Hello from sunny southern California ... yes ... California! We're home on furlough, though not by choice. The government of Brazil kicked Brenda out, again. As most of you already know, we all have permanent visas to live in Brazil . . . all of us except Brenda. When our opportunity to receive permanent visas came due in 1994, Brenda was here in the states for medical reasons and could not sign for her visa. Because she is an adult the Brazil-

The solution of the standard s 18th of last month to finish up a discipleship class I was teaching and to hold an evangelism camp and then I joined my family here in California.

Brenda cannot go back to Brazil until 1999 and then she can only stay six months and she will have to leave again. So we are trying to get the Brazilian Consulate in Los Angeles to help us obtain a visa for Brenda. Please pray that they will cooperate with us. We have enrolled the kids in a Christian school and will be staying here in southern Cali-

fornia for at least the next 2 months while we work on Brenda's visa, then we hope to travel back to Kentucky. Dear Brethren, October 30, 1998 As many of you know, every year we take a group of doctors, dentists and nurses on a mission trip that begins at the Peruvian border. The regular month for this trip is May. This year I was in the States in May and the folks down south who work with us on this project were not ready at that

time, so the trip was postponed until October. This was the best trip ever. We have been doing this for 4 years running. The best part is always seeing more people saved. Next to that, is knowing that we have also helped them with their health needs. For me, the guy that has to have the vision and do the planning of this kind of project, there were a number of added blessings, though

First, we were able to take a doctor, dentist and nurse from our home church. The first 3 years all the professionals came from other churches in south Brazil. We take 2 doctors, 2 dentists and 2 nurses every year to work these clinics. This year half of the team came out of our church! The Missionary Aviation Fellowship (MAF) pilot, Paul Backman, who does the flying for us, also attends our church, along with his wife Beth and 3 children. The clinics that we do here have been such a success and so well organized that ours has become the standard and model for those conducted all over Brazil. That's not me bragging. The presidebt of MAF told me this last Wednesday! Praise God!

There are many hardships on these trips. There are bone chilling rains and searing sunny days. There are muddy river banks up and down which we must carry heavy loads of medicine and equipment. Dear Friends, November 2, 1998 I just got off the phone with our people down in Curitiba, Brazil. The report that they gave is really motivating! Let me share the highlights with you. There have been some new faces in the services and several have

begun to attend regularly. I was especially happy to hear how much the leaders have taken upon themselves to do without asking or expecting to get advice from me as to how they should implement new ministries. I am looking forward to the fellowship that we will have when we return, but as a fellowlaborer and not as their pastor. I plan to start some new mission points in different neighbor-

hoods and I believe that several of those workers will be joining me as we reach out to establish new churches together.

Our resident professional soccer player is back for the off-season. He has finished his first year on an adult league team and is now back at our church. The little soccer school that he and I founded last year to reach unchurched kids in our city is still in operation and he will return to coach there until he receives word about future playing opportunities. To be honest, I hope that he isn't drafted to a top contending team next year. That way he'll be staying in our church year round. But I have learned that, like one's children, it is best to let them face their own decisions once they've grown. I trust that God will show him the right way. If he doesn't follow God's guidance the Lord knows how to discipline better than I do. The evangelism through that ministry is so exciting because those 30 boys would not be attending church through conventional means. Remember to pray for Edinei and Fernando as they lead that ministry.

I have been studying at Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, since August and boy has it been challenging! I hope that the difficulties are because of the heavy load that I'm taking and not because of an aging mind. I never imagined that I would have to spend so many hours to keep up with the assignments, but I believe the benefits will be worth it. Most of the professors are very gifted and have a passion for God and those who are lost. I was certain of the Lord's guidance in my decision to come study here, and I can already see much of what He wanted me to learn. As a result of what I'm learning we hope to be more effective in ministry upon our return to Brazil.

Charlene is recuperating from foot surgery a week ago. She had been suffering for several months thinking that she had a bunion. After the pain got continually worse, she knew that it was not something that was going to get better by itself. The x-rays showed that the big toe was dislocated and fractured. The surgery went well, but she will be limited in her activities for several months. Pray for her because she has to depend on me to help around the house and make sure she doesn't go hungry.

I am really excited about the upcoming Thanksgiving Conference! Plan to be there and take as many youth as you can. I'm praying that God will be working in a special way to stir our young people to serve in missions. I trust that He will give the speakers messages blessed by the Holy Spirit to touch hearts and to burden pastors, youth layleaders to participate in missions and evangelism like we have never seen. I have been blessed to hear and speak to missionaries who are seeing God do a marvelous work in many parts of the world. Our Baptist Faith Missionaries are included. It is evident that God is accomplishing a work that far exceeds anything that we could have imagined only ten years ago. I want to be on the cutting edge of what He is doing. One of the greatest truths of the Bible is to learn that God has decreed to include us, His people, in His plan to bring others to know Him. He could have done it any way that He chose, and He did! I'm thankful and want to be useful as He desires me to be. Please make an efforr to be at the conference. Encourage your pastor and youth to go also. I trust that you'll be blessed there.

biting/stinging kind. Food, not exactly your average southern home cooking. Drinking water? Trips in a small plane over miles of virgin jungle, amidst clouds of a menacing nature. Landings into dirt strips that are definitely not Dallas-Fort Worth. Long, long river trips-rain or shine-mostly both, this time of year.

It is just great though, when you see people lining up to see a doctor or dentist, after months with no access at all to such things as a real live loving Christian doctor and free medicine. The wooden school house is a hospital during the day. At night it becomes a church building. With just the light of the open flame of a kerosene lamp I play and sing hymns with the same people. I preach Christ to them. The children sit on the floor in rows right at my feet. The adults sit at the school desks. This was our third year at Foz do Breu (mouth of the Breu River) on the Peruvian border.

The first night I told them the story of the Phillipian jailor. As I tell the part about the earthquake, I shake the table where my Bible and flashlight sit. The flashlight crashes to the floor and I blow out the light. Do you suppose that they get taken up by the story? Later at the close I ask, "What must I do to be saved?" They know the answer. As one, all those children and many adults respond, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved."

The next night is John 3:14 and I tell them the story about the snakes in the desert. Two little girls (about 10 or 11 years old) will never forget this sad and frightening Bible story. As I describe the snakes coming out of the sand and slithering into the tents, my hand and arm becomes a snake. It bends and twists slowly toward one of them. She shudders involuntarily. I figure the snake better not bite her. It turns suddenly and bites the arm of the one next to her. Believe me, it may not have been less real than if it had been a real snake. She knew it was coming, but couldn't help the shock. The comparison is carried to the New Testament and Christ being lifted up to take away the venom of our sin today.

Six more people were saved at Foz do Breu.

The clinics continued as we made our way down river. A shuttle flight was made between Breu ann Thaumaturgo. Some of us went to Pedra Pintada one afternoon, just down river from Breu. I also took the canoe leg with 3 other team members from Foz do Breu to Thaumaturgo. It took us 9 and a half hours. The same trip with an outboard motor takes just 2 hours. It takes 15 minutes by plane. Of course if you go by plane you can't quite carry as big a load and can't stop anywhere in between. I really do need that boat and motor that I have been talking about for the past months. Pray and please give a special offering.

This year we also got an invitation to visit the Ashaninka Indian tribe in the Amônia River. They asked us to bring the dentists, but said they didn't need our doctors. They have their own kind of doctors! Only the chief and his family speak Portuguese. He listened closely to the presentation of the Gospel. He said that most people that visit his tribe have other motives that are not always clear. He thanked us for our frankness. The doctor on this leg of the trip was born a Buddhist in China, later saved during med school in Brazil. Oh, yes, we did go ahead and take in a doctor-just in case. The racial similarity between the South American Indians and Orientals seemed to help. Doctor Shiu took care of 55 patients that same day. We now have a standing invitation to return.

Well I could go on and on, but must stop somewhere or the editor might not be able to print this. Rejoice with us. Pray for us. Be used by God to supply our needs. In Christ,

Exciting News From The Interior ... National Brethren Hard At Work ... Dear Brethren, September 10, 1998

Things are back to normal around here. Last month I was still trying to get the Jeep and other equipment back to good running conditions. Just about everything is working again. Bev's microwave gave up the ghost, but the Lord's work will probably survive without it.

I was able to visit a few churches and congregations in the interior this month. The first visit was to the church at Lagoinha (near camp). They are doing well and have reactivated the mission at Campinas. They are getting ready to rebuild. We also had a preacher's meeting there a few weeks ago. We had a really good turnout: over 40 preachers and workers.

My next visit was to our congregation at Santa Rosa. During the next few months I will be going there to do some teaching. We are praying about organizing the church there. The congregation has grown and made a good impact on the community. Four of our men from First Baptist Church have been working there for the past five or more years. These men and their families will probably be charter members when we organize. We have an aggreement that they will go on down the road to São Pedro and start a new mission. They have also offered to help strengthen the work at Rodrigues Alves. We already have a full time missionary there - Edson Lopes. He needs the boost that these more experienced men can give. Anyway I am teaching about the origin, nature, function and responsibility of the church. We had over 60 present for the first lesson.

Finally, I visited our church at Colōnia São Francisco - Calvary Baptist. Brother João de Deus (John of God is his nickname) is pastor there. The crowds are growing. We had over 100 people on a Sunday evening. I helped them with a baptism. Five more were added to the church. One of these was an elderly man who had persecuted for years. He said he wanted me to perform his baptism, so I was honored.

I have resumed the recording of the TV program. Pastor João Vicente had taken care of this while I was in the States.

We have continued to have small numbers of folks saved each week. Crowds at some services are down though. The country is in an uproar that leads up to general elections. This and World Cup soccer always hurt our attendance. Both occur back to back every four years.

Summer is almost over and it will soon be time to get back to river travel. I still don't have a boat and motor. Pastor, please lead your church to give a special offering. Church member, ask your pastor when your church will be taking up the special offering for the motor and boat. The last boat you helped me buy lasted for 16 years. This may be the last time I ever ask you to do this. I am now 50 years old. If the new boat lasts as long as the other one, then I would be 66! By God's grace, it is conceivable that I would still be out running up and down the river at 66.
