Dear Friends,

This has been a month of trials and blessings for us. The Lord continues to teach us many lessons, like perseverance and patience. We are so thankful to many of you who continually pray for us. Your prayers are so important to us and to the ministry God has called us to here in Kenya.

We have had to make several very difficult decisions while we have been out here in Africa. We have been working with some pastors in our very young fellowship of churches and for some time now in working with them, we have discovered some things that trouble us greatly. We have tried to train them according to the Word of God but they have allowed some unbiblical practices to enter their churches. Both Pam and I have prayed about it and have decided to make a necessary transition in our ministry. The Lord has led us to another Kenyan pastor, who is Baptist in doctrine. We plan to 'plant' a Baptist Church in the Kitale area where we presently live.

One Sunday a couple of weeks ago, we were driving to a church north of here to observe. As I was driving, the differential on our car gave out. We had to wait over 5 hours before a tow truck could take our car to a mechanic in Kitale. As I was waiting to get help, I was able to pass out Swahili tracts to a lot of people that passed by. Well, when the tow truck finally came, they damaged our rear fender in the process of towing us back to town. So we had one problem after another. We were very thankful that nothing worse happened.

Pam and I did receive a great blessing too. As many of you know, Pam has been having severe eye problems for almost 2 years now. She has an eye condition called Blepharospasm and we found out that it cannot be treated in Kenya. It was recommended by some eye specialists here, that she go back to the States to get eye treatments. So Pam & I prayed that the Lord would provide money so Pam could make the trip. Well, the Lord answered our prayers in a wonderful way. One of our supporting pastors sent us an E-mail telling us that their church had selected us to receive a special missionary offering. Believe it or not, it was more than enough to pay for a round trip ticket to the States. So I E-mailed this pastor and asked him if we could use the gift for the purpose of helping Pam. He wrote back and said it was 'OK'. Praise the Lord! Pam cried... God is so Good! We were able to get Pam an appointment at the Wilmer Eye Clinic at John Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore. Please pray for Pam, that she will have a safe trip back to the States. Also pray that the Lord will help the doctors that treat Pam's eyes. Pray especially, if it is God's will, that He will heal her eyes.

We are still active in increasing our Swahili language skills. We both have a Kertyan language helper and try to meet with them 5 days a week. Please pray that the Lord will continue to help us learn the language.

Pam & I are very thankful for the good friends we are making with the Kenyans and other missionaries in the area. We are looking forward to starting a new Baptist church soon. We have already been discipling church leaders for this church.

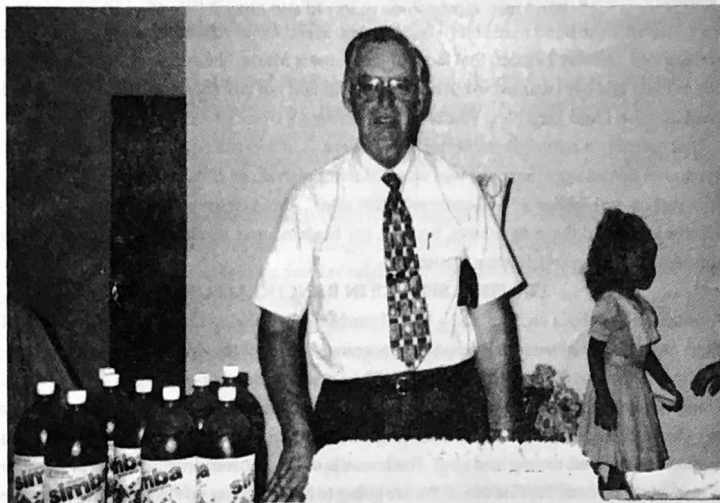

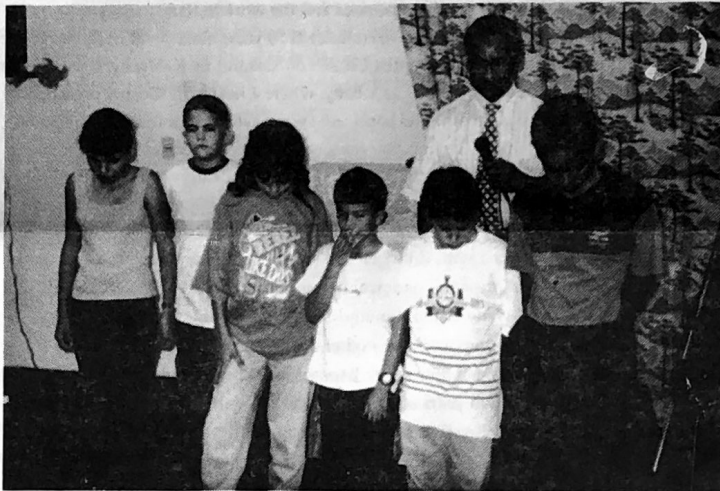

# Great News, Great Blessings . . . Fifty Years In The Ministry . . . Precious Memories . . . Looking Ahead . . .

Dear Friends  
"My Father works until now, and I work." At least I am trying to keep up. Great news, great blessings. In has been five months that I have been visiting in Rancho Alegre every Wednesday morning from 9 am to 12 noon. Only one Wednesday morning was missed. Until two weeks ago there had been two persons who had made professions of faith: John, a blind man ninety-three years old and Eliza, a lady 65 years of age. During a visit with the blind man I met a woman who asked me to visit her mother, an alcoholic. The next Wednesday I visited that lady whose name is Maria. She runs on liquor 24 hours a day. When I told her I wanted to tell her about Jesus and not talk about her drink she showed great interest. I told her, "Next Wednesday morning a 9 o'clock I will be here."

That morning it rained. Being water proof I went. God sent the rain to hold the two men at the house. Before I got there she was worried that I would not come and said to her family, "You reckon that "believer" will come with this rain?" About two minutes after the question, I arrived. She had three daughters, her son, her husband and another man who lives there and several little grandchildren waiting.

## THE FIRST SERVICE IN RANCHO ALEGRE

At the end of about an hour and a half of teaching about being saved, six persons trusted Jesus as Savior. That was on Wednesday morning. I asked if they would like to have a service in their house. They said they would. They marked Monday evening at seven o'clock. Rained again. Plenty of mud. I brought the blind man and there were 15 present. Another lady trusted the Lord that night. Alta played the organ held on her lap. They loved the hymns and wanted to sing and sing. The house is of the poorest, only one light bulb and it was in another room. No one cared. We are going to have another service this Monday in the house of a daughter, where there is more space. All of those who had trusted the Lord on Wednesday were present. Pray for these persons and the work in Rancho Alegre.

On the nineteenth of October I will have completed 50 years since I was ordained to the ministry. I was ordained by the First Baptist Church of Alexandria, Kentucky. It was to this church that I was taken by my parents as a baby, where I heard the Gospel preached by pastor Arley Jones, was saved at nine and baptized. I was pastoring a mission in Shelbyville, Kentucky when I was ordained. That mission was organized as the Second St. Baptist church. Today, it is the Highland Baptist Church. From there I went to Beattyville where our church had four missions. My brother, Charles, came there and built a mission building and remodeled the old building in Beattyville. From there I was called to Peoples Baptist Church in Alton, Illinois, where I worked with Bill Beeny in a Bible school and new mission works. Here God brought us together with wonderful people like Del and Ada Mayfield, Bill and Minnie Brown, John and Myrtle Keltie, Jim and Faye Hicks, Bill and Juanita Roberts, the Grays, the Coopers, the Forsytes and many other dear souls.

It was from Alton that we joined forces with Baptist Faith Missions and left for Brazil. And here we have been for forty-two years serving the Lord and gathering friends to receive us in glory. Old men talk about the past because that is about all they have, but it is not all in my case. The future is still in our sights, praise the Lord. In this new area of work we have an organized church and seven missions (eight with the mission of Vila America, under the tree). 1. Tabernacle Baptist Church in Cornelio Procopio . Home base. 2. Urai mission with lot paid for waiting to build. Need: \$4,000 for basic building. 3. Primavera mission with lot and small building. Paid for. 4. Leopoldis mission with lot paid for and walled. Presently renting small room. Need: \$4,000 for basic building. 5. Santa Mariana mission with lot paid for. Need: \$5,000 for wall and basic building. 6. Santa Terezinha mission with lot and building in progress. Need: \$3,500 •This mission has a mission which meets under a tree with an attendance of 35 average. Need: Money to rent a building or purchase a lot. 7. Casa da Familia mission meets in a garage of a man who owns a bar. Need: \$5,000 We made an offer of \$4,000 this week on a house. 8. Rancho Alegre mission. Need: To buy lot and basic building. \$6,000

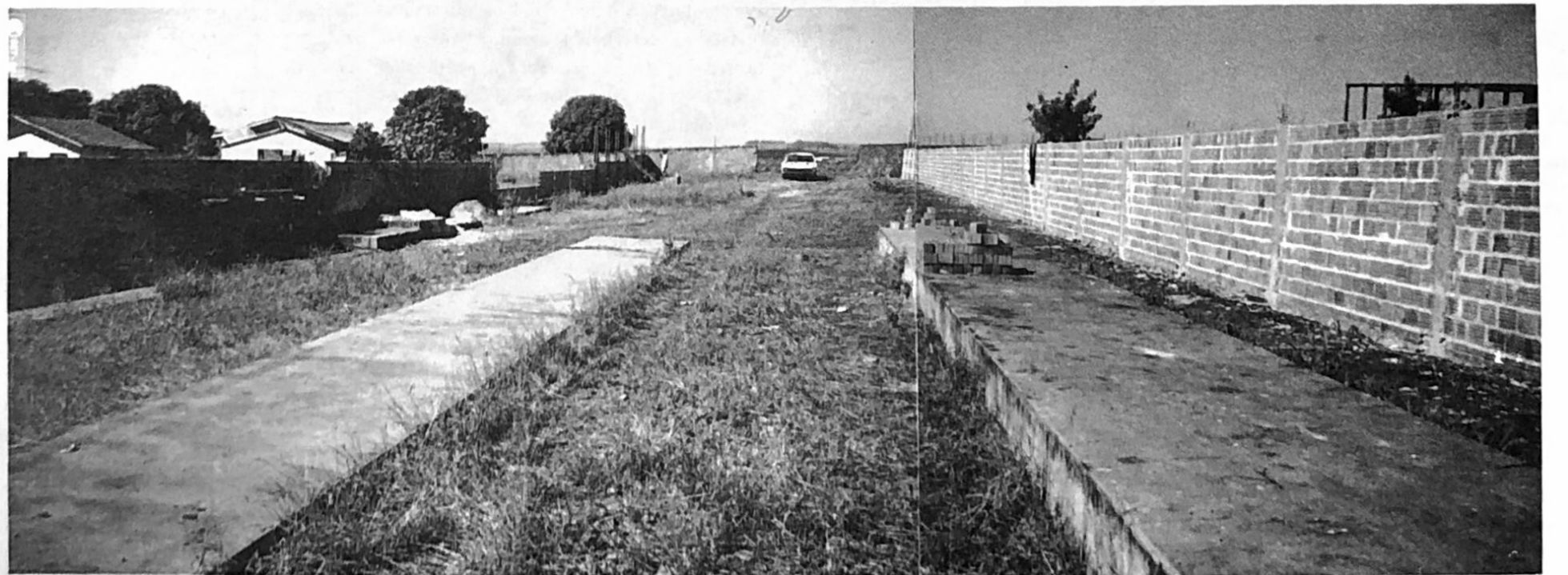


Photo of large lot in Urai

For some reason, here in Brazil, it is the idea of all that an unwalled property is public property, and it becomes just that. So the first job in building is the wall.

The lot is large enough for future development. What we are planning is to build a basic prefabricated structure 35 ft. x 45 ft. Cost including roof and labor is about \$4,000. The basic structure can be used for services while the walls and divisions are being constructed.

Dear Brethren:

This "Mission Sheet Month" begins October 5, and ends today, October 31.

Sunday, October 5 - I preached this morning and tonight at the Ella Grove Baptist Church, Greenville, Georgia. Tom Sallosi is the beloved pastor. I was royally entertained in the home of the pastor who with his wife, Gay, and their son, Timothy, were very kind and considerate of my needs.

Friday, October 10 - This afternoon I attended the Grace Baptist Church's Mission Conference (Holly, Michigan)—Pastor Bob Hopkins. I brought the fourth and final message of the day.

Saturday, October 11 - I attended the Lake Road Baptist Church's Mission Conference in Clio, Michigan. Pastor Doug Armstrong was one of the speakers. I was blessed by being a guest in the home of both of the above mentioned pastors.

Sunday, October 12 - I preached this A.M. at the Grace Baptist Church and tonight at the Lake Road Baptist Church.

Wednesday, October 15 - We attended (Marie with me) the prayer service at the Calvary Baptist Church, Richmond, Kentucky. I brought the message—a message especially for Pastor Bobby Greene who the following Sunday celebrated his 10th anniversary as pastor of the church. Congratulations, Brother Greene!

Sunday, October 19 - This morning I began with the Calvary Baptist Church, Uniontown, Kentucky, a revival which ended Saturday night the 25th. The pastor is Jim Adams. The pastor of visitation is Robert Tucker. It was a blessing to work with both of these pastors during the meeting. The Lord gave us the blessing of a 13 year old boy, Shane Gatewood, asking for baptism, and his mother, Mrs. Glenda Gatewood, wife of Garland, asked to be received by letter from the Uniontown Baptist Church. Pray for the salvation of Garland.

Sunday, October 26 - This morning and tonight I preached at the Woodland Baptist Church of Morganfield, Kentucky. The pastor is A. Todd Jones. Be of good cheer Bro. Jones because your labor is not in vain with the Lord. Being with the saints at Woodland brought back many precious memories. My father, Dr. C. S. Bratcher, was pastor there for many years. As a boy I attended the services there many times.

"Manaus is a mess," Asa Mark told us over the telephone the morning of the 17th. The three month old drought has caused the rivers to be low and as a result Asa Mark told us that some days the lights in their home are out up to six hours. There is also a shortage of water. Due to the burning of the trees in the interior there has been much smoke over Manaus. I am praying publicly and privately for the Lord to send rain.

Pastor Ediberto Ribeiro da Silva wrote us of the death of Brazilian Pastor João José Dias. Brother Dias received financial help from the Baptist Faith Mission during many years.

Monday, October 27 - I left Morganfield this morning around 10:30 on a Greyhound bus and arrived in Richmond on a Greyhound bus at 18:20. Brother Glyndon Dargavell met me and took me to Willis Manor where I preached. Different churches and pastors hold services there. I was there at the invitation of Pastor Gerald F. Stamps. Brother Stamps told me that he is an ordained Baptist preacher and is a member and deacon of the First Baptist Church of Richmond. He played the piano and sang a solo during the service. Afterwards, he took me to our home here in Richmond where Marie and her mother, Mrs. Flossie Moore, were waiting my arrival.

Thus, Brethren we have shared with you the news of our labor while on furlough from Manaus, Brazil, and also some news from there.

Pray for us, dear saints of the Saviour. Marie was not able to go with me during the three trips that I made this month. I miss my Marie when she has to stay to take care of her Mother and she misses me. The Lord willing on December 27, we will complete 43 years of marriage.

Pray for us and note our furlough address and telephone number. Write us or call if we can be of any service to you. Continue to pray for the work of the Lord in Brazil. Pray for Asa Mark Bratcher and all the members and the six missions of the 14th of December Baptist Church.

May the Lord continue to supply through you and me the needs of Baptist Faith Missions. The hymn writer tells us: "Give and to you shall be given - Christ - his beloved Son gave."

Dear Friends,

Another month has gone by so quickly. Anita and I continue to travel and tell of the Lord's work in Peru. It has been such a blessing for us to be with so many brothers and sisters in Christ. In October we put about eight thousand miles on the car! November is going to be even more miles. The traveling is hard but when we arrive the fellowship is always great. We hope to see many of you at the Thanksgiving Conference in Detroit.

We're praying for a great turnout and a great Thanksgiving Offering for this year. I've not heard anything new from Peru this past month, so were assuming that things continue to go well. I hope that you all read our letter from last month where I explained the need of our BUILDING FUND. Anita and I continue to pray that the Lord will touch your heart and give a good response to this need. I don't mention any funds or ask for anything when I visit the churches. It's through our letters that I make the appeals. All of the love offerings that we receive from the churches when we speak are being used toward the purchase of a "digital duplicator" for the printing of books, tracts, and materials in Peru. Pastors, if you would like to have us come and be with you and share about the Lord's work in Peru, you'd better call soon. All weekends are booked up into February. We plan to return to Peru the end of February but we can delay our departure a few weeks if more churches wish to have us come. Hope to hear from you soon!

For several years now many of you have been praying for our little niece, Julie, in Raleigh, North Carolina. As we have visited the churches several of you have asked how she is doing. I thought I would take this opportunity to explain the fatal disease that she has so that you can pray with better understanding for Julie and her parents, my brother and sister-in-law, Wanda and Charles Leffler, and Julie's sister, Kate. Julie has Batten Disease. It is an inherited, degenerative, neurological disease which may affect a person of any age, but primarily strikes infants, toddlers, and school age children. There is no treatment. It is always fatal.

Only about 3 children in every 10,000 are affected. Parents must helplessly watch their children degenerate to become totally helpless and then die. Often it begins with deteriorating vision and seizures, personality and behavior changes and always progresses through mental and physical deterioration to death. Julie is now fourteen. She is blind and her speech, mental capacity and motor movements have deteriorated sharply. We don't always know why things like this happen. Sometimes it's not for us to know this side of Heaven. But one day the Lord will explain. Meanwhile, we must love and pray and show our support for the family. Family and friends can show support and caring but really only those that have gone through or are going through the same experience can truly understand the hurt, pain, and sometimes the confusion. Besides your prayers there is another way you can help.

Charles and Wanda Leffler (my brother-in-law and sister-in-law) are very active in BDSRA (Batten Disease Support and Research Association). This is a small support network for those with the disease, their parents and siblings; and for ongoing research to work toward protecting others from the disease. Once a year they try to meet in a different city to share with one another and provide much needed coping skills. This is the only support organization for Batten Disease and families come from most of the fifty states and some from foreign countries. This is not a "religious organization" but so many of the families are believers, like Charles and Wanda. Their faith in God is a blessing to see. Thanks for your love and caring. Until next month.
