WHY I SUPPORT THE MISSIONARIES OF B.F.M.

By Edward H. Overbey

I have been supporting B.F.M. from the beginning until now. I was 17 when I gave my first offering to B.F.M. on Sunday, December 7, 1941, Pearl Harbor Day. The first issue of the Mission Sheets came out in January of 1942 and my offering was listed among the first givers to B. F. M. I have continued through the years to support the work, generally through the church of which I was a member.

Why do I support B.F.M.? Briefly I support B.F.M. because it is doctrinally sound and it is run honestly and efficiently. This was emphasized when B.F.M. began. I gave my first offering because I believed it when I was 17 and I still know this to be true.

To be more specific, I support B.F.M. be-

1. All Money Received is Handled Honestly. Every giver is given a private receipt and a public receipt. The public receipt is given on the fourth page of the Mission Sheets each month. <u>This is not a financial</u> report, but a public receipt. This enables all to know how much in offerings came in each month, where they came from and what must be accounted for. A private receipt alone is not enough. There is a financial report given at the Spring Conference. It is printed and given to all who want it. It is explained in a meeting at the conference. Explanations are given of all money received and expenditures made during the year. Questions are answered. Business is carried on honestly and above board.

2. All Money is Used in a Very Efficient Way. All expenses are kept to a minimum so that every dime possible goes to the mission field to support our missionaries. Everything done is to help the missionary have more time to do mission work. The only overhead expenses are absolutely necessary overhead expenses. They are long distance phone calls for our missionaries, paper, envelopes, stamps, the Mission Sheets. These average about 3 pennies for every dollar that comes in. These are absolutely necessary expenses for the missionary to do his work If the missionary did all this on his own, he would have to make necessary long distance phone calls, buy more stamps, envelopes, paper, print his mission letter, mail it out, etc., to keep in contact with his supporters. The cost to him multiplied by the same number of missionaries B.F.M. has would figure out about the same amount it costs B.F.M., if they could do it as efficiently. Our overhead is necessary overhead and it is very low. If each missionary had to do this for himself, he would have less time to do his mission work

3. All of Our Missionaries are Sound in the Faith. All of our missionaries stand for the whole Counsel of God. Each was sent as a Missionary on the authority of a Baptist Church. They are sound Baptists who desire to win people to Christ, baptize them, teach them to observe all things Jesus taught. They organize their converts into New Testament Baptist Churches. They not only have a desire to preach the Gospel to all and urge them to trust Christ, but they believe that God has an eternal plan and that all who do trust Christ as their Saviour were chosen by God before the foundation of the world to be saved for no reason other than the good pleasure of His will. The salvation of a soul is not an accident, but according to God's plan and God's plan is all of Grace.

All of our missionaries believe baptism is the immersion of a believer to picture what Christ has done for him and it is to be administered on the authority of a New Testament Baptist Church. They do not believe baptism saves or helps to save. They believe a New Testament church is a local and visible assembly of those who have trusted Christ as their personal Saviour and who are scripturally baptized. They do not believe the New Testament teaches an invisible uni-

They believe Jesus started the first New Testament Church during His ministry and these kinds of churches have continued in history until now and will continue until Jesus comes again. They believe in the ver-bal inspiration of the Bible, the Deity of Christ, His virgin birth, His Substitutionary death on the cross, His literal resurrection from the dead and His second coming in power and great glory and much more. They believe in the whole Counsel of God.

It is really great to be home and see our family and friends. Also to meet and make new friends as we travel from church to church. It is truly amazing that after only a week or so here in the States how we have started to miss our other home and our other family.

Speaking of our other home I would like to tell you about the Alpha

and Omega Children's Home. Or perhaps more to the point about one or two of the children there. As you can tell by the name, Alpha and Omega Children's Home,

we are not just a home for orphans but we are a home for children with problems. When I say problem children I mean children who are in trouble with the law, in trouble at home, or in trouble at school. One of the questions we hear most is "How do you get the children for your home?" Well we get them several ways, the Judge in our town sends them to us, the social workers send them, also Pastors in the towns around us, and parents, grandparents, and other family members bring them to us. Some even bring themselves! Two of those who have brought themselves are Edwardo and Caio. One of these young men just has no home life. He began by just coming and spending the day with us to play with our boys and have a good meal. Then he began to spend the night, then to stay longer and longer and to our amazement no one came looking for him. We checked at his home and no one seemed to care that he was not at home so we allowed him to stay. When his mother finally decided she wanted him home he did not want to go. By that time his grandparents had contacted us and offered to sign papers so we could keep him because they said the only reason the mother wanted him back was to get money on him at the first of the month and then she didn't care what happened to him after that. So Caio is now with us permanently. The other young man has a college education and a good home but he got mixed up with the wrong crowd and got involved with crack cocaine. One Sunday morning he showed up on our doorstep and told Odali that he needed help and he knew this was the place to come. I am happy to report that he is in full recovery and is a very productive member in our home. Not only does he work there at the Home he is very active in our Church with the Ministry Team, the Visitation teams and the band.

It is truly AWESOME what God can do in lives--if we will only submit to His will!!!

Come down and you too can see these things as they happen and be a part of what God is doing here in Brazil. As you can see from the photo there is no lack of space for visitors for God has given us much space and all that is lacking now is YOU!!!!!

Dear Friends,

January 4, 1999

I have successfully finished one semester at Seminary and will begin the second in about three weeks. The heavy study load was a challenge at times (a threat at others) and I gleaned some material that will be a big help to our work when we return. Charlene has had some great courses too, and even with her surgery interfering, kept her grades very high.

with our people down in Brazil and was thrilled to hear how well the ministries are progressing. Two weeks ago they held a special evangelistic meeting and had a large turnout of first time visitors. The workers gathered information and will be following up on the visitors to encourage them to keep returning. I was happy to hear that Fernando, one of our young ministers, did the invitations (flyers printed up by computer). I donated my computer to the church there when I received another one here. We will be starting new works when we return, and we wanted that church to have the tools to keep up the ministries. Fernando has been taking a computer course for a few months and should be able to help the church considerably as he learns to use it.

We have been in the U.S. for six months and the work has continually grown. It is clearly evident that it is time for us to begin new works. We have a neighborhood called Diaderma in mind that appears to be wide open. We surveyed this neighborhood a few months before we left Brazil and could not find a single Baptist Church although the population is over 40,000. The young ministers that we instructed at the Training Center will be working with us to start home Bible studies and evangelistic meetings. We don't have a building yet, but we believe that we can get started in someone's home first. One option that we are considering is to place one of our own people in a house within the neighborhood and use that as our starting point. This option gives us several advantages. One is that they will be able to witness to their neighbors daily and let them see their Christian walk in everyday life. Another is that less money is necessary to get a work started. As the work develops then we will be able to search for a suitable location to build a church building

God has blessed us with some dynamic Christian workers and we are looking forward to a really productive term when we go back in June. The studies here at Southern Seminary have opened my eyes to some ways to improve our own approach to ministries and we've got a larger picture of what God is doing around the world. I, personally, have been guilty of thinking too small when He has no limits to what can be done when our ways are surrendered to Him. Pray for us to be better servants and to be bold in our faith.

Several More People Saved Here... Still Need Funds For Boat and Motor... Charismatic Groups Trying To Oust Baptists...

As promised last month I want to try to get you caught up on the "routine" things that have been going on here

tine" things that have been going on here.

We just had an annual report from our missionary at large, Brother Raimundo Vieira. Last year he made 23 river trips and held 123 services. There was about one person saved per service over all. He also built 2 more buildings in 2 tributaries of the Juruá River.

Last month we had several more saved here at First Baptist and one of our best services was held on Christmas night. The building was packed. The Governor and his family were present for this service. There were 3 people saved that night. Our New Year's service was just as fantastic. We had 13 special songs by that many groups. We also took up an offering of \$3,000.00. The service was so fast paced (3 hours +) that I only had 25 minutes to preach.

Two days later I was in São Paulo with Odali Barros at their camp. Seeing and participating at their children's home was a real blessing. I taught each night to a group that averaged over 150. It rained the whole time I was there, so all the activities ended up being indoors. The meeting hall is a few yards removed from the rest of the complex, but fortunately the rains eased up every evening. I was also privileged to preach at the Garca Baptist Church on Saturday and Sunday. The people there are just great. The trip was actually a good rest for me, even though my cell phone was going constantly to Cruzeiro do Sul and Manaus, trying to keep things running. To get there was also quite a marathon. It took me over 30 hours each way. Still it was restful and refreshing to see the wonderful job that Odali, Kathy and their team is doing with over 50 street kids.

Several churches and individuals have already sent in offerings toward the boat and motor for our work. Thanks so much for each and every one. Hopefully by next month this time we will be able to get the boat. Several trips have been postponed and others are scheduled for the coming months, so please continue to pray and give. Thanks so much.

Let me share one more victory before I close. There is a huge charismatic group that originated here in Brazil that calls themselves the Universal Church of the Kingdom of God. They are of the faith movement, what we call prosperity theology. If you just have enough faith you will be beautiful, healthy and wealthy. This is very popular in third world nations, where people see themselves as uglier, sicker and poorer. This cult has spread all over Brazil like wildfire. They have a huge following in all the larger cities and even in several countries overseas. They do look first for places with easy money and that is what they are all about. For this last reason they took quite a while to come to Cruzeiro do Sul, but they did eventually come. The first move is to rent the biggest and best building in the middle of town. The next move is on the media. Cruzeiro do Sul was no different. After they got the building they bought time on TV and bumped the regular Baptists off of the radio. Their latest tactic is to get a building as close to a Baptist church as possible and get the Baptists off the air.

Well we have this little ongoing campaign of prayer against all the cults and false religions. Our whole church goes down a list every day asking God to shut them down. Guess what. We bumped them off the radio! Our daily program from 11:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. was expanded to 12:00. We took over their half hour. Our program goes out on AM, FM and medium wavelengths. We go by their building at "church" time every week and they are only having 5 or 6 people. God has been answering our prayers. Of course our people are also very busy witnessing to as many as they can. We just put up a tract rack a few weeks ago and we can't keep it stocked.

Time to go. Please continue to pray for us and participate in our work here. God bless all of you richly.
