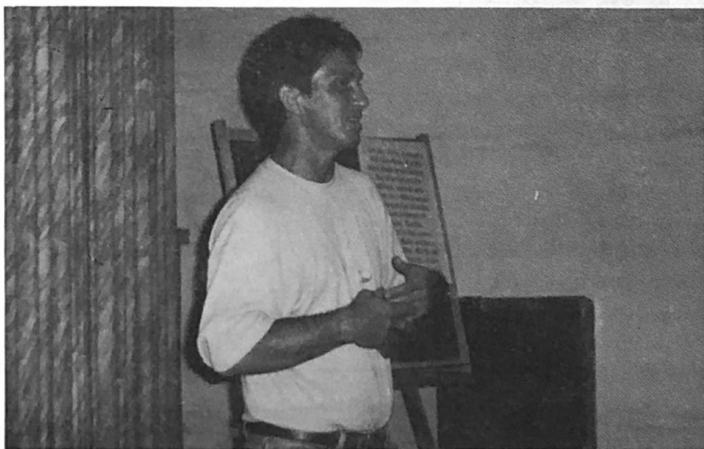
Brother Wacaser teaching at leadership seminar.

Also the local government is nearly always on the side of the natural mother even if she is totally unfit to care for the child. All this leaves Charlene a trifle apprehensive, which is understandable since it took 21 months to settle Jessie's adoption. For the time being we are praying for the Lord's guidance and waiting to see how the situation develops.

We thought that we already had a place of meeting, but found out that we would be sharing the same building with three Pentecostal churches that use it on different days of the week. Another month has gone by already. Certainly time flies! But the Lord's goodness is continuous. He is continuing to bless the work here in so many ways, especially at the home church, the 14th of December Baptist Church. Sunday was a most blessed day. There were 400 in Sunday School, and 430 at night. There were 6 professions of faith, and I baptized 18. We praise and thank the Lord for each and every blessing. He is so gracious and we are so undeserving! We have also received a good report this month from Evangelist João at Amatori. The congregation is growing and they are excited about building.

To go along with the blessings, there are always a few difficulties. One morning, while backing out of the garage and stopped, the Toyota was hit by a speeding bus whose driver was a little inebriated. The back door was smashed and the glass broken, but there was no damage to me or the girls, who were on their way to school. It will cost around \$2,000 to repair, as all parts have to be brought from the states or Panama.

Also this month, Manaus has suffered a daily electrical blackout. So our lights have been off every day up to three hours at a time. The classes at the Bible Institute and Bible College are progressing well despite the power shortage, and will be concluding the final week of June.

Last week, Marcia graduated from the 8th grade, and Lucy Marie from the 4th. Lucia is still teaching English at the Christian School close to our home. Once again, the Bratchers thank you for your prayers and support throughout the years!

Dear Brethren:

Last month I wrote "... this Mission Sheet month, March 20-April 17, has been an unusual month..." This month's Mission Sheet has been an unusual month. Four of the five Sundays we (Marie and I) spent here in Manaus. I preached at least one sermon during the four Sundays in the city at the 29th of March Baptist Mission. On two Thursdays I preached at the Vessel of Blessings Baptist Mission. On the last Thursday that I preached, there I performed the wedding ceremony for two couples of the Mission. Last Sunday night I once again preached at the Vessel. On Saturday and Sunday nights, April 26-27, I preached at the Elim Reoalar Baptist Church here in the city where José Morais Duarte is the Pastor. On Friday, May 2, Marie and I arrived by boat at Novo Remanso, too late to hold services.

Saturday - "Very early, while it was still dark, before dawn, I sought the Lord. 'Lord, Lord, have compassion on me, resolve my problems, I leave everything in thine hands.' That night I preached to some 45 people. Sunday morning and Sunday night I preached to less. Sunday night, one dear Brother whose wedding I performed some months ago, asked for Baptism. Saturday night, the 10th of this month, found us at the Gerizim Baptist Church where Bro. Eli is the Pastor at a special Stewardship Service. The next Saturday night, I

Dear Christian Friends,

Yesterday, marked fourteen years in Peru for my wife, Anita and myself. When we arrived on April 29, 1983, our daughter, Leah, was just five years old; she is now finishing her freshman year in college. Our son, Joshua, was only four when we arrived; he finishes his senior year of high school the end of June, and then off to college. The time has flown by rather quickly, but the Lord has been good, and gracious to us all these years. We still praise and glorify HIM for HIS grace. By HIS grace,

HE has used us to start three New Testament Baptist Churches, take a struggling Christian School and get it to economic independence with 880 students and to start a Baptist Bible Institute that is helping to equip seventy five men of God for the Gospel Ministry. Yes, truly the Lord is gracious to use someone like me in HIS great work.

We've seen a lot of changes over these past years both here in Peru, and back in the States as well. Here in Peru we've seen some radical political and economic upheavals. We've seen terrorist attacks, dead bodies in the streets, appalling injustice, and a few personal near death experiences due to sickness and accidents. In spite of all these things HIS work has continued on and grown, HE has always bestowed HIS great grace upon us.

In the States we've seen a lot of change over these past years. Our home church, the Jordan Missionary Baptist Church, of Sanford, Florida, has had three different pastors since we left in 1983. But through the years they've always encouraged us and supported us. It is a blessing of the Lord to have such a strong, caring, praying, and Bible believing church to always be there to support and encourage us. They have grown in numbers and in God's grace, but they have not changed their beliefs. They still believe and teach the authority of the local church and that the Bible is the inerrant inspired Word of God, and the "doctrines of Grace" (all five points), even as we do. We've seen some other Churches change their doctrinal positions and others seem to have lost their love for souls and missions and seem to be using their time and energy in fighting one another in an effort to prove who is the most doctrinally sound. The field is still "white unto harvest," but where are the reapers? Thousands are still dying every day without ever having heard the "gospel of God's grace."

But I thank God that the majority of the Lord's churches continue on in Christian love and truth. Their eyes are still focused on Jesus and they know that God is still on HIS throne and that HE never changes! They're still looking, anxiously, for Jesus to come again, even as we do. Anita and I still see a bright future for the Lord's work here in Peru. Our continuing prayer is that the Lord would raise up more workers and more and stronger supporters for the work.

We will be coming home the end of August for a six month furlough, from the first of September to the end of February. We are excited to have the opportunity to share with each of you what the Lord has done in the past few years and also our plans for the next few years. Pastors, we hope to encourage your churches to do even more for missions. Besides coming and sharing the work with you we are open to help in Mission seminars, evangelistic meetings and my wife Anita loves to work with the children and share with them about Peru and what it means to be a missionary. We are your servants. To help you is our desire.

We will be moving from the house we are presently renting to another temporary place for three months until coming home on furlough. Our e-mail address will be current but if you desire to communicate with us I suggest that you contact our Pastor, Bro. ## Good News From The River Work ... Blessings of First Baptist ... Only Heaven Could Be Better ...

Dear Brethren,

This has been a month of ups and downs. I will tell you about the "ups". The Lord has taken over the "downs", and you don't want to hear about those anyway!

Brother Raimundo Vieira has reported back after a 21 day trip to the Tejo River. There were some more folks saved and they finished the building at Maranguape. Actually he was to spend less time on this trip, but the rivers have gone down early this year, and he was trapped way upstream. He usually goes in a canoe when the river is low, but since he had to take a lot of tools and other supplies he was in a larger boat. He finally had to leave the big boat and come back downstream in a borrowed canoe. All is well though. His report was excellent.

Last week I was at Porto Walter to visit the mission, our missionary Mario and do some urgent jobs. The river being as low as it is I had to go in the lime aluminum canoe and small outboard. It took almost 5 hours to get there. The visit was great. There are now 46 believers. While there I put in the electrical in our new building. With the exception of Sunday morning they had been meeting in homes since there were still no lights for the evening services. I also cut the templates and made the first pew, so that Mario would know how to build the rest. He still has some lumber to saw and that which has been cut already still has to be planed. It is all paid for though and they should have their pews finished in a few more days.

The guys who take care of our mission at the penal colony reported 3 more saved. The attendance varies from 35 to 45. One man who was saved is in for selling drugs and was caught with 20 kilos. The other 2 are a couple. He is in prison and his wife attends the weekend services with him.

Yesterday was one of our best days at First Baptist Church this month. There were 8 professions of faith, 2 requests for baptism and 2 men came before the church confessing sin. My sermon was about the rapture and included the following items: a rod and reel, large magnet and over 20 assorted bolts and screws. Feel free to write or call and ask anything you'd like! One of the most rewarding things about preaching here is the freedom from formalities that are present in so many places. I thank God for planting me right here over 30 years ago. Other than heaven, I can't think of a better place to be.

May God bless all of you. Thank you for your constant prayer and financial support.

## Busy Working With Youth ... Over 1,000 In One Service ... A Wonderful Problem ... Youth Invited To Visit Brazil ...

Dear Friends,

Well, we're off and running! Last month, after four months of "raining" our adult leadership team started working with the teens and things have been unbelievable. It started with camp on the 8th of February; the leaders helped organize and run the activities and games, they served as counselors in the cabins, cooked and served the food, and even had time to enjoy themselves while they were at it. We got back from camp on a Wednesday and had our first youth night, "Explosao Jovem", on the following Saturday.

That first week we had 99 teens, our average crowd for a Saturday night; the next week we had over 200 teens; the following Saturday there were 230; then 280. Then we planned a 'gincana' or contest, in which the contestants had a list of 37 unusual items to bring for points, as well as points for each visitor they could bring. Naturally the points for the visitors were greater than the points for the objects and we had 6 teams of 15 teens each competing to see who could bring the most visitors. A few teams even made up small invitations and went down town to the plaza and spent hours inviting every teen who passed by to come to our youth night. Well, all their hard work paid off. Last Saturday we had over 1000 teenagers at our youth night! It was unbelievable! Every pew was full, they were standing in the aisles, they were packed in the back and in the foyers, and there were still well over 100 teens outside who couldn't even get into the church. One team alone brought over 175 first time visitors. What a night! "Explosao Jovem" is definitely exploding!

At the same time all this was going on we were taking our praise team (more on them next time) to the Primeira Igreja Batista in Assis Brasil for youth night on Monday. We have been averaging over 70 teens in attendance every week and have had as many as 118. The associate pastor of this church, who is also a part of my adult leadership team, was a little disappointed that we have only been having the 70 teens coming; but I reminded him that there are only a little over 300 teens in the town of Assis Brasil so we have been ministering to almost 1/4 of the teenage population. How would you like to have 1/4 of the teenagers in your town attending youth night?

But the best news of all is that we have had 40 teens make professions of faith since we started in February. Many of these young people had never been to our church before, but have been coming to our new Saturday night youth program. Also, most of them are attending the other church services as well. Our next project is to start a new convert's class so that we can begin to disciple these new Christians.

Now we have a wonderful problem on our hands.... space. We don't have the room to handle all the teens that are coming on Saturday night. It's pretty bad when you have so many teens coming to youth night that over 100 of them can't fit into the building to hear the gospel. We need our youth center!!! We have the land, the concrete, and the money to buy the steel for the structure; but there is still a lot more that is needed. We need your help, please pray and give as the Lord blesses you. Our goal is to win Cruzeiro do Sul for Christ through it's young people.

One last thing before I end this letter. With summer coming up I would like to encourage you to send your young people to visit us. We have room in our home for them and we would love to have them. This summer will be packed with activities for our young people and it would be a great time to expose your teens to missions. Who knows, if my parents had sent me to Brazil when I was a teen maybe I wouldn't have waited till I was 35 years old to become a missionary.
