



Great Trip Up The Jurua River... Minister To The Physical As Well As The Spiritual . . . A Call For Help . . .

Dear Brethren,

The trip to the upper Jurua River that I started to tell you about last letter was a great success. In case you don't remember, I had 2 doctors, 2 nurses and 2 dentists with me to visit Foz de Breu (a village on the Brazil-Peru border), Thaumaturgo and Porio Walter. The latter 2 towns we have missionaries living and working full time. This trip is an annual thing. The idea is for these Christian medical people to work with us for a few days treating the river people's bodies and souls.

In my last letter I told you about the first day and first service of the trip. The next service we had 12 more people saved. There are now 23 believers at Foz do Breu. We do not have a worker there, but we are praying and looking for the right family. Please pray with us.

The project went a little slower at Thaumaturgo. We deal with a different kind of people there. For some reason they are rather, how should I say it; cocky? Nevertheless, the medical part went well, the services were well attended (average 80 people) and one local merchant

When it was time to move on to Porio Walter we had a nice rain that made the landings on the red clay strip interesting! The Lord protected though and the 2 shuttle flights went well. There were plenty of village people on hand to help us carry and set up equipment, so even though the "streets" were sloppy, it went well. The Catholic church still holds an iron fisted grip on this town. Anyone who attends our services gets a special visit. Those who make professions of faith get the visit and a warning. As you may guess, the warning has some thing to do about the Catholic view of where the soul goes if one leaves the Catholic church to follow Christ. Even so, our congregation there has over 40 young Christians. There were 4 more saved during this last visit.

In our mission work this has been a busy month. Some of our weaker members sort of cooled off in the absence of the pastor. We are visiting them to encourage them to be faithful. I have learned that you can't make a goat be a sheep. So I try to help these come to a solid position concerning their salvation. I do believe in "backsliding" in the sense one can live carnally after being saved, but my personal experience has been that a sheep is never happy and satisfied while away from the fold. I'm afraid there may be a considerable amount of goats mixed with the sheep in our churches, but the only way I know to weed them out is just preach the word. I just saw a member of the Faith Baptist in the grocery store. He said that the preacher last night stated that Satan will tell 2 lies and one

truth in order to deceive people. As soon as he had said it one of the "problem lady members" of the church jumped up and screamed out for the preacher to shut up. To me that indicates whose side she is on. Perhaps that is the chief question we should ask ourselves. May we commit ourselves as did Joshua of old. Surely our greatest need is to be committed to the Lord's work. Yesterday on the Internet a dear pastor in the States asked that we pray for him and his church. He said the older folk are leaving this world and the younger are wrapped up in materialism. This certainly seems to be the case. May God send a revival among Bible believing Baptist churches. Dear Pastor friend, your job is not just to get up and preach 3 times a week, it also is to shepherd the flock the Lord has given you outside the 4 walls of the church. Many times today church members are suffering and alone and do not receive not even a visit from their pastor. What a shame! If I did mission work in Brazil the way you do there dear pastor, would you be enthusiastic about supporting me? I had better quit meddling but I am burdened about the situation. Pray for us as we try to preach the glorious gospel here in Brazil.

Thanks for your continual prayers and support of this ministry. We are especially thankful to those who write us. We appreciate your kind words of encouragement.



There have been services with over 200 present at Pucalpa and Profeta. The work at Santa Rosa is very encouraging. The new brick building is already under roof. The folks started construction on May 1. The local congregation and our missionaries raised all the funds right there! First Baptist Church didn't have to fund this one. Our teaching and our missions program are working! Don't be upset with me if even I seem surprised. It has been a long hard string of years to get to the starting line! Obviously we are happy to have come this far, but the finish line is still far away.

Busy Days Before Leaving For Furlough ... Arrive Back In The States ... Concerning The Offerings ...

My last Mission Sheet Letter was written from Manaus, Amazonas on June 26, 1997. Today, July 29, 1997, I am writing this month's Mission Sheet letter seated at Stephen M. Bratcher's desk at the Temple Baptist Church, Ocala, Florida, where he is the Pastor. "Backward, o backward, oh time in my flight." Let us stop on June 27th. It is now 11:17 a.m. Marie and I are leaving on the boat bound for Itacoatiara. We got off the boat at around 20:30 and we were met by our grappediet. Less Transpare Pastole.



around 20:30 and we were met by our evangelist, Joao Tuanama Portela.

Saturday morning Joao and I went to the cemetery and held a short service at the grave of Dona Raimunda Maia Portela, who died a week earlier. She was awaiting her 18th child. Pray for her husband and children. In the afternoon I performed a wedding ceremony and then in the evening I preached to 62. Sunday morning 52 people heard my message. At 14:30 we left with several of the Mission with us in a rented boat. We arrived an hour and a half later at the town of Novo Remanso. There at 17:00 we held a short service and then we all went to the river. There, Pastor Ediberto Ribeiro da Silva baptized Joao Silva de Vales, 33 years old. This was the first person for Ed to baptize after his ordination. I wrote about his ordination in last month's Mission Sheets.

Wednesday, July 2nd-Held a funeral service for a young mother and then we visited a new baby with his mother and then on to the 29th of March Baptist Mission. Only 8 of us present at Prayer Meeting.

Friday, July 4th-We again left Manaus and traveled to Codajas. There I preached Saturday night and both Sunday services at the 25th of December Faith Baptist Church. The Church honored us for 38 years in Brazil, as of July 15th.

July 9-13-We celebrated the first anniversary of the "Vessel of Blessings" Baptist Mission. Each night we had a different preacher scheduled to preach. On Sunday morning Pastor Hershael W. York preached and I translated.

July 15th-At 15:30 I bade farewell to my beloved wife, Hattie Marie Moore Bratcher (she

July 15th-At 15:30 I bade farewell to my beloved wife, Hattie Marie Moore Bratcher (she did not feel up to making the trip to Olinda). At 18:15 aboard the "Santo Antonio de Barba" I left Manaus. The next morning at 6:00, I arrived in Nova Olinda do Norte. Brother Zonil Nunes Cunha met me and took me to his house for "Cafe" and then with his help I rented a small boat with two young men to take me to Olinda. We left at 13:00 and arrived at 18:30. 12 were present at the first service. I preached each night through Sunday night. Sunday morning, 29 were present. We made visits each day, Thursday through Saturday. The Lord gave us 6 decisions, two girls, 9 and 10, made a profession of faith and two boys, 9 and 10, made a profession of faith and two men made a profession of faith. Ozeno Gois Cunha is our evangelist there. He had painted the small church building and parsonage and went out of his way to supply my needs during the 6 days I was there. We arrived back in Nova Olindas do Norte at around 13:00 then caught the "Bismarck" at 17:00 and arrived home at around 10:00 on Tuesday.

Wednesday night, July 23-I preached to 17 at the 29th of March Baptist Mission and Thursday at the "Vessel" Mission. Friday night services in a home, 29th of March Mission and then Saturday a wedding at the "Vessel" Mission. The couple I united in marriage are the parents of 11 children.

Sunday, July 27th-A day to be remembered. Marie and I left the house around 7:30 and with some 300 other people ate breakfast ("cafe") at the 14th of December Baptist Church,
