Harold and Ursula Draper Missionaries to Brazil

I, Harold Draper, was born in 1942 in St. Louis, Mo. to Harold and Louise Draper. Both were faithful servants of the Lord as long as they lived and had a great influence on my life. We moved back to Kentucky when I was 3 years old and I grew up on the farm, attending a small Baptist church (Emmaus Baptist Church). I was saved in that church in March of 1954 at 12 years old. The church has since gone out of existence, but my salvation is eternal! At about the time I was getting out of High School I began to feel that the Lord was calling me into the ministry. I was very bashful and shy and felt that I could never do that and tried to convince myself that it was all just my imagination. I went to St. Louis and later Chicago and worked briefly to get away from it all. When it didn't go away I decided to go in the Army and volunteered to go to Vietnam. After several months of training I anxiously awaited my Overseas Order for Vietnam. When they came they were for Berlin, Germany.

I was very upset but had to go along with it. When I arrived in my new barracks at noon day, the first GI that came in the door said to me, "I bet you are a Baptist preacher, aren't you?" I almost died of shock but quickly recovered and denied it. That night in my bed I promised God that I would surrender upon my return to the U.S.

I soon began to see that the temptations were great and that I was beginning to yield somewhat. I began to pray that the Lord would give me a Godly companion. Very soon after that my dear wife Ursula came into my life. I told her before we married that I would have to preach. We returned in 1965 to America and began

to experience all the difficulties a new couple does at the start. God was with us and still is. I surrendered to preach at age 30 while a member of the Faith Baptist Church of Wauseon, Ohio and was ordained by the Bible Baptist Church of Clarksville, Tenn., and became the pastor of the Calvary Baptist Church of Arlington, Ky. The Lord richly blessed our ministry there.

In May of 1977 I became sure that the Lord was calling me to be a missionary in Brazil. I was authorized by my church in Arlington and on July 1st of 1977 was accepted to be part of Baptist Faith Missions.

We started out in Fortaleza in the Northeast. There we studied the language and had the privilege to participate with Bobby and Jane Aldridge who were opening up their first work in that area. It sort of jump-started us. In October of 1979, we were invited by Richard and Wanda Turner to take care of their work in Mato Grosso while they came home on furlough. The Lord blessed greatly our year there. Then we went North to work in Sao Luis do Maranhao. We spent 8 yrs. there and felt our time there was up. Bro. Bobby Creiglow asked us to pray about returning to Mato Grosso since he was about to retire. We have been there now about 12 years and our ministry has been richly blessed.

During these past twelve years in Mato Grosso in Central Brazil God has blessed in a marvelous way. Four churches have been organized and two missions started. The existing churches without exception have grown both in number of members and in knowledge of the truth. With the help of the Lord we have grown some also. We still fall so short but are so thankful, first to our Lord for giving us the privilege to serve in Brazil, and then to all of the churches and saints who have and continue to give that we may continue on with this great work. May God bless all of you.

Sister Draper Writes . . .

I, URSULA DRAPER, was born in East Germany and brought up under Communism. My parents were Christians, my father also being a Jew. He was able to survive the Nazi regime because he was a veterinarian and needed by them. I was schooled in East Berlin to be a Nurse and got a job in West Berlin where the pay was much better. When the wall was about to go up, a border guard who was a friend of the family warned me and I was able to get to the Western side before the border was totally closed. There I met my husband who was a tall skinny G.I. from Kentucky. Our first daughter, Karin, was born in Berlin.

In 1965 we came to the United States to start our life in America. I had a bad cultural shock, but we began to attend church and to adapt to our new country. In 2 years I became a citizen of America while living in Toledo, Ohio. I thought I was saved, but while attending the Friendship Baptist Church in Toledo I realized I was not and the Lord saved me. I was baptized and became a member of the Lord's church. While living in Toledo our second daughter, Melody was born. We were able to buy a new home and all seemed to be well. But my husband felt he was called to preach and we sold our house and moved to Clarksville, Tennessee to go to Bible College. We then went to Kentucky to pastor. It seems we were about to get settled in for a long stay and Harold began to feel he was being called to work in Brazil. It was a scary thought, but before long we were packing our bags to move to the 3rd Continent of residence for us. My mother back in Germany asked me if I was married to a Gypsy! I wrote her that I was not, but to a Baptist preacher.

During these 22 years in Brazil we can see where the Lord has used us in his work. It has not always been easy. Both Harold and I have had some serious health problems. There have been some blessed and some discouraging times. The hardest part for me is being away from my two married daughters and our four grandchildren when they are sick or have problems. The Lord gave us our 3rd daughter, Michelle, who fills this void somewhat. She is now 14 years of age and is so precious and such a blessing to us both.

I ask that all of you always pray for your missionary families. We appreciate your love and support. We are anxiously waiting right now our return to Brazil on the 15th of December. God bless all.

Dear Blessed Brothers & Sisters of the Savior: Nov. 4, 1999
On the authority of what I recorded in "My Pastoral Record" Book, I submit to you the following facts.

During the month of October I preached 15 sermons - 10 of the 15 at the 24th of March Baptist Church where I am the pastor. The rest of my report will be to explain about the 5 sermons preached at 5 different places.

Saturday night the 9th of October the evangelist of the Root of David Baptist Mission - Paulo Sergio Campos - picked us (Marie and me) up at the house and took us 15 miles to the Mission and there with many visitors from the mother church, the 17th of August B.C., I preached to a total of 70 present.

October 17 - At 6:30 this morning I was waiting for Raimundo Mendes Vieira to pick me up. He arrived a few minutes late and took me to Mauazinho. From there after picking up a brother of the 17th of August Baptist Church, with his guitar, and his wife and son, we got in a speed boat, and after almost an hour on the river we arrived at the Xiborena Baptist Mission where I preached to the 16 of us present. This trip was good for the spirit (one lady asked for baptism) but hard on the flesh.

October 31st - At 7:30 this morning we (Marie, Lourdes Martins de Oliveira and I) left with Brother Borges, and we drove a few miles to the river, then crossed the river - about an hour - to Careiro. There, before I preached at the Careiro Baptist Mission, we attended, after walking a country mile, a baptism service at the river. The pastor of the mother church, Edilson, baptized three adults. This trip wasn't quite as hard on the flesh as the one of October 17th.

May we all continue to grow in the grace of giving. We thank all of you who faithfully give to the regular fund and the gifts designated for us. We thank the brother or sister who gave a special offering "as needed." May the Lord bless you is our prayer.

Greetings from Garca, November 1, 1999

Well our language classes in Manaus went well, we gained a greater understanding of the language and the culture here in Brasil. We also gained a better appreciation for the climate in Garca; the heat in Manaus was very overwhelming. We made many new friends in Manaus, and when it came time to come home it was difficult. But the children had a greater pull at our hearts than did our desire to stay with friends.

Getting home was good. Our kids had missed us and it is always good to know that you are missed. We thank God for the Turley family he provided to stay with our boys while we were in Manaus. They were reluctant to leave after 6 weeks of growing attached to the kids here. It is real easy for these children to get into your hearts. You all should come down and see which of our kids will become someone you cannot forget.

God has provided us with a new addition to our staff here at the Alpha and Omega. We now have a male nurse full time. Not only does he have a heart for the children but he is a Christian. Also he worked here when this was a clinic, and he knows how to handle the maintenance of the building. Isn't God marvelous?

I know you are all wondering about the purchase of the property. Well, we are continuing to purchase the shares of the workers one at a time. As of this date we have purchased 2590 of the shares of this property for \$58,421.99 dollars. We have a Doctor that has 11 and is offering to sell for \$23,000.00. Another worker has 4% and we can buy that for \$15,000.00. One more has 12% for \$5,000.00. This is a grand total of \$43,000.00 and would bring our share of the property up to 52.2%. As you know, that percentage would give us controlling interest. As you can see if you are doing your arithmetic, the \$60,000.00 we received during the Mission Conference has been well spent but the need is still great. Our hope is that God will provide you with the funds to continue to help with this purchase, and when you send your offering designate it to Purchase of the Alpha and Omega Property.

Our children are doing well and the number as of today is 68, but as we have said before that is subject to change daily. We have some in computer classes, some working with a brick layer, others working with a welder, others working in the kitchen, the laundry, the carpentry shop, all for the purpose of learning a trade. Our main goal for these kids is to share Christ with them and then to help them become productive citizens when they return to society.

The best way to know about the Alpha and Omega is to come see for yourself. We can tell you over and over, but if you talk to anyone who has been to the mission field you will hear the same thing, "It was different than I imagined." We have three groups scheduled to come visit this coming year, so when you are making your plans to come, contact us so we can schedule a time when it will be just you and us. Please come and see what your mission dollars are doing in Garca Brazil. As my granddad used to say, "Come and we will treat you so many different ways that you will have to like one of them."

One more thing: In a previous mission sheet we told about a group of children in the States that gave money for building a playground; all the facts were true except the name of the Church. The children were from the Pleasant Ridge Baptist Church and I put the Wilderness Road Baptist Church. Please forgive this error.

Let me conclude by saying "Thank you" to all of you as you pray daily for us here at the Alpha and Omega. Without those prayers there would be difficult times that would be even more difficult. But we serve an AWESOME God because He provides us with every need even down to the prayer warriors.

I just got off the phone with our music director, Sandro, who is up in north Brazil. He has been away for a little over a month on a mission trip. He told me that God has blessed beyond his greatest expectations. Several folks trusted Jesus as their Savior, and he recruited some to come to here to study. It was exciting to hear how God has blessed. We expect him to return on Thursday of next week (Nov. 11).

We are a step closer to getting the work in Diadema started. I have saved a little more money and we have received some special offerings that we will use toward the purchase of the lot there. If you are still thinking about contributing toward that work, we can still use your help. We have been preparing for this work through much prayer, for four months. Our workers are looking forward to the opportunity to get into people's homes, sharing the gospel and discipling the new converts. We will keep you posted as the work progresses.

Yesterday was a holiday here in Brazil. It is called "The Day of the Dead". It is a day that most people remember their deceased loved ones. It is a sad day for most people because they have no real hope that their loved ones are in a place of peace and rest. We tried to take advantage of the theme to share the message that with Christ there is a sure hope after this life. Our youth put on a special program and invited folks to come see why Christians do not mourn as those without Christ. There was a good turnout and a receptive audience. Only God knows what kind of eternal fruit will come of the effort.

We had two couples visiting in our home for just over two weeks. One of the couples was from a sister church in Acre, Brazil. The other couple is not saved, but came for improved job training that is offered in our city. We had several marvelous opportunities to share the gospel with the unsaved couple and to fellowship with the saved couple. No profession of faith was made, but the unsaved couple told us that they wanted to strongly consider everything that we shared with them. We pray that God will touch their hearts to accept Christ as their Savior and Lord.

Charlene and the kids are doing great! The two weeks with our visitors just brought out Charlene's qualities. She was an excellent hostess and witness. The kids gave us plenty of opportunities to show that we believe in discipline with love. They are used to getting all of our attention at home, but they had to learn that they have to share that attention sometimes. They were basically well behaved and one of the couples asked us if we thought some kids were just better than others or if the way they're raised made the difference. I have to admit that some kids are just mild-mannered by their personality (not ours), but most of it has to do with the way they are raised. I pointed out to them that, although we are far short of what we should be as parents, any success we have is due to following the principles of God's word. We make it a point to raise them to love and obey God for His glory, and not to try to show them off as sweet minister's kids. We feel that if we please the Lord in raising them, then it won't really matter if people are impressed or not.

We hope that the each of you has a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday and that you experience all the blessings that God has for you. Continue to pray for us as you think of us.

Dear Partners in Ministry,

October 26, 1999

You know you're in a traffic jam when the bus driver pulls out a newspaper and begins reading. We have discovered that in situations like this we can make much better time by getting off the bus and walking. When traffic begins moving you can always get on a bus that is near the front of the jam. This kind of situation is a good illustration of what walking with the Lord is like. You never know when the Lord may adjust your plans.

Actually, of course, He has it all worked out, we just get instructions on the fly. This is what makes the Christian life so exciting. One of the problems is that we are all a lot like Israel. When the Lord tells us to cross over, we cower down in fear. When the Lord tells us to stay we run ahead with our own foolhardy plans. Remember the old chorus, "My Lord Knows the Way through the Wilderness"?

Sometimes it seems that we are in a jam with the language. We long for the day when it will become a natural way of communicating. However, we are making progress and the Lord encourages us in many different ways. Last week we successfully completed the first phase of language study.

This past weekend the Baptist churches of France set aside a time for prayer concerning the Lord's work in France. Here are a few excerpts from the letter from the Frenchman who serves as secretary for this group: Many people around the world make the mistake of considering France to be a Christian nation. It is, in fact, a mission field with tremendous needs for evangelism. Here are some figures to give you a feel for the situation: France has a population of 59 million people, of which 41 million (70%) consider themselves Catholic, but only 5 million (8%) attend mass; 4-1/2 million are Muslim, but the level of religious observation is low 800,000; (1.4%) are Protestants, of which 400,000 are Evangelicals; 600,000 practice Buddhism or Hinduism. Eastern religions are currently in vogue. 400,000 are members of various cults. Influenced by their philosophers, French men and women often have a rationalistic mind-set that is a barrier to faith in Jesus. Finally, occultism continues to flourish throughout the society. Our Federation of Evangelical Baptist Churches with its 113 churches wants to rise to the challenge and has called for three days of prayer and fasting on October 22-24, 1999. We want to repent of our lack of zeal in witnessing, lack of unity..., and wrong motives that stain our evangelistic efforts. Please pray with us for renewed compassion for our generation, the planting of new churches, increased creativity and boldness in our proclamation of the Good News. [On] Sunday, October 24, an invitation will be given for congregations to discern who among them God is calling to serve as evangelists, pastors or church planters, for the members of our churches to move out for the Gospel through personal witnessing, practical service, and support of those involved in such ministries.

Together, let us lift up our voice and ask the Lord to have mercy on this country. And let us remember that any blessing that comes to France will have repercussions on French-speaking nations worldwide. We would love for you to pray with us! Please forward this call to prayer to fellow Christians you know throughout the world. Thank you!

Please, pray with French believers and us for God to display Himself gloriously in the salvation of people in France.

Dear Friends,
October 31, 1999
Anita and I sure enjoyed the visit from our pastor, George Sledd, from Jordan Missionary Baptist Church in Sanford, Florida. He and Brother Danny Johnson came down for several weeks to visit the works. They left on October the 8th. It was a pleasure having them with us. They also traveled out to the Northern Jungle town of Iquitos where I taught another class for the Bible Institute. The class was on Discipleship and I had 85 preachers show up. This was my largest class ever to date. My wife, Anita, taught a Sunday School Seminar at the same time. She had about 75 ladies (Sunday School Teachers) show up for that. It was a great time and as always a great blessing.

After getting back to Huanuco we are now getting ready for another Institute class here. We have been expanding and remodeling the Institute's kitchen. It is now twice as big and with the tile floor will be much easier to keep clean. This class will be over by the time you get this letter. I am expecting preachers from all over Peru to show up. Should be a great time.

As always we stay very busy traveling and preaching. I just got back about noon today after preaching to a packed house up in the mountains in a village called Conohuayun. They've been after me for about a month now to come up and teach on the Second Coming of Christ. It seems that with the year 2000 very close there has been a lot of wild speculation about "when" Christ is coming. We had good time and I will be going back up again tomorrow to finish teaching. This afternoon I travel about three hours to the town of Tingo Maria to preach the ordination service of a young preacher there, Moises Ore. He's been doing a good job at a mission work in the jungle town of Tocache. Please remember him in your prayers.

The work in Huaral is doing very well. This is the work north of Lima on the Pan-American Highway. Brother Carlos Gonzales is doing a great job there. He started out with several teenagers trusting the Lord, but now he's seen several of their parents come to know Christ as well. They baptize on a regular basis. They have located some property for the work. Pastor George Sledd and myself have seen the property and it is in a good location. We will need to buy two lots side by side. The cost of this is \$9000.00. Would some of you be willing to help us out in this? This work has proved itself to be solid and now they need their own property. Please pray about this. Thanks.

The Ebenezer work in southern Lima is doing well. They seem to hold their own. It appears to have a few problems holding them back, but we know that the Lord can solve all the problems. Please remember them in your prayers.

Anita sends her thanks to all of the churches and friends that sent birthday cards to her this month. She turned one year older on the 13th of October. We always appreciate the letters and cards that are sent. We love you all and thank the Lord we have such good friends helping us in the Lord's work here in Peru. Until next month.
