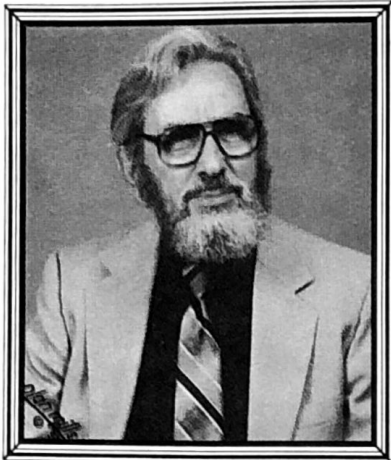

A TRIBUTE TO SIDNEY FISHER



Brother Sidney Fisher, *Pastor Emeritus*
 1911 - 1998

"THESE ALL DIED IN THE FAITH"

Brother Sidney Fisher was 40 years old when I was born, so he was quite a few years my senior. I would not meet him for at least another 21 years. But he became to me one of those "great cloud of witnesses" who not only pointed out the way, but showed us how to walk it.

He and Sister Fisher had no biological children of their own, but they doted on the children of their close friends. My wife's family were among those close friends. The Fishers loved my wife and her brothers from the time they were born, and when I began coming around our Conferences and Churches, they took a liking to me also. Debbie says "they prayed us together" as husband and wife.

Both Brother and Sister Fisher were lovely people and very dear to us. We "adopted" them as our "parents" and Mrs. Fisher, especially, would always beam with pleasure when we called her "Mom Fisher." Brother Fisher always reached out to children and showered them with special affection and attention, not only in their own church's ministry, but when he visited other churches also.

God gifted Brother Fisher with the ability to think incisively and express God's truth poignantly. When he preached, he would say things in such a way that he would insist that you listen, pay attention, and remember what he said. And, his messages always had that "one thing we should do" as the life application of knowing that truth.

Just since he has passed on to Glory, others have related testimonies to me how God brought them to services where Brother Fisher was preaching, and they heard him maybe for the first time, but the whole course of their faith and life was changed by the truth, power, and pointedness of his message.

But what I will probably remember about Brother Fisher more than anything else was his patience, gentleness, kindness, and moderation. He spoke the truth in love. His speech was always with grace, seasoned with salt. He aged gracefully and gracefully, and the older he got, the more easily one could get along with him. He delighted to help and encourage others and build them up. He maintained that sweetness of spirit, and even humor, right up until his death. He was willing to change, to grow, and to adapt to the ever new challenges of communicating the Gospel of Jesus Christ, not only to

the nations, but to his neighbors, acquaintances, and the strangers he met. Just ten weeks ago, the 87 year old veteran shared with us his personal resolve to be a better missionary and witness for the Lord Jesus. We not only celebrate our memories of him, but we also glory in his hope. He inspired us by the way he lived and aged, and then finally by the way he died. He rejoiced in his faith in Jesus Christ. He knew whom he had believed. He aspired to go to Heaven. He longed to enter into the fullness of his promised inheritance and reward. He wanted to see Jesus' face . . . in person. He was willing and even glad to die for the same faith he had lived for. He ministered encouragement to those of us who were privileged to visit him during his dying days. Those of us who are still very much in the fight and the fray of our Gospel witness have been strengthened to continue earnestly and confidently in our service for Jesus Christ and mission. Consider the outcome of his way of life and imitate his faith. If an old man still in his right mind, knowing whom he has served and what he has given his life for is willing to step from this life to that which is to come - and do it with such joy and anticipation - then we who still live can "be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that our labor in the Lord is not in vain."

Dear Friends,

We arrived here Tuesday May the 19th and have not looked up since. The building God has provided for the Children's Home is more AWESOME than we could have ever imagined, though there is lots of work to be done to it, we are getting along fine. Odali and Kathy live in one of the wings and we live in another. We have 10 boys in our wing but that could change any minute. These 10 are not all the kids we have, this is just the number we have in our care. We set the table for 31 people daily, then we have drop-ins at every meal. Two weeks ago we got SIX new kids in one day. You may ask how we get these people; well it is all by word of mouth, some one tells others how their grandson or other relative has been helped here and that is how it works.

You see we are not only a home for children with no parents but also a home for street kids and for children whom their parents cannot control. Continue to pray for us that God will continue to give us the insight as to reaching each one He sends our way.

We have been blessed in June with visitors from the States, on the 9th we had 27 kids and adults from Ashland Avenue Baptist Church in Lexington, KY, here with us. They accomplished much in the short time they were here, they helped do repairs on three of our mission points and also worked on the building here. They also had a program they did for various groups and they led 37 people to know Jesus as their savior. Isn't it something what God can do with a group of teenagers who are willing to give their time and money to come to the Mission field to work for Him!!

We are always looking for people who would like to visit and the excuse of having no room is invalid because we have room and bed space for 200 people at one time. So answer the call and "Come on down".

After the dust settled we brought our Tuesday night group back to meeting at our house and the first thing we did was to begin a visitation program. There will be 27 teenagers and young adults doing visitation this week. We have a problem, more people are wanting to join and we are running out of space in our living room, isn't it wonderful to have such a problem!! But in a building the size of this one space is not a problem, just the time and money to get electricity to another part of the building with bigger rooms. Also this week we will be starting a group for the young married couples, with an emphasis on church service. Pray with us that God touches their hearts as He has touched the teenagers. Pray for us as we try to do our best for "The Master."

Dear Friends,

Sorry I missed you last month and hope that you missed reading us. Thought I had sent a letter but evidently it got there too late to go to press. The Lord has given us a great month.

Services in two new cities. Everson and Marcia have been visiting on Saturdays in the city of Santa Mariana. On the third day of visits they found a family who wanted to have services in their home. Today, will be the second service. They are looking for a lot to buy or a house to rent. Everson and Marcia are now working in three places. Marcos, who lives and leads the work in Nova Fatima, has visited in the city of Congoinhas. On his second day of visits he, also, found a home where they could have services. This makes ten areas that are now being reached with the Gospel.

New building to be inaugurated June 24th. Painting is almost finished, windows are in, doors are hung and the Lord willing, the house will be full on the night of June 24th. This is the new building at Santa Terezinha, where a little over two years ago the work was begun with meetings in the street.

Roofs on the three prefabs. All of the three prefabs are roofed and ready for the floors to be poured and the walls to be built. Metal forms which can be used in all the new buildings are being made and, the Lord willing, by the end of July the building in Urai will be well advanced.

Our sincere thanks to God and to you who are giving. \$50,000 has been spent in the last three or four years in the purchase of lots, houses and buildings in our work here. This is not a little job. Your help is vital and we sincerely thank you who have given. Some give regularly each month for the new works. Others give special offerings. We thank each of you. Special thanks to the Spring Missionary Conference in Lexington to Thompson Road Baptist Church for the offerings given for new works. To pastors Dave Parks and Tim Doss, who host the conference, our sincere gratitude.

The war never ends. We are committed to building a permanent building in every new city in which we start a work. This means that there are already two more buildings needed. In the last 23 years there have been works opened in 21 different places and cities. Nineteen of these have permanent buildings. There are 28 millions of persons living in the two States where these 21 works have been started. The field of harvest has barely been touched. To begin two new works, with facilities, every twelve months is the very least we should do. We need missionaries. We need money for buildings. We need people who will pray. What part will you commit to God?

New help has arrived. Brother Alex Hensley, BFM's newest missionary, (Welcome aboard, A. J.) lives in Garca and works with Odali and Kathy. Alex is a builder. He came to visit us in Urai and we are making plans for finishing the prefabs. He is enthused and so are we. He is committed to the building of new buildings. Pray for him. There is no limit to what God can do.

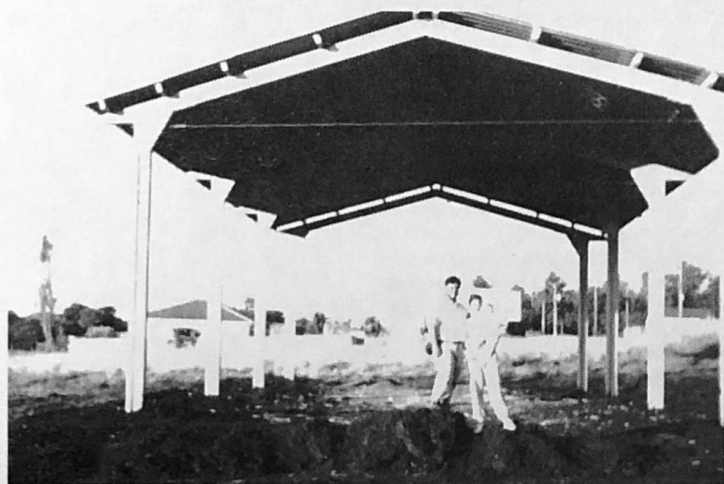

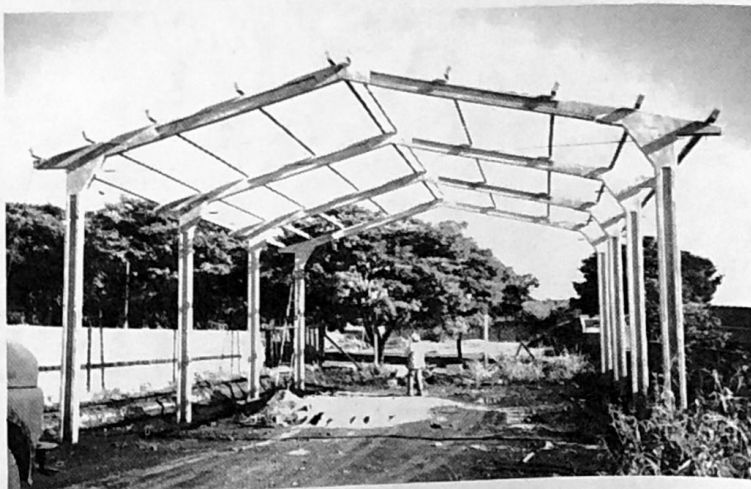
Four New Buildings



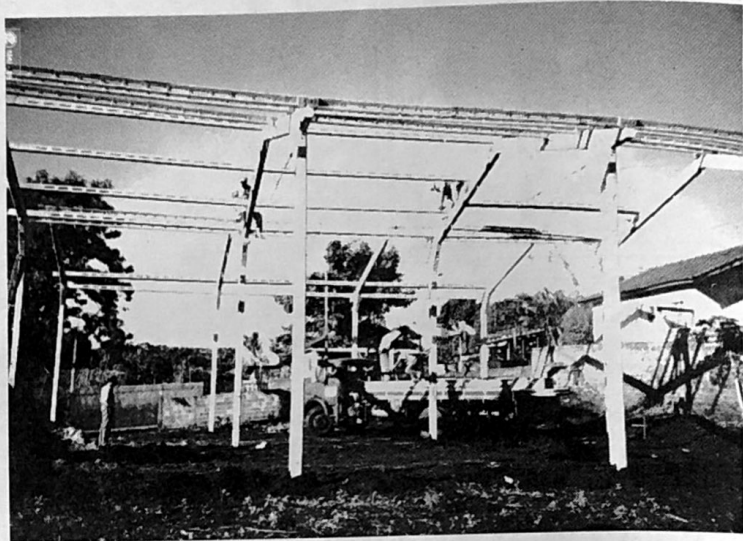
This is the new building at Santa Terezinha. In foreground you see the ramp and stairs that lead to the auditorium with seating capacity of 120 persons. Built on very declining land, this part was built with foundation that supports two more stories. In the future there can be built another floor for educational space and on top, an auditorium to seat 300 persons.



This prefab is located in the city of Nova Fatima, twenty miles from Cornelio Procopio. It is built on a beautiful lot with space for enlargement. This building will have four rooms for Sunday School and an auditorium with capacity for 100 persons.



Here you see the strongly built prefab structure of the building in Urai. This is on the front of the lot which measures 45.5 feet by 195 feet. It is the same size as the building in Nova Fatima.



The largest building is in Leopoldina. This lot is 81 feet by 163 feet. The building has a capacity of 300 people. The width of the lot made it possible to put the building sideways and the second part was built for 30% less.

Pray for these works. In forty-three years on the mission field we have found that the blessing of a good permanent building is greatest asset for a new work. If you have not had a part in these there is still time and there are many more to be built.

July 2, 1998

We have been in the U. S. for nearly four eventful weeks. And what events they have been. The kids got some kind of virus that causes vomiting, the battery, alternator and head gasket on my car went out in one week, I pulled a shoulder muscle (ha, ha, you thought I didn't have any muscles, didn't you?), and the roaches didn't want to let us move into our trailer. There were a few days that Charlene and I discussed getting back

on the plane to return to Brazil. We were wondering if maybe we had misread God's will for timing on returning for our furlough. Now we have learned that the trials helped us to focus our minds more completely on the Lord. We need Him as much in the U.S.A. as we did in Brazil. He has given us peace of mind in the midst of the struggles and we know that He'll see us through them.

We received a marvelous letter from the folks back in Cuitiba and I'll translate a portion of it to give you an update of the work there.

"Bobby, all the works progress as the Lord wills. We have visitors at almost every service as many of them keep returning. It is clear that God is in control and is blessing. In spite of the intensely cold weather the children come regularly to the Bible School. I wish you could be here to see how well the young preachers are working together to prepare their sermons and lessons. They help one another; their messages have been very inspiring. The attendance at the Saturday night youth meetings has increased and some of the youth who were less dedicated have improved. We started a Junior choir and we now have ten adolescents participating. They come to all the practices and their families have started attending worship services as a result.

Your absence has caused us all to realize how much we must depend upon the Lord. All the leaders are becoming united like a family. We are praying for you, Charlene, Jessie and Brennen and ask that you remember to do the same for us."

So folks, as you can see, God is truly blessing our brothers and sisters in Brazil. We are looking forward to being with you and sharing about this work. You may contact us at the above address and/or phone number.

May 3, 1998

I am writing earlier this month because we will be traveling most of the month next door in Bolivia. We will be doing some sightseeing and checking out the possibility of future mission work in this neighboring country. Pray for us as this poverty stricken country is both beautiful and can be a bit risky. They just had a bad earthquake in one of the areas we plan to visit.

Our work is going well. This has been a month of sowing without a lot of visible results. We had a special service this past Saturday night with 250 people present. About 200 were lost people who came to the Birthday service of one of our young girls who completed her 15th birthday. Here when a girl turns 15 she is considered to have entered into young womanhood and if her parents can afford it they have a big party. In Christian families this usually becomes a church service with cake etc. afterwards, which was the case this time.

We want to again thank all who support our work and the work of BFM. These are trying times financially here in Brazil but the Lord takes care of us real good. So far this year we haven't had too many doctor bills. We pray this will continue.

I will close and give a fuller report next month. May the Lord bless all of you.

June 30, 1998

In last month's letter I related that I had preached 9 sermons and heard 4. During this Mission Sheet month, I preached 18 and heard 9. This was from May 28th until today, June 30th.

May 24 - May 31 - This morning I began a revival meeting at the Clarksville Baptist Church, Richmond, Kentucky, where Bradley Johns is the pastor. The meeting continued through Sunday night, May 31st.

June 1 - At 15:00 or 3:00 P.M., I left Richmond, Kentucky on a Greyhound Bus and arrived the next morning on a Greyhound at the Gotha, Florida bus station. Stephen Bratcher met me and took me to the Central Baptist Church, later on to his home. He, with his wife, Salete and son, Stephen Matthew, were my hosts for 3 days. That night I attended Stephen's graduation program from Kindergarten. Wednesday night I preached at the Central Baptist Church where Andy Bloom is the pastor.

Dear Friends,

July 1, 1998

Anita and I send your greetings from the beautiful, Andes Mountain town of Huanuco. The Lord continues to bless us in many ways. Our pastor, George Sledd, and his son Timothy were with us for two weeks and we really enjoyed having them. We have visitors scheduled to be with us every week until the middle of August. Praise the Lord! We love company! A friend of Anita's is with us at this time. She will be here until next week. After her, another missionary friend and his family will be with us for a few days. Three days later we go to Lima to receive the group of ten coming from the Storm's Creek Baptist Church. They are coming to help on some construction work we have going on. Another group of fifteen come in the very day the Storm's Creek group leave!

I baptized four this past Sunday in one of the coldest mountain streams I have ever been in. I've been preaching for twenty-six years now and I've baptized hundreds of people but that was the coldest water I've ever been in!! It took an hour for my feet to thaw out! I just hope the four that were baptized don't catch pneumonia and die! We've seen five more trust Christ as their savior this past month also. A lot of folks are coming forward, repenting of sin, and reconciling with their churches. It's an exciting time here in Peru!

We received notice of the death of Brother Sidney Fisher, a great soldier of the Cross, and a personal friend. Anita and I were saddened at first to hear the news, and we send our condolences to his family and other friends, especially those of the Waverly Road Baptist Church. Brother David Parks sent me the news first and told me that he had been to visit Brother Fisher and that he had said, "I'm ready to die by the same faith that we lived by all these years!" What a testimony for us all. It inspired me to preach a message last Sunday titled, "The Faith of Our Fathers." I used Brother Fisher's statement mentioned above, as the theme of the message. One young man was saved and four others came forward repenting of sin and asking for prayer that they might have the same type of faith as Brother Fisher. Even in death, he still speaks!!! I'm sure he has received his crown and is enjoying his time with the Lord!

Remember to pray for us please! The devil fights us at every turn. Our electric meter was stolen this morning about 6:00 A.M. We thought it was a blackout. (Common occurrence here in Peru). However, as we got up and got moving we discovered some thief had pried the meter box open, cut the wires and then took off with the meter! Pray for the soul of that thief I would like to find him some day and tell him about the love of Jesus. Until next month.

June 4, 1998

Five more souls have trusted Christ this past month. I've been preaching in three different works here in Huanuco and it seems in every service folks are making decisions to follow Christ. I'll be baptizing four in a few weeks. It's an exciting time for us here in the beautiful Andes Mountain town of Huanuco. Anita and I thank you for your prayers.

I travel to Lima tomorrow to meet my Pastor, Brother George Sledd, and his son Tim. They're coming for two weeks to visit the works here in Peru. Both the Ebenezer Mission in Lima and the Faith Mission in Huaral are under the authority of our home church in Sanford, Florida. I go to Lima about every six weeks to check on the works and encourage them. It will be great to have Brother Sledd with me this time.

The work on the apartment in Huanuco is about done; just a few small things to finish up. We moved back in a few days ago. We are now cleaning and getting the furniture in place. When I get back from Lima in four or five days we start full force on the rooms for the Bible Institute. As I told you in the last letter, we'll be in construction most all of this year and maybe into next. Please continue to give to the STANTON BUILDING FUND. Several of you have been giving faithfully to this but we're praying for more of you to help out also. The work must go forward, not stand still. Pray about helping, won't you?

Many of you have asked about our children since we've been back in Peru. Leah (20) and Josh (19) finished this past semester on the Dean's list again at Berea College. They are on summer break right now and both are working at a restaurant in Berea. They get a good salary, two meals a day and tips. Not bad for college kids. Anita and I miss them a lot but E-mail helps us to keep in touch almost daily. We hope to have the money to be able to bring them to Peru for the Christmas holidays. Please remember them in your prayers as well as Anita and me.

We have a group of teenagers from the Storms Creek Baptist Church in Ironton, Ohio, coming down in July. We are looking forward to their arrival also. Until next month.
