A Tribute to **Brother Richard Turner**

Richard Turner, Brother in Christ, Missionary to Brazil, and Pastor of the Lord's Churches. Husband and Father, a Beloved Servant of the Lord.

I first knew Brother Turner when he came to Lexington Baptist College in the early sixties. He was a good student, a hard worker, and an upright, clean living young man. He was, even in his youth, dedicated to the understanding that the Bible is the Word of God and that the Bible is the final authority for faith and practice. He lived his life according to what he believed the Bible taught. All else in his life was subject to this overriding conviction.

Richard was a devoted family man. He loved dearly his wife, Wanda. He loved his children. He did not fail to discipline them, but he did so in love, mercy, and compassion. He worked hard in difficult circumstances to provide well for his family.

After pastoring churches in Kentucky and Illinois, he went to the mission field in Brazil, South America. He labored sixteen years there. He founded the New Hope Baptist Church in Cuiaba in the state of Mato Grosso. That church remains to this day a faithful and steadying influence on the other churches that have since been started by missionaries with Baptist

Brother Turner accepted the pastorate of the Riverview Baptist Church in Point Pleas West Virginia in 1987, In 1990, the Faith Baptist Church in Kirksville, Missouri, called him as their pastor. Wherever Brother Turner labored, he gained the love and respect of the people. He left behind churches that know and love the truth. Brother Richard Turner was a man faithful to the Word of the Lord. He did not turn aside to the right hand or to the left. He stood firm in the principles and teachings of the Word. He knew he was a sinner saved by grace through the shed blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. He took no credit to himself. He gave all the honor and glory to our Lord Jesus. May we long remember this giant in the faith as we carry on in his absence. Richard, absent from the body, absent from friends and family, is present with His Lord and Savior. We wait the resurrection morning. We wait for our Lord to call us home.

We have had some wonderful experiences in our 20 years of ministry here in southern Brazil, but we have to admit that God just continues to bless and amaze us. We can't praise Him enough! This past month we had the joy of 3 men asking to be trained for Christian service. This is certainly an answer to our prayers and to that of those who have been praying with us. Our vision of establishing churches in the hundreds of cities in our region that are without a single New Testament church

is closer to being accomplished. We have plenty of work ahead of us, but we see the Lord at work and this encourages us tremendously for the task.

The leadership training program is developing better than I could have imagined. My Brazilian partners are a blessing to me in my own walk with the Lord and as great role models for our trainees. Anderson, and his wife Janayna, have recently joined us to aid in the Bible and missions courses. They were well prepared for these roles under the ministry of Bro. David and Sister Pennie Hatcher in Manaus, in northern Brazil. We trust that God will use them greatly in the leadership training program here to reach this region with the gospel and to plant many new churches.

The Project Life pioneer evangelism team is getting set to get back out on the highways this month. During the month of January, school is not in session and that is their main venue for public gospel presentations. We took advantage of the school break to do some necessary repairs and maintenance on the bus/motor home. It is almost ready to roll again and we are looking forward to a fruitful year of conversions to Christ.

Charlene has been meeting monthly with a group of unbelieving ladies to be salt and light among them. These meetings have generated considerable interest among some and two of them have gone with their husbands to a special presentation at our church. The door is still open and we pray and trust that God will use Charlene's testimony and personal witness to bring these ladies, and perhaps their husbands and families, to know Christ intimately.

Building Moving Forward... Visitor From Cornerstone . . . Needs . . .

February 2, 2005

This has been an AWESOME month here is Caraguatatuba, Brazil! God has blessed in many ways and we have been able to be a part of these blessings. Our power has been installed on the lot and now we will be able to put the concrete mixer to work. We have been mixing the mortar and concrete on the ground and for those of you who have never done this it is a new experience. You get done in one day what would take one hour because of the manner in which you have to

work. But God is faithful and to those who wait faithfully He gives much. We were looking forward to having the Group from The Cornerstone Baptist Church in Winchester, Ky. come to work with us, and we planned two more projects. The projects were to lay blocks to make the fence around the school property(this was for the men) and make covers for the bus seats (this for the women). But we are entering into the rainy season and guess what, it rained every day that the group was here. But do you think that stopped us? No we just changed the projects; the men took the bus project and the women moved on to another. I don't mean that the men sewed covers for the bus seats but we tore out all the seats and also the floor (what there was left of it) of the bus and replaced all of it. The group purchased fiberglass seats for the bus and we put in a new floor to hold the seats. The ladies went on to paint a mission point and paint murals on the walls and Bible verses around the walls. So you see there is no lack of projects for you to do when you come down. So if you have an interest in working on a mission project or visiting a mission field here in Brazil, Barbara and I would love to have you visit us here in Caraguatatuba

Remember the man, Daniel, that I spoke about last month? Well he has been fired form his job, so we are contracting him to help lay the wall on the property now, and it is going slow becau the rain. Another reason the wall is progressing so slow is that we have to make our scaffolding. The reason being if you want to rent, it costs an arm and a leg, and we need both of them to do the work here (Ha!). So as a great friend of mine says-improvise, adapt and overcome. Here that is a saying that we put into practice everyday. We don't have all the necessities that we have back in the States, so we improvise, adapt and overcome. We hope to complete this in February and start making the monster gate (3 meters tall and 6 plus meters long) for the front of the property. This gate will be on rollers for the ease of opening and closing it. This project will require much welding, so if you are experienced in this area we welcome your help. Come on down. After the wall is built we will begin on the buildings for the school and the carpentry shop.

Our seminary will start in February and I will be teaching this semester. The classes I will be teaching are Discipleship and Evangelism. I am really excited about the classes and we have eighteen to twenty students, most of them from our Church. What a way to be a part of planting missions here in Brazil. Speaking of missions, we are negotiating to buy property for the third mission here and are looking about starting another on down the road about forty-five minutes. Continue to pray that God will be the center of all that we do here in Caraguatatuba.

We are still looking for a bus that will help in our Sunday School program. Actually our

attendance is down some since it is vacation time and also because of the rain. You see they have a more valid reason not to come to Church when it rains than we there in the States do. They have to walk, if not all the way to Church, then at least to the bus stop and stand in the rain waiting for the bus. During this vacation season lots of our members have to work because this is a tourist city and you make your money during the tourist season. So they work long and hard hours during this time. After this season we will be back to normal in the Church, and I know that we will be looking for more room for the children in Sunday School. All this said to show the need for the extra bus, because of the travel time and the need for two routes per Church service.

I have mentioned several projects that will need your help to be completed. We need your

I have mentioned several projects that will need your neip to be completed. We need your prayer that we can continue with God's work here and also your financial help. It is very hard for me to ask for financial help because my father always taught us boys that you have to work for what you want in life. So when it comes time here to do a project I struggle because here I cannot work, and if I could I would be taking time from the work God has sent me here to do, spread the Gospel. Then how can I accomplish the tasks at hand? By telling you and others about the needs and letting God work in the hearts of all. So here are the immediate needs here in our work: If we could get \$4,000.00 for the downpayment for the bus, the church could then pay the monthly payments. For the school: foundations and wall \$6,880. Roof and trusses \$4,800.00, floor \$750.00, 1,600 sq. ft. for \$12,430.00 For us here on the field this is an unsurmountable amount, but then we remember that our Father owns the cattle on a thousand hills and for Him nothing is impossible! So we wait patiently to see what He will do and through whom He will do it.

As we start this new year here on the field we want to say how much we miss all of you and love you in Christ. But even though we miss you we would not want to be anywhere else because this is where God has put us and we are happy in His service. How AWESOME is the God we serve?!? As it says in Jeremiah 29:11,12,13, He thinks about us and has everything planned for us and when we pray He harkens and when we seek Him with our hearts we will find Him.

God's Justice . . . Dog With An Ear For Music . . . Anita's Health . . .

Last month I told about one of our young preachers, Manuel Avila, being murdered. The response by so many of you from the States was such a blessing to Anita and me. His murderers have been brought to justice in God's own way. A band of four men had robbed and killed at least three taxi drivers (including Manuel). The third week of January they attempted to kidnap a lady from her home but

failed in the attempt and stole her car instead. While driving the stolen car from Huanuco to Lima they had a wreck and two of them were killed instantly and one of them had to have his leg amputated in the hospital and the other (the leader) was apprehended later after being dumb enough to return to his house in Huanuco. He is in jail. I thought you would like to know "the rest of the story."

I spent a week in the interior jungle town of Yurimaguas. Brother Daniel Castro has been

working there for about twelve years now and doing a great job. Several works have been started and three churches organized since he began working there. His son, Benjamin, studies music here in Huanuco and lives with us. He is a real blessing to the church. We had two trust the Lord during the meeting in Yurimaguas. We had several from the Camponal Indian tribe in the services. They came dressed in their native Indian garb; very colorful and interesting.

I have to tell you about "doggy," Pastor Daniel's cocker spaniel. "Doggy" is accustomed to laying under the front pew in the church building while services are being held. This little dog sleeps during the preaching but has quite an ear for good music. Each night as the congregation would sing or someone would sing a special, "doggy" perked up and listened and actually would get a sort of smile on its face. But one night the youth group got up to sing and to be quite honest it was terrible! "Doggy" sat up and literally had a snarl on its face and during the second verse promptly proceeded to bark once and then walk out the door. I thought about following "doggy's" lead but I stayed put and suffered through the rest of the song!

We have five more days before we begin our "Summer Youth Camp." The church is excited and in full swing with making the preparations. Pray for us and the campers that God's love and grace will

be manifested in all we do. I will give you a report after camp is over.

Anita and I thank each of you for your prayers for her health. She is doing 100% better and free from pain in her leg. She wears a back brace and also a knee brace and this seems to keep the nerves from being pinched and therefore the pain is alleviated. Thank you for your e-mails and calls expressing your concern. The roads here are very rough, and hard on a car, so car maintenance takes first priority. Anyway, the Lord was good, and we arrived back in Kitale safely last Saturday. It was a blessing to stay longer in Nairobi, though. Due to not having a car, we had to use a taxi to take us to do many errands while we were there. Back In Kenya ... Report On Works . . . Note New E-mail Address . . .

Greetings from sunny Kenya. We arrived back in the country that we love just three weeks ago. It was very sad to leave our family, friends, our home church, and all of our loved ones, but God has called us here, and we must be faithful to the tasks ahead. Since we are in the Southern Hemisphere, the seasons are reversed, and it is sunny and hot now. We are really enjoying the change in weather from what we left behind in W.Va. God was so good to allow us to return safely, and it was so nice to get back home to those that we love here.

Nathan has remained back in the States to get more financial support, but we are looking forward to he and Carrie joining us here again in October, Lord willing. The prison ministry continues to do well, and over fifty more souls have been added to God's kingdom since we left. Noah, the prisoner who is taking over for Nathan, is doing a great job, and many of the prisoners have graduated from the evangelism and discipleship classes, and they are reaching their fellow inmates for the Lord. There is a waiting list for the classes, and it is a blessing to see the changes in lives that have been wrought by the Word of God. the Word of God.

Andrea and her workers are doing a good job with the street children's ministry, and just last week, three precious souls received Christ as their Savior. When we left, there were ten orphans/street children being cared for in the homes of some of our church members, and now, there are seventeen Andrea is reaching between 80-100 street children per week with the feeding program, but many of these kids are on sniffing glue, which alters their thinking capacities. In order to be placed in a Christian home, the child has to be off of glue, and have a desire to follow the rules, and attend school. Many of them do not want this, but they are still reached with the Gospel, and fed when they come to the ministry each week. The number of street kids in Kitale has grown to close to 2,000. Much of this is due to the death of parents from Aids. So, we continue to pray and ask God how that we can expand this very needy ministry to reach more of them.

The helicopter is being repaired, as there were some major problems with the blades and motor

So, Pam will not be able to go up into the bush this month. However, we are looking forward to expanding the ministry there, as time and finances allows. We are praying about new areas to go into in order to reach those who have never heard of the name of Jesus. Lord willing, Pam will be going to Nairobi next month to attend a week long workshop for nurses that deals with tropical medicine, and many of the problems that she sees commonly in the bush areas. There are professors coming from a major university in Texas to teach the classes, so we want her to take advantage of this opportunity to learn more, so she can be more effective.

Our Calvary church is having problems with the leadership there, so we would ask for your prayers for wisdom to know how to handle these problems. There is gossip and jealousy among the leaders, as well as other problems. So, we are asking God to intervene.

Imani Baptist, our second church, is growing and is a blessing to us. There are over (60) who come regularly, and we are pleased with the increase in the number of young people coming, and desiring to learn more about our Lord. Laban, the pastor, had a very bad case of malaria last month, and almost died, but is recovering now. He has been a faithful servant and has led the church well. The members love each other, and have a heart for the work of our Lord. I want to restart the Bible Institute that was on hold while we were in the States, in order to train leaders and to better ground them in the fundamentals of our faith.

Well, this is a report on what has been going on while we have been gone. There are many challenges and problems, but God is faithful to hear and answer your prayers for us, and we appreciate all of you who encouraged us when we were in the States. Without your prayers on our behalf, and your financial giving, we would not be able to stay, and serve our Lord in this part of His mission field. Please do continue to pray for us, that we would have His wisdom in handling the daily problems of the work. We invite you to come and see what God is doing here. May our Lord bless you in your mission field there.
