October 2, 2005

We just got in this afternoon from the church up in Novo Diamantino. We have done a lot of work on the building there these past two years, a little at the time. The worker there does the work and although he is young, he and his wife are very faithful and hard working. We had a great time with them. It will be the last time we go this year up there. It is a long and dangerous trip.

We received a great blessing at our church this morning. A lady in her 40's by the name of Camila was saved. She has been coming for some time. Also we were able with the help of the Hardman Fork Baptist Church to purchase a small house next door to the church building, and now our worker is making plans to move on the field. His name is Ernesto Jr. and his wife is Regiane. Pray for them as they take this step of faith.

All of our churches and missions are doing well except the one at Primavera do Leste. It is without a worker at present, and the mother church is having to send each week a different preacher up there. It is a pretty good trip. I've been going one weekend a month but will not go this month.

We will be coming in to the States in November in time for the Thanksgiving Conference. This two year term was broken up somewhat with our trip to Germany etc. and went by very fast. We are looking forward to visiting some of you while in the States. Health Clinic For Street Children . . . Back Into The Bush . . . Taxes, Taxes, Taxes . . .

Dear Special Friends, October 3, 2005

Time marches on and each month seems to pass so quickly. It is getting much cooler there, with the beauty of the mountains and changing leaves. October is one of the prettiest months in the States, and we really miss the beauty of God's handiwork in His preparation for winter. Here in Kenya, it is getting much warmer, and we are going into our summer season. The rains have stopped, and the sun is out everyday. The garden that we planted last month is growing, and we are expecting a nice crop of green beans, corn, tomatoes, cucumbers, and beets by December. There are two to three growing seasons in Kenya, so we try to take advantage of this, and grow food for the visitors that we are expecting next year. Pam has a canner, so she cans the food, and it is a real help when we have company.

Speaking of company, Dr. Shawn Lawrence and her sister, Robin Carlton, are here visiting us now. Shawn is a family practice doctor from Nebraska, and her sister, Robin, is a nurse from Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Michigan. They are here for a few days helping Pam do some medical clinics, and we have really enjoyed their visit. They will be examining our street kids tomorrow at a clinic, as Tuesday is the feeding day, and also, the day to share the Gospel with those who are orphaned, or neglected, and live on the streets of Kitala. On Wednesday, Lord willing, we are going by plane into the bush to do a clinic with the tribal people there, and to present the Gospel to some who have never heard the Good News. The helicopter is still being repaired, so we decided to rent a ministry plane from a missionary agency here to take them into the bush to see the tribal people there, and to try to help them physically, as I present the Gospel to them to help them spiritually. On Friday, we will do a clinic at our church, Imani Baptist. This is an opportunity for our church to minister, and our people are excited about this outreach to the community. Laban, our pastor, and I will be presenting the Gospel outside of the clinic. Shawn, Robin, and Pam will be examining people inside of our church, which is where the clinic will be held. We want to present the Gospel every two hours for those who come to the clinic. In order to get in to see the doctor and nurse, the people who come to the clinic have to hear the Gospel presentation first. Then, they will be given a tract as their ticket to come in, as we know that they will have heard the Gospel. This is a way for us to reach the community with the Good News from God's Word, as well as it will give us additional contacts to follow up on if there are professions of faith. Some of our ladies will be cooking and selling food to go toward a project to help them to be able to help themselves, and others less fortunate. We are excited about this opportunity, and our people have united to help to make this a church project.

The Lord has blessed us this past month with several professions of faith. Yesterday, Shawn and Robin went out with members of our evangelism team to see first hand what we do every Sunday after church. Shawn witnessed Peris, one of our faithful teens, lead someone to Christ. There have been several professions of faith this past month, and we are training one of our young men to follow up on these new Christians to disciple them in their faith. Jared is one of our Bible Institute students, and he feels that God has called him to preach, so I am discipling him, and he in turn, is working with those who have trusted Christ as their Savior. There are ten to twelve who are faithful each Sunday to go out to witness, and half of this number are teenagers! There is an interest by a few others who have approached us about teaching another class in how to witness, so we plan to do this in the near future. It is such a blessing to see our people want to serve the Lord and reach out to tell others of the saving grace of Christ.

Andrea is in Nairobi now finishing up her requirements to be registered as a nurse here. She wants to join Pam in the ministry in the bush, so she needs to be registered here in Kenya as a nurse to do this. The street children's ministry is going well, and the people that Andrea has trained to carry on this important ministry are doing well with it. The former street children who are in Christian homes of our members are attending Sunday School at Imani Baptist, and they are learning the Baptist catechism that Pam and I are teaching as well. The adult Sunday school class that I am teaching has about forty adults who are attending and learning the truths from God's Word. This is double the number who were attending Sunday School before we started the catechism. In this culture, Sunday School is considered just for kids, so to have adults come and be faithful is a real blessing.

On a sadder note, Pam's mother-in-law died last month. She was the mother of Ron Radford, Pam's fist husband who died with melanoma cancer in 1990. Louise Radford was a very godly lady, and Pam really loved her. She was 95 years old, so God blessed her with a long life. She will be greatly missed by Pam and her grandchildren, Sara and Nathan. However, they all know that she is in heaven with her Lord, and with her son who preceded her there.

Nathan and Carrie, our son and daughter-in-law, have just been accepted as BFM's newest missionaries, and will join us here in a few days to work with us again. We are so excited, as Nathan has been gone for a year and a half, and Carrie will be a big asset to him and to our team. We have really missed them, and the prisoners that Nathan worked with have missed him. They arrive in Kenya on October 13th, and we are planning a church-wide party to welcome them back.

Please help us to pray about getting our mission registered here with the government. We have been trying to do this for three years, and because we will not bribe the officials, they are really prolonging our efforts. We are under the umbrella of the Brethren Fellowship of Kenya in order to work here, and have just received our work permit for another three years under their ministry. A work permit is necessary to live here, and it is an involved process to get it renewed each time. It is necessary for us to be registered as Baptist Faith Ministries in order for us to get tax-exempt status, so that we pay fewer taxes than are being required by the government. There is a law coming into existence later on which requires missionaries to pay 30% tax on their income. However, we have been dealing with an international C.P.A. firm that is trying to help us, so that we do not have to pay the huge tax on our car each year, plus the taxes on our utilities, household help, etc. The tax here on items bought, gas for the car, food, etc. is 16%. On top of this, the government wants to tax us because we drive a car, have electricity and running water in our house, and have workers who help us to do the household things, so that we can do ministry. We have hired a Christian lawyer to help us to get this tax-exempt status, so pray that the government will work with him, and grant this for us, so that we can proceed. In order for us to be registered, we have to be investigated by the Central Intelligence Dept, which is like the F.B.I. in the States. There have been thirteen notices sent to them over the past two years, but the notices are disappearing. I went to get an official from the C.I.D., and she came and investigated our ministries, and did a report, but they dismissed her report because she gave us a copy of it. So, please help us to pray about this.

Thank you so much for your interest and prayers for the Lord's work here. We deeply appreciate those of you who E-mail us and write to us to encourage us. We could not be here without your faithful financial support and your labor of love to pray for us. We represent many churches and saints of God, and we take this responsibility seriously. You are a part of all that is accomplished for the Lord here, and we invite you to come and visit us. May our Lord bless your labors for Him where you are, and thanks again for your ministry of kindness and encouragement to us.

Leadership Training Center Growing . . . Shortage Of Space . . . Project Life Motorhome . . .

Hello Friends, September 3, 2005

We were blessed to see several individuals come to know Jesus as their Savior and Lord in the past few weeks. We baptized six in August and will be baptizing 5 or 6 more this coming week. Oh, how we thank God for pouring out His grace and love.

Our leadership training center is growing steadily each semester. Presently, I have 26 attending and it is exciting to see how much personal growth is going on in their lives. We launched three new outreach groups last month with leaders who have been, or are currently enrolled in the training center. We are looking forward to seeing how well these groups will develop. As we observe the progress of these groups, we hope to address any leadership deficiencies and help them make the necessary adjustments.

We are still having problems with a shortage of space in our worship services. Even though we are considering going to double services on Sunday, we still will not have time to fit in our other meetings. Please pray with us for the Lord to show us how to deal with this situation wisely.

Our evangelism team, Project Life, spent the month of August in Rio de Janeiro. Many of you were praying for their safety and success and we want to tell you that God did bless. There were no mishaps or problems for our team, even though they were in some of the most dangerous neighborhoods in Brazil. Not only did God provide safety, but He also saw fit to bring many individuals to Christ as their Savior. The gospel was preached in public schools, parks and in some local churches. There were over 30 public professions of faith.

We were contacted by another missionary in Brazil who owns a bus transformed into a motorhome. His present ministry does not need the motorhome, and he would be willing to let us purchase this motorhome at a very reasonable rate so that it would continue to be used to get the gospel to unreached cities. With this bus we would be able to double our outreach to the many cities which have no evangelical witness. The cost of this bus is approximately \$10,000. The motorhome is self-contained and would be very helpful in getting a gospel team into areas without the added cost of lodging. If you feel led of the Lord to aid in this purchase, label your offering Project Life Motorhome.

We are thrilled to be God's servants in this part of His vineyard and we thank you for your part in supplying our needs in prayers and support. May God bless you.

Dear Brothers of the Beloved Lord Jesus and Sisters of the Savior: September 2, 2005

We praise God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) from whom all blessings flow. During this "Mission Sheets Month", which is the month of August, I heard fourteen sermons preached by eight different preachers and I preached a total of ten sermons. Seven of those were delivered at the 24th of March Baptist Church where I serve as pastor. One was at the 3rd Mission of the Celestial Baptist Church and one at the Second Compensa Baptist Church. The other one was at the home of a couple, members of the 24th Baptist Church at a distant suburb from the church. He is 29 years old and she is 36 and had several children when she married him. Since their marriage she has had three children. The baby will be a year old in January 2006. I have visited in their home several times and one time held a birthday service for one of their little girls. At this service Saturday night we had seventeen present. Marie and a couple from the 24th church went with me. The lady of the house has two daughters who have children. They were present with their two children. We have thought about trying to rent a house to have services in but we do not have any definite plans. We do request your prayers.

We thank all who pray for us and all who help us in any way. We especially thank Bro. Dave Parks for keeping us informed that Marie's pacemaker bill has finally been finalized after one year and three months. We still owe several hundred dollars, but are thankful that Medicare insurance and IGM have paid most of the over \$43,000 which her total pacemaker bill came to. The Lord has been so good to us. Thus we have shared with you some of our labors for the Lord in the city of Manaus. We praise God from whom all blessings flow. Many of His blessings flow through you that support us through BFM. May the Lord bless you and help us to obey Him is our prayer. "So likewise ye, when ye have done all these things which are commanded you, say, we are unprofitable servants. We have done that which was our duty to do." (Luke 17:10). Pray for these unprofitable servants of the Savior Jesus Christ who is Worthy.

We were made sad reading about the destruction of New Orleans, Louisiana, the lives lost, and property destroyed in Mississippi and the death of almost 1,000 people in Iraq. The Lord knows all about these tragedies and why He permitted them to happen.

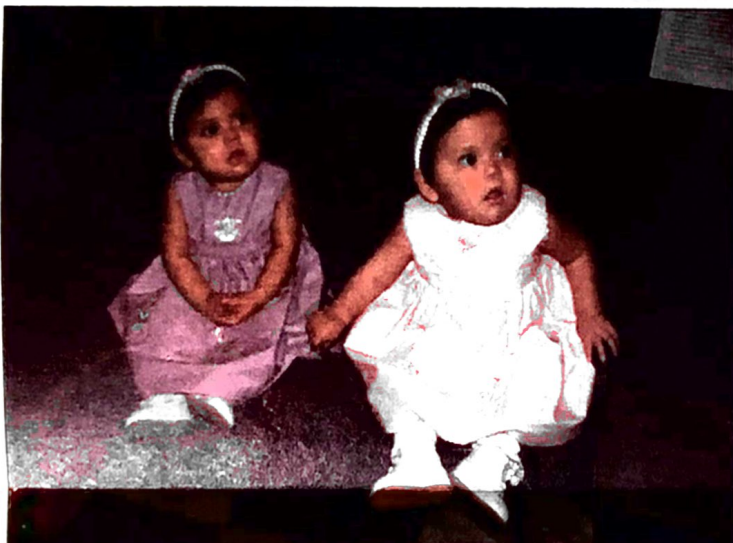

Running Out Of Room ... Open Seventh Mission ...

Friends,

October 3, 2005

It has been an absolutely AWESOME month for the work here. First, I had the privilege to preach at another Baptist Church here in our town this month. It was their anniversary service. It was a small congregation but a very sizable church building. It is here that I got to see how blessed our work is. We have a small church building and a large attendance. The Lord has unusual ways to show us sometimes just how blessed we really are.

Our Sunday School is bursting at the seams. And after using the rooms in the parsonage (we moved the pastor to a nice apartment) I only have one area left that will not be occupied. And even after I have divided two more classes and started a new youth class, we have two more classes that need to be divided. Someone out there is really praying—KEEP IT UP!!! For all these new class rooms we need new benches.

Also this month we rearranged our mission points with respect to leadership, and now Barb and I are helping in a different mission point with one of the seminary students. Where we were helping will have the seminary graduate and another student working there. Where we are working we had twenty-four people in attendance this week. It is in a believer's home in their garage. Our helpers name is Daniel and his wife's name is Lillian; they have four children. Please remember them and us in your prayers as we begin this new ministry. We will be visiting in the neighborhood and in the future we will begin a children's ministry. Here the children come first and then bring the parents. Where we were working, the Saturday Bible School had grown to about fifty children. So pray as we make this transition in ministry points. This will be our 7th mission point away from the main Church. How AWESOME is the God we serve. As we have opened these new preaching points we are in need of benches for these also. As you can see our need for benches is great and you can help in this area. We need \$400 to build all the benches for all the different needs. These can be built in the Vocational School for this price because we are teaching these boys how to work for a living.

Speaking of that, we have been working on the lots and building of the Vocational School. Our area is just about clean and the carpentry shop is covered. Last week we started purchasing the tools for the shop. I spent two days in Sao Paulo shopping and purchasing. This week I am recovering from the shopping and moving the tools. It will probably take another month just to get the tools organized. And since some were secondhand, we are having to recondition them (sanding, painting, and oiling). We are still struggling with the energy problem. I am paying close attention to the electrical wiring. Most of my machines are 3-phase but some are 220. So in the shop we will have to have 3-phase, 220 and 110. Our town is wired for 220 so I will have to keep a close eye on this part of the project.

Sometimes it is really hard to write what is going on in our ministry here. The work is plentiful and thanks to all who are praying and contributing, we are able to keep sowing the seeds and sometimes reap the harvest. Continue to pray for our seminar students because from there we will be able to raise up more workers for the ministry.

Again KEEP PRAYING!!!
