Church and Three Missions . . . Purchase Good Property . . . Work Teams Welcome . . .

Dearest Friends,

August 31, 2004

So much has happened this month that it is hard to know where to start. So I will begin with the ministries: When we returned, the main Church and the three mission points were going well. But as you know as in all things, there is always one that needs more help than the others, so we are going to concentrate on the mission point at Pereque. The work there is not the newest one but it is the slowest growing one. We have Bible school there every Saturday morning and church services on Thursday nights. This week we had nineteen children and four adults on Saturday, and we have asked the children to bring their parents this Thursday night for a special service. With this we are hoping to get more adults involved.

The other two points are growing steadily and more and more adults are beginning to come to the services. We have built a building at the Mission point at Morror and are meeting in the house at Olarira. We are looking at beginning another congregation in a subdivision a little farther from the main church. Pray for the workers of this new work because of the distance they will have to travel.

We have told you about the Seminary we have started at the main Church. Well we are hoping from that we will get dedicated workers for these new works. We had four classes last semester and will have five classes this semester. Please pray that the people that are taking the classes will remain dedicated to the end.

Now for some more great (AWESOME) news. We have found the property for the School. YES!!!! We have a contract on 5 and 1/2 lots. How AWSOME it is to see the Lord at work—sometimes in mysterious ways. When we left here in January we were pretty much set on a piece of property and had made an offer on it. When we came back we contacted the owner and he had given up on us coming back and had sold part of the land. He thought he could back out of the deal, but we were unsure of trying. We began to pray and look for another place. In the meantime God was at work as He always is and we sometimes forget it. We found these lots and the pastor and several church members prayed over the lots and the results: we are beginning to build our fence to secure the property. With the money we recieved when we sold some property in Paris, Kentucky, and the generous giving of Gods people there in the States, we were able to put more than half on the purchase price. We have the rest of this year and until next August to pay the rest. We have enough money to build the fence around the property and start the building for the school. If God should bless you with some money and you would like to help in the purchase of this property or with the building of the school, please send your donations to B.F.M. designated for the new work we are doing. We have also bought the block making machine (thanks Terri) and have set it up on the property to begin making the blocks for the fence and the first building. I will be getting pictures as the work progresses.

We have begun the footer work and have given thanks to God that the lots are 95% flat as all the digging is done by hand with posthole diggers and mattock and shovels. It will take some time as we have to put the fence around all the property to protect the construction materials and the tools. The lot sizes are 10M X 36M, this is a standard building lot here in Brazil. They are in a good neighborhood and will suit our needs wonderfully for the vocational school. It just never ceases to amaze me how AWESOME is the God we serve.

Our doors have always been open to visitors, but now more so than ever as there is a never ending amount of work to be done. Work groups are welcome. We are looking forward to seeing you all.

Again as always Thanks for your prayers and for the support you give to us through Baptist Faith Missions. You are an important part of our work here in Caraguatubata, Brazil.

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

September 3, 2004

Greetings in the name of our Sovereign Lord and Saviour. We trust all is well with you there. The Lord is better to us than we deserve a thousand times over. We marvel every day at his mercy and grace with fallen man. Certainly we live in times of great immorality and violence. It helps to remember that He is still in control and takes care of His children.

Our work here in Central Brazil is stable and without great problems in the nine works that we help support. We just got confirmation that Bro. Marcelo Calota and his wife Luciana as well as their three children, Brna, Filipe and Marcela will be coming here to Mato Grosso to help us out in the work at the Altos do Coxipo Baptist Church. This church has been organized for several years. Many souls have been saved here, some have surrendered to preach from this church and it has been a blessing in the community. Due to the fact we have not been able to have a steady Brazilian preacher there it has suffered. Everytime we come to the States and leave somebody there to conduct the services it goes down some. We beleive this family has the God given commitment and capacity to carry on this work long term. He is not a fireball preacher, but very much into the Word; His family all help out in the music and his wife is a very gracious and talented person. Pray with us that they will be able to come for sure. They plan to come in January after the end of the school year. We will have considerable expenses moving them from Minas Gerais to Cuiaba, but we are sure in our hearts that it is the Lord's working and will.

We have been with colds and allergy for some time now. It is very hot and dusty this time of the year. It may be a month or more before we get any relief. When we were younger we didn't slow down when this hit us, but now we are forced to take better care of ourselves. We are planning to go to the Novo Diamantino work tomorrow to spend two days. All seems to be going well there. Here at the Altos do Coxipo church we have three awaiting Baptism and we received one by letter this past Sunday. Pray for us as we proclaim the precious Gospel here to a very needy people.

MISSION ADVENTURES TO AFRICA

On June 28, we were up early and eager to get started on what we came to Kenya to do, build a church building. The weather was not what I expected it to be. Kenya is in the Southern Hemisphere, and so the seasons are the opposite of what they are in the States. There, it was winter and the weather was much cooler than I expected. At night, we slept under blankets, and some mornings it was so cool that we could see our breath. However, the days were clear and beautiful, and the temperature was about like we have in Ohio during September.

Our first stop of the day was at Mike and Pam's where Pam had prepared a "workingman's" breakfast. We ate each morning under a gazebo on the property. Here, for the first time, we met Daniel who is the Anderson's language teacher and who also helps in the street children's ministry carried on by Calvary Baptist Church. Daniel speaks six languages and has taught about fifty missionaries the Swahili language. He said that of all the people he had taught, Mike and Pam's son Nathan is the best student he has ever had. He informed us that there are about 600 to 700 street children in Katala. Our heart ached as he told us some of the things he sees and deals with while working with these unfortunate children. We would visit that ministry the next day, and so more will be said about it in the next MISSION ADVENTURE report.

After breakfast, devotions, and prayer time, we were off to the work site.

When we arrived at the work site, we were met by about eight nationals who had started work a few days before we arrived by clearing the lot where the building was to be built. They had also set large poles, about eight inches square, in concrete. We were soon at work cutting boards that were to be nailed horizontally between these poles and cutting tin that would be nailed to the sides of the building. The nationals who had nothing to work with except handsaws and hammers had made one rafter out of very heavy timber. I took one look at it and wondered, "How in the world are we ever going to lift that thing into place?" With the arrival of Brother Mike came a gas generator and power saw. Rich and Greg took over the sawing of the timbers (too big to call boards), and the sawdust was soon flying.

Soon after lunch we left to visit an orphanage where Pam sometimes goes to examine the children and dispense medicine. A couple from Germany operates the orphanage. There are about 50 children there. Many of them have lost their parents to aids, and some of the children also have this disease which is of epidemic proportion in Kenya and throughout Africa. Here, we again saw Lorissa, a young German girl, whom we had met when in Nairobi when we first arrived. She had gone to the city with Mike and Pam for medical treatment. Lorissa came to Kenya about three months earlier to work with the children at this orphanage. She was not there long until she became seriously ill with malaria, typhoid, and had several kinds of parasites in her body. Had it not been for the special care that Mike and Pam gave her, she might have died. She informed us that her body could not live in such conditions and that she would be returning to Germany in a few days.

There are about three buildings in the orphanage compound, and the conditions are very primitive. Their water comes from a well, and they have outhouses with only a hole in the floor for the waste. If they had a bath house I did not see it; they must have only pan bathing. The orphanage was not at all clean by our standards, but these children had two things that the street children do not have: a roof over their heads and food each day. We brought gifts of candy that we passed out to the children.

The next day, we would again be working on the building. We would also visit the street children's ministry.

Good Report From Prison Ministry...

Dear praying friends,

September 2, 2004

Another month has quickly come and gone, and there are many things to give you an update about. Many exciting things are happening in the ministry in Kenya, while there are other important things to report here in the States as well.

One of my major prayer requests before leaving the country of Kenya was to find a faithful leader who would be able to continue the work well and strong while I am in the States for furlough. This is a major task for missionaries, as many times, those who would desire a position such as this are in it for the wrong motives. The Lord blessed in a wonderful way by providing me with a faithful Kenyan who is teaching the Word of God each week in Kitale main prison. Because of reasons of identification, I am not able to say his name, but please pray for him as he carries on this ministry presently. He wrote me a letter last month and told me that the classes have doubled in size since I left the country. Praise the Lord! He is now training around 200-250 prisoners, so this is exciting and I ask you to pray for him and his health and strength as he has much to do in the present day. Also, pray for the new believers in the prison, that God would encourage and strengthen them as well as they are new in their faith. There are around 110 new believers, both men and women, since the beginning of the ministry (Proverbs 11:30).

I will be moving to Pennsylvania in the next couple of weeks to be with Carrie and also to attend pre-marital counseling. I will be continuing to raise support, so please pray that God would bring in the necessary funds in His time. Please pray for us during this time, as this is so important to our upcoming marriage and our future as a couple. Please pray for Carrie, as she has many responsibilities with our wedding and also with other duties at this time.

I read a fantastic Christian book earlier this month, and it had great information on the subject of prayer. It said "Prayer is the cure for the disease of self-confidence. When we pray, we see ourselves as needy, and God as wealthy." How true! How much we need to "empty" ourselves of any pride, or other sin in our lives, and realize that everything depends on our Heavenly Father. We are to pray without ceasing and depend on Him for everything in our lives (1 Thess. 5:17). Let's start trusting the Lord more than ever and watch what great things He will do for us.

The other ministries in Kitale seem to be running very well. In both churches, evangelism teams go out and share the gospel each week, and even now, when I am in the States. This is a great encouragement to me, and I know the Lord will bless those who are so faithful to Him.

Please pray for Carrie and me for our upcoming wedding, for our support needs, and also for the works in Kitale as they continue on. 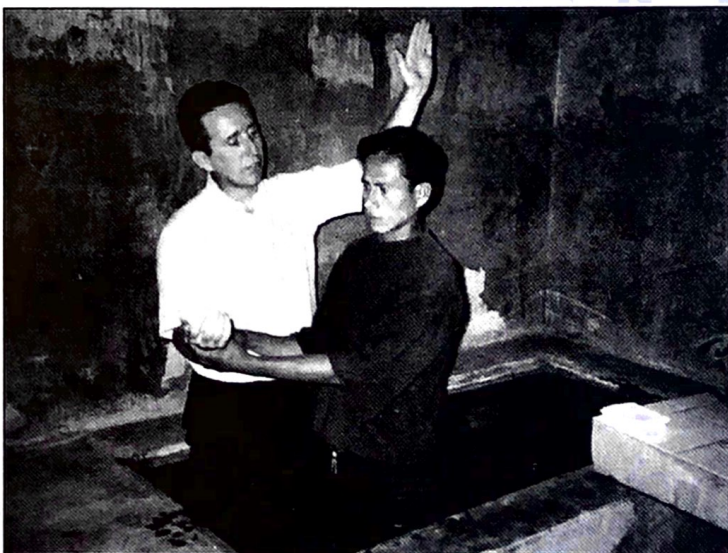
The baptismal service that we were anticipating went even better than expected. I mentioned in my last letter that there were seven candidates, but we actually baptized on August 15th. Included in that number was my own son, Brennan. What a joy it was to hear him share his faith in Jesus Christ. We held a riverside service which was well attended.

After the winter school break in July our evangelistic team, Project Life, returned to their activities in the public schools and public parks. My daughter, Jessie, participated on two separate trips and is developing a greater passion for winning lost folks to the Lord. There were several hundred professions of faith in a coastal town a few hours drive from our home. There are a couple of Baptist churches located not too far from where these folks live and we have helped them get connected for their spiritual growth and discipleship. In the month of September the team will be going to some interior towns where there are no Baptist churches. One of our main goals will be to win a sufficient number of persons to Christ to establish a mission point for a future church plant. God has blessed this evangelistic ministry beyond my wildest dreams.

There were several obstacles to overcome in these evangelistic efforts that might have been disheartening had the Lord not given the victory. A group of satanic worshipers attempted to disrupt one public park meeting by running circles around the gathering with long flowing gowns with white hoods. But God, in His power, did not let the crowd become alarmed and they remained attentive to the preaching of the word, the testimonies, and the gospel skits. There were several dozens of persons saved at the conclusion of that meeting. In one afternoon presentation, a local politician (it's election time here too), tried to take advantage of the social services our team offers (free haircuts, blood pressure checks, etc.), as being his own to promote his own cause. Our ministry leader, Paulo, perceived the deception and warned the people that the politician was in no way connected with our efforts. With his guise removed he gave up and left the scene. We ask that you continue to earnestly pray for God's blessings on this ministry of outreach.

We appreciate the cards and e-mails that some of you have sent. May God bless you for your care and support of the work here in southern Brazil.

Ninth Year For Medical Team ... Many Villages Visited ... Remember Boat and Motor Fund ...

Dear Brethren,

June 2004

Last month on my way back from the visit with the Asheninka Indians in Peru, I met up with our medical missions team at the border town of Foz do Breu. We have a full time missionary, Brother Aesio, and congregation there.

This was the ninth straight year that we have taken doctors, dentists, nurses and medical supplies, and of course the gospel, to this remote area.

We were glad to have Janete back with us. The church sent her to Goias (central Brazil) for her training as a nurse's aid. It was also good to have our missionaries from Thaumaturgo, Emerson and Flavia, along to help. Emerson takes care of the pharmacy and Flavia works with the children, teaching Bible stories and songs.

Our supply boat and support team of three young men arrived Saturday, May 29th. The doctors, dentists, and nurse arrived by plane Sunday morning. I came from up stream in Peru on Sunday afternoon. We held our first service that night with a full house. All day Monday and Tuesday the medical team was busy. Each night we had services.

The villages visited were, Pedra Pintada, Caipora, Aida, Belfor and Matrinxa. This was the first time we visited with this last village with the clinic. Our mission at Thaumaturgo had opened a preaching point there a few months ago and already has a number of Christians. I baptized eight of them. The river was so low that I was over half across the river with the candidates, to get enough water to perform the baptism. That night we had over 100 in the service.

During the trip over 1,500 people were served with some kind of medical care. About a 1,000 of them attended services. I baptized eleven and three more were saved. The weather was perfect. We had temperatures in the 70's and 80's and not a drop of rain. Of course the river was as low as it could get.

Fortunately, the motor held up for the rest of the trip. There were so many shallows, stumps and rapids that it took me a few extra hours to get home. Don't forget to help me replace the old motor. Please pray and consider the possibility of a special offering for the boat and motor fund.

God bless you all and thanks for all the ways you support us.

September 1, 2004

The summer Baptist Faith Missions conference was a blessing and very motivational. Richland Baptist Church at Livermore, Kentucky and their pastor, Glenn Archer, were most gracious hosts. Every detail was carefully planned to make the missionaries, pastors and all participants welcome and comfortable. Certainly they rolled out the best of Kentucky's hospitality and cooking, and the fellowship was delightful.

The messages were inspirational and encouraged each of us to keep missions in our hearts, on our minds and in our works of love. The mission reports from the churches at home and abroad in Kenya and Brazil were reason to rejoice and praise the Lord. We were challenged to have the heart of God and share the Gospel with every person on the earth.

New Churches - The first service at Riacho Doce was held on August 28. The mission team has been visiting and sharing the gospel door to door for weeks. Seventeen people had already professed their faith in Jesus and were being taught individually because there was no place for them to meet. The building was completed and all rejoiced to have a permanent meeting place for the new mission. The construction team was able to finish the building in four weeks of hard work.

August 30th, the construction team began the foundations for the building at Cidade de Deus. This is an area of very poor people and the gospel has been received well. God has blessed and there are consistently more than 150 people who attend the services and Bible teaching each week in the outdoors. Dr. Mark Miller met the need to purchase land and build a church building before the rainy season begins. As you read this report, their building should be ready. Praise God for the roof over their heads, out of the rain and sun; now they have a permanent meeting place.

After weeks of prayer and of searching, we are closing a contract to rent a small warehouse to start the second mission church in Belem. The population in this city is one million and a half.

Mission Team from Mt. Calvary Baptist Church - August 9-18 a team from Mt. Calvary Baptist Church, Charleston, West Virginia (Bro. David Mitchell) came to Manaus for a mission impact. While here they saw over 250 people accept Christ. The Lord worked mightily through the lives of Pastor Mark, David, Justin, Lauren, Amber, Kelly, Courtney, Brad, Anne and Raquel. Each morning they drove out to a neighborhood where we've recently started a church and at the local school presented the gospel through drama and music. In the afternoons they walked the streets of the neighborhood inviting people for the service in the evening. In the evenings they led the service, where the gospel was presented clearly. They were at a different congregation every day. All were excited to have them and were impressed by how well they sang in Portuguese. They also participated in starting a new church at Santa Etelvina. It was a true blessing to have them with us. Our prayer is for God to mobilize a new generation of people whose heartbeat is passionate about being personally involved in missions at home and abroad.

As the Lord leads you, support the general fund to keep us missionaries on the field and give special donations marked "Paul-New Churches" to purchase and build meeting places for new churches in new areas.

Praise the Lord, for His mercy endures forever. God is faithful and His mercies are new every morning. What life would be without Him I cannot imagine. Jesus is so kind, loving, forgiving, merciful, tender-hearted toward His children and His hand is outstretched with compassion to the needy sinner. How I want to be like Him!

HEAVEN AND PREPARATION TO GO THERE

Our dear Brother Sebastian, age 73, beat us to it. He got there before us, but our bodies will rise together. He is the first member of our congregation in Urai to die. He lived on our street and for several years I have shaved him two times a week. Victim of a life of strong drink, he had had several strokes. When he trusted Christ as his Savior here in Urai his life was transformed even though his body wasted away. I took him to church since he was not able to walk much. It was his joy and pleasure to go and sing praises to the Lord. Every service he sang with joy though his words were very difficult to understand. Sometimes he would ask for a certain hymn and when I could not understand I would ask him to sing a little of it. He would hum a little of the tune and I would know. As long as he could speak at all, I loved to hear him pray. He and God understood what he was saying and I rejoiced greatly in spirit. I thanked God for the joy of preaching his funeral. I told the story of his life-one of hardship, sin and suffering-and told how different his life would have been and the life of his children had he trusted the Lord as a boy of 12 when he first heard. His mother did trust Christ and was baptized by a Letonian Baptist Preacher who had come to Brazil to escape communism after the First World War. She died when he was about 12.

For almost three months our bus route has been in action. Two Sundays ago four children and one young lady trusted Christ. On that same morning I baptized Wesley, a young man 19 years old. These are saved and waiting to go to Heaven.
