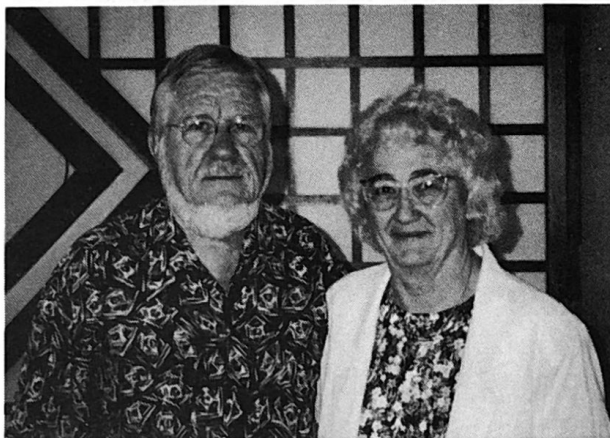
100 YEARS OF PREACHING

Dear Friends,

It's hard to believe that February is almost over. It's hot here during the day- in the 90's, but we are thankful that the rain has stopped, and that we once again have water, and we don't have to pan bathe and recycle the dish water to flush the toilet.

Our church is progressing nicely. We have a youth meeting each Saturday evening at a field nearby our house, and we play ball with the neighborhood children. Afterwards, we have a devotion and we are currently teaching through the 'Wordless Book' as a way of presenting the Gospel. We have had a real good attendance; 70-75 children each week, and because of this, many of them come to Sunday School the next morning. Last Sunday was our 5th Sunday of having services, and we had 72 in Sunday School- most of the children are between the ages of 1-14 years of age. About 12 adults came and some teens. Pam is doing a good job teaching through the book of Genesis, and I am preaching short messages on practical Christianity. During the week, we and our Kenyan pastor, are visiting in the homes of people who are attending our church, and we have seen several people receive Christ as their personal Savior. In the afternoons, Pam and I continue to study the language of Swahili with a Kenyan tutor. She helps Pam to prepare her Sunday School lessons, and she also helps me to prepare my sermons, so we can speak more effectively in the language of the people that we minister to here in Kenya.

Also, we are trying to help our Kenyan pastor to have an additional income for his family. The church is too small to support the pastor, his wife, and their 3 teen age children. A friend suggested that we help them to make and sell fruit jam. This is relatively easy to make, and fresh fruits here in Kenya are in abundant supply. We have helped them by giving them instructions, and also buying the fruit, sugar, jars, etc. to help them to get started in their business. Please pray that the Lord will bless this business venture to help provide for our pastor and his family.

Some of you have asked about Pam's eyes. She is SO THANKFUL that her eyes are still doing well after her injections in December. Please continue to pray that her eyes will continue to do well, and that the Lord would completely heal her eyes, if that is His will. She thanks each of you for your prayers.

We are enjoying our new 'used' vehicle, and we have used it a lot already to transport people, supplies and church pews. We are still waiting for the paper work to come through from the port, and after that, we will have to go back to Nairobi to finally get our permanent registration for our vehicle. This whole process of getting a ministry vehicle has really taught us patience!

Nathan, our son, E Mailed us today. He reported to us that for the 3rd time in 4 years, he has won 1st Place in the talent show at Cedarville College! This is a record, as he is the first person to have won 1st Place 3 times. Nathan loves doing ventriloquism as a way of spreading the Gospel. We are very pleased with what God is doing in his life.

Our daughter, Sara, has been recently hired to teach in a 'charter school' in the Detroit area next year. This is a new way of teaching, and the movement is really growing in the States. We are looking forward to attending Sara's upcoming wedding to Graig Austin, a ministerial student at Cedarville College, in June of this year. Sara is very active in our youth group at our home church in West Virginia, and we are pleased with what God is doing in her life, as well.

Please continue to pray for us, as we seek God's wisdom and direction daily, as to know how to handle situations in this third world culture. We'd love to hear from each one of you.

Until next time, keep looking up. Jesus is returning soon!

A Late Letter, Exciting News . . . Establish a Church Where Believers Were Once Persecuted . . .

Dear Brethren,

The best news this month comes from up the Jurua River, at a place called Porto Walter. On October 12 three of my workers went with me to dedicate the new building and perform the first baptisms.

The first missionary to the Jurua valley (Brother Joe Brandon) and some of his helpers tried to preach the gospel there many years ago. Before they could even get off of the boat a mob met them (sent by the priest) with the following "greeting": "If you 'crentes' (believers) try to tie up here we will cut the rope and the person carrying the rope."

It has been a long wait, but we are finally in. Our missionary, Mario and family have been working there for 3 years now. We started by building a house for them. Our next effort would be to put up a building, but that was not so urgent to me. Mario often spoke to me of how he was concerned because they weren't always able to hold regular services. My instruction to our men has always been to not worry about not having a pulpit to preach from, but just build testimony among the village people. Mario has done this very well. He even went back to night school under the teaching of the priest's head honcho! The 3 men who went with me were really impressed with the respect that Mario has built in the community.

Well he does have his building now, complete with pulpit and pews. I told you a few months ago about another trip that I made there to put in the electric and begin building the pews. Well, it is all finished now and the building was dedicated on Saturday night. The service was great. There were six saved.

The next morning after the regular service we went down to the river for the baptism. It was an unforgettable thrill and privilege to be able to wade into the water of that same port where God's people had been turned away so many years earlier and baptize 29 young Christians.

The village will never be the same. The darkness of idolatry is still lingering, but the light has started to shine on the horizon. The cathedral still stands tall and menacing on the highest hill overlooking the river, but on the other side of the cemetery now stands a simple wood frame building with a sign in large letters for all to see: Primeira Igreja Batista (First Baptist Church).

The last priest left the village not too long ago, the convent has closed down and only one man remains to carry on the persecution. God's man has moved in, though, and the village knows it! Thanks to God for faithful Baptist missionaries.

May God bless all of you. Thanks for your prayers and financial support.

Greetings once again from the great nation of Brazil. We received letters, Holiday greeting Cards, and some E-mail this month as well as two packages. One came from a couple from the Buffalo Baptist Church in West Virginia, and the other from the folks of the Bible Baptist Church in Harrisburg, Illinois. We appreciate so much your kindness. It is encouraging to us.

We have had a good month. I preached at the Faith Baptist Church in Diamantino where things are going much better, at the Boa Esperanca (Good Hope) Baptist Church and ministered to the Altos do Coxipo Baptist Church here in Tijucal. This month of February I am bringing a series of messages to stress Sanctification in the lives of the members. Next month we plan to go out and distribute tracts with our church's address and schedule of services in the community around the church. Next will come the follow-up visits, then the personal witnessing. We will sow the good seed and wait for the harvest.

We want to call attention to our need for your prayers. We do not like to complain but we have had some difficult times in our work. All is going well but we are not able to expand our work more due to not being able to find an able preacher to take over this present church which has been organized for 2 years now. We have a man who is a lay preacher, but he does not have his personal life in order. His wife is very much against his ministry which makes it impossible for him to be used. It has been our experience that installing some one who is not capable is always detrimental and delays the development of the work even more. We are willing to continue on until furlough time but are earnestly in prayer about this. Would you pray with us that we will be able to find a worker for the Altos do Coxipo Baptist Church this year?

Returning To Peru March 18th ... National Pastor Shot ... Much Work To Do ... Funds Needed For Building Projects ...

Dear Friends,

I didn't get a letter in last month. I was down in Florida for about a month speaking in several churches down there. While many of you were getting twenty inches of snow or more, Anita and I were toughing it out in the Florida sunshine! We arrived back in Kentucky just long enough to see the last of the snow melt away. We were well received by all of the churches we visited while on our southern trip. The Winter Conference at Park Ridge Baptist Church of Gotha, Florida, was a good one. We were with churches in Mississippi, Georgia, and Florida. Thanks to each church that had us.

By the time you get this Mission Sheet, Anita and I will probably be back on the field. We will be returning to Peru the eighteenth of March. Please be much in prayer for us. This is the first time we've ever gone back without the kids. Our children, Leah and Joshua, are both in college now. Anita and I have a lot to do when we return. Our truck must have some body work done and the motor rebuilt. We will be remodeling the small apartment in the Andes mountain town of Huanuco. This is where we will be living for the time being. We have several mission buildings to get underway and we have three groups coming down to visit the mission field this year and we must prepare for them. Busy, busy, busy.

A prayer request: Please pray for one of our national pastors, Pastor Abel Panaifo. He was shot twice in the chest on the 25th of January in the jungle town of Pucallpa. The details that I've received are sketchy but it appears to be a case of "road rage." He was driving his three-wheeled moto-taxi when another one nearly ran into him. When they stopped the other driver pulled out a gun and shot out the Brother Abel's tire. When Able protested the gunman shot him twice in the chest. One of the bullets shattered the bone in his left arm. We're not sure yet if he'll ever regain the full use of that arm. Please pray for his recovery.

The mission works in Lima and Hualar are doing well. We're looking forward to getting back to work with them when we return. Our furlough time has been nice but we are both very anxious to get back to Peru. We have been in several new churches and made a lot of new friends. This is the best furlough we've ever had. You have all been very gracious and hospitable. We hope we've been an encouragement to you and that we've sparked an interest in you to come and see the wonderful things that God is doing in Peru. Remember, you're always welcome. Anita and I would love to have you!

I mentioned that we have several mission buildings that are urgent projects, but we still don't have enough funds to get them started. Please remember the "Stanton Building Fund" in your giving. Until next month ...

Friday, February 13 - At 8:00 a.m. I left our city (Marie had to stay with her Mother) on a Greyhound bus and after changing buses in Cincinnati and Detroit, arrived at 9:30 p.m. at the bus station in Flint, Michigan. Brother Peter Santisteban met me and I was a guest in his home until the following Monday morning.

Saturday afternoon I spoke at a fellowship banquet of the Liberty Missionary Baptist Church where Brother Peter is the Pastor.

Sunday morning and night I preached with liberty (thank you, Lord) at Liberty. Thank you all at Liberty for the generous offerings and the new suit, shirt, socks, and tie that I received and also for the gifts you sent by me to Marie.

Wednesday, February 18 - Tonight I preached the first of five messages at the Northside Baptist Church, Lexington, Kentucky, where Bob Jones is the Pastor. It was their annual Faith Promise Mission Week. The church had another missionary speaker that spoke before I did each service.

Dear Friends,

Don't you just hate it when you find out you've been ripped off? In most cases, I do too. Last night at church we had a visitor come in a little bit late. He sat down and paid attention throughout the whole service. At the end he told us that he enjoyed the service, but wanted us to pray for him. He said that he had just come from the hospital where he was going through treatment for a sickness which affects the immunological system. He also said that he was in the process of overcoming drug abuse. I suggested that we pray for him right then. Several members of the church prayed and then we dismissed formally to fellowship casually. He explained to us that he was a foreigner from Uruguay on his way to see his aging mother who lived in Southern Brazil. He said that he was going to hitchhike there so I took out enough money to buy him a one way ticket to the city where he said his mother lived. He also asked me if I could give him some verses from the Scriptures that would show him how to have peace with God. I shared the gospel with him and gave him a New Testament to take with him on his trip. Right after that, I found out it would be a really short trip! He was a member of a band of Gypsies who were camping just a few blocks from the church. The whole story was just a scam in order to rip off a bunch of lefties.

You may ask, "Am I sorry that I gave him the money and the New Testament?" Let me answer that like this: If I had KNOWN that he was a swindling Gypsy before I had given the money I doubt that I would have given it. But, since I didn't know and I thought that I was truly helping someone in need, I am glad that I did what I did. For at least two reasons: First, the gospel was shared and backed up with action. God may use that seed to stir the heart of the man and bring him to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Second, our church members learned that doing the right thing is always right even if the motives of others aren't. That man will not be able to honestly spread the rumor throughout our neighborhood that our church is only out to get money or that we turned away someone in need. May God have mercy on him and bring him to repentance some day. In the meantime, we aren't going to stop helping people because some of them might be swindlers. If we are going to claim to be followers of Christ then we must obey him. "Give to every man that asks of you; and of him that takes away your goods don't ask for them back." (Luke 6:30)

Our teenagers have been really getting out into the community with the Word. They meet on Saturday afternoons to either share the gospel in the streets or to gather neighborhood youth for sporting events to develop friendships for future evangelistic efforts. We have had a noticeable increase in our meetings and more excitement among our workers because of this increase. I am thankful to the Lord for the level of spiritual maturity and commitment our young people are displaying. Although many like to describe our present generation of teenagers as being worse than those of any other I can honestly say that our youth are more disciplined and dedicated to God than I or any of my friends were at their age.

Our car is still in the shop. Ever since Thanksgiving, when it was hit, the body shop keeps promising that it will only be a few more days. In fact, last Tuesday, the owner told me for the fourth time that the car would be ready by Friday. It may very well be ready on a Friday, but maybe they just forget to specify on which Friday. We are thankful for this old '79 VW van that our friend is loaning us in the meantime. It is very ugly and not completely street legal for children passengers, but it has helped me to get around to do my work. Many of our friends are calling it Swiss Cheese because it is yellow and full of holes. The rust has done a number on it, but driving it helps to keep us humble and I'm sure I'll appreciate my own car more WHEN I get it back.

We are expecting an answer from the judge any day concerning Brennen's adoption. The last word we received was favorable and that there was only a question of backed-up paperwork from the end of the year for everything to be finalized. Continue to pray with us on this issue.
