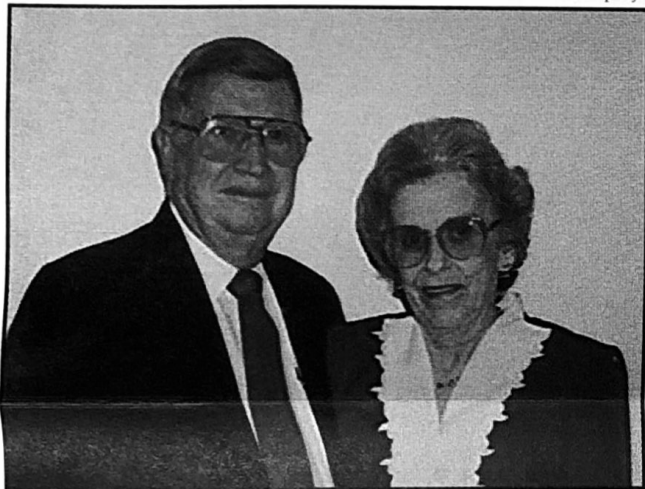

To All Churches Interested in World Wide Missions,
Dear Brethren,

Since Betty and I retired from active work on the mission field a few years ago I have not had the privilege of communicating with you by means of the Mission Sheet. I have been asked by Brother Orrick to write once again to inform all of you about the new work we are undertaking. After working in Brazil for 33 years the Lord lifted the burden to continue there, so we returned to the States. We spent a few months getting settled in what we thought would be our permanent home in South Carolina, but the Lord had other plans, and for the following three years I was pastor of a church in central Florida. After leaving that pastoral we have been very active in the Southside Baptist Church of Winter Haven where we now reside.

At the Thanksgiving Conference last November the directors of Baptist Faith Missions invited me to become their field representative. After more than four months of praying by



the directors and I, it was mutually agreed at the Spring Conference that I should assume that position. Although I am nearly 72 years old and am not too sure just how I should go about the job, I do believe it is the Lord's will for me at this time. I recognize it will only be a success if the Lord blesses giving me strength and open doors to do the job.

The directors of Baptist Faith Missions have recognized for some time now that there is much of the world that we have not reached, and to reach out we must have more men to go and money to support them. The system under which B.F.M. operates is very good, in fact I think it is the best I have ever heard of. One of my jobs will be to inform more churches as to how they can get in on the blessings of this great work.

For several years now the missionaries have been taking shorter furloughs, which does not give them much time to visit many churches. The truth is, many churches have not recently had any of our missionaries in their churches. My desire is that I might represent these missionaries to keep their needs before you as well as keep the churches informed as to the progress of their work. I will also be traveling from time to time to the different mission fields to be better prepared to inform the churches of the work and it's progress.

I am at this time working on a visual presentation, and as soon as it is complete to my satisfaction, Betty and I will be ready to hit the road. If you would like to have us come to your church to present the work you can contact me at any of the above addresses or phone. If you do not contact me, I may contact you. We want to be a blessing to you and your church. We also solicit your advice, recommendations, and help in being able to better serve you as well as reaching more churches and prospective missionaries.

Handicapped Preacher, An Inspiration . . .

Dear Brethren,

Everyone is finally out of school for the summer vacation. Yes, it is summer in the southern hemisphere (rainy season for us) and the school year is also different here. When the year goes well everybody gets a month off in the middle of the school year (July) and then 3 months between years. Usually this is December, January and February. We are taking advantage to teach several short, practical courses. There have been three, so far. The first was 8 classes to help Christians identify their gifts and talents; then put them to use. The second was study skills. The last one is to prepare couples to counsel young couples who are getting ready for marriage. The church has grown and I am behind in training people to help me carry the load.

During this vacation period we are using the Sunday school to beef up the training. We are into our fifth week of a new series to help all members to become more authentic as Christians.

We have had some good reports from our missionaries. One of these is a real example to all of us. Brother Marinho is 53 years old and crippled from the waist down. He comes to

church in a wheel chair. His boys push him around and over all the obstacles. He has been a Christian for a long time, but 3 or 4 years ago God called him to preach. He now takes care of the congregation at Valquirie. To get there he has to go down the river bank, get into a canoe, travel over 3 hours, then crawl up the bank. Now that bank is a challenge for anyone with 2 good legs. He goes up the 130 plus steps that have been carved out of the red clay every weekend without a complaint. Once there, the suffering is just starting. The insects swarm day and night: by day the blood sucking gnats (piuns) and mosquitoes by night. The Lord has really blessed Marinho's efforts though. He began with a small building and a handful of believers. The congregation has grown. The crowds are always over 60 and sometimes as high as 200. They have added to the building, bought a generator, PA system and now are putting in fans. All of this is done without direct or regular financial support from the church. His main helper is a young businessman from our church who carries the financial burden. Gilson also helps in many other ways. It is a joy to watch the Lord put together mission teams and see them in operation.

Well I noticed in the last Mission Sheet that many of my colleagues have put in their e-mail addresses. I just realized that I had not thrown mine in. It was not easy to get on line, nor is it exactly inexpensive from here, but we have been on since May last year. Anyway for those who like to collect such things, here goes: miked@mdnet.com.br. We hope to be in the States for a short furlough as of late March. In fact, hope to see many of you at the Spring conference. During that period we will be away from our computers, but will still try to stay in touch. God bless all of you and thanks for all your support.

Dear Friends,
Greetings from the continent of Africa. April has been an especially busy month for us. We praise the Lord for how He has blessed our church. Since we started our church at the end of this past January, we have grown from 17 in our first service, to an average of over 80 people now. Pam and I have been trying to visit our regular attenders and visitors. We have been discipling some of them, too. Pam continues to enjoy teaching in Sunday School. The youth love the visuals, and also they get very excited when she plays Bible games at the end of each class. She quizzes the youth on what they learned from the lesson.

I have been preaching a series of messages on essential Baptist doctrines. We hope to organize into a New Testament Baptist Church next month. Last Sunday, we had about 40 people who expressed an interest in becoming charter members of Calvary Baptist Church of Kitale. I plan to teach a new believers' class on the meaning of salvation, the importance of baptism, and what it means to be a church member, before they actually qualify to be a part of the church family. This past Sunday, I preached on the Christian's responsibility to tithe.

Pam and I enjoyed having Youth Week, from April 13-17. It is like Vacation Bible School in the States. The children and teens were on break most of the month of April. So, since we do not have a building big enough, a public school near us allowed us to use their buildings. The school is very run down, because there is no glass in any of the windows. Some of the buildings did not even have doors, and most of the desks were in need of repair too! Our church used the school, despite these problems, and the children and youth had a great time. We averaged around 100 young people each of the 5 days. Six people from the church helped us during the week. Pam taught on the "Life of Joseph," and I taught about the "Wordless Book." Pam taught her class to make and perform some Christian songs with sock puppets. Our teens practiced and acted out the drama on the "Life of Joseph" without any assistance from us. All those in the Youth Week performed in our closing program on the following Sunday night. All those children and teens that memorized the 4 assigned Bible verses, and attended every day, were awarded a special t-shirt that was given to us by Dr. Ricardo Fujilawa and his church in Garca, Brazil. Mike and Patti Barnette, who are members of Buffalo Baptist Church in Buffalo, West Virginia, donated many of the craft items that we used during the week. Also, our home Church, Calvary Baptist Church of Hurricane, West Virginia, donated socks and other items to make sock puppets. At the end of the week, I gave an invitation, and several teens and older children made professions of faith in Christ. Praise the Lord! We plan to disciple these new believers too.

Pam and I were also in two of the public schools in Kitale with our African pastor before the school break. We were able to have a meeting during their school assembly. We are thankful that they allowed us to pass out Gospel of John and Romans booklets that Pastor Charles Lybrook's church, the Waverly Road Baptist Church in Huntington, West Virginia, donated to us. There is much more freedom to share the Gospel message in Kenyan schools, than in the States. We hope to minister in many more of the public schools in the future, Lord willing.

Last Saturday, we had a leadership retreat at our landlord's farm outside of town. We had a good time discussing plans for the church.

Pam and I have plans to return to the States at the end of May. Our son, Nathan, will be graduating from Cedarville College, and our daughter, Sara, will be getting married, both in the month of June. While we are in the States, Pam will need to get a couple of additional treatments for her eye problem again. We do not plan to return to Kenya until early January of 1999. So, we also plan to visit and report concerning our ministry activities to our family, friends, and supporters. If you would like us to come to your church, we would love to personally share our burden for the people of Kenya with you. We have a special prayer request. If anyone has an extra vehicle that we could use, or an affordable used vehicle that we could lease or purchase while we are on furlough, we would greatly appreciate it. Please let us know as soon as possible.

Thank you for your interest in the Lord's work here in Kenya. We deeply appreciate many of you who have written to encourage us, and say that you are praying for us. It is a pleasure for us to serve the Lord together with you. As you know, without your faithful support, it would be very difficult to serve our Lord here in Kenya.

May our Lord's continued grace, peace and mercy be upon you.

Well, Anita and I are in Huanuco. The Andes Mountains are beautiful and the weather here is just perfect! We praise the Lord for His blessings! Our truck came out of the shop in Lima on the tenth of April and we were able to make the trip to Huanuco a few days later. During the trip we traveled over the highest road in the Andes Mountains. It is over seventeen thousand feet at the highest point. We take a portable oxygen bottle and that helps keep us from getting sick or passing out. We arrived safely in Huanuco on the fourteenth of April.

Once we arrived we began to immediately start the work of fixing up the small apartment where we'll be living. Knocking out walls, putting in a new bathroom, installing hot water, etc.; all of these things are taking time. We've been living in the midst of construction, with all the dust and dirt, for about two weeks now. It looks like we've got about one month to go. Anita and I are still living out of boxes and suitcases. It's slow but we keep telling ourselves how nice it will be when we're done. Thanks for your prayers.

Dear Friends,

May 1, 1998

It is a real pleasure to write to you about the month of April. Charlene and I celebrated our eighteenth wedding anniversary! We were invited to attend a wedding on that night, which we attended and the romantic atmosphere only added to the joy we already felt. God has been so good to me to have blessed me with such a marvelous wife.

The month was also fruitful in the ministries. We baptized four on the third Sunday of the month. One other candidate was not allowed to be baptized by her father. He had prohibited her from doing so several months back then changed his mind when his wife wanted to be baptized, but at the last minute, he changed his mind and only let his wife. We are praying that he will not only allow his daughter to be baptized, but that he also will be saved and baptized in the near future.

Last Sunday night we had a unique experience in our evening worship service. About fifteen minutes before the end of my message a colorfully dressed Gypsy woman entered the auditorium and started walking all around kneeling about ten different times and mumbling in a low voice. Her behavior was very bizarre for a sane person and I suspected de-

monic influence. At the end of the service I went to speak to the woman and asked if I could help. She said that she was being perturbed by evil spirits and wanted me to pray for her. I asked if she understood about needing a Savior and if she knew who could save her. She told me that all of her brothers were evangelicals (I'm not sure what she meant) and that she knew that only God could save her. When I asked her if she knew how God saved a sinner, she said that it was by His son's death on the cross. I noticed, though, that she was unable to say the name Jesus. She would refer to Him in various ways, but would not (or could not) say His name. As I pressed her more toward this area she began to change the subject and wanted me to take her home. I refused and she left in a huff. She was carrying a Bible and in it was a list of Bible verses explaining how one might come to know Jesus as Lord and Savior. I suggested to her to read these verses and to make the decision to repent and trust Christ. I'm sure that I didn't handle the situation perfectly, but I thank God for the opportunity to share His word of salvation with someone who is in need.

Our youth soccer ministry is doing very well. So far our victories have been spiritual and not on the scoreboard. We have around 18 to 20 boys ages 10 to 14 and they seem to be very interested in everything we have to share. Some of them have started coming to our regular church service as a result. We pray that God will use this effort to bring some of them to know Christ. Our young men who are heading up this ministry are challenged by the opportunity to influence kids who would not otherwise attend church services.

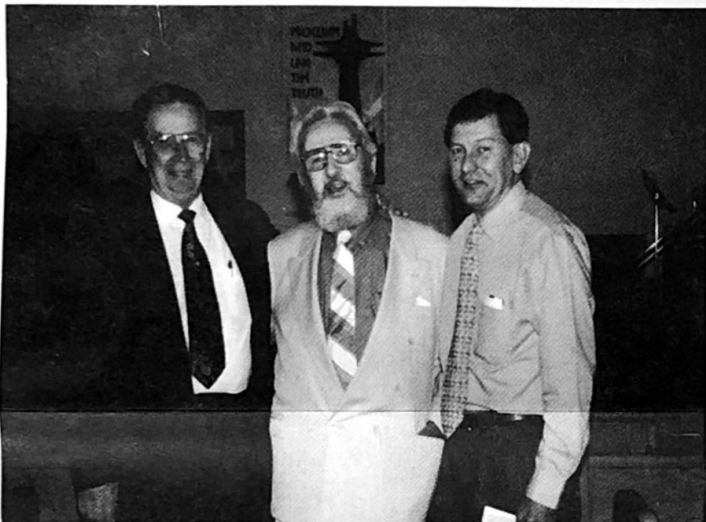

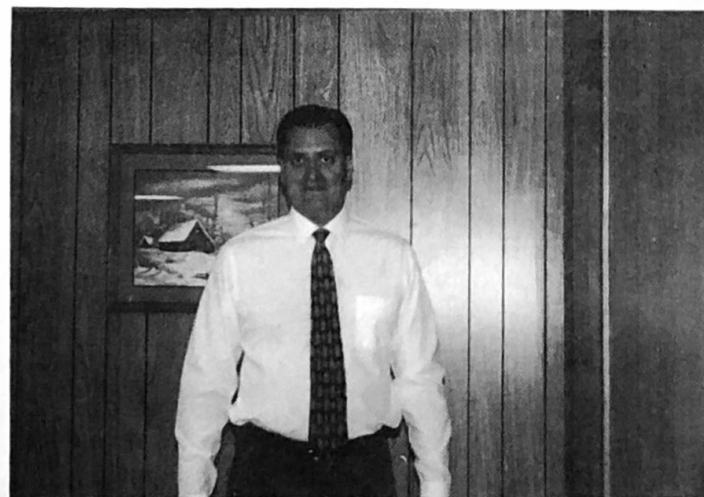

It's going to be a short while before I can start the Institute again because of the building situation. But the Lord knows what is best for us so we must go at His pace!

Pastor Carlos Estabridis of the Ebenezer Mission in Lima called today and reported that he baptized two adults yesterday. I've not heard from the other works in Pucallpa or Huaral yet because we just got our phone hooked up last week. I'm scheduled to go to Pucallpa next week and help in the organization of the "Tierra Roja" Baptist Mission. This mission has been under the authority of the Faith Baptist Church of Pucallpa since its beginning nearly ten years ago. I'm sure I'll have more to report next month from the other works. Remember us in your prayers. Anita and I are looking forward to the arrival of our pastor, George Sledd, and his son the end of this month. Pray that they'll have a good trip.

There is still such a great need for funds for building projects; Huaral, two in Lima, Pucallpa, Iquitos and here in Huanuco. Please remember the "Stanton Building Fund" as well as the "General Fund" of Baptist Faith Missions. Until next month.
