We plan to come to the States the end of May or first part of June for Ursula to have her surgery. We will visit family and take care of her health for the first month or so. During this time we will be in western Kentucky and will visit some churches in the area. Pray for us as we seek the right man to take care of the church here in our absence.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is awesome to go home and much different because I now have two places to call home. As we leave the States we really miss our family, friends, and the things we generally take for granted - air conditioning, a vehicle you can start without pushing, and going around the corner to get a Big Mac. But as we arrive here to our other home we know why we leave the States and those conveniences; our new family here (the children), our new friends and the work that God has called us to do. When you see this all the inconveniences fade into the background.

When we left the States it was around 30 to 40 degrees. Our first week here I sun burnt my head and it hurts to brush my hair. You see it is 90 degrees in the shade here. This has required some adjustment because in this temperature your body just does not function as fast as you are used to.

Looking at all these transitions you can see how truly awesome our God really is. Within two weeks we have just about gotten the house set back up. The children are on summer break so we are having many activities for them, softball, basketball, volleyball, soccer, and swimming. They are really taking to softball. They ask for it more often than the other activities.

There were a few new faces here when we arrived and more and more it seems they are getting younger and younger. There were four new faces here that truly were God sent. This was the new family that are here to help in the work. He is a cook and she is a teacher. They have two children who fit right in with our kids. Both of these professions are really needed and they both are great with the children. We are continuing our Saturday visitation at each of our 7 mission points. The Lord is blessing in a special way. The first week 17 people accepted Christ as their Savior, the second week there was 30, and last weekend, 46. How awesome! The fields are truly white unto harvest here. Our visitation teams are made up of 4 old men (I am one) and six teenagers. Each week we have more and more people wanting to join the teams. I hardly know how to tell you how it feels to be a part of something so awesome.

The main Church here in Garca is doing great. The membership is getting into serving and it is a blessing to watch them grow spiritually and to see them seek God's will in this service.

We have 54 children today and each one seems to need your love and attention. Each one is special and is a tale to be told. We have a boy named Paulo Henrique and he is 13 years old. He cannot read or write and he came to us through the judicial system. He had so many charges against him that the judge gave him the choice of coming here or going to jail. He has been with us for about 6 months now and last week he and Odali went to court and all the charges were dropped against him. This school year our new teacher will begin his classes here at home. Also last week his family was present at church and his brother accepted Christ as his Savior. Doesn't God work things around in mysterious ways? The other boy is Luiz Antonio. His parents were separated for 5 years because his father was an alcoholic. Odali gave the father a job and he got his life straight. Because of this his wife decided to give their marriage another chance. She and the four children are here now also. So I guess you could say that we help children in many various ways.

Here are some prayer requests that we ask you to take to God with us; pray for Odali and Kathy as we work here with them, the children, their needs, and the changes that are taking place in their lives, our language improvement, and the insight to be better stewards.

As we returned this year a friend from Ashland Avenue Baptist Church came with us. Glen Tolson is taking a sabbatical from his work to spend some time here working with the children. He has been a blessing already and God is using him in a great way in the visitation program.

Again we can only say "What an awesome God we serve."

Dear Brethren,

March 1, 1999

Where to begin? Probably with: Thank you. Many churches and friends have responded to our need for a boat and motor. If all goes well, my next trips should be made in the new boat. The offerings have come in quickly and have been most generous. My last trip was 3 weeks ago. I went to visit our congregation at a place called Tartaruga on the Valparaíso River. My daughter Crissy and another girl from church went with me. Elizanete is daughter to the missionary who takes care of the work at Tartaruga. We made this trip in my aluminum canoe with 15HP outboard. Before we ever pushed away from shore it started raining cats and dogs. The girls wrapped up in a tarp and stayed fairly dry. I, on the other hand, was sitting completely exposed, driving in a driving rain. It rained the first 3 and a half hours to the mouth of the Valparaíso River. Fortunately it let up for the last hour and a half up the Valparaíso! Believe me, the new boat with a windshield and hopefully a top, will be very welcome. The visit was good though. Large crowds. It had been 5 years since my last visit there. The work here is so big and scattered that it takes forever to get around and make these visits. There are many mission points that our preachers have opened that I have never visited! On the trip back, we had one of those rare sunny days in the middle of our rainy season. We burned a little even though we had sun screen on. Rain going and sun coming. Thanks for those offerings.

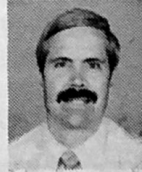
Two weeks ago we had our regular youth camp during Carnaval. This was camp number 22 in that many years. Of course, we have other camps during the year, but this is the one that has all the tradition. The number of kids to sign up was off the scale! We had kids fighting to pay in advance to make sure their slot was secure. We opened up for 70, ended up taking 75, and turned away not telling how many. We had 14 staff members to help this year, so in all we had 89 people. Actually some of our staff had to take their little ones, so there were more than the 89 mentioned. This camp, in my estimation, was the best we have ever had. It was definitely the easiest to handle. The road is now paved all the way, so transportation was a snap. I had a group of teens working with me for 2 weeks in advance to make the facilities ready. There were 3 other couples and a few teens to work a staff this time. They really took a load off of me. The financial part is still tough. Each teen paid about \$20.00 (R\$30.00), but I still ended up putting about \$700.00 from my own pocket. I'm not complaining though. Each night after activities I was up to as late as 3:00 a.m. counseling, as were other staff members. This year we had 6 teams of 12 members each. There were plenty of activities to score points and also the group devotions morning and evening. Camp Salem was buzzing for 4 days. Our main activity in the evening is always the Bible study time. This year we designated Bible stories and themes to our staff to produce plays. The plays were enacted in the middle of the "Casa Grande" (our main meeting hall) instead of on the stage. The teens were in a big circle around the actors. After each play we had open debate. The plays were: Amnon and Tamar (Turning off after illicit sex); The Prodigal Son (the lure of material things and getting back home); Absalom (rebellion). The debates went past 11:00 p.m. every night. The kids really opened up. It was really neat to hear the applause for the comments of those who, though young, are so wise. It was good, too, to see the tears after

Dear Friends,

March 2, 1999

Greetings from Kitale! The weather here has been hot and dry. The Kenyans say that there has been hardly any rain here since last November. So many have prayed for rain. Thank the Lord, in the past few days, we have been having some much needed rain.

Since we have returned from the States, our time here has been full of activities. Each day seems to go by in a blur! At the beginning of February, we did get away for a few days to pray. While we were away, I had the opportunity to lead a man to the Lord named Smith Likare. It was a joy for us to share the good news of the Gospel with him. We have already sent him some discipleship materials.

Pam and I had to go into Nairobi to do some business. While we were there, we went by to see the American Embassy that was bombed by radical Muslims last August. So much had changed since we saw our embassy last. It was the scene of a great tragedy. Please pray for the many victims, and their families. Also, pray that the Muslim agenda to wipe out Christianity in Africa would be stopped.

One of the biggest disappointments of the ministry is when we put our trust in someone, and they take advantage of us. We left an African pastor in charge while we were on furlough in the States. We found out that the pastor had not been loyal to us or to the members of the church, and had deceived so many people. We received many complaints about him. After praying and talking with the church leadership, we all decided to discipline him by removing him as pastor. Later, the church voted to remove him, as well.

The next week this pastor went out and hired a lawyer to sue us! Pray for us because we need God's wisdom and strength in dealing with this erring, former pastor. Through all these trials there have been many blessings, as it has unified our church leadership, and the members have been very supportive of us and this ministry.

The Lord blessed us this past Sunday. I preached, and during the invitation, six people came forward. Four of the people came for special prayer, and two came to receive Christ as their personal Saviour. I led one Catholic man to the Lord, and Pam led a young woman to the Lord. This was the first time she had led someone to the Lord completely in Swahili!

Please pray for Pam's mother that will be having surgery soon. Also, pray for us as we look for land to build a church building. We are trusting the Lord to provide the rest of the money needed for the land and church building.

Hope you all are doing well. We are so grateful to our praying friends and supporters. May our Lord richly bless you all.

My mother-in-law, Bertha Richard, went to be with the Lord early Friday morning the 26th of February, in Cincinnati, Ohio. Anita, my wife, and three of her sisters were present when my mother-in-law passed away. Anita arrived the day before and was able to spend some time with her before the Lord called her home. We thank all of you for your prayers, cards, and e-mails. I stayed behind in Peru because it was too expensive for both of us to travel, and it was not a good time to leave the work. Anita plans to return on the 25th of March. Please remember us in your prayers.

The construction here in Huanuco for the Bible Institute is still coming along. Those of you that have been here before would not recognize the place now! We'll soon have twice the space to house the preachers when they come for classes. There is still a lot to do. Please remember the "Stanton Building Fund." Thanks.

Speaking of the Bible Institute; last week while in Lima I was with one of the Baptist preachers that had taken my theology course. He told me that he started a Monday night Bible class in his church and used my book as his text. One of his students was a young lady that was invited to discuss and debate "Protestant Doctrine" with a priest on a Catholic television program. She used my book as her text! She debated with the priest for six weeks until they got to the doctrine of Salvation by Grace. I was told she did such a good job that she was told not to come back anymore! They never even got to the doctrine of the local church! The purpose of the Bible Institute is not only to teach the truth of God's Word but also to teach the pastors how to go back and teach their congregations the same truths. This story reminded me of the verse in II Timothy 2:2 where the Apostle Paul said, "And the things that thou has heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also." Pray that the Lord will continue to use my wife, Anita, and me in the training of others.

The Ebenezer mission in Lima is doing well. They baptized two last week. The roof for the meeting house should be finished within a few weeks. The Faith Mission in Huaral just built four more benches to hold the new people that have started coming. Brother Gonzales has also started another mission work about one half hour away from Huaral. His oldest son, Luis, recently surrendered to the call of full time ministry, and he is doing the preaching at the new mission work. The Lord's work continues to grow and we are seeing "fruit bearing" all around us. Thank you for your prayers and financial support of our ministry here in Peru. Dear Brethren,

March 2, 1999

During this Mission Sheet Letter month, January 28 to today, March 1, I preached 13 sermons (including two short funeral messages in two different homes and 2 sermons at the Ocala Christian Academy, where Stephen Bratcher is professor) in two different Baptist churches and one Baptist Mission. Permit me now to give you a day by day description.

January 29 - I preached to two different classes at the Ocala Christian Academy.

January 31 - This morning I spoke at the Town and Country Baptist Church near Ocala, Florida, where Stephen M. Bratcher is serving as interim Pastor. Tonight I preached at the Jordan Baptist Church, Sanford, Florida, where George Sledd is the Pastor.

Tuesday, February 2 - We (Marie and I) arrived at the Manaus Amazonas, Brazil, South American airport at around 3:00 a.m. We left from the same airport at around 3:00 a.m. on July 28, 1997! Ever since arriving we have been given royal welcomes publicly and in private homes.

Wednesday, February 3 - We attended the reception given to us by the 29th of March Baptist Mission here in Manaus. Ediberto Ribeiro da Silva is the Pastor. I preached at the 29th of March Mission on Wednesday night the 17th and again on Sunday night the 2nd (of February). This morning and tonight I preached at the 14th of December Baptist Church where Asa Mark Bratcher is the Pastor and again on Sunday morning the 21st.

February 21 - Tonight we (Marie and I) attended the services at the Coroado Baptist Church and I preached.

February 27 - This morning for the first time since we returned we left Manaus on a passenger boat, and with Pastor Ediberto helping us, we journeyed for some 5 hours down river to the New Jerusalem Baptist Church where Ediberto is the Pastor. Tonight I spoke at the young people's program on Baptist Doctrine and then preached to some 50 people present at their regular Saturday night services.

February 28 - This morning I preached again. Thus, beloved of the Lord, we greet you once again from Manaus. We soon were reminded that here it is hotter than in Richmond, Kentucky, with more mosquitoes and roaches, and wetter.

Permit me to change Paul's petition for prayer to the Romans (see Romans 15:30-31) to serve as the Bratchers of Brazil petition for prayer. "Now I beseech you, brethren, for the Lord Jesus Christ's sake, and for the love of the Spirit, that ye strive together with us in your prayers to God for us; That we may be delivered from them that do not believe in Brazil; and that our service which we have for Manaus may be accepted of the saints here." Permit me now to request your financial help as well. Don't forget the WORK HORSE FUND. This is General Fund. Out of it comes the missionaries' salaries, expenses, travel, medical, cars, etc. After remembering the WORK HORSE FUND, remember the HAROLD BRATCHER FUND.

(Not only pray for Marie and me, but for Marie's mother, Mrs. Flossie Moore, 93 years old, and Mrs. Deane Cruse, her daughter, who will have more burdens to bear).

Dear Friends,

February 28, 1999

Last night I talked with one of our folks down in Brazil and we were really encouraged. She told us that the preachers are doing a great job and the work keeps on steadily. She shared with us how especially faithful Sandro has been. He has been having some serious difficulties with his health and, in spite of that, keeps preaching, witnessing, worship leading, evangelism and disciplining of others. Pray for Sandro as he also has to support his family and himself as a professional upholsterer.

Charlene and I had the wonderful privilege of having some of our Brazilian friends come and visit for two weeks. Luiz has been a friend for about seven years and newlywed wife, Michele, for about three. The greatest joy we had concerning their visit was for us to learn that they had both trusted in Christ as their Savior and Lord. Luiz owns and operates a Fitness Center in Curitiba. He called me today after arriving back in Brazil to tell me that he wants to change the policies of his establishment. He started the Center before he came to know the Lord and many of the staff persons and programs that they offer are not pleasing to the Lord. This began to weigh on his mind as he was in flight to Brazil. He said that someone who sat next to him on the plane gave him the suggestion of offering a clean family oriented environment to health and fitness. I will not dictate to him what to do or how he ought to do it, but I'm certain that if it is the Lord who is guiding his conscience, then He'll show him how to work out the details. I am just excited to see the evidence of his spiritual growth.

Another exciting result of their visit was the development of a plan to start a home Bible study with the people of their social group upon our return in June. This is major advance for us because the upper-middle class to which they belong has been rather closed to us for over twelve years. We have mostly worked with the lower-middle to lower class and we have experienced quite a barrier to move outside of that. Now, with Luiz and Michele as "insiders" we may begin to see some fruit among those who for so long showed no interest.

We are praying for guidance concerning the placement of our next mission point. We have great burden for the bairro called, "Diadema." It has a population of over 40,000 and no Baptist church. Our plan is to locate one of our trained leaders and his wife in the neighborhood and adapt their house to accommodate a weekly Bible study. Other trained workers from the sending church would assist by supplying music, evangelistic outreach and discipleship of the new Christians.

The month of February was pretty tough for Charlene and Brennen physically. I had to take Charlene to the emergency room on a Sunday night because she couldn't breathe and was running a fever of 104 degrees. She had developed a severe case of bronchitis. She took antibiotics for 10 days, but the fever returned and she continued to have a terrible cough. We went back to the doctor and he prescribed another antibiotic. She just finished that treatment and it appears that she is recuperating. Brennen (our 20 month old) has had several

March 1, 1999

After a busy and wonderful visit with Bobby and Betty Creiglow and several churches in Florida, Alta and I headed north. Bobby and Betty, our thanks to you for your hospitality, your much needed help and for your love. We stopped at Nashville where we had a great visit with Ross, Lynn, and our grandchildren, that is, part of them. Then we continued north to Lexington.

Brother David Parks met us at the mission house to welcome us and give us the key to the house where we are living, at least a part of the time we are in the States. Our thanks to BFM for providing a lovely home for us, and especially, we want to thank Debbie and David Parks and all those who helped in preparing the house. It is lovely.

On February 15th, I had a hernia correction operation by Dr. McGee at the Lexington Surgery Center. All went well and I am recovering fast, but must stay away from lifting for a few weeks. Thanks for your prayers; God heard and answered. I drove the car for the first time on Friday, the 26th, when we went to Evansville, Indiana, to visit John Mark, Judy, and family.

February 28th - A Special Day: On Sunday, February 28, 1999, the Emmanuel Baptist Fellowship Church was organized from the Emmanuel Baptist Church. At the same service Phillip Hatcher, son of Judy and John Hatcher, was called as the new Pastor and ordained to the Gospel Ministry. Praise God for His blessings and promises: "I will bless you and multiply you."

During the following weeks, we, Alta and I, will be traveling almost all the time. We have about three months of engagements already marked. Pray for us that God will bless us and make us a blessing.

News From The Front Line - Here is an excerpt from the letter received by e-mail last evening from Tom Turley who is in Urai and caring for the work in our absence.

"Dear John and Alta, Greetings from Urai. We are well. Glad to hear that you are recovering. Have had several interesting things happen around here. First, the road into Urai washed out last Saturday. Had to go to church Sunday via Congonhas. Rained that evening, though, and had to come home via Primavera. On Monday they opened two detours, one that has 4 km of dirt going toward Londrina, the other goes behind the gas station and comes out 6 km (dirt) later on the main road. They are saying that it may take over a month to repair. They are spending more time on the detours than on the washout. It is bad.

Second, I was trimming the tree out front today. The phone line was about to break, and the power lines were almost touching in the middle. Just as I was finishing I found an owl's nest with 2 small owls. Hope the cats don't get them. Speaking of cats, boy, I've had my share. I'm about to declare open season and you know ALL is fair in love and war, and I certainly don't love cats.

We have had good services at Casa da Familia this week. Averaging over 70 each night. Tonight is the JESUS film. No decisions this week, however, I pray that tonight will have a harvest. Marcos is bringing three tomorrow for baptism from Nova Fatima. Praise the Lord! Marcia and Everson seem to be more at peace. Silvio and Kelly went by and talked with them and had prayer. It helped. The couples classes last week were great. Everybody enjoyed and learned a lot, too. I think the classes helped, too.

Next Saturday we start the youth meetings. Going to be "A noite colorida" with the wordless book colors. I may even paint my head. This coming week we're going to "blitz" the parks and youth hang outs with invitations.

Attendance has been good in Urai. Have learned that other churches are trying to proselyte, however. Tomorrow we're finishing a special Month of the Word campaign. Found a good deal in Londrina on Bibles. Hope the 13 that I bought will not be enough. Going to do a similar campaign with the youth; a special memorization program.

Have to get ready to leave now. Will pass your word along to the church. God bless, Tom for the 3 of us."

Friends, I am sure you will praise the Lord with me for the good report and the blessing upon the work in Parana.
