## NATHAN AND CARRIE RADFORD ARRIVE IN KENYA

Dear praying friends,

Greetings from the beautiful country of Kenya. I am happy to write this letter, as we have finally arrived back on the mission field after a year and a half away from the ministry. This past furlough was very important, as I married, and also was raising additional support. I was strongly advised to spend a year with my wife in America before leaving, as we wanted our marriage to be on a strong foundation before leaving. I am blessed, as the Lord has truly given me a Proverbs 31 woman, who will be a great help to me here in Kitale, Kenya.

We left the States on October 12th and arrived safely in the capital city of Nairobi on the evening of the 13th, after an 18 hour flight in the air from America. Although we were very tired, we are also excited to begin this next term and commit our plans to the Lord. In Proverbs 16:3, it says "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and your plans will succeed." We are committing this term to God, asking Him in prayer for wisdom and guidance, and giving Him our plans and lives to be used for His glory. It is overwhelming to think of all that we need to accomplish for His Kingdom, as He has done so much for us, but we serve Him day by day in the field He has called us to.

Many of you have been praying about the new officer in charge of Kitale Main Prison. The former officer retired while I was in the States, and this was a major concern, as the ministry would be under new leadership, and we were praying that the new officer in charge would also support the ministry. The Lord truly answered this prayer, as I have already met with the new officer in charge, and

am happy to announce that he also is a born-again Christian and wants the ministry to continue with no opposition! The Lord truly is good and has answered this prayer, as it was a genuine concern. I praise the

Lord for this answer to prayer, and ask that you would pray for him that we would work together to reach this needy prison for Christ.

Presently, I am teaching two classes with fifty prisoners and we are studying Godliness from the life of Job. The study is going very well and the prisoners are extremely interested in more materials to be taught. This was a group that was already formed in my absence, and I plan to start new groups this month, beginning with evangelism. I also would like to form a branch of our Bible school in the prison as well, as there are many opportunities. Also, there is a possibility of a church plant in the prison, so please pray for this as well. Please pray that the Lord would give me wisdom, as it is very overwhelming with all of the needs represented.

Please also pray for my wife, as it is difficult to leave family and friends and live in a completely different culture from America. It can be very overwhelming at times, but others and I are continuing to pray for her, that the Lord would give her strength and wisdom during this time. Whenever we are afraid, we can trust the Lord, and He will help us (Psalms 56:3). She has made a large sacrifice to come and minister to the people of Kenya, and I know she would appreciate your continued prayers, as there are so many adjustments to be made. The Lord will help her as she makes this major transition, just as He helped me. We would appreciate your prayers.

Concerning our financial needs, we now have a compound where there are many repairs to be made. We have four workers that must be paid to maintain the compound, our ministry expenses have increased significantly, as there are more needs, etc. Also, the standard of general living in Kitale has grown more expensive since my departure. So, these are very legitimate needs and we are praying and trusting the Lord to provide.

Also, my wife is interested in orphanage work, as this is a major mission work in itself here in Kitale. She is very gifted working with children, and feels that this is where the Lord would want her to work. We do not have the funds for this undertaking, but we are praying that the Lord would provide the funds for this crucial work here in Kitale. If you would like to donate to her ministry needs, please list "orphanage" on your financial giving records, so that it will go to the correct account. I have been told there are nearly 1,000 orphans in Kitale, so this is a fantastic ministry opportunity. We continue to wait on the Lord for the funding for this work and are praying for new donors. We know that He has called us and will be faithful to provide for us. (2 Timothy 2:13)

Thank you for your interest in the work in Kitale, Kenya. Welcome to Kenya anytime. Please keep us in your prayers.

## My Exciting Trip To Brazil As A Missionary In 1955

When God brought John and me together we were already called to Brazil. We married on December 20, 1947, after the 2<sup>nd</sup> World War, when we were both students at Georgetown College. John pastored and organized Highland Baptist Church in Shelbyville, KY, while we were students at Georgetown College. Then he was called to the First Baptist Church in Beattyville, KY. After two years he accepted the People's Church in Alton, IL, which was six months old. Everyone who knew us would ask us, "Oh, what happened to your call to the mission field?" We would answer, "Nothing. When God gives us the sign, we will go. We're sure He is training us for the job."

Finally, when we received a Baptist Faith Missions journal in June 1955, Brother Hafford Overbey, secretary of BFM at the time, made an appeal for a missionary to start a seminary in Manaus, Brazil. John immediately called Brother Overbey to apply to go Manaus. John was surprised when Brother Overbey said, "Brother Hatcher, I have already been waiting three years for this telephone call. When I heard you preach at the Ashland Avenue Spring Conference three years ago, as you preached God said to me, 'I have called John Hatcher to Brazil. When he applies, send him immediately.'" We were accepted immediately and in two months John arrived in Manaus.

At that time, there were no beds, only hammocks, no stoves (people cooked on an open charcoal or wood fire outside the house), and no refrigerators. We sent beds for John and me and our four children, a kerosene refrigerator and a kerosene stove, which would arrive by boat.

On Saturday, before the boat was sailing with our belongings, we went to Chicago, Illinois, where we had to get our visas to go to Brazil. We stayed in the home of Ed and Jackie Overbey. Brother Ed was then a student at Northern Baptist Seminary. The law had changed two days beforehand and no baggage could arrive by boat into Brazil unless accompanied by its owner. John called New York and found out that the boat was departing for Brazil only two days later.

John did not have time to drive me to my parents home near Elizabethtown, KY, so he drove me to his home in Alexandria. From there his brother was to deliver me to my parents in order to fly by plane a month later.

Now I had to make the 19-hour plane trip along with our four small children. Lynn turned six the day before her Daddy arrived in Brazil, Paul was four, John Mark was two, and David was just nine months old. Everyone was alarmed that I should go alone, because at that time very few people had ever flown.

Brother Hafford Overbey was very concerned. He told me to buy a shoulder purse and carry my airplane tickets, money, and visas in it since I must carry the little baby, David, in my arms. He also arranged for me to fly to Detroit so he could see us safely off to New York.

My parents took me to Louisville and the Louisville airport was just one big room. I let the children run and play. My Mother said, "Be sure you don't let the children out of their seats in New York."

Before boarding the tiny plane to Cincinnati, Ohio, I pleaded with my Mother, "Please don't cry when I leave." She didn't, but as the plane made its way around before being airborne, I looked and there my dear Mother was crying so much she was shaking.

We arrived in Detroit and Brother and Sister Overbey were there to meet us and we spent the night in their home. The plane from Detroit to New York was leaving at 7:00 am. Brother Overbey wanted me to have plenty of time to get the children ready so Sister Overbey awakened me at 3:00 am.

I gave all the children baths, then one needed a diaper change and then another needed help. Sister Overbey came to the foot of the stairway and said, "Sister Hatcher, my husband wants you to hurry. He is afraid you'll be late for the plane. I replied, 'Sister Overbey, I'm doing all I can, first one needs something and then another.'" She replied, "Sister Hatcher, I understand." At that time, no one called a married lady or man by their first name.

Well, I made it. At 4:00 am, we were on our way to the plane. As soon as we arrived at the airport and were seated, Brother Overbey rushed to the desk to see if the plane was on time. He was informed that the plane was 45 minutes late. After 15-20 minutes, a request came over the speaker, "Passengers for Belem appear at the desk." I went to Brother Royal Calley, who had just arrived home from his first furlough, and said, "Brother Calley, they are calling for passengers to Belem to appear at the desk." Without even listening, he replied, "You will only hear the city, Belem, when you arrive at the international airport in New York." I sat down and again I heard, "Passengers for Belem appear at the desk." Again, I went to Brother Calley and told him. He replied again, "You'll only hear Belem when you get to New York."

In a few minutes I heard, "Passengers for Belem appear at the desk." Now I went to Brother Overbey, who had difficulty hearing, and said loudly, "Brother Overbey, they are calling passengers to Belem to appear at the desk." He replied, "Sister Hatcher, you will only hear Belem when you arrive in New York."

Fifteen minutes before the 45 minutes was up, Brother Overbey said, "Sister Hatcher, take the children to the bathroom as it will be difficult on the plane." I had them all seated in the bathroom, except David who was in my arms, when Sue- who was 12 years old (now Mrs. Bob Jones), ran into the bathroom and said, "The plane has taken the stairway away, closed the doors, (Please See Alta Page Two)

## Last Letter Before Leaving For Kenya ...

Dear praying friends,

October 5, 2005

This month is filled with excitement, as my wife and I plan to leave for Kenya, East Africa on October 12th. I appreciate all your prayers for this past month, as there was so much to do and very little time to get everything done. We had a major shipment that we had to get to Africa Inland Mission late last month, and I praise God that we were able to get it completely done by our deadline. The Lord truly gave us strength to help us, as we were very tired by the end of this past month.

As I look to this next term, there are many things to pray about. First of all, pray for our cross-cultural adjustment, as living in a different country is very overwhelming at times. Please pray that both my wife and I would adjust well, especially in the first few months, as we prepare to live and minister in the African culture for a two year term. One of the major adjustments is leaving friends and family, so please pray that this time will go easily and that the Lord would give us the grace and strength that we need to follow His call to us in Kenya. It has been a year and there since I have been in the country, so please pray for me as well, that I would adjust quickly also. A half so many changes in the first few months, so please pray that we will get the help from the Lord that we need. We need to trust in Him at all times, and He will help us if we seek His help. (Psalms 34:17)

I am excited to get back into the prison ministry in Kitale and see what the Lord has done in my absence. I have trained a Kenyan to take over the ministry in my absence, and he has done a great job. I am praying about possible future opportunities to do other ministries with him, as he is scheduled to get out of Kitale main prison in the near future. Please also pray about the possibility of a church plant in the prison. I was ordained last summer, so there is a definite possibility of a church, but this also involves the cooperation and understanding of the top government officials. The Lord directs and guides, and we know that He controls all things in His sovereign plan for our lives. If it would be the Lord's will, I would like to pursue this church plant opportunity, but it must be in His timing and His plan. Please keep this important request in your prayers.

There are expenses that we did not originally figure into our budget, and costs have increased since I have left the country. Prayer is essential to everything we do, whether concerning financial needs or regular, day-to-day missionary living. D.L. Moody, the famous evangelist, said "Every major movement of God has begun with a kneeling figure." We are praying and waiting on the Lord to provide this money. It is a concern, but we know that when we seek Him in prayer, that He hears us and will answer our prayers. We trust in the Lord and believe He will answer our prayers as we request His help. (Psalms 34:4) (Psalms 34:19) (Mark 11:23) Would you pray, and consider how God would use you to further His kingdom in Kitale, Kenya? We continue to pray and wait on the Lord to provide for us. He will be faithful to us as we remain faithful to His calling upon our lives.

That is all for this month. Please pray for our safety as we travel, that the Lord would protect us all the way to Kenya, an 18 hour flight. Also, please pray for all the adjustments that we will be making in the next few weeks and months. Next month will be written from the mission field, Lord willing, and I will bring you the latest news from Kenya.

In Sao Paulo, we took our baggage through Customs and nothing was opened. Only problem was the baggage did not get on the same flight with us. No problem, our taxi driver friend from Urai was at the airport to meet us and we rode home foot loose and fancy free. The next morning the air company brought our heavy suitcases in their delivery truck and the man carried them into the house for me. It was just like taking care of the Garden of Eden (no sweat).

We have our house at night cleaned it from top to bottom; how nice to see and enjoy it again. The car and the pick-up started as if they were homesick to be driven again after being parked for almost three months.

After fifty years as missionaries in Brazil we have become aware of some old and very rare jewels in our lives and the lives of our children. They are you dear friends in Christ who have contributed throughout all these fifty years with your prayers and financial support. Only God knows how Alta and I thank you and appreciate you for your confidence through all the winds as well as the fair weather we have traveled through.

But, dear Friends, the job is not done and the war has not ended. Yesterday, Alta and I drove to Congoinhas to see the new building that was begun a few days before we traveled. Marcos, the pastor of Nova Fatima is the builder of the new building. In another month it should be ready to inaugurate. Presently, they are having services each week under a tree in the street. All of the other workers and churches are going well.

Alta and I are praying for God's direction as we focus on a new work in the city of Assai. This city is about 20 miles from where we live and has about 25,000 inhabitants. Pray with us for spiritual direction and physical ability for two old missionaries.

## Work Slowed By Rainy Season ... Come And Help Us Build ...

Dear friends,

November 2, 2005

Our month has been one of hustle and bustle, we have hosted our second annual ladies retreat, hosted a Brazilian Pastor and family for a weeks vacation and coordinated a wedding of Barbara's cousin and our (adopted) Brazilian daughter, and all of this during a month of rain.

Because of this rain we have been limited to what we could do on the school grounds and on the other projects we have going. We have

used this time to get the plans completed for the building of the new mission church, and worked on the wiring of the machines for the vocational school. Our plans were to start making the blocks for the new church building last week but that too was put on hold by the rain. We now have all the inside work done and the plans made for the projects, so pray for there to be a period of sunshine to put in practice the things that we have put on paper.

Speaking of plans for a new church building, we will be able to build this building because of a generous gift from a family in the States. God is good with all things, the timing of this gift was perfect. The family where we are holding the meetings now is getting ready to sell their house and we would have been without a place to hold our meetings. We did not know this but God knew and planned for just the right time to touch the hearts of this dear family to give for this new church building. The God we serve is AWESOME. We and the members of our church can only say "Thanks" to those who were responsible for this wonderful gift.

Our seminary is suffering with attendance problems. But that is to be expected when God is at work Satan cannot be quiet. So we will not give him any credit and just say that the rain has been a great problem! I have been giving much thought to a new class in seminary and construction of church buildings. I think this will be an important class for the prospective pastors as they need to know how to build the churches that they will be preaching in. This will give them an insight into the other side of mission work.

A little update on our mission locations with respect to buildings. All total, outside the principle church, we have seven points. One has a permanent church building, two others are in rented buildings, three are in homes of believers or garages and one is held under a tarp in front of a believers home. In this last one we have had seven people saved this month. Pray with us for these areas of ministry here in Brazil. Remember the mission point in Salisopolis where we have a pastor and his wife in that very traditional city where there were no Baptist works. We started with just four in attendance there and today we have twenty-two in regular attendance. AWESOME!

Going back a little bit and talking about the wiring on the woodworking-shop-school area: we have worked the last two weeks on the electrical wiring and the motors on the machines. I have tried to get all 3-phase motors so our energy bills in the future will be economized.

While we are working on the Vocational School areas, I would like for you to pray for the practical aspect of this school. It will allow me to make all the doors and windows needed for the new missions, and we will be producing all the blocks needed to build the missions. And the best part is that the construction of the buildings will be part of the vocational training of the young men and seminary students.

It is totally amazing who God chooses to use. Are you available to help do some missionary work out of the country or at home?

Here again is an invitation-Come on down and help on a mission project in Caraguatuba Brazil. If you can't come down, you can help by continuing to pray for us and through your offerings to Baptist Faith Missions.

and is ready to take off. Daddy said to hurry." A lady in the bathroom said, "I arrived in that plane 30 minutes ago."

I got everyone taken care of, and as I was leaving the last stall with David in my arms, the Lord made me see that there on the floor, beside a commode, lay my little purse with all my money. Purses did not have zippers in those days, only a snap to close them.

I rushed out with the children and Brother Overbey said, "Sister Hatcher, let us pray together before you depart." After the prayer, his daughter, Ruth, walked across the runway with me, which was a good distance, and helped us get to the plane. They put the stairway up again and opened the plane door. The motors were running and the plane was ready to depart.

As I walked into the plane, the flight attendant said, "Sit here in first class, the plane is taking off. Why were you so late?" I replied, "I've been in the airport for three hours already!"

Well, the plane landed in Cuba. I was alarmed to see policemen with guns guarding the entrance to the airport as all passengers had to go through inspection. Finally, after 19 hours of flight, we arrived in Belem safe and sound where my husband, John, and Brother Paul Calley, met us. Brother Calley had come 3,000 miles from Cruzeiro do Sul to Manaus in order to go with my husband, who didn't speak Portuguese, to meet me and our precious little ones.

We spent the night in a hotel. The next morning, we all flew to Manaus where we lived and worked 20 years before moving to Southern Brazil. We have lived and worked in the states of Sao Paulo and Parana for the last 30 years, which completed 50 wonderful years in Brazil on September 9, 2005.

## Ministering To Those Who Know Little... Ministering In "Tongues"...

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

October 24, 2005

Thanksgiving is my favorite Holiday. We hope that the Conference this year is a blessing to all who attend. We have much for which to be thankful including the privilege of being Ambassadors for Christ here in France. We have had new doors of opportunity recently and new participants in Bible studies and Sunday Worship.

Last week we had two new ladies at the Bible study in the city of Mazere. They came with Francine, who was back after not coming since the beginning of summer. The town of Mazere is a one hour drive when there is no traffic. The Bible study there is on Thursday evenings in the home of a Baptist young lady who moved there with a job. There is no Baptist church in this city or any church that even preaches the basics of the Gospel. In this study we are going through the letter to the Romans. When we discussed the fall in the Garden of Eden, Francine immediately said, "But that's a myth." When we mentioned the justice of God, another lady said, "That's up for debate." I am amazed that they keep coming when they believe so little. But, we have hope that God will change their hearts as He has others. Alain, a man who comes to this Bible study, was an atheist before he was saved several years ago. So, there is the other side of the coin. God gives life!

This week we had two Brazilians come to the Thursday morning Bible study in our home. It was their first time and they showed a good interest. Rosana, the lady, said, "I don't think that it is by accident that we moved in near you." I agreed. We love these divine appointments. And this is one of many.

One of these divinely orchestrated appointments has gotten Judy back in the public school where she donates time teaching three English classes each week to third graders. This is the third year that she has done this. We "ran" into the teacher in whose class Judy taught four years ago when we ducked into a store to get out of the rain. To Judy's surprise the teacher's daughter, who was with her, had been a student in her class last year. This teacher, who is now a special education teacher, took the initiative to get Judy an interview with the new principal to get her set up to teach English in Third Grade.
