SUMMER MISSIONARY CONFERENCE JULY 29-31, 2002

The summer conference will be hosted by the Storms Creek Baptist Church, Ironton, Ohio, Jim Orrick and Kenneth Hurst co-pastors. The church is located just outside Ironton on Route 93, almost directly across from the Ironton McDonalds. Coming from the West on Interstate 64, you should exit at exit 185 which is the Ashland-Cannonsburg exit. Turn left on Route 180 to Route 60. Take Route 60 through Ashland, Kentucky and cross the bridge into Ohio. As soon as you come off the bridge, turn left onto Route 52, go about four miles, and exit at the Ironton-Jackson exit. Turn left at the stop light onto Route 93. Go to next stop light, turn right into the church parking lot. If coming from Portsmouth, Ohio on Route 52, exit at the Ironton-Jackson exit, turn left at the stop light onto Route 93, go to the second stop light then turn right into the church parking lot. Area motels include Days Inn, (606) 928-3600, \$50.00 with AAA or AARP and Knights Inn (606) 928-9501, \$39.60 for AAA or AARP, both located just off Interstate 64 towards Ashland. Many other motels are in the Ashland area.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Savior,
May 31, 2002
During this Mission Sheets letter month, the 30th of April until today, May 29th, I preached seven sermons and heard 8 sermons preached by other preachers. I shall now relate to you about the sermons preached.

On the 5th of this month, we visited (Marie and I) the Hilltop Baptist Church of Beattyville, Kentucky, where I preached both morning and evening. Patrick Prather is the pastor. We enjoyed the fellowship.

On Tuesday night, the 14th, I preached at the South Lexington Baptist Church. The church is presently without a pastor, but Joe Earwood and Steve Blake are holding the services.

She is 98 years old.

On the 23rd, our son, Stephen, arrived from Ocala, Florida, and will leave on the 30th. He has been a great help.

To every church and individual mentioned thus far in this letter, Marie and I express our sincere thanks and appreciation for the favors showed to us during these days. May the Lord bless you is our prayer.

Oh, yes, on the 12th, Hershael York picked us up and took us to Louisville, where we attended the Sunday morning services of the Highview Baptist Church, Louisville. We heard the pastor, Dr. Kevin Ezell, and then we heard Dr. Hershael York preach.

Dear friends, June 3, 2002

As all of you in the States are looking forward to the coming summer, we are going into our winter. Some of the nights are beginning to be a little chilly but the days are still t-shirt working weather. What you do is start out with layers of clothes and then begin to peel them during the day until midday. Then after about 3 o'clock you begin to put back on what you have taken off during the day.

We are now beginning our remodeling phase of our work. We are remodeling one house to include an additional bedroom, bath, and dining room. In our home in which we live we are beginning an addition for a kitchen and dining room. This was needed because the existing kitchen was only big enough for Barbara and I and that would not do for kids. We have dug the footer, bought the sand, gravel, and concrete for the footer, and are hoping to use the Americans that are planning to visit this month for our concrete mixers; yes, we still mix the concrete by hand.

Our mission is in a slow and steady growth. We had a new family move into the community and they accepted Christ about 3 weeks

Dear Special Friends,

June 2, 2002

We have had a busy month, but do not want to write too much this month, in order to allow space for Nathan to update you on what God is doing in his life, and how that He has answered prayers.

Pam returned to nursing the first week of May, as she wants to be registered in Kenya as a registered nurse. Currently, she is registered in the States, but licensed in Kenya. In order to get her registration here, the Nursing Council of Kenya requires her to do 12 weeks of community health, and 6 weeks in the E.R. of a teaching hospital. They would not allow her to get this experience in Kitale, as Kitale is too small to gain a variety of experiences, so she lives during the week in Eldoret, which is the nearest city. Eldoret has a large teaching hospital, and is Kenya's fifth largest city, but is an hour and a half away. So, she lives in a guest house during the week, and travels back to Kitale by public transportation each Friday evening, and I take her back on Sunday evening. It is hard for us to be separated all week, but both of us feel strongly that the Lord has opened the doors for her to increase her knowledge, and expand our ministry in new areas. Please pray for Pam that God would use her in this new field for His glory.

She has already had four weeks of nursing, and has been out into the rural areas to visit clinics that have no inside toilet, no electricity, no running water, and are very primitive, but functional. Also, she has worked in a dispensary, and a small hospital, and has given immunizations to children, worked with a doctor doing physical exams and diagnosing problems, prescribing medicine, has helped with her first birth (no lights in the Delivery Room, the suction machine was broken, no bassinet for the baby, the room was dirty, etc.), has done some teaching in Family Planning, and is learning how to counsel people who have been immoral and now are diseased. She is the only white person wherever she works, and most of the teaching and conversation is in Swahili, so she has really increased her vocabulary. It has been a profitable time, and she is asking God to show her what He wants her to do with this experience when she is finished to help to further our ministry.

I have been trying to expand my knowledge of Swahili, and have had a special teacher working with me this past month, helping me to improve on my vocabulary and ability to speak the language of Kenya.

Unfortunately, we have had more car problems, as our car is now 11 years old, and parts are wearing out. This past month, we replaced the clutch, the turbo part of the diesel engine, the tires, worked on the electrical system, and have done other repairs which have been costly. It is a good car, especially for these Kenyan roads, but is old, so parts need to be replaced.

The problems continue on in the church, but we have restarted our Men's and Women's home Bible studies, and have seen more unity among the members, since we have begun to earnestly pray, and study God's Word. Everyone seems to enjoy these home meetings, the study in God's Word, and the fellowship afterwards. This is what helps to build unity and cooperation among the members, and we are gaining more people as we invite our new believers to attend these meetings, too.

Thank each of you so much who pray for us so faithfully. The times of trial and testings are difficult, but we know that when we are actively serving our Lord, and expanding so that we can do more, Satan is angry, and we are tried even more. So, keep praying for us, and asking God to give us wisdom, and to use us more. Your prayers and interest in what God is doing here mean so much. Now, we want you to read on to learn how that God is using Nathan, and giving him opportunities for service. May God bless each one, as you serve where He has called you.

We have been praying for a family about one mile down the road from us for about 5 months. Their 20 year old son accepted the Lord about 3 months ago. He came to Church about two weeks and then didn't come anymore. But last week he returned and asked that we come to his house to have a service. But before we could do this God stepped in and began His work. This week his mother and sister came to church and God touched their hearts and they accepted Christ as their Savior. AWESOME. To let you know a little about the family, the mother has been heavy into witchcraft and many in her family are also. This means only that God has taken back one of His. Please pray for this family and their spiritual growth. We gave a Bible to the daughter as the mother does not know how to read; the daughter promised to read to her mother. We have already scheduled discipleship classes in their home for this week. Pray for guidance and leadership of the Holy Spirit as we attempt to work with and train these new Christians.

Thank you for the opportunity to work for the Lord here in Brazil on your behalf. Thanks to BFM for the support and having confidence in us to do the work for the Lord. Always remember to lift us up to the Lord each time you pray; as we work for the Lord we also battle the devil.

Also remember the open invitation you have to visit a foreign country and work for the Lord in a different land. We will be in the States in Sept. until Feb. Greetings once again this side of glory. As we see the news we see that this world is a mess as usual. I must remind myself at times to remember that our Sovereign God is in control and that Romans 8:28 applies to me also. If I sound discouraged it is because that we have been confronted with a lot of sickness and death in our churches here this past two months. We lost one of our most faithful and beloved young men in April. Now one of our beloved pastors is with serious cancer. His name is Joao Candido and is the pastor of the Good Hope Baptist Church. On the 3rd of June, he will have surgery to see if they can remove the malignant tumor that is in his bile duct. It is not known if it has spread or is localized. We are praying that it will be operable.

On the home front we can say that our works are doing well. Steady growth is the word. With all of the religious confusion of our day we have a lot of competition. I have determined to just preach the word and leave the results with the Lord.

I am trying to prepare the Altos do Coxipo church for the young preacher to take over completely in December. He has a very strong personality and has been slow to grow in some ways but is showing signs now that he may be about ready. Pray with us about this. We will be coming home in 2003 for furlough and must have him or somebody ready to take over the work by then. We are praying the Lord will spare the life of the Good Hope church's pastor. Good sound men are hard to find. His will be done.

Ursula is having some real difficulties with her arthritis. Her neck where she had the surgery 4 years ago is giving her a lot of pain. We are trying to hold out until the middle of December so that Michelle can finish High School before we come to the States for Ursula to get her check-up. She gave me a real scare 3 weeks ago with much pain and swelling in the area. It is some better now. Michelle is very busy with her school work. It is a challenge to change languages at the High School level but she is making it up until now.

We continue to enjoy the blessings of the Lord and are so thankful for your support. We haven't yet started to build at our newest work in Primavera do Leste due to the sickness of Pastor Joao Candido. He is to help head up the project. Out of respect to him we are holding up for just a little while. If you feel led to give to our New Work Fund it will be used in these new works. Next month I will give a rundown of all the missions and churches. Pray for us as we come to mind.

The missionary to India, William Carey, coined the phrase, "Attempt great things for God; expect great things from God." I memorized that phrase many years ago, but I couldn't say that I had practiced it much since then. This past weekend we had the fantastic pleasure of seeing God do a great thing. We stepped out in faith on putting together a large scale evangelistic marriage workshop. It required our going way beyond our comfort zone in many areas. The result was that the gospel was preached to over 2,000 folks on two different nights! At the end of the Workshop we asked the participants to fill out a response sheet

if they would like to participate in other meetings of the same nature. We were thrilled that every single response was affirmative. We attempted a great thing for God in the faith that He would bless, and bless He surely did! Now we have our hands full with the follow-up work with so many folks, and our hearts full with trust that God will enable us to do long range church planting and discipleship with those who have shown interest.

Brother David Hatcher was our guest speaker at the marriage workshop and God used him in a great way.

I have come to see that God loves to bless faith. I've read about it in the Scriptures all my life, and I've seen how He blesses it in practical ways in my life today. I think I could get to like living as William Carey stated, "Attempt great things for God; expect great things from God." God, help me to trust You even more each day.

Please pray that we keep our eyes on Him.

Receives Work Permit . . . Starting Prison Ministry . . . Experience Of A Lifetime . . .

Dear praying friends,

June 1, 2002

I just wanted to write and bring you up to date on what God is doing here in Kitale, Kenya. There has been so much that has happened since my last prayer letter, and I will try my best to give you all the details of the major events in the past month.

I am thankful to God for answered prayer, specifically in two areas. The first area is the need for a work permit. To legally stay in Kenya, you are required to get a work permit after a period of three months. You are allowed to stay in the country for three months on a visa, but you must get the permit to stay in the country for an extended period of time. I grew concerned about the problem of the work permit, as I moved closer and closer to the date of the expiration on my visa. I really began to pray about it and ask God to move in this situation. I was expired for three days and was granted an extension by the government so that they could make a decision regarding the permit. At the end of the week, after being expired for three days, I was informed that I had been given a work permit for a period of three years. God is so good! I praise Him for an answer to that prayer.

Also, I have been praying about the opportunity to start another ministry here in Kitale with the main prison. I did a prison ministry during my time at Cedarville University, and really enjoyed it. I saw the impact that it had in the prisoner's lives. I visited the main prison in Kitale with our assistant pastor to inquire about the possibilities in the prison. I was amazed at the size of the prison as I entered the compound. I asked the guard at the gate what the population of the prison was, and he said it was 1,200 prisoners! I later met with the head officer, and was referred to Nairobi, the capital city, to meet with one of the head officers of the prisons in Kenya. After a detailed interview, I received a call from Nairobi informing me that I was able to go and start a ministry in the prison. Praise God! Please pray that God would guide me and lead me with this opportunity.

I had the experience of a lifetime a couple of weeks ago. A ministry in Kitale, named Helimission, helps missionaries to fly by helicopter into areas that are not reachable by roads. I was asked by one of the pilots of Helimission if I would accompany him on a trip to the Samburu region of Kenya. It was an offer that I could not refuse, and I was very excited about the trip, and really had no idea what to expect. When we arrived, we landed on top of

a mountain about a 10 minute flight from Maralal, the major city in Samburu. As we approached to land, many people came out of the hills to see us and were captivated by the helicopter. We then proceeded to have a church service under a tree, as there were no buildings. Another interesting element was that the people did not know Swahili, the major language in Kenya. The service was translated into Samburu for the people. I was also interested in how the people were dressed, as they wore tribal clothing, and had spears, etc. that you would expect to see in a true tribal setting and situation. Also, the women wore several layers of beads, which indicated if the woman was married, single, etc. as well as other characteristics. Also, some of the men wore feathers in their hats, which indicated their level in the tribe. An evangelist preached to the people, and a doctor treated several people in his role of medical missions. I was then asked to give my testimony to the people. I encouraged them to give their lives to Christ and to serve Him. After I gave my testimony, I was offered goat milk by one of the chiefs of the tribe as a sign of appreciation for coming.

This was only the second time that anyone had come to reach these people with the gospel. It was truly an unreached people group, which I studied in college. Mark 16:15 says, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." This was certainly the most primitive people that I have seen in Africa, yet they still must be reached with the gospel, and we must be willing to go. My friend that went with me from Helimission, Marcus, told me that I would not see Kitale in the same way after I returned from this trip. He was right, for when I returned to Kitale, I was appreciative to see developed buildings, gas stations, public telephones, public bathrooms, restaurants, which were nowhere to be found on the top of the mountain and among the people that we ministered to. I now have a greater appreciation for all that I have here in Kitale.

These are the main events that I have experienced within the past month. I would love to hear from any of you that would like to write. God bless you as you serve Him.

Dear Friends,

May 31, 2002

Anita and I made it back to Peru safe and sound. We had a nice trip with no delays or problems. We have found the work to be going very well. The reports we've received from most of the mission works have been very positive. We have had one week since our return and we are still getting things in order around the house and offices. Anita is still having trouble with her feet but doing better. I took her to see a doctor in Lima, the day after we arrived, and he diagnosed her with fibromyalgia. He gave her some shots in each foot and she was doing much better within two days, but now that she is back and on her feet again all day working, they have begun to hurt her as before. Please pray that the Lord will give us wisdom in how to deal with this medical problem. It hurts me to see her suffer like this.

I am traveling tonight, Friday the 31st of May, to Lima and then on to the mission work in Huaral. While there I will be meeting with an architect about drawing up the plans for the mission building there. We hope to organize this work on Saturday the 13th of July. My pastor, George Sledd, and some others will be coming down to help in this. I do hope to have the new building well under way by then. At present they are meeting in a structure made from straw mats. Would you consider a special offering for the Stanton Building Fund? It will go toward this project. It will be a big help. Thanks.

I am also going to Huaral to look into the possibility of two more new mission works. While on furlough a few new churches promised to begin support, so I figure we should be able to start some more mission works. Isn't the Lord good? Just when one work is to be organized and become independent, opportunities open up to work in other parts. It has always been like that my entire ministry. The Lord has always provided the support needed just when it was needed. Please be much in prayer for us and for the work here. As Anita and I stood with the congregation singing on Sunday night, here in Huanuco, we both looked at each other and knew we were back home!

Thanks again to each and every church, pastor, and friend that made our furlough so enjoyable and fruitful. We didn't hear from a few churches that have supported us for years. We always try to visit every church that invites us. Maybe next furlough we will have the opportunity to visit all our supporters. The invitation to come and visit with us is still good. So many told Anita and I that they wanted to come down and see the Lord's work here in Peru. We have three groups coming down already this year. We hope to have even more. We love you all. Until next month.
