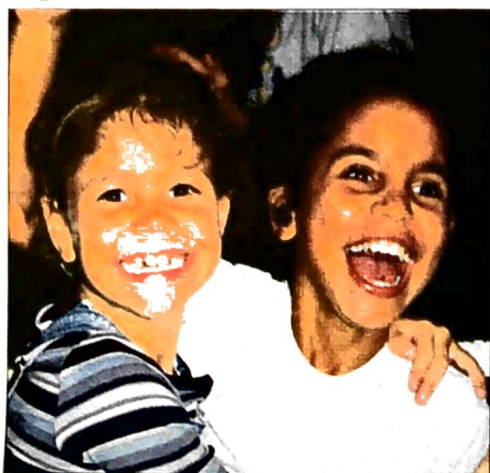

Unbelievable! The New Year has barely begun and two months are already gone.

By the time you read this almost 3 months will have passed. We hope that all of you are doing well and being blessed by our Lord and Savior. We are all doing well. Many things have happened since we got back from our short trip to the States in October.

Here at the Home we are in full swing. Well it is kind of hard not to be in full swing with 110 kids around. The kids are just getting used to going to school again. We have changed many things in our curriculum to fit the kids' specific needs. So many of them are behind. A good number of them are 3 and 4 years behind. We pray that things will go well until the end of the year.

We are really happy with some of the changes that we have seen in many of the kids' lives. It seems like they have finally seen the light. They are growing in stature and wisdom, that is what our work is all about. This is what makes us keep going, even when things get tough and discouraging.

We have had a lot persecution. Basically, there is one man who has decided to make things hard on us. He has gotten in contact with every one that he thinks can hurt us or be against us. The only ones he didn't contact were the prosecutors and the juvenile court judges but this man accused them of covering up for us. Needless to say, that did not make them very happy. The Bible does say that when we don't control our anger it destroys us. Well our enemy is really getting himself in quite a bit of trouble. Vengeance is mine says the Lord. So all we have to do is be kind to the inspectors that come to the home. Trust me, that is not always easy. "And he opened not his mouth." Pray for us to be strong when things get rough and that we will have wisdom when we need to talk.

We have an unusual situation here at the home at this moment. We were asked by the Judge to keep a young lady that is 15 years old. There is nothing unusual about that except she is 8 months pregnant. That in itself is sad. But she is here because the baby's father is the girl's father. Until the father is proven guilty the authorities wanted her far away from the father. Pray for her that while she is here she will come to know the Lord as her Savior.

The church in Garca is doing great. We have started more visitation groups. Different teams go out on Saturday afternoon and visit in different areas of town. We have had many new people coming. Several have been baptized. Many of them have been children that live with us. Also we had one of our boy's mothers to get saved and baptized. What a blessing!! There are several other parents that are coming to church. If they get saved it will make a difference in their relationships with their kids. Also, the judge has sent a man here to do some work to pay his dues. He got saved last week at church. Praise God! This is Carnival weekend and he was at church last night. It was a test because before he was saved he had a pretty liberal life. Pray for him. Marcos is his name. We thank you for all your love and support. Your prayers are much needed.

From I-64 coming east or west; or I-75 coming south: 64 and 75 merge into one highway on the west of Lexington. Come to Exit 115 on 64/75. This is KY Route 922, Newtown Pike. The big green sign will read also "Bluegrass Airport". Exit and come toward town (south). Follow Newtown Pike over the New Circle Road overpass all the way to Main Street. Cross Main Street onto Cox Street (same street; different name). Go to the deadend of Cox street. Turn right on Manchester Street (also called Old Frankfort Pike). Go about 1 1/2 miles to Thompson Road, Turn right to the church building.

From I-75 coming north: Exit at #104. This is Athens-Boonesborough Road. Turn west toward Lexington. This same road will become Richmond Road and then Main Street. Follow this route all the way through town. Just past the Rupp Arena / Civic Center complex, turn left on Jefferson Street. Then immediately right on Manchester (also called Old Frankfort Pike). Go about 1 1/2 miles to Thompson Road. Turn right to the Church building. If you have any questions about the conference, a place to stay, or motel information contact Dave Parks at (859) 223-8374.

Dear Special Friends,  
March 3, 2003  
Another month has gone by so quickly, and it seems hard to believe that two months of 2003 are history. We started the month by preparing for the wedding of our assistant pastor on February 8th. It was a typical Kenya wedding that started 3 hours late, with me having to help with so many of the preparations, since only two other people in our church have cars. My day started at 6:30 A.M. that morning with me picking up many of our church women to take them to the church to begin cooking for the day's events. Later, I went to pick up the bridal party and bride at her home, which is the custom here, and as also is the custom, she and her party were not ready, so I waited for almost an hour before bringing them to the wedding. There was so much excitement among our women as she arrived at the church, and they encircled the car, and began singing and banging on the car to welcome her, and her attendants.

I performed the ceremony, and was so surprised at the number of people who attended, many from the community. Over 600 people came, and 200-300 had to stand during the ceremony, as church is small, and cannot accommodate that many people. All in all, it was a great day with much celebrating, giving of gifts, and eating, and we rejoiced at how well that our people worked together to make this a special day for Moses and Maureen. As with our previous wedding of one of our deacons, our church united together to provide and prepare the food, took up money to give them a nice gift, and make it a special day. I returned home after helping with returning extra chairs and taking the bridal party back to their home, after dark, tired but thankful for the blessings of the day. Moses seems happily married and he and Maureen have begun to become involved in ministry together, which is good to see.

We started a new program to teach our people how to witness, and reach people for our Lord. It is called "Sharing Jesus Without Fear", and Nathan studied and worked in this program for over a year when he was in a Baptist church in Michigan before coming to work for us. He began to teach our people yesterday after church, and we had 15 in the class, so we are thankful for the interest. Another blessing for us are the three teenage boys from our church who are in the class. Emmanuel is 14 years old, and Benson is 16 years old. Both feel that God is calling them to preach, and Benson has even started teaching some unchurched youth in his neighborhood about Jesus, as well as starting a Bible club of 23 students in his public school. He has told us that the students meet during their lunch break. Dennis is the other teen, and is one of our orphans. He is 16 years old, too, and is very active in our church in Sunday School, our Bible club on Saturdays, and is one of the leaders selected by our teens to be a leader. Emmanuel has preached at the church several times during our Youth Sundays, and all of these boys are a blessing, and want to learn how to reach their friends and unsaved neighbors for Christ, so they are taking this class. We are excited to see the interest among our church members for evangelism, and are expecting many blessings as new people are reached for our Lord.

Our Bible Institute started this week with 6 students. I am teaching one class on Baptist distinctives, and another on Old Testament Survey. Nathan is teaching "Experiencing God" and a discipleship class, and the students are working hard to learn as much as they can about these subjects. It is our desire to prepare those whom God has called, for the leadership in Baptist churches, and three students feel that God is calling them to preach.

The prison ministry that Nathan started in January is going well. There are over 1,300 prisoners in this prison, and Nathan has started by doing evangelism, and several have received Christ as their personal Savior. He has divided them into two small groups of 6-8, and is doing a discipleship program with them. He hopes to eventually reach all of the prisoners, but he wants to go slowly, so that he can personally disciple them, and be involved in their lives. Several have expressed gratitude for him coming each week, and are meeting in the evenings to discuss what they were taught that day. Even the guards who are guarding the prisoners while they attend his class, are taking notes and wanting more information about his teachings.

Pam is anxious to start her medical work by going out into the bush where there are no medical facilities. She will be traveling by helicopter, as there are no roads to these areas. The Lord has sent a medical doctor and his family to Kitale where we live, from the state of Ohio. He is also interested in using his skills in the bush as well, but the engine of the helicopter is currently being repaired. This has been a long process, as parts have to come from South Africa, and the wrong parts were sent the last time, so it still has to be repaired. We know that God's timing is perfect, but Pam is anxious to get started in this important ministry.

We are Pleased with the new president that was elected here in Kenya in December. He has really started to crack down on corruption, and is making some good changes. There was an

Dear Friends

I want to thank God for His marvelous grace. When we arrived in the USA in December we stopped in Florida to visit family for a few days before continuing on to our mission house in Louisville, Kentucky. We had no idea that our little visit with family would be our last time to see my brother Ronnie this side of heaven. Just a few weeks later I received a call from my father informing me that my brother was killed in a work related accident. I thank God for the opportunity He gave me to see my brother again. I thank Him even more for the assurance that Ronnie is at home with our Lord Jesus Christ. I thank God for the grace to endure the loss of someone I love, and I thank God for the certainty that I will join with them in glory at my appointed time. I appreciate the prayers and consolation that we received from those who learned of our loss and offered them on our behalf.

Ronnie's death helped to impress on me, even more, how important it is that we carry out Jesus' commission to his church to share the good news of salvation from our sins. There are still so many who do not know Christ and many who have never even heard of Him. It is a marvelous privilege to be used of the Lord to bring folks to an eternal relationship with the Father.

I was speaking with Paulo and Edinei concerning the works in southern Brazil and they gave great reports. Paulo is back out into the interior with the motor home ministry where they are sharing the gospel in public schools and parks. They will spend three straight weeks on the road this month before they return to Curitiba. There will be some new volunteers going out with him next month who will also be seeking to gain experience that can be used in establishing a better local evangelistic ministry for their church. Charlene and I are partnering with the Bible Baptist Church in Curitiba to support this work. Once again, I encourage you to take part in a ministry that God is truly blessing to bring folks to know Jesus Christ. That ministry is called Project Life and you may designate your contributions accordingly.

Edinei and his new bride, Debora, are doing a fine job, having assumed the leadership at Bible Baptist Church. I received word that they recently held an evangelistic campaign at their church and had two folks profess Christ as their Lord and Savior. We were also thrilled to hear that he successfully handled a "sticky" little problem with a disgruntled church member. This is Edinei's first pastorate, but we are confident that God will supply the wisdom needed to serve the Lord faithfully in that capacity.

Charlene and the kids are doing a fine job of adjusting to our Stateside living situation. We are living in Louisville, Kentucky. I am studying full-time at Southern Seminary and am getting some very useful material to aid us in the ministry upon our return to Brazil. Jessie is catching the second half of the fifth grade and will move on to the sixth in August. Little Brennen started kindergarten in the middle of the year. The Brazilian school year is on a different schedule than the American one and he wasn't old enough to start there before we came to the US. His teacher is helping him to catch up with the other students that are a half year ahead of him. He seems to be doing fine, though. These transitions are a challenge to the kids, but we believe that they will be benefited by them in the long run.

## Helping the Poor ... Door to Door Evangelism ... New Missionary Couple ...

Dear Brethren,

January 28, 2003

About a year and a half ago a group of our members started a new project. They call it social assistance. Their goal is to promote events to collect food and clothing for the needy. At each even there is lots of Christian music and a gospel message. "Tickets" to the events are bought with food and clothing. They have already helped hundreds of people who are jobless, orphans, widows, lost their homes to fire, poverty in times of sickness, etc.

At about the same time another group sprang up in the church doing another form of social work. They call themselves "IDE" or "GO". They take dental hygiene, haircuts, baths, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, Bible stories and other little things to small towns out in the interior. They

travel once a month. We now have a dentist in our church and a lady doctor has just been saved. I baptized her and her daughter last month. This project was a spontaneous offshoot of our medical mission trips, which have been a huge success. We have sent 3 young women away to nursing school, one last year and 2 more just this month.

Then about 6 months ago 2 couple from our church asked to start special team to do door to door evangelism in the outer neighborhoods of town. They were trained by my son-in-law Dauro, who is also one of our pastors here at First Baptist Church. Luis works for the National Health Foundation (Federal government) and has a college degree. He was saved in an Assembly of God church, but when he moved to Cruzeiro do Sul started attending our services. When he heard and understood the security of the believer he dumped the Pentecostal heresies. Then he met Alcinete here at church. They gathered and trained a group of young people to work with them in house to house evangelism. On one weekend recently they were in 16 homes, witnessed to over 50 people and 7 were saved.

Two months ago I dropped a hint to the leaders of the 3 groups I just described in the 3 paragraphs above. My hint was as follows "What if we were to take all 3 teams into a poor section of town, take the gospel door to door (evangelism team), bring the neighborhood to our chapel to take care of their teeth, hair etc. plus more gospel (IDE team), then close the day with a service and soup for the whole neighborhood (Social Assistance team)?" What do you know, they took my hint seriously! We held the first joint project at Cruzeiro do Sul on December 21, 2002. This section of town is very poor, drug ridden and overgrown with little kids. Well it was one fun day! It was a challenge trying to "preach" to over 200 little children sitting around me on the concrete floor. There were over 100 adults present, too. We plan to try to do this in a different section of town at least once a month.

This month I have been to Thaumaturgo and the upper Tejo River. We have a new missionary couple at Thaumaturgo: Emerson and Flavia. The former missionary who we sent there 9 years ago is now in seminary in southern Brazil. He, Jose Maia, plans to work with Indians and needs special training. Emerson has already done a great job and it is pleasing to see a young couple that has been trained directly in our home church going about the work just as they have been trained. I went to the upper Tejo to look for another location for an air strip. All the terrain up there is so hilly that we have not quite found the ideal spot yet.

Andrew also has made two river trips. He went to Thaumaturgo last month for the anniversary meeting. I was unable to go because the event I described earlier in my letter. While there, he and 2 of our other workers went up to the mouth of the Tejo River where they visited and witnessed in every house. We do not have a work in that village. There were 23 professions of faith. Seven more were saved during the conference at Thaumaturgo. His other trip was with Pastor Ernesto to another village that we don't yet have a work. There

Last month I reported about a 16 year old girl from our church named Danitza. She had her open heart surgery on the 20th of February and she is to come out of the ICU unit tomorrow. The three hour surgery we expected turned into nine! They found more problems with her heart and were able to repair them. This is why her recovery is taking longer than expected.

Anita and I thank each of you that had a part in helping financially and with your prayers. The Lord always knows what He is doing. The figure I stated we needed for surgery has more than doubled due to the complications and extra hospital stay. But you gave almost twice as much as I said we needed. This just proves again how the Lord leads and directs in our lives. After the doctor

found the other problem in her heart he had to close the wound with latex (Gotyrx) patch. It so happened that the patch they used was the only one they had in their supplies of donated things from the United States. The doctor told me you can't get them here in Peru. The patch was also the perfect size and thickness for the doctor's purposes. If he had not had the patch we would have lost Danitza! She will be in the hospital for about one more week and then to a hotel here in Lima for about another week after that, and then, hopefully, back to Huanuco to be with her twin sister, Sofia, and her mother and brothers. Again, thank you all for your prayers for Danitza. I want to give special thanks to brother Jim Miller who made an all out effort to help on raising the funds for the operation. Many individuals and several churches responded also. Thanks to each of you.

I traveled north to Huaral the other day and finally got the construction under way there for their new church building. It has been a long time waiting on plans and other red tape.
