

This has been another very busy month. I spent over half the month in Florida where I was in five churches, including the Winter Conference at Park Ridge. I heard some great preaching and was fed spiritually. All told, I was in eight churches during the month of January. We are so thankful for all of you churches and pastors who invite us to come share about our work in Brazil and to preach the precious word of God. We have no greater joy than doing this.

Ursula's health continues to improve. I am hoping that by April she will be able to travel some with me. She is now get-ting some much needed dental work done that could not have been done until she felt better. Michelle is doing well in school and has a good part-time job. God is blessing us for which we praise His Name. During the month of February I am schedul-

ing only one out of state trip so I can be with Ursula while she has some teeth extracted. Due to her rheumatic heart, this procedure has to be done with care. We thank all of you who pray for her and our family. Yesterday our daughter Melody had an eight hour surgery on her heart at the University of St. Louis Hospital. It looks like it was a success. In six weeks they will know for sure. She seems to be doing extremely well.

Our report from Brazil is very good. All of our nine works are doing well except one that is without a permanent worker in Novo Diamantino. One of our more mature pastors in town is overseeing the situation. I have been told by Bro. Sledd that some good offerings have come in this month for our new works in Brazil. I am in constant contact by E-mail and phone to the preachers and pastors in Cuiaba. All of the "As Needed" funds you send are used in the field in Brazil. On rare occasions I have in the past used some of this for doctor bills etc., but in recent times all has gone to the work to help in the building, for workers' needs, and for Sunday School materials, etc. I plan to use it exclusively for the work unless some extreme emergency takes place.

I will be here in the States this summer for the first time in some years. I still have most dates open starting in May. If you would like for us to come, please contact us at the address above. We thank all for your faithful support. God bless all of you. Let's keep on keeping on, our redemption draweth nigh.

January 2003 has started off well for us here m Kenya. The weather is beautiful, in the high 80's every day, with little rain.

Since we are in the Southern Hemisphere, our weather is the reverse of the weather in the States. God's creation is so wondrous this time of year.

On January 25th, we celebrated the fifth anniversary of Kanisa la Kalvari Baptisti (Calvary Baptist Church) of Kitale. There were over 170 people there, and we had a special service with several of our young men and older men giving testimonies of what the church had meant to them. It was such a blessing to us. Two of the people who gave testimonies were with us on our very first service five years ago, and they have really grown spiritually. So, it was a time of reflecting on God's goodness to us, and

Next Saturday, February 8th, will be another highlight in the ministry of the church when our assistant pastor, Moses, marries Maureen Miolo. The pre-wedding party was this past Saturday, and many of our members attended. Although it started three hours late, which is typical here, it was quite a celebration with many testimonies from Maureen's family and some of our church people. I had to transport many of our people as there are only two other people in our church who have cars, so this made the celebration to start late, and I had to make several trips, plus hire a van to help with the transportation. Anyway, there was singing, testimonies, eating, and giving of gifts, so everyone was happy, and it was a joyous time. Moses has already worked out the dowry (bride price) beforehand with the family, so this did not have to be done. We all met under a tent made of feed sacks that were sewn together and supported by sticks at the home of the bride's parents. It was truly a time of great joy for all who attended.

Lord willing I will perform the vows next Saturday and will go to pick up the bride and her family to bring them to our church. In this culture, the bride gets married at the man's church, and attends his church from then on. The man is the one who arranges for and pays for everything, so it is different. Our church members have been planning for the food to be fixed, and other matters to be done for a month now. Each person is donating something for the meal, and also donating to get the bride and groom a nice present from the church. The food will be cooked outside while the ceremony is going on, and will be cooked over little charcoal burners or on wood that has been cut up, all outside. We do not have an inside kitchen or bathroom at the church, as it is typically Kenyan, and Kenyans cook outside and use an outside toilet all of the time. It will be a big day of celebration, and we will report more on it next month, Lord willing.

Nathan started his prison ministry this past month and the Lord has really been blessing his efforts. He is going with our assistant pastor two times per week and has the opportunity to reach over 1,300 prisoners, plus wardens. Two people have written him letters to tell him that they were saved after reading the gospel tracts that he gave out, along with the

I reported last month that my editing computer was sick and needed a doctor. Well, I called a nurse instead of a doctor that I thought would be cheaper than a doctor, but in the long runk should have called a doctor. It is now in the computer hospital. I hope to get it back next week in good health. I can still reproduce the videos that I made in the past and will mail them to anyone that requests them. I mailed some to Nigeria this past

Betty's and my physical health seems to be stable and within a few days we will return to the doctor for our routine checkup. On our way to Florida we stopped in South Carolina to visit two of our daughters for a couple of days, and then sp week in the home of some very dear friends, Pat and Grant Epps in Plant City, Florida.

While in Florida we attended the good conference on behalf of Baptist Faith Missions osted by Pastor Danny King and the Park Ridge Baptist Church in Gotha Florida. It was so hosted by Pastor Danny King and the cold there that I told them that if it did not warm up I was going to the Florida I once knew. In Christ,

toiletries, on December 23rd. Last week he presented the gospel to a group of 7 in one group, and three professed faith in Christ. Also, two wardens were in attendance and they listened attentively, too. So, he hopes to go slowly, divide the prisoners into groups of 10, present the gospel in the first hour, and then do follow-up discipleship with these new believers in the second hour. He says that the prisoners are so thankful for his visits, and they listen attentively, take notes, and even learn the Bible verses, when he teaches. He is so thrilled by the reception that he has received there, and is anxious to reach as many as he can. He is preaching to those who have committed murder and other crimes, and God is saving them and they are changing. Please remember this special ministry in your prayers.

Just yesterday we had the opportunity to meet with an American doctor that has just moved last week to Kitale. He plans to work with Helimission, the helicopter ministry in our town that takes people into the very remote bush areas of Kenya to present the gospel and do medical work. Pam had talked to the pilot last week, and an exploratory trip has been set up for February 18th-21st, for all of us to fly into the bush for four days to see the work there, and for Pam to begin to do some nursing among these very primitive people Nathan and I will go along to present the gospel to these people before they are seen in the clinic, and Lord willing, Pam and another Kenyan nurse will see the patients and treat them. The doctor will not be going on this trip, as he has just arrived and has many things to do in order to prepare for this medical work. If this works out, either Nathan or I will go each month to present the gospel, teach, and start Baptist churches among these tribal people. Pam and the doctor will treat the patients and this all will be an extension of our work. The doctor is also Baptist, so this is another blessing. Please pray for this endeavor, as we are excited about the possibilities of reaching people who have never heard of Jesus.

Thank you so much for remembering the Lord's work here in Kenya. We deeply appreciate your prayers, thoughts, love and encouragement. We could not be here serving the Lord without your prayers, financial support, and encouragement. We invite you to come and see what God is doing here, and may our Lord bless each of you for your labors for Him there.

Dear Friends, January 25, 2003

Thank you dear ones who have been so loving and faithful to pray for us and support us with your offerings for so many years. 2003 brings us to forty-eight years in Brazil. We praise Him. Our special thanks to you our "friends in Kentucky" and "a friend in Michigan" for your gifts.

The year 2002 ended full of blessings and 2003 has begun the same way. After twenty years, our daughter Lynn was able to visit Brazil once more. She and daughter, Virginia, were here the month of November, and Ross and Ryan were here during the last half of her visit. Believe me when I say "we enjoyed to the most this rare joy." Day and night we looked at each other and shared our love with every glance and touch. The last week

of December and the first days of January we were in Manaus to visit Paul and Wanda, David and Pennie and many friends. What a thrill to see how God has blessed and is blessing His work. (Got to play tennis one day! No, they did not have to carry me off the court, but if I die while playing tennis, just say, "he went down with a racket!") The only times I do not tire is when I am preaching or playing tennis. Unfortunately, tennis has become a rarity.

We arrived home from Manuas on January 3rd, rested a little, Alta repacked our bags and we went to camp on January 6th. There were 173 persons from three states and about ten cities. All from works that have been started through the ministry God has given us through the years. The people are like our children and grandchildren. Valdir dos Santos, pastor at Cornelio, directs the camp but he insisted that I bring the principle Bible Study each morning. This year I taught on "Knowing and Doing God's Will." The interesting thing is the study is for everyone from nine years up, a total of about 140 persons, and the study lasts for an hour and a half. Many lives of young and old have been changed during this time of communion in God's Word.

After camp, we had a week of rest and preparation for our Vacation Bible School. A total of 75 children were enrolled. Valdir and his wife, Sonha, directed the VBS and some of our members got first hand experience. It was a success and several children were saved. On the third day our neighbor, William, ten years old, came on his bicycle to visit Alta. He asked how could we know that God did not have a body. She talked to him and answered another question or two and he left. In a few minutes he was back and said, "Dona Alta, what I really want to know is how to trust Jesus and be saved." He listened and he believed. Two days

The year, 2003, started just as busy as usual for Anita and me. The first week we took the young girl from our church into Lima to see the heart specialist. (We wrote about her last month). Danitza is sixteen and the doctors discovered a small hole (7mm) in her heart between the left and right ventricular chambers. Danitza has had this condition since birth. The older she becomes the worse her condition. She already suffers from shortness of breath and swelling in her chest cavity. The Doctors said that the hearts of most children that are born with this cure themselves by the time they are five years old. Not so in Danitza's case. She needs an operation (open heart). The doctors in Lima have programmed it for the end of February. The doctors and nurses are donating their time and skills but we still have the cost of the operation (medicines, surgical supplies, heartif cest, etc.). The president deset of this is arranged \$1,900.00.



Dear Brethren, January 28, 2003

The work here continues to be blessed and continues to grow on almost every front. Our attendance at First Baptist Church has not really grown since we are usually at the maximum capacity of our building at least on Sunday night. Our chapels around town are absorbing most of our numerical growth. Many of these who have been baptized over the last few months are from one of the seven chapels that are scattered around the edge of town. In November there were 19 baptized. December another 22 and January 27. We are trying and working on getting more people out on Sunday morning. Our attendance has only been fair, and we still have lots of room to take care of folks in Sunday School. Our average for January was only 336.

We have now finished the new TV and video studio. Since Andrew arrived back in Cruzeiro do Sul, we have been able to go ahead and do the things that were only dreams a few months ago. We built our own teleprompters. One very simple commercial teleprompter would cost at least \$4,000.00. We built 2 of them for about \$1,000.00. We have just finished all of our set. We built new stands and tables for the editing workstation, switcher, etc. The building is all freshly painted, new carpet on the floor and the walls (for better acoustics) and air conditioned. We have already produced over 20 programs and lessons since the conclusion. We still have some furniture to buy and don't have the DVD player and tape decks for reproduction of tapes. That will come together in due time. We are now able to save all of our work on DVD. Andrew just produced the first one last week. You would not believe how much time and work is involved to produce just one of these DVD's. Andrew has relieved me of a huge burden by taking over the studio. Most of the time now I just have to edit texts, select backgrounds/graphics and sit down in front of the cameras for recordings. Andrew takes care of the post-production. This alone takes some 30 hours a week. Video tape only lasts about 10 years under favorable conditions. In our humidity, probably not even half of that. They say that CD's and DVD's should last 100 years. No one has ever told me how they know that! We are now able to produce all of our own video materials for TV and seminary courses. It is

now also possible to save them in a stable format and reproduce them at any time without loss of quality. As I write this letter, Andrew is in the studio working on the second DVD. Thanks to all of you who gave so generously toward this project. We have been working on it for over 10 years and it is fully functional. We are on 2 local TV broadcasts and are making our own materials for training our workers out in the field. Thanks again. You are getting the gospel to those who would not hear through other means and are training Brazilian missionaries to carry the gospel through this project. Your donations are working.

Occasionally there is a little bad news along the way. On our return to Brazil (we were in the States for our daughter Monica's wedding and to bring Andrew and family back down to work with us), we were charged almost \$4,000.00 in customs. Since this had never happened to us, it was a blow to say the least. The very same day we arrived we had a car accident. Since insurance is nonexistent here in Cruzeiro do Sul, we ended up paying for all the repairs. Even though the accident was not our fault we paid for the repair of the other guy's car and ours, too. Don't even ask! Just remember this is way south of the border and it is better just to fix the other guy's car and be finished with it. All of that took three months and another \$2,000.00. After hearing about the ordeals that Mike Anderson and A. J. Hensley went through recently, I just felt that we didn't have a thing to complain about! We are fine and recovering slowly. Keep us in your prayers.
