Preacher Faces Poisonous Snake ... 200 Visitors In One Service ... Coming To States For Short Furlough ...

Dear Brethren,

Last month I told you about Brother Marinho, the crippled preacher who takes care of the congregation at Valquirie. Great things have been happening there, some of them quite frightening. Last week the boys put him down above the mud line (the river is going down right now) and he insisted that he would crawl up those 130 steps. He had only climbed three when he found himself face to face with a surucucú, a very poisonous snake. It was coiled, ready to strike less than 2 feet from his face. He prayed for God's protection then threw himself over backwards. He landed in the mud at the river's edge, but otherwise unharmed. That weekend they had 8 saved and 7 people came confessing sin. Just the week before they had 11 saved. These 2 weekends they took Brother Claudimir along to do the preaching. He is one of our newest preachers. You can imagine how excited he is with all those people being saved. Claudimir is one of the men who went with me on the mission survey trip to Envira. The other young preacher who went on that same trip is Gilson. He is the businessman who takes Marinho up river every weekend. Just this month he was able to buy an aluminum boat and outboard motor for their work. They are now able to get to Valquirie in 50 minutes instead of 4 hours.

Just last week Brother Sebastião Pereira was able to buy an aluminum boat and outboard motor, too. He had been planning for this for a long time. An American missionary was selling a like new boat at a bargain price. I contacted Sebastiao and we closed a deal the next morning. For years you and I supplied the equipment for these missionaries, then we tried to get them to move into their own. It has been a long, hard process, but the Lord has finally made it come together.

We have had some really great services here at First Baptist. Last week we had one service with the building completely full and people standing. This was just our regular Sunday evening service. We must have had almost 200 visitors. Two young people (who missed camp) came confessing sin. There were some 8 to 10 requests for baptism. There were over 15 professions of faith. The reason that I am not real sure about the exact numbers is that our counsellors have not returned all the information yet. It was one of those services when, during the invitation, I was meeting those who were coming down one aisle, but when I turned around, there were several others who had come down from the other side of the building. We have been having a few saved right along, but it had been a few months since we had had one of this kind of services.

Next month we are planning to go to the States for a short furlough. Our reservations are set for March 27. I hope to see many of you at the Spring Conference in Lexington, Kentucky. This time, I would really like to visit your church and report on the work here. Andrew and I are preparing a 15 minute video that you might find interesting. The church where I am serving as Missionary-Pastor has really improved in the Sunday School attendance since the beginning of the year. We had a young man in his 20's make a

Then, at the beginning of March, the Bible Institute resumed classes, with 12 students on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays and 33 for the Wednesday Bible Doctrines class. The other subjects are Personal Evangelism, Leadership, and Old Testament Survey. I teach on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Things are going well at the church, also. Last month I baptized 11. 8 from here and 3 from the City of God mission point. Speaking of that mission, in January we were able to make a down payment on the lot and in May we will have it completely paid for. We deeply appreciate each church and individual that has contributed to this. The attendance there continues to increase. In fact, Wednesday I gave Brother Manuel, our evangelist there, money to make 10 more benches.

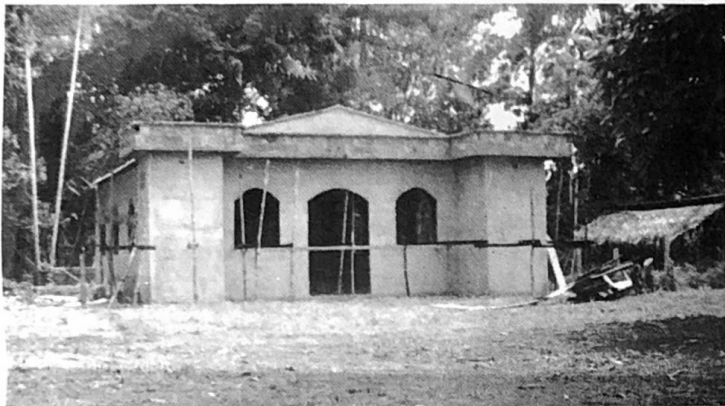
Tonight I will be preaching at the 29th of March Mission, as they are celebrating their 7th anniversary.

The short month of February was only short in number of days. In every other aspect it was jam packed. We had super attendance in our worship services and our monthly Youth Bash was beyond our expectations. I know we should have had higher expectations, but we thank the Lord that He blessed beyond our level of faith anyway.

Our ministers-in-training had their first opportunity to speak publicly this month. I am motivated with the way God has helped them to grow.

Their messages were both interesting and biblical. They have another opportunity coming up in the next few weeks and are already busy with research and preparing their outlines. One young man will be delivering the message at our March Youth Bash. He is a little nervous, which is to be expected, but is looking forward to the privilege.

Edinei, our resident soccer player, and I began our ministry to the adolescent boys of our neighborhood three weeks ago. We had nine boys show up on the first day and have had an increase every Saturday since. We are working with kids who do not attend other churches. Each week we have prayer and a devotional message before practice. We do not obligate the kids to come to church, but we extend an invitation to them and encourage them to do so. The first week we already had a visitor and as we pass through the neighborhood the kids like to point us out to their friends and say that we are their trainers. We pray that this will be a true statement in more than just terms of soccer. The time invested in this ministry is one which would be very difficult (maybe impossible) to have with these kids through any other means. We pray that the seed sown in them will take root and produce fruit in the appropriate time.

I want to take this opportunity to express our deepest gratitude to two churches who have been especially generous to us. Ahava Baptist Church of Plant City, Florida who has time and time again contributed to strengthen our work. Their pastor, Bro. Mike Holliand has on many occasions been a real help to me by encouragement and keeping me supplied with excellent study materials. I have neglected to share our gratitude publicly for this demonstration of brotherly love. The other church is one which we haven't met personally. The Buffalo Baptist Church of Buffalo, West Virginia was so kind as to send us a wonderful gift package through the postal system. I'm not sure if Pastor Tim Day and the members realize how encouraging it is to receive unexpected gifts like that, but they were a real lift to my family and me. On the 24th of March of the year 1927 I was born in the Baptist Hospital in Louisville, Kentucky.

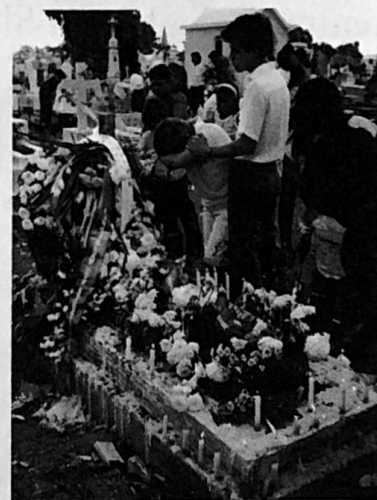
A scene from the cemetery in Manaus . . . "that we sorrow not as others that have no life."

Dear Prayer Partners,

Pam and I continue to thank the Lord for bringing us here to Kenya to serve Him, by sharing the Good News of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. We have had many different kinds of testing while we have been here, and we are sure that we will continue to be tested and tried. Our Lord has been good and faithful to help us through every problem. But we have also had many wonderful and joyous experiences; like when we have had the joy of leading someone to the Lord.

This past weekend, the Lord really blessed us, and this ministry. He has placed us here in Kitale. Last Saturday evening, we had our regular youth meeting down on an open field below our house. We had around 75 children and teens playing all sorts of games like soccer (they call it football here; actually in Swahili, it is called mpira ya miguu), frisbee and ring toss. Then after the game time, we had everyone sit down together on the ground, and they heard a story about an African boy named Wafula, and how he came to know Jesus Christ in a personal way. During the invitation time, one teen-ager, who is 19 years old, raised his hand for salvation. We are thankful that he made a profession of faith in Jesus Christ.

Then on Sunday, we met in our church. It is called Calvary Baptist Church of Kitale. Pam has been teaching in Sunday School; on the very basics about the Bible, and the plan of redemption. This past Sunday, she taught in Swahili, on the "creation of Eve." The children really enjoy the way she teaches, and they love the visuals she uses. They especially like the games she has them to play, when she asks questions to review them on what they have learned from the Bible lesson.

I have been preaching a series on Basic Bible Doctrines in Swahili. This past Sunday, I sang my first solo in church, in Swahili, the song is called, "Yesu Kwetu ni Rafiki" (you would know it as, "What a Friend We Have In Jesus"). It was a joy for us to have over 90 in Sunday School, and around 110 in Church. So our little church is really starting to grow!

Later in the day, we began our first Sunday evening service. It starts at 4:00 p.m. Most of the people here do not have electricity in their homes, so it is best to be home before dark. We showed an evangelistic film, in Swahili, and over 200 people came to see it. At the invitation, 11 people came forward and made a profession of faith in Christ. Pray for these new believers as we try to disciple them.

We are planning, in the future, to begin a Ladies Bible Study. Also in April, we will have our first Vacation Bible School, because the children in the schools here are on the quarterly system. They will be out on break for the whole month of April. Pray for Pam and I, as we minister with the youth for this special week.

We continue to go out on visitation in the homes, and we really enjoy this opportunity to greet new people and to become more familiar with those who attend our church. So we are very pleased that we can be used in so many different ways in the Lord's work here.

NOT 1, NOT 2, NOT 3, BUT 4!

Dear Friends,

No I am not crazy, hazy or lazy. You read it right. We are now in the endeavor of building four church buildings at the same time. You have seen pictures of the one being built in Santa Terezinha. This building should be ready for use by the end of March, even with all the delays and disappointments.

On the eleventh of February I signed a contract for three prefabricated buildings which will include the basic structures and roofs. One is for the work in Nova Fatima where we are meeting in a rented building. Another is in the city of Leopoldo where we are also using a rented building, and the third is in the city of Urai, where presently we are using our house for services. Two of these are structures 32.5 feet by 48.75 feet; one is 65 feet by 48.75 feet.

The total costs of these three structures is \$26,303.00 including the roofing. 40% was paid at the signing of the contracts. The remaining 60% will be paid when the buildings are erected. The target date for completion of the prefab buildings is April 11. This next week we will be busy getting water and electric hookups at each lot as well as leveling the building areas with land graders. After the basic structures are up we will close in the walls, pour the concrete floors, put in the windows, doors, toilets, etc., as we are able. Remember we are not in the jungles. There are strict building codes as in the United States. We cannot build mud huts and bamboo buildings.

Alta and I are committed to this endeavor with all our hearts and parts. We have seen what God had done in the past, what He is doing in the present and we know what He will do in the future. For those who give liberally to the cause, rejoice and God bless. For you who make no special effort, if you would like to help, we would love to have you on board. We cancelled our trip to the States and we cancelled our trip to Manaus to be with our children at the end of the year because God is moving and we want to stay on the crest of the wave.

Marcos and Silvia, along with their nine month old son moved to Nova Fatima today to devote their lives to the work of the Lord. He left a good job and moved by faith. Silvio and his wife, Kelly, have a new baby, six weeks old. This young preacher sells eggs from house to house about three or four hours a day so he can give time to the Lord's work.

Praise the Lord with us for His blessings.

Pray the Lord will give us physical strength and wisdom.

Ask the Lord what He would have you do to help.

Back In Peru . . . Anxious To Move To Huanuco . . . All Works Going Well . . . Needs For Buildings . . .

Dear Friends,

Well, Anita and I finally arrived back in Peru. We had a wonderful furlough. It was great to be with all those that we had the opportunity to visit. Thanks again to each one that opened up your homes, pulpits and hearts to us. It was the best furlough we've ever had in fifteen years as missionaries.

Our return to Peru was an exhausting trip (I think we're getting older) but we made it! We arrived in Peru on March twentieth after an all night flight. Anita became ill on the flight and nearly passed out. She required oxygen to bring her around. She's doing just fine now. We are both adjusting to the extreme heat here in Lima, due to the infamous "El Nino". Our truck is in the repair shop for a complete motor overhaul, body work and paint job. It should be like new when it comes out next week. At least we're hoping for next week; sometimes here in Peru, next week could mean next month! Once the truck is out we're off to the mountains where we'll be living in the town of Huanuco. We are very anxious to get up there and get to work. Of course as soon as we arrive we have to get right into the remodeling of the apartment. This is going to take about one month, with me doing most of the work. After that it's building bunk beds and preparing for the Bible Institute.

A blessing to share with all of you. The churches we visited while on furlough gave us some tremendous love offerings. Anita and I put these back, saving for a Digital Duplicator, (printing machine). I was able to purchase the machine last week, here in Lima, and the manager of the company dropped the price of the machine five hundred dollars! Quite a savings. I was planning on around five thousand eight hundred and it all came to five thousand three hundred! Thanks to all of you for your prayers. This machine will be used for the printing of tracts, books, Sunday School material, and other Christ exalting literature. "Praise the Lord from whom all blessings flow!"

The Jordan Baptist Church out in the central jungle town of Pucallpa has started a new mission work in a village about fifteen miles from town. I hear they are doing quite well. I'll let you know more about this one as I learn more.

Our three works here in Lima are all doing very well. The "Ebenezer" mission in the south of Lima is having around forty in attendance. They've not grown as well as I had hoped but they're doing well. They continue in the small rental house where the pastor lives and where the meetings are held. Please pray that the Lord will open some doors there toward the purchase of a piece of property.

Anita and I will be traveling Sunday, April Fifth, to the town just north of Lima on the Panamerican highway. The town is called Huaral. There we have a work going with Pastor Carlos Gonzales. This is the newest work and they are doing very well. He came by the other day and shared with us how the Lord is blessing there. They're running around sixty in attendance. They've baptized around fifteen and have seven more to be baptized as soon as the river calms down some. (A lot of the rivers are at maximum capacity due to the heavy rains in the mountains. They meet in a little "lean-to" shanty they've constructed. We're going to be staying over night in Huaral and on Monday the sixth I'll be looking for some possible building sites for the work. Yes, another pray request for property. Do you all remember back seven months ago I wrote a long letter explaining why I needed more funds for the "STANTON BUILDING FUND"? Well these are some of the reasons.

We also visited the Iglesia Bautista de Jordan, in the central part of Lima. This is the work we organized two years ago. They are doing quite well in their attendance. They run close to one hundred in the services. They also are in desperate need of a building. The old adobe (mud brick) house they've been meeting in is not adequate any longer for a meeting house. Please pray about some help for a new building for them.

You'll notice there is no phone number in our address above. As soon as we get to Huanuco I'll be getting a phone and I'll have it in the next mission letter. Please take note of our new e-mail address for those of you that work in cyberspace! Anita and I thank all of you again for giving us a great furlough. Please continue to remember us in your prayers and as always we invite you to come and visit with us and see how wonderful the Lord is blessing here in Peru.
