Dear Christian Brothers and Sisters,

The Spring Conference at Thompson Baptist Road Church was absolutely great! With BFM voting to receive Barbara and I as your newest missionaries, that just made it the most awesome week I have ever experienced. This just proves a very important point, "When there is a need in the life of one of God's children, God has already prepared the heart of another of His children to meet that need and to share in the blessing." We have spent six months in Brazil in 1997 and have experienced the needs there and Praise God we can go back on May 18 and help meet those needs. This is because BFM is helping us to do so. Isn't God awesome? We are looking forward to many years of service in Brasil with BFM.

In January of 1996 I took an early retirement from the Lexington Fire Department. At that time Barbara and I had plans to winter down south in Florida and come back home for the summer months. But God had greater plans for us than we could ever imagine. Yes, we are still wintering down south but much farther south-all the way to Brasil. We have already spent our first 6 months there and are preparing for our second 6 months (this amount of time is because we do not have our permanent visas yet).

The past two weeks have been truly busy, we have been going to Cincinnati four days a week for intense Portuguese classes, working construction and preparing for our

return to Brasil. Now we are in the last four weeks here in the States and the pace has increased. Our schedule is full up to the day before we depart on May 18. We are enjoying our time here with family and friends but at the same time our hearts long to be in Brasil with the children and the work. This busy schedule helps since we cannot be in two places at one time.


Just a word or two about our work in Brasil: We are working there with Pastor Odali Barros and his wife Kathy in Garca Brasil. The plans for this work began several years ago while we were on a Sunday school outing. We began talking about the millions of children that were living on the streets in Brasil and Odali's dream to have a home for children. For those of you who are unfamiliar with Brasil's problems with street children, there are 7-10 million of them. You can begin to see the need for homes and the influence of a Christian family. If we can meet these needs; hunger, shelter, absence of pain and of abuse, then we can share God's love with them and let God do the rest. We began to put that dream in place two years ago with petitions for donations to build a four home unit on farm land outside of Garca. We still have the sketches we drew that night on hotel stationery. Our part in this work has changed many times since we arrived in Brasil, but the biggest change came after we returned to the States. The Children's Home has experienced an awesome growth, not only with an incredible number of children but God has moved our dream from the farm to the city. We have been offered a 300 bed abandoned mental hospital for \$300 per month, with the option to purchase pending Brazilian government approval. This has pushed our plans forward at least 30 years. By this I mean we have all the room we need, we just have to do some remodeling not totally construct four homes. You know when God does something He does it on a grand scale!!

Can we make a difference? We believe so. Our beginning is in Garca Brasil with the Alpha & Omega Children's Home. Please pray for the children we already have and those God is preparing to give to us.



Dear Friends,




January, 1999, then we plan to fly back to Kenya. During this time, we hope to visit many of our family, friends, and supporting churches so we can report on the ministry here in Kenya. If you would like us to visit you or your church while we are in the States, please let us know.

The Lord has blessed our ministry, especially in the last three months. Since our last letter, we have started a new church in the town of Kitale, in western Kenya. The church is called Calvary Baptist Church. Our first service was held on January 25th, and there were 17 people in attendance. We, and our Kenyan pastor, Pastor Hesbon Isinga, have been involved in visitation, planning, and ministering in the services. Easter Sunday, we had over 80 people in attendance. This past Sunday, we had over 125 people who attended both Sunday services. Praise the Lord for the many who have been reached with the Gospel of our Lord. Several people have professed faith in the Lord Jesus Christ recently. We have a big job ahead of us to disciple and train these new believers.

This past week, we had a Vacation Bible School for the young people in our church. We had the VBS at this time, because the schools here in Kenya are on the quarterly system, and so they are out for most of the month of April. We averaged over 100 kids each of the 5 days, and we had 7 adult helpers from our church to assist us. Pam

taught a series of lessons on the "Life of Joseph" and I taught a series of lessons on the "Wordless Book." I taught on a different color each day that explained a step in the plan of salvation.

During craft time, the different age groups did different things. Pam had her kids make sock puppets with button eyes. They performed with their puppets and sang 3 Christian songs during our closing service, this past Sunday night. I had my class make "Wordless Book Bracelets." Our teens practiced and performed a drama on the "Life of Joseph" and did a really good job. They wrote the script themselves, and it was very Biblical. We discovered that we have some "budding" actors and actresses. As (Please See Anderson Page Two)

Dear Brethren:
Another month has rapidly passed us by into eternity. His mercy is sufficient, as He is our Strength and Shield.

On Easter Sunday, the ladies prepared a special breakfast, serving over 350. Then there were over 500 present in the service. I baptized 11; being 8 from here and 3 from the City of God mission. Then we sat at the Lord's Table. It was a wonderful morning. That evening, among the several that made professions of faith, was a 45 year old muslim man born in Lebanon; Ibrahim Toghbi. He owns a bakery. Pray for him as he grows in the faith. Before he met the Lord, he had been contemplating suicide. On Friday and Saturday before Easter Sunday, I preached at the Cidade Nova Baptist Church. There were some seven professions of faith.

There is a lot of sickness here at this time. Over half of our congregation has had dengue; a very strong cold with high fever, diarrhea, body aches, etc. I had most of these symptoms for over a week. Then after being better for 3 and a half days, everything started again, with the added insult of hiccups. Finally after seeing 3 doctors, exams and medication, the hiccups went away (after 8 days). I am leaving for the States early tomorrow morning.

The building at Amatari is ready for the windows and doors. We have ordered these and hope to have them installed by the beginning of next month. At the City of God mission, Brother Manuel finished the benches and will be working this week on plastering the inside walls. We appreciate each special offering for these buildings and lots. A special thanks from the brethren at Amatari to the Lake Road Baptist Church in Michigan and dear Brother Doug Armstrong.

Continue to pray and give so that we may keep "keeping on" for Him until He sees fit. In His service, The A. M. Bratchers

Dear Brethren: May 28, 1998
In last month's letter I related that I had preached 17 sermons and heard 19. During this Mission Sheet month, I preached 9 and heard 4. This was from May 5th until today, May 28th.

May 8 - This afternoon I left Richmond, Kentucky, and drove to Joe Prewitt and Peggy Sallee's house in Seveirville, Tennessee, where I spent the night.

May 10 - This a.m. and p.m. I preached at the Gists Creek Baptist Church where William E. (Bill) Stephens, Jr., is the Pastor. The invitation to preach at Gists Creek came through Joe Prewitt Sallee who was a young boy and member at Newby Baptist Church, Madison County, some 40 odd years ago. It was a blessing to be with him and his wife and to renew old memories and to be in his church and to know his pastor and fellow members.

May 15 - Marie and I met Asa Bratcher, our son, at the Lexington, Kentucky airport. He came to the U.S.A. from Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil, South America, due to some health problems. From the airport we drove to Frankfort to Charles and Reva Bratcher's residence arriving there around 5:30 p.m.

May 16 - At seven thirty-five a.m., I left Richmond and drove to Mr. Grant Fox's house. I left my car at his house and he took me to the bus station. I rode the bus to Chicago, Illinois. Brother Stanley Keys met me at the bus station and took me to his home for the night.

May 17 - This morning and afternoon I preached at the East Maine Baptist Church, Niles, Illinois. The church is without a pastor. Lewis Maples was the Pastor for many years until his death a few years ago.

May 17 - Early this morning I left the home of Robert Rossman with Brother Edward Overbey where we both had spent the night. I rode with Brother Overbey back to Lexington, Kentucky.

May 24 - This morning I began a revival meeting at the Clarksville Baptist Church, Richmond, Kentucky, where Bradley Johns is the Pastor. The meeting will continue through Sunday night May 31st.

May 26 - Asa Mark arrived at Mrs. Flossie Moore's trailer around 5:00 p.m. Marie and I took him to a restaurant for supper. He will arrive back in Manaus Thursday morning, the Lord willing. He is going back, he believes, with his health problems resolved.

May 28 - As we look back over the happenings during this Mission Sheet month, we give thanks to the Lord for the many blessings He has bestowed upon us. Also we thank the Lord for the kindness shown to us by each pastor and person whose name is mentioned in this letter. May the Lord bless you all is our prayer. Also we thank C. Marion Greenwell of Morganfield, Kentucky, for the photos he took of us and others at the Calvary Baptist Church, Uniontown, Kentucky, on Sunday morning, May 3rd.

Thus, my blessed beloved brothers we ask you to continue to pray for us and give to Baptist Faith Missions.

I concluded my last lesson on the "Wordless Book," I challenged the youth to put their trust in Christ. Several of the youth received Jesus Christ as their personal Savior at the invitation.

Since starting our church, I have been preaching a series on Basic Bible Doctrines. I have also been sharing the pulpit with our African pastor. Pam has been teaching a series on the "Creation" in Sunday School. Please pray for us as we continue to learn to minister more effectively, using the Swahili language.

Life in Kenya continues to be a challenge with water shortages and electrical power outages. We have to take extra precautions, like boiling our water, and sleeping under a mosquito net, because of outbreaks of cholera, typhoid and malaria. Our African pastor's wife has been sick with typhoid and malaria for the last few weeks. Please pray for Mary Isinga during this time of sickness.

A few weeks ago, we were in Nairobi trying to get the registration and the license plates for our vehicle. While we were there, they had a student demonstration in the streets. There were cars burned, tear gas, and even gun shots. Because of all the student unrest, we had to drive way out of our way to avoid the troubled areas. Traffic was really terrible that day! We are so thankful for God's protection. We really keep our "guardian angel" busy when we drive on the Kenyan roads. Many people use the roads as a side walk. Drivers have to dodge bicyclers, assorted animals, pot holes (sometimes even craters!), unpainted speed bumps and "turbulent" dirt roads.

Oh, if you are wondering? We finally did get our vehicle registered, and we did get our license plates. The whole process of ordering our used vehicle from start to finish, took us around 15 months!

Pam's eyes, unfortunately, are going back to the way they were before her eye treatments last December. Please continue to pray for the complete healing of Pam's eyes. If not, then pray that the Lord would give her continued grace to endure this affliction with her eyes.

Pam and I are very grateful for your faithful support and prayers of this African ministry. We count it a privilege to be co-laborers with you as we serve our Lord together.

May our Lord continue to bless and keep you in His perfect will. Looking forward to seeing many of you soon, Lord willing.

Dear Brethren,

Greetings from Brazil. I'm sure all of you are enjoying the warmer weather. Here we have had a cold spell in the 60's and 70's and we are all freezing. We will be going to Bolivia for a short time this month and expect to see some 40 degree weather. It will be an exploratory trip. We live close to the border and have never been there. We stay pretty much glued to our work here in the State of Mato Grosso. Michelle will be out of school on the 22nd. We are all looking forward to this break. It enables us to travel to the other works as a family.

I preached at 3 of our works this month. When we preached in Varzea Grande 6 people came forward. Some for prayer, one for baptism and one was saved. It was a high service. I just got back from the church in Novo Diamantino. I preached there on Friday night with a good number of people present. I took them a chalk board to use in Sunday School. In July we have invited a young preacher and family to come preach a weekend meeting in view of a call at that church. Also he will be preaching a weekend meeting for us at the Altos do Coxipo Baptist Church.

Right now I am in earnest prayer about two things in particular in our ministry here. First, we are being attacked by the Pentecostals through our young people. Two of our young boys who are about 16 years old who have grown up under our ministry are being courted by the Assembly of God group. They are impressed by the so-called "Espirituality" they see manifest there. I am trying to show them the truth. Pray with us that we will be used to help them not go into heresy. Second, I now have 3 men in this church who say they are called to preach. The most capable preacher has a wife that is very worldly and rebellious. I've decided he may never be used as pastor if the Lord does not intervene. Another is young and immature. He is trying to grow and we are giving him all the support possible. The third is more mature but only has been saved for 2 years. I may leave the church with him next year when we come home for furlough. Pray with us about this.

April 30, 1998

We have been in the States for a month now. We got in in time to be at the Spring Missions Conference in Lexington, Kentucky. It had been years since we attended one of the missions conferences. The conference was really 100% missions. Exciting! I hope that this is the start of a new direction and thrust for missions among our supporting churches. Thanks to the churches and pastors who worked so hard to make it all possible.

We have visited several churches already. I won't bore you with the list. Thanks to all of you.

The week before we left home the services were great. The crowds were larger than average. Several people made professions of faith. Some of these people were saved in our home.

One couple who trusted Christ in our living room had just moved to our town from east Brazil. They married very young. They came from opposite sides of families who have long standing political feuds. These feuds are serious; shootings and tons of hatred. They now have three children, but also marital problems. We met them through some of our members who were aware of the problems and recommended they talk to us. We (Bev and I) worked with them through their problems, but also witnessed to them. They trusted Christ on Saturday night. On Sunday morning they made a public profession of faith at church, and I didn't even give an invitation. They have already been baptized.

The last Sunday at home I baptized 40 more new members.

We have had some more good news from the field. I will share some at a later date.

Dear Friends,

May 19, 1998

Yesterday we received notice that my brother-in-law, Wick Wood, married to my sister Neree, went to be with the Lord on May 16. Wick and Neree have been faithful and generous partners in our new works. They have sent many gifts for our work through Baptist Faith Missions. Several years ago they came to visit us while we lived in Garca. After retirement they worked for a year in the Baptist Village, a Baptist camp and conference complex in northern Israel close to Tel Aviv. They have four children, all serving the Lord. Blessed are those who die in the Lord.

Fifteen professions of faith

This month there have been nine young people and children who professed to trust Christ as Saviour in Cornelio Procopio; there were three in the new work at Ranch Alegre. Three men of the crew who came to mount the prefabs made professions of faith in Nova Fatima where Marcos is pastor. He invited them to the Wednesday night service, they came and three trusted Jesus.



These four people were recently baptized in the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Cornelio Procopio.

They left all and followed Jesus

In our church we have four families, all of which have been saved, baptized and taught through the work here in Cornelio. This month two of these couples with children left all of their guaranteed income to serve the Lord fully. Silvio and Kelly had already left permanent jobs to serve the Lord. He sells eggs from house to house to make expenses. Everson and Marcia are another couple completely dedicated to the Lord. She left her job this month and Everson works in his own car body shop. They give their time to God's work. Look for great and marvelous blessings of God on these servants and their families. Put their names up where you can remember to pray for them.

Marcos and Silvia

Marcos quit his well paying employment and moved with his wife and one year old son to the city of Nova Fatima. He is selling eggs for house to house about two days a week. He is making 1,000 visits each month to make known their work and to reach people for the Lord. Does the Lord recognize faith? Two weeks ago a church here in Brazil sent them \$160. Last week an individual sent them almost \$200. This is a new work and one of the places that a new building is being built. (It is a prefab and today, at this moment, they are putting on the roofing.) Pray for this couple and pray for God's blessings on this work.

Valdir and Sonia

Valdir and Sonia had a grocery store. After being saved they decided they would not sell any alcoholic drinks. Later, they took out the tobacco products. On April 30th they closed their store to give full time to the Lord's work. Two weeks later a man came to Valdir and asked him to carry workers for the coffee bean harvest. One hour in the early morning and one hour in the evening with a very good recompense. The rest of the time he has for doing the Lord's work. He has been helping me in a part of the construction work. He helps buy materials and supervises the work and takes nothing in return.

Four Buildings

The three prefabs are mounted and tomorrow the last will be roofed, the Lord willing. They are lovely structures and we will try to get some pictures to you by next month. These buildings will have to be floored, closed in, windows and doors mounted as well as making electric and sanitation installations. I close this letter with a reminder to let each of you know, who have prayed and given, that we thank you with all our heart.
