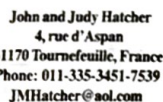

Dear Brothers and Sisters, July 26, 2005

It has been less than four weeks since I last wrote you, but the many good things that have happened make it seem like much more time has passed. As the school year was closing, the Lord gave Judy the desire to have a "day camp" for the children who come to Sunday school and their friends. When she shared her thoughts with Amanda, she became excited about it. Then they talked to Angela and she was thrilled to participate. Angela was saved and baptized in a Baptist husband, Joachim, who was recently saved and baptized. So, on the summer Bible Club. All went very well. We had a dozen children attend. A number of the children who regularly come on Sundays were not able to come. The children were from families that have never come to services. 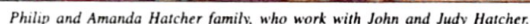
We had hardly finished the Bible Club before our next adventure started. We have mentioned in earlier letters Aude, a French young lady who was saved about a year ago and who lives about two hundred miles north of us. She suggested to some scout leaders in her area that we could teach their troupes American Flag football and teach them songs. I will summarize what God brought about by saying that we got to give the gospel (and teach flag football) to troupes from seven different areas of France. One group of twenty-eight was from Rheims in the very north of France. This happened at three different camps. We began the day at 10 a.m. and taught and played flag football until 6:00 pm. Then with Judy leading we prepared and served *taco salad* for supper. This, of course with the help of troupes assigned to the task. After supper, we taught songs, shared the gospel, and fielded questions. Not only did we get to share the gospel with the troupes, we also got to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with the leaders. Most of these were in their early or mid twenties. At one camp, the leaders kept us up long after the scouts went to bed asking us questions.

The leaders also shared that they were quite apprehensive about having us come, wondering what our true motive was. They said that it was just so unusual for people to give expecting nothing in return. We believe that God put it together from beginning to end. And we certainly enjoyed sowing the seed (though I am beginning to understand why pro players retire a bit younger than me).

There have been other blessings as well. One man, the husband of a lady who comes regularly, has been to several services. We have been praying for him for a long time. Though He formerly claimed to be an atheist, he follows along carefully as we study God's word.

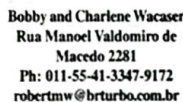

Dear Friends August 3, 2005

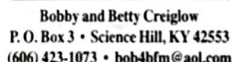
I'm sure you'll rejoice with us to know that we will be baptizing about ten new converts in a few days. We are happy to see all of these folks following Jesus in obedience to his command, but one man's conversion brings us a special joy. Paulo is the husband of Tina, a member of our church. Tina and her two daughters have been coming to church for involved in witchcraft and idolatry for many years before we met her. She before she was converted a few years ago. Another month has flown by and we are one step closer to eternity. I'm so thankful that I can look forward to eternity! We have been busy as usual this month. I just got back from a trip to Primavera do Leste. Last week the Boa Esperanca church had three adults saved and several young people there in a week of Vacation Bible School. The work there is without a permanent worker at the moment. Several young preachers are going there to take care of it until the Lord sends the right man. Pastor Jairo in Varzea Grande is starting up his school again with 90 students. The three works that he heads up are being blessed. Our new family who came up from Sao Paulo are still learning to live here in this heat and this culture. They have struggled somewhat but show signs of coming out of it. The new pastor at the Boa Esperaca church is really adapting well and the church is being blessed with souls saved and a sweet spirit among the members. All in all things are going pretty well here.

At the Altos do Coxipo church we have had a lot of sickness this month and I have spent considerable time trying to help out the sick folks. The greatest sickness is "sin sickness." There is no shortage of that here. How awful is the suffering caused by sin. Every day here in our city somebody is murdered and many crimes are committed. Many homeless kids run the streets taking drugs and committing crimes. What a mess our world is getting in! The Gospel message is the only thing that God uses to make a difference to the lost world. Let us be faithful in carrying it to our generation.

Several have commented on the picture of Ursula with her two brothers and her sister in last month's mission Sheet. We are so thankful that the Lord allowed us to see them. We thank all of you who the Lord used to make this possible. We will be in the States the first part of next year to visit churches. We ask that you pray for Ursula. She was in a car wreck this past Spring and is having serious problems with pinched nerves in her neck and lives in a lot of pain. She is taking therapy and medicine. We had an interesting experience this past month. I have been overseeing Nathan's prison ministry, and I try to visit the prison two to three times a month. The main officer in charge of the whole prison retired on July 8th, so we were invited to his farewell party. It was supposed to start at 7:30 PM. Pam and I arrived at 7:35, and there was only one other car there. People started arriving between 8:00 and 8:30 PM, and the dinner got started at 9:00 PM. During dinner, we listened to Kenny Rogers CD's, and later on, to gospel music. So, here we are in Africa listening to American country western music! There were over 200 people who came, many from other prisons who knew Mr. Gachanja. The testimonies about the impact that Mr. Gachanja had had on the lives of his staff and others who knew him started at 10PM. Finally, at 12:30 AM, both of us were so tired of listening to Swahili for over 5 hours, plus sitting in the same place, hearing the same testimonies over and over, that we decided to leave, and the speeches were still going on! What made it tough was that we were the only white people there, plus the Welfare Officer who Nathan works under, seated us right up front, so it was difficult to leave undetected. We really had a cultural experience, but were glad for the opportunity to represent Nathan and his ministry there.

That's the news from this part of the world. We are very saddened at the news of terrorism in London and in Egypt this past month, and we need to pray for the families who lost loved ones in these tragedies. God is in control, but it makes us more mindful of His imminent return, as conditions in this world get worse and worse. Thanks again for all of your prayers for us. Please continue to ask God to hedge us in from the fiery darts of the evil one who wants to hinder the Lord's work here. May our Lord richly bless each of you in your areas of ministry.

Another month has passed and I feel like it has been only several days. I don't know if the fast passing of time has anything to do with age or hard work or maybe a little of both. This month we have been blessed with visitors from Manaus and Garca. We have had various projects started and others completed.

In construction it has been a very busy month. The first week of the month was devoted to getting the wood trusses up and secured. If you have never worked with rough green wood you can't imagine the work and energy to get it all in place. But after a lot of blisters and sore backs we got it in place and ready for the next stage. We also got the covering on and that was a major undertaking, (but through it all what got the results is simply FAITH. We know who is in charge and it is through Him that all things are possible). As we were putting the asbestos roofing on, it rained for three days. Here was a small test of faith—thoroughly wet at the end of the week—BUT the shop area is under roof.

In ministry we have been trying to accommodate the growth in our Sunday School program. We had 112 children in our breakfast program this Sunday and then add adults into that and you will see the growth. We are having two Sunday School classes in the area where we feed the children and another class had thirty-three children in it this week. We need more class rooms and there is no more room inside the church to create them. I am not complaining at all—just glorifying our Lord and Savior. He gives the increase.

Here is where we need your help, we need to expand, remodel, add on. These are great problems to have are they not? Pray to give us insight to solve these problems. One possibility is this, there is a lot beside our Church that is for sale but it is greatly overpriced. This lot would alleviate our problems if we could afford to buy it. All things are possible with God!!! This is the prayer request—that God would provide the means to purchase this property for us to use it for His glory.

Our missions are all doing well, one is outgrowing its meeting place so the church has bought a piece of property to build a building. This is another need. It will take time for us to be able to build as we wait on the money for this building. Our newest mission is in Salesopolis and it is beginning to have people coming to the meetings. Up until this week the only people in attendance was the pastor and his wife and us. But through perseverance, visitation and lots of prayer God is sending the harvest. We were aware that there would be problems in this town as there was not a Baptist Church there and the Catholic Church is very predominant there. But all things are in His timing and we must wait patiently on this.

As you know, for us to be successful here we are dependent on God first and then on you, your constant prayers and your help financially. As it has been said, "Prayer is not overcoming God's reluctance, but laying hold of God's willingness." PRAY! GOD DELIGHTS TO ANSWER.

As always we want to invite you to come down and see how your mission dollars are being spent. In reality this invitation is just a sly way to get you down here and put you to work, but it has been working as various people continue to come. So if you want to be a part of this work just come on down.

During this "Mission Sheets Month" which is the month of July, I heard three sermons preached and I preached a total of fifteen sermons, (Marie heard fourteen of them). Ten of the fifteen were delivered at the 24<sup>th</sup> of March Baptist Church where I serve as pastor.

On the morning of the 9<sup>th</sup> around 4:00am, our son Stephen, his wife Salete and their son Stephen Matthew, arrived and spent almost two weeks with us and her parents and family. Stephen attended and participated in three services at the 24<sup>th</sup> of March Baptist Church. That night I attended with four others of the 24<sup>th</sup> Church, the organization of the Vaso de Bencaos Mission of the 14<sup>th</sup> of December Baptist Church to be the Vessel of Blessing Baptist Church. ## Prayers Answered . . . Unusual Experience . . .

Dear Special Friends,  
August 1, 2005  
We hope that you are enjoying your summer. It is very cool here, and one needs to wear a sweater or jacket all of the time when going out. So, you need to appreciate the summer weather there. The gardens are really growing, as this is rainy season, so we have green beans, squash, tomatoes, corn, and cucumbers growing in our garden. The crops will soon be ready to can. We are really thankful for the harvest that we will have.

God has answered prayers, and we thank each of you for praying for us. It has been several weeks since there have been any derogatory newspaper articles about us. We are really praising God for His protection, and answer to prayers. Hopefully, we have weathered the storm, and the worst is over. Please do continue to pray, though, as we know that Satan is still very active, and has many more trials in store for us. However, God is sovereign, and allows these times of testing for His glory, and to draw us closer to Him.

We have been very busy this past month building a fence around our Calvary property, which is our first church. If you remember, we had to take the church building down because it was on our neighbor's property. When we had a proper survey done by the government, we discovered that we were on property that did not belong to us. A fence is necessary to show ownership, so without a fence around the land, it is public property. So, we have put in chain link fence with two gates for two different entrances. The first entrance will be for the church, and we are allotting 1/4 of an acre for this part. The second entrance is for another project that we hope to do later on. Lord willing, we would like to have a vocational school to train the street kids, orphans, and prisoners in a skill that would enable them to be self-supporting. We want to teach them responsibility as well, so please help us to pray about getting the funding for these projects in the Lord's timing. We have also built a house for a caretaker on the property, as someone is needed to live there to care for the upkeep of the land, as well as guarding the property, since it is on the main highway and is very visible.

Our second church continues to progress well. We are taking between 20-30 people from our first church, and are combining them with the members from Imani Baptist, our second church. We plan to combine the two churches for several more weeks until I can teach classes on Baptist catechism. The majority of people in the Kenyan churches here do not have any idea about what the truth is as it is taught in the Bible, and we find that our people lack knowledge of God's Word, as well. So, as Pam teaches the youth in Sunday School, and I teach the adults, we hope to ground them in our Baptist faith by teaching them many verses about what the Bible teaches, so that they can stand strong when the many false doctrines that are prevalent in our area arise. There are crusades almost every month in our town, and we want our people to know the difference in truth and error. Pentecostalism is rampant, and we want our people to know what the Bible says so that they will not be swayed. Later on, we plan to regroup with our Calvary Baptist people and meet in homes to worship. As the Lord provides, we will restart this first church, and build again on our property, but we want them to be grounded first.

The Bible Institute is going well, and I have taught classes in New Testament survey, Discipleship, and Starting and Strengthening New Churches, and the students have been learning many practical lessons that they can use in ministry. It is a blessing to me as I teach them and see their eagerness to learn. I have really enjoyed visiting in homes with them, too.

The medical ministry is at a standstill right now. The pilot is in Germany on a short furlough, and will be back later this month. However, there are some adjustments that need to be made, so the helicopter won't be flying until sometime in September.
