Our God is an awesome God! I praise our Lord for the landmarks in our lives this year.

In May, our oldest daughter, Leigh, graduated from Liberty University with a degree in Psychology, and four weeks later married Michael Samples. Michael is from Georgia and completed his masters degree in Animal Science at the University of Kentucky. Michael was serving on the administration and faculty of Lexington Baptist College. In the summer of 1996, Michael did a summer missions internship here at Tabernacle Baptist Church. They both have hearts turned to ministering the gospel in Brazil. Michael and Leigh arrived in Manaus in September. Michael continued his language training, which he completed in December. They will be moving to the church camp grounds as administrators. The camping season will begin in February. We are planning to have camps every weekend. Wanda and I rejoice, seeing the heart for God alive in the next generation.

In October, Dad and Mom (Dr. and Mrs. John A. Hatcher) completed 50 years of faithful service in the gospel ministry and in December celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary. This is a landmark of the generation before us, examples that show us Christ in action today. They are still active - serving, training and sharing the gospel of Christ. We had hoped that they would be with us for the Christmas holidays, but due to the fact that in the Christmas season the air fares have no special discounts, it would cost two thousand five hundred dollars (more expensive than to go to the US) for them to come be with us in Manaus.

I was with Mom and Dad in October for the celebration of their 50th year of ministry. Monday night (every night they have training classes or services) was the day for the Rancho Alegre (Happy Ranch in English) Bible study. This little town is a farm town. I was anxious to go there as, months before, Dad had told us about this place. God gave him the idea of selling Bibles door to door; the neighborhood has nothing against a salesman. So he sold them Bibles at cost and in as many payments as they needed to pay for them. Each buyer got a visit each time his payment was due. Each visit was a great occasion to share the gospel. On one of the visits, a family of alcoholics accepted a Bible study in their house. On that first night, several adults accepted Christ. I was looking forward to get to know this place and these people. The night was cool, so we got jackets, Bibles and a portable organ and were off for a 35-minute drive to Rancho Alegre. As we drove up to the house, the lady was waiting for us in the middle of the street, Bible and paperback songbook in hand. "The Bible study is going to be in my daughter's house tonight," she said. Dad nodded, "Where is it?" "I'll take you there," she said. We arrived at a small house and were introduced to the daughter and then invited to come inside. We were taken to the only room other than the small kitchen. In this room there were two single beds with enough space to place a chair between them. People started arriving and, finally, there were 18 adults crowded in the tiny room. Mom played a small keyboard and we sang together. A Bible study followed for the next hour. Two weeks later, a small house was bought for a mission site. Fifty years - and the flame is burning stronger than ever. Thank you for parents who are sold out to you, Lord.

On the 9th of November I fractured a vertebra and have been grounded to a bed for the last 40 days. There have been some readjustments to make for sure. I set up office at the bedside to administrate from bed. Several are covering the speaking for me. I am improving; and in another 30 days, I hope to be back to full activity.

We wish you a happy new year. Wanda and I thank you for your support and prayer; may God bless you richly.

December seems to be a busy month for everyone. I have spent the whole month without my wife, Pam, she is still in the States getting treatments for her eye problem. She went for another eye treatment right before Christmas, at the West Virginia University Medical Center Hospital. She decided to switch hospitals, because this one is a lot more convenient and they were able to give the same treatment. Pam reported to me recently that her eyelids are about 85% improved, since having the treatments. Please continue to pray that the Lord would completely heal her eyes, if it is His will? Pam is planning to be back here in Kenya on January 12th, Lord willing.

I have missed not having Pam with me here. It was especially lonely being without her on Christmas Day. Thankfully, I was invited to spend Christmas with some missionary friends from Israel. I also thank the Lord for the good church services we have had in our church in Kitale, this past month.

Please pray for Brother Hesbon Ininga who will be working with us in this new church. He and his family just moved to Kitale from a town south of here on the very last day of 1997. Pam and I are looking forward to serving the Lord together with Brother Hesbon.

Earlier in the month, I had to make a special trip to Nairobi to check on our vehicle that has finally arrived in the Kenyan port city of Mombasa. We have had delays all year trying to get this vehicle. Now we are trying to get it through customs. Please pray that we will soon be able to have our own vehicle soon. It really has been a 'nightmare' trying to get it. You have no idea what it is like trying to get things done in a third-world country sometimes! The Lord continues to teach us to trust Him more and to have a lot of patience.

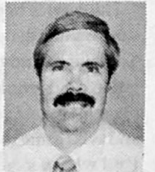
While I was in Nairobi, I had another opportunity to preach in our friend's church. Their church meets in a rented metal building. They actually meet in one of the many slums around the city. The most noticeable thing about the location is that everyone it seems, dumps their trash and garbage in the next field beside the church. The Sunday I was there, they had more fresh trash and garbage than ever and it was even spreading up to the church building. You had to wade through this trash to even get to the church building. There were flies everywhere! And the smell was so bad that our missionary friend's wife had to go back home, because she could not stand the stench! I took her back to her home and then I returned to the church and preached. That was an experience that I will not forget for a long time.

You may have seen in the international news that Kenya had their elections? They have elections every 5 years and this past year, there has been a lot of disturbances and violence sporadically throughout the country during the campaigning this past year. Please pray that peace will prevail throughout Kenya during this time of political uncertainty.

Well the year went fast and Pam and I look forward with great expectancy to our ministry here in Kenya in 1998, if our Lord tarries. We count it a privilege to serve the Lord in partnership with the ministry of our home church, Calvary Baptist Church in Hurricane, West Virginia. We thank the Lord that we can serve under Baptist Faith Mission. We also, are very thankful for all our many other supporters who pray and give, so that we can help fulfill the 'Great Commission' of our Lord in this part of His harvest field.

May the Lord continue to bless you all in the New Year of 1998.

On the 19th of October, 1997 I was ordained to the Gospel Ministry by the first Baptist Church in Alexandria, Kentucky. So you see we have passed these fifty years of ministry together, for which we praise the Lord.

What was planned to be only a simple thanksgiving service in our church turned into a full sized service of worship and thanksgiving. We sent no invitations for we thought it too much expense of time and money to expect people to come for one service. But they came—Our son, Paul, came from Manaus, a trip of over 7,000 miles; Odali and our daughter, Kathy, came with more than forty friends from Garca, including A. J. and Barbara Hensley; friends whom had been saved and baptized in our ministry came from San Paulo, a trip of 800 miles round trip; others came from Cambe and from Marilia. 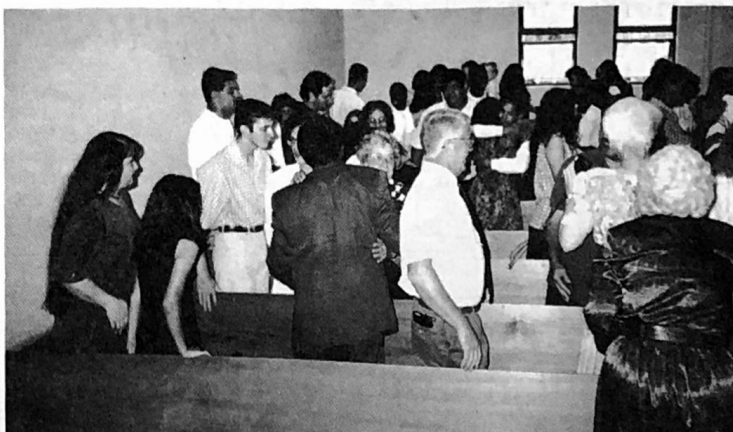

Maria and Helena, who were saved and baptized in Manaus and who came to live with us as our daughters when their father died. There was Kathy and Paul who were saved and baptized in Manaus. From the twelve years spent in Garca there were more than forty who came. There were greetings from Africa, San Paulo, and the United States.

The service, including the lunch prepared by the ladies of our church lasted three hours. Wish you could have been here to rejoice with us.

Dear Brethren,

The middle of last month Bev and I went to Porto Velho, Rondonia. We had been there last year to visit a church where one of our folks moved and is very active.

We stopped off first at Rio Branco for a couple of days. We visited our church there, Memorial Baptist. They are doing very well and continue to grow.

On Friday, October 17 we arrived in Porto Velho. This city is the capital of Rondonia, a neighbor state just east of Acre. Porto Velho has just over 300,000 population. The city grew and became famous as a gold mining town. The government finally shut down that business as it was destroying the environment. Now farming is the main source of wealth, but isn't a whole lot easier on the environment.

We visited 10 churches this year. The first engagement was with the church that we visited last year. There was a weekend meeting to celebrate the church's 20th anniversary. There were big crowds each night. The members got out a lot of people, even a number of politicians. One night the vice governor was there. There were 4 or 5 professions of faith.

Most of the churches we visited are small, but pretty solid. Most of them have Brazilian pastors. A couple of them are taken care of by American missionaries. They are all avid for Bible teaching. One night we had a couples meeting with couples from all of the churches. The meeting started at 7:30 p.m. I just started talking to them about practical matters that I teach routinely here in Cruzeiro. At 9:00 I said it was time for me to stop. The reaction was, "No way!". At 9:35 I stopped again, but they said, "Go at least to 10:00!" Even so, they kept asking questions and it was 10:30 when I finally made them stop. It is always fun to teach, but even more so when people are this hungry.

One day was spent in a preachers' meeting. I didn't count, but there were at least 15, maybe as many as 20 present. After the opening ceremony I gave a report of what God is doing here in Cruzeiro do Sul. I followed that with a lesson on unity and cooperation within their ranks. They asked for 2 hours and got about an hour and half.

We also did 2 activities with teens. One was a monthly fellowship and the other was one that we put together ourselves at their request. The latter was done on a Saturday at a public park. Both of these activities had good numbers and hopefully will continue to reap results in the coming months.

I really enjoy getting out and encouraging other Baptists toward greater intensity in service. The Lord has been giving me a few of these opportunities and I am grateful to Him. I think all of us Baptists could be doing more and let the other non-churches play catch up or quit, for all I care. Don't you agree?

Thanks for all your help.

Sunday, December 21 - Tonight I preached at the Calvary Baptist Church here in Richmond where Bobby Greene is the pastor.

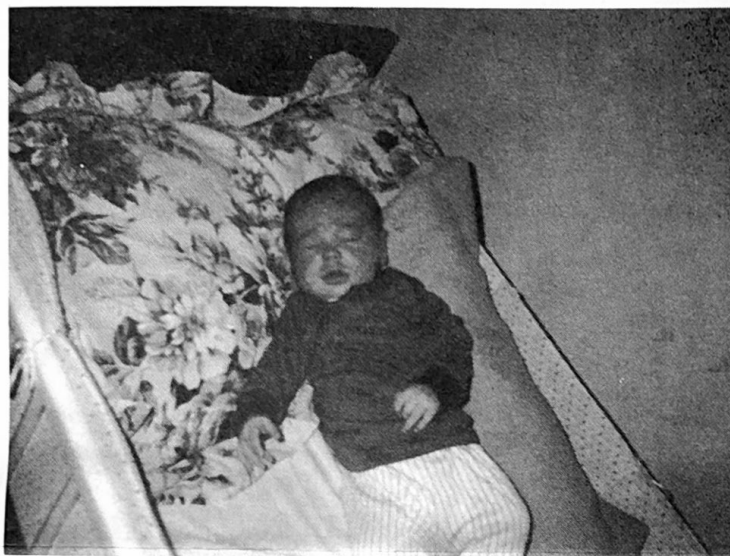

The Wacaser's newest addition to the family. (Brennan, 4 months old).

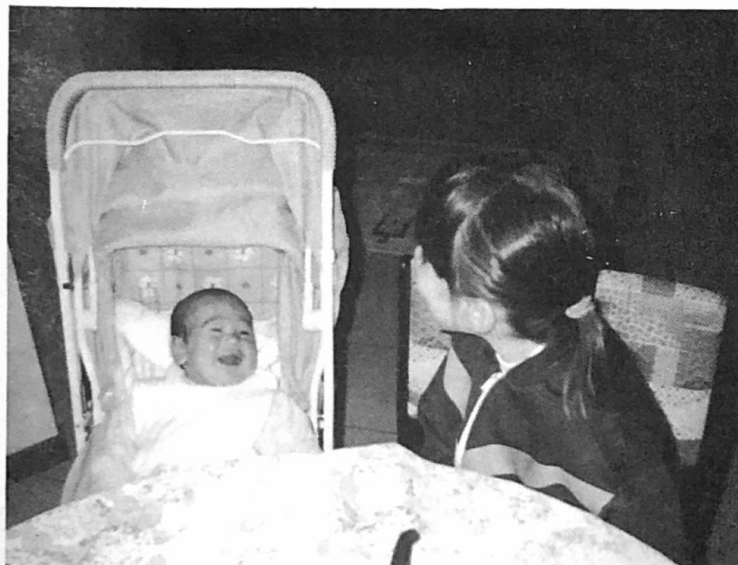
families know what a wonderful thrill this is for him. Rejoice together with us in this blessing.
