Another month has flown by. We have now been back in Brazil for nearly 3 months. I believe it has been about the busiest time of our lives, but it has been great. We even by His grace are thankful for the adversity we have enfronted. It has caused our transition back into the language and culture to go practically unnoticed.



We went to Novo Diamantino and spent 3 days last week. We were pleased with what w saw. The last convert in Bobby Creiglow's ministry there was a young married man by the name of Juscelino. His wife had been saved for a number of years back in Varzea Grande. Now, four years later, they are standing in the gap in this needy place. Pray for them. They are persecuted acutely by the Pentecostals who specialize in robbing away new converts.

The mission at Primavera here in town is to be organized under the authority of the Faith Bapt. Church in Varzea Grande by the end of the year. Last week we started up a preaching point using one of the preachers at the Boa Esperanca Church. All of the other churches are doing well with souls being saved and several are waiting baptism. We recently had a 30 year old man saved in our services at the Altos do Coxipo Church. I am bearing down some on sanctification. It seems that many people want to talk, walk, and live like the world and still consider themselves right with the Lord I find that to be inconsistent with the scriptures and am at times surprised by the comments I hear from non-Christians. It is very difficult to teach separation in our day, but without it how can we have the power of God upon us?

Anita and I arrived back in the States on August the 10th. We are here for a six month furlough and would be happy to come and share with you how our Sovereign Lord has been working in. PERU. Our God is a mighty God and He has been pleased to continue to use my wife and me to accomplish His work in PERU. These days in which we live are exciting and challenging days and you and your church should he aware of what our Lord is doing in other parts of the world. 

THE ART OF WAR

Ps. 18:34 He teacheth my hands to war, so that a bow of steel is broken by mine arms Ps. 144:1 Blessed be the LORD my strength, which teacheth my hands to war, and my fingers to fight:

Psalm 144.10 It is He that giveth salvation (victory) to kings; who delivereth David his servant from the hurtful sword.

Prov. 24:6 For by wise counsel thou shalt make thy war: and in multitude of counselors there is safety.

It seems that we Christians forget we have been translated from the kingdom of darkness into the Kingdom of His wonderful light, that we are, therefore, engaged in an unending conflict which has the honor of our Lord at stake.

We are all too much like the Israelites who gained the Promised Land, but failed to obey and completely annihilate the enemy as God commanded. His command was not for His protection and well being, but for His people. After 40 years of wanderings with Moses (wanderings caused by their own doing, or not doing), seven years of battles under the leadership of Joshua and the enemies subdued they began to look at their selves and forgot to obey. 'We have had a long hard time of wanderings and battles. We are tired. The enemy is beaten and does not offer any danger. We will plant and reap and have plenty. The foe is among us but he is not bothering us so let's live and let live."

They forgot that God knows more about enemies than they did. They disobeyed. For this

obedience they paid a high price. If we imagine in any way that God can be disobeyed and not pay the price, we are in for a sure surprise. To cure any doubt simple check out the history of the disobedience of God's people and the result.

In God's war battles are not won by looking at what the enemy has or what he is doing; they are not won by looking at our human resources; they are won by obeying God.
God's people and His churches have a solemn mission in the world. It is to make Jesus

Christ known to the ends of the earth for the glory and honor of the Father, to seek and to save the lost for whom Christ died and to remember that even though we are in the world we are not of the world.

God's earthly people, the Jews, were to invade, kill out the enemy and inhabit the land. Our mission is somewhat different. We are to invade the lands that are filled with dead and to bring them to life. A war quite different from the nations.

On June 7, 1944 our ship unloaded troops at the Normandy beachheads. Trip after trip was made bringing and unloading troops for the killing and destruction of the enemy. Thousands were killed

Casualties and Expenditures in WW II

In loss of lives, World War II was the costliest war in history. No adequate figures exist, and estimates can be only roughly approximate. Probably between 15 and 20 million military personnel were killed in action. Among the Axis powers, Germany suffered about 3.5 million battle dead, Japan 1.5 million, and Italy 200,000. Among the Allies the USSR had the heaviest battle casualties, as many as 7.5 million dead. China lost 2.2 million combatants from July 1937. The British lost more than 300,000 dead, the United States 292,000, and France

Civilian dead numbered approximately 25 million. The USSR lost more than 10 million, China at least 6 million, France 400,000, the United Kingdom 65,000, and the United States 6,000. On the Axis side, Germany suffered the loss of 500,000 civilians, Japan 600,000, and Italy 145,000. In addition, about 6 million Jews, mostly from eastern Europe, were put to death by the Nazis.

Expenditures for war materials and armaments totaled at least \$1.154 trillion. The United States alone spent about \$300 billion on its war effort, Germany about \$231 billion. Added to these enormous costs incurred by governments was the tremendous material damage done to property of all kinds, any estimate of which would be futile.

There can be no doubt the world's "art of war" is the art of killing and destroying.

The "art of war" in God's Kingdom is just the opposite. His soldiers, few in number, spread far from each other, and all volunteers, invade the enemies land to give life to the dead. The invasion of Normandy was an emotional experience in my life, but there was no joy in seeing people killed, bombed ships sink and bodies floating in the sea.

The invasions of enemy territory in God's war is also, an emotional experience that brings with it joys unspeakable as people dead in their sins come to life through the power of the gospel. This past month we made the sixth invasion into the lost world in the city of Nova Fatima. After a week of meetings several heard the Gospel and last Sunday Marcos and Silvia who are expecting their first baby in two months went by bus and held the first Sunday School under a tree. Twenty-six persons attended. Mark the date, March 9, 1997. As a result of this beginning, people will be saved and in the future a church will be established.

We have spent a lot to kill as many as possible in our wars. Don't you think it would be wiser to sacrifice more in the war that brings to life forever? During the war the English paid 46% of their salaries to finance the war. God saved their nation, but they have forgotten Him. Less than 2% attend any kind of church in England. What a price they will pay! We, too, are fast forgetting God's instructions. Disobedience is everywhere among God's people. May we learn anew the art of making war according to righteousness that He might bless us and so we might dwell in peace.
