The Lord Answers Prayers . . . No Case As Judge Flees . . . Work With Team Of Youth . . .

Dear Prayer Partners,

April 1, 2005

The Lord did answer your prayers for us this month. In general, Brazil has a great degree of liberty in spreading the gospel in public places. We got a different reaction in Teixeira Soares, a town about 200 miles from our home church. During the evening gospel

presentation, law officers arrived on the scene and demanded that our team stop the meeting immediately. We discovered that the judge prohibited the presentation of certain gospel films in that town. Our team was unaware of that prohibition and was forced to stop the presentation. Three members were also required to appear at the police station and to return two days later to give a deposition. During the interval of those two days we prayed and asked many of you to be in prayer about that delicate situation. As it turned out, the Lord worked in such a way as to cause the judge to flee town and not to press charges. When our team members returned to give their deposition, there was no case against them. God is great, isn't He!

The events in the next town to which our team took the gospel seemed to bring a special message of comfort and encouragement from the Lord. Instead of being demanded to stop our gospel presentations, the local police force gave us special protection. Not only that, but when an invitation to accept Christ was given, several of the police officers got out of their patrol cars and went forward to publicly declare Christ as their Savior.

My daughter, Jessie, and I had the privilege to work with a team of youth who came to Brazil from Brandon, Florida to share the gospel through skits, testimonies and translated messages. Jessie had just turned 14 years old, but showed a maturity beyond her years. The Lord thrilled my heart by allowing me to see Jessie work passionately and skillfully with the languages and to see many people trust in Christ as their Savior as a result of having heard the gospel. We thank the leaders of Bell Shoals Baptist Church for giving us this privilege of working together and for their passion for the lost in Brazil. This is their fourth trip to Brazil and they intend to return again next year. I had the privilege of translating the messages for my life-long friend, Mark Hutchinson. He has a tremendous passion for the glory of God and the Lord used him greatly to turn many to Christ. The Lord can use you too. Contact me and make plans to come share the gospel where the fields are white unto harvest.

Thank you for your faithfulness to pray for and support us in this marvelous ministry.

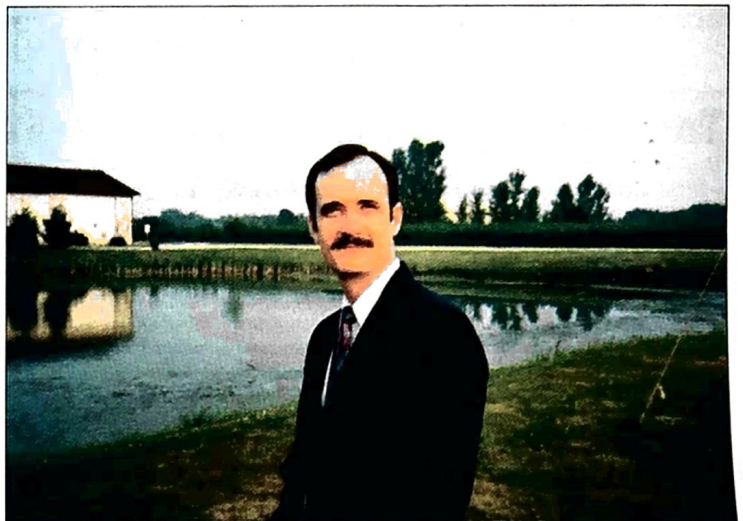

Looking For Places To Start New Churches . . . How God Used An Automobile Accident For Our Good . . .

Dear friends,

April 4, 2005

Wanda and I and Abelardo, a Christian businessman, and his wife Aida, are in the northeastern coastal area of Brazil. Our objective is to find and purchase land or buildings suitable for planting new works this year. The distance from Manaus is 1,770 miles. In Brazil, the capital city of each state is the center of political, economic, educational and business affairs. For this reason, we strategically target the center of the state activity for these new church plants. We pray that those who respond to the gospel and accept Jesus Christ as savior and Lord

will become disciples in the word, prepared for the ministry of the word, and that the Father will empower and send these messengers in to the unreached cities and towns of their own state. The initial cost of going to the big city is a larger investment but also more cost effective in the years to come.

In each location, the Lord has provided new friends to help in this important task. We flew to Fortaleza, Ceara at the beginning of the month, where we picked up brother Abelardo's car and drove to Natal, in the state of Rio Grande do Norte, to begin the search for land or building. A pastor from Natal pointed out the areas that are most in need of Baptist churches. We concentrated our search in an area that is growing and very densely populated, finding several locations that would be suitable, but very high priced. Brother Abelardo began negotiation with the owners and placed bids. We were in Natal for a week and did not reach a suitable response. We decided to drive on to Joao Pessoa in the state of Paraiba. After looking for almost a week, we located a large building that would be most suitable for a new church and contacted the real estate agent. Our bid was much lower than their asking price; but after several days of negotiation, we were able to close at an acceptable price. We received the keys on Saturday. The four of us had a thanksgiving service in the building on Sunday morning.

Having completed this purchase, we drove to Recife, in the state of Pernambuco, and scouted for buildings or land suitable for purchase or rental. We felt it would be best to wait, as we would possibly have to rent, considering that our reserve for purchase was depleted.

We then returned to Natal with the intention of going on back to Fortaleza the next morning. On our way into the city, we were hit by another car and the repairs took 3 days; no one was hurt. On the last day, in the area of our preference, the owners of a building originally built for a restaurant showed willingness to come down to the price we had offered. After several hours of negotiation, we arrived at a suitable value. We recognized that the Lord held us in Natal for three additional days in order to give the owners time to sell at a price acceptable to us.

Natal, Rio Grande do Norte, and Joao Pessoa, Paraiba, both state capitals, just two hours apart, are very beautiful, tropical, coastal cities. Natal has a population of nearly a million; Joao Pessoa has three quarters of a million people.

The buildings purchased will both need to be remodeled. We plan to move mission teams to these cities in early August. We are now on our way back to Fortaleza, Ceara, to look at land and negotiate for a possible donation.

Pray for the teams that are making preparations to move cross-country to these two northeastern cities. Please pray that God will raise partners to help shoulder the spiritual and financial burden for the church plants in these cities.

Dear Friends,

Since last month's letter, I preached a special meeting for the Faith Baptist Church in Hualar and also celebrated with the church here in Huanuco her thirty-third anniversary. One trusted Christ as Savior, and many wayward children of God got back on the right path.

But the most significant happening for Anita and me is that we are now taking care of two precious little seven-month-old twin girls, Katy and Carol. We are old enough to be their grandparents, and we admit they are very tiring, but we love having the opportunity to love them and take care of them until our heavenly Father directs otherwise. Needless to say that after many years of not having any children in the house, our lives and home have been turned upside down, Praise the Lord! I recommend all of you buy stock in "huggies" because two little girls here in Peru are sure to give the company a record year this year! We are in the process of obtaining legal custody, and then we will see about finding them a Godly Christian home (adoption). In last month's letter I wrote about their mother, Tanya, who has two other kids and just can't take care of the twins. She also has had some psychological problems in bonding with the infants due to their being the result of her being raped. God is on the throne and always knows what is best, and He has given Anita and me the joy of taking care of them and loving them for awhile. Please remember us, Tanya, and the babies in your prayers.

I will be leaving Anita alone for one week while I travel into Lima to meet Pastor Darrell Messer and Douglas Brooks and their families. Brother Messer is the pastor of the Emmanuel Baptist Church of Bellbrook, Ohio. They are coming down to visit the mission field and we are excited about their coming. We will be visiting works in Lima, Iquitos and Huanuco. I'll write more about it next month.

I have had a lot of trials this month in our church here in Huanuco, but God is always gracious and gives us the strength and wisdom to cope and win the victories. Our youth group is strong, our attendance is up and a good spirit pervades the church body. Thank you for your prayers.

I ask you to remember Roosevelt Hermitano, a national missionary that we love and support. He is one of the best men I have ever had the pleasure of working with. Roosevelt and his family have three mission works going at this time, but because drug trafficking is once again taking over many parts of the jungles of Peru, it is making his work and travel much more dangerous. Please remember him and his family in your prayers. Thanks. Until next month.

Taxes...Kenyan Style . . . Minister To Both Physical And Spiritual Needs . . . A Girl Named Dorcas . . .

Dear Praying Friends,

Thanks so much for your prayers on our behalf, and for your interest God's harvest field here in Kitale, Kenya. One fourth of this year is history, and we are closer to the Lord's return for His people.

Pam has been working on our tax records, and this has taken much time. The government of Kenya is planning on taxing missionaries 30% of the income that they are bringing into the country. Our accountant here wants to try to get us exempted from the high taxes, if possible. So, Pam has gone back to the year 2000 since we have been paying taxes here, and has gathered all of our receipts for these five years and categorized them, so that we know the amounts spent in the various ministries. Since 95% of our money goes for ministry, we have to prove to the government what we are doing with the money given to us, so that we will not have to pay the 30% tax. If this becomes law in June, we think that many missionaries will be leaving, as no one can afford to pay 30% of their income in taxes. Because of the high corruption here, many foreign donors are not giving aid to Kenya, so the government wants to get the money through taxation.

On a happier note, we are pleased with the progress of our Calvary church. We have lost members, but the spirit of those remaining is much better. There are still many problems, but several have left who were promoting bad attitudes that prevailed throughout the congregation. I am preaching messages on repentance and salvation, and a few have responded. It is still our desire to have a national pastor for this church, as we have for our second church, so we are starting our Bible Institute again this month. Many things have happened since our return to Kenya, so we are late restarting the Institute. There has been more interest this time than ever before with church members, especially from Imani Baptist, who want to attend. We want to train Kenyan nationals for pastoring churches, as well as being good deacons and Sunday School teachers.

Pam and I attended two different conferences this past month. Pam went to a place close to Nairobi for a week-long nursing conference. She said that the classes were very beneficial, as the teachings were on illnesses that she sees regularly here in Kenya. She also loved the spiritual aspect, as a Baptist pastor from Texas came for the conference, too, to preach to the nurses who were from different countries in Africa, as well as the Middle East. Pam has been asking God to use her more for some time now, so she is praying about not only doing clinics by helicopter, but driving to areas to do mobile clinics as well. She wants God to use her to help people physically, and I want to go with her to help people spiritually. We plan to take some of our Bible Institute students, too, as we want them to get experience in ministry.

I attended a conference in another part of Kenya on community health evangelism. I took 5 of our church members with me; three from Imani Baptist, and two from Calvary Baptist. We learned how that we can help people in villages to help themselves, and prevent so many of the common diseases by just washing their hands, boiling water before drinking it, having clean latrines, etc. Also, we learned how that physical problems can have a spiritual aspect, too. We hope to use these teachings from the conferences wherever we do clinics to make a difference.

Andrea left today to go for 3 1/2 weeks to the States for a short break. A friend of my brother-in-law's paid for her ticket to go to Abingdon, Va. We will miss her, but she needs a break. The street children's ministry is going well, and over 100 are being reached each week with the gospel. Pam and I are having the 2 acres that our Calvary church is sitting on resurveyed, as the first survey was not done correctly. We are praying about putting a good fence around the property, so that we can build a building to house street children there, use the church for ministry with them, plant a garden, and raise chickens in the back. We desire for this program to be self sufficient, as well as teaching them responsibility.

In our Calvary church, there is a family who has full blown AIDS. Kefa, the husband, contracted Aids before he was saved, and he has passed it on to his wife and one of their children. They are involved in the anti-retroviral drug program in Eldoret, a city which is an hour from us, and they are doing very well. Kefa and his wife are actively sharing the gospel whenever they have opportunity to give their testimonies. Now, they are burdened about helping needy, homeless children, too, so they are taking care of Dorcas Milee. Dorcas is 10 years old, and her mother is a prostitute who has many children by many different men, and is now mentally unstable. Dorcas has only completed the first grade in school, and was beaten and kicked out of her house by her mother. Her father had already died. Kefa and his wife befriended Dorcas and took her into their home to live with them and their three small boys. They shared what little food they had with her and are planning to put her into school when the next term starts.

Dorcas is very happy and loves to sing by herself in front of our church about her Lord. Her clothes are ragged, but she loves Jesus and wants to tell others about him. Pam and I met Dorcas when we visited Kefa and Matilda, and now, we are helping them to care for her. So, when you help our street children, you are helping Dorcas to have a better life. Thanks so much for caring.

Our daughter, Sara, and her husband, Graig, and our grand daughter, Melia, are coming to see us this month. Graig is a missionary on the campus of the University of Michigan, and he is bringing six of the college students that have been won to Christ with them. They are coming to Kenya to do a cross cultural ministry on the campus of Moi University in Eldoret, a city which is an hour from us. They will be here for a month, and they want to do ministry with our street kids, prisoners, and our church members from both churches. We are excited about them coming, and are praying that this trip will impact these students to do more for Christ when they return to the States.

Thank each of you for your E-mails, and letters of encouragement. Sometimes we get discouraged when we see the corruption here, and the deception of Satan among our people, but we know that God is sovereign, and we keep plodding on. Without your prayers and support, there are times when we might want to quit. So, thanks for your involvement in our lives and those we touch. May our Lord bless you for ministering to us and for encouraging us to continue on. We are grateful for you.

Soon To Travel To Germany ... Reports From Churches ... Growing Pains ...

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

April 2, 2005

It is after midnight and I can't sleep due to eating too much good food at a Brazilian family's table tonight. This is my last night here in Cuiaba for 60 days if all goes as planned. I am to catch a plane at 5 pm to start the journey to Bardwell, Ky. There I will meet Ursula and prepare for our trip to Germany. We are scheduled to leave St. Louis on April 11th and arrive on the 12th in Amsterdam, Holland where her brother, Heinz will meet us. We are excited. It will be the first time in 44 years she has seen her people and the first time ever for me. Pray for us as we make this trip. We thank all of you who have prayed and given to make it possible.

This past two months have perhaps been the busiest I've ever spent in Brazil. So many unexpected things have happened. Some good and some not so good. A storm almost destroyed the worker's house in Novo Diamantino. We got it all fixed up again. We finished the S.S. Rooms there also. The work there is going very well. At the Primavera work the worker was asked to resign last week due to lack of interest. A new worker is already on the job and we are expecting great things there in the future. The Boa Esperanca church has called a pastor and he has indicated that he will come. Our new worker arrived and is doing well at the Altos do Coxipo church. Sister Teresa, who has cancer in her jaw bone, continues to recover, and the Chacara dos Pinheiros church is reaching many people with the word. Our mission at Jardim Fortaleza is getting stronger all the time. The worker is having difficulty finding employment and is selling fried snacks in front of his house to supplement the family income until the Lord opens the door to a meaningful employment. The Igreja Batist da Fe in Varzea Grande is doing well under the direction of their able pastor Jairo. Both of their missions are doing well.

I ask that you folks pray with us about the mission at the 7th of May community in Varzea Grande. The work is going well and the building is completed. A lot of vandalism is taking place there. We need desperately to build a worker's house there. Our dear friends in West Virginia gave to make possible the church building. We ask that some of you give that we may move our worker, Bro. Ernesto, onto the field there. With the weak dollar, I estimate that it could take as much as \$7000 to build a decent two bedroom dwelling there. We are praying that the Lord will lay it on someone's heart to help us. I feel sometimes that I'm getting old and slow but the work here just keeps growing all the time. I realize it is the Lord working in spite of our weaknesses. Praise his name! Next month at this time I expect to be in Germany somewhere with Ursula's relatives. I don't know if I will be able to write a Mission Sheet letter. To my memory, I've only missed writing one in 28 years. When we return from that trip we will tell you all about it in the next letter. God bless all of you.

Barbara Writes Of Blessings And Needs ... Need For Another Bus ... Growing Pains ...

Dear friends,

March 31, 2005

This month I have been given two of the best gifts that I have ever received. First, Aj used all of his frequent flier miles and sent me to the States to visit our children and my parents, and then he let me write the news letter for the month. So here goes:

This year, to date, has been a full one with our home full of visitors from the States. Not only full of visitors but full of love, the kind that only your friends and family can bring. And it is through these visitors that our work here continues. So let me begin this letter by inviting you to be a part of this happiness that you can bring to the mission field. Take your vacation and come down and see us and what God is doing in Brazil!!!

The wall is finally built around the property to the height that Aj wants, and we are waiting for the next month's offering to put up the large gate to have the property secured. We have the containers on the property, but we are still waiting for permission to cut the tree that is smack dab in the middle of the place where Aj plans to put one of the containers.

The wait on the 3 phase electricity is now over as it has been connected to the pole. The next step is to get it run to the block maker and the rest of the needed places on the property. So as you can see, the progress on the Vocational School is slow but it is progressing. We feel that we are going to school before the school is completed. Our classes consist of lessons in "Waiting on the Lord". Pray for us that we learn these lessons so that we may teach others.

While we are waiting in that area we are not idle. The pastor and his family have gone on a much deserved vacation and Aj is filling in the gaps. Plus this is his semester to teach in the seminary and he is so excited. I feel sorry for those students because when he gets this excited about something, it means that he has much to impart, and I hope they are ready for all the information he has to give. There are 19 students this semester and they are enthusiastic about the new semester.

The Church is growing and we are busy directing this growth. The Sunday School has just about doubled and this is due to the purchase of the second bus. The program of recycling to help pay for the bus is truly involving the membership. But if you have dealt with recycling you know that it takes a lot to make a little, so if you would like to help with the purchase of this bus just designate your donations to the Aj bus fund. I know that in past newsletters Aj has told you about the steps of faith our Church has been taking and now we are watching as God strengthens the members in that faith.

The mission at Morro do Algodao has gotten to demonstrate Christian love to the neighborhood in the past week. We had a bad flood in this area and the Mission opened its doors for those who had lost their homes to have a place to live during this time. Also those who were not affected by the flood helped provide food for those less fortunate. We are praying that through these acts of Christian love we can reach some that would never enter a Church building to hear the word. The mission point at Pereque is beginning to burst its seams also. We are constantly looking for new ways to reach the children there. As we have told you many times, we reach the parents through the children here in Brazil. Our rented building will hold about 30 to 40 people, and we are having on the average on Saturday 68 children. We are struggling with providing the materials and the helpers for this many children. Pray that God will continue to provide. The mission point in Olareira is anxiously awaiting the land to be paid off so that they start with a new structure for their new meeting place. But first things first, we must get the land paid off and then the building.
