"YOU! FOLLOW ME!" The Lord Jesus Christ, John 21:22: *Then Peter, turning around, saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following... Peter, seeing him, said to Jesus, "But, Lord, what about this man?"* Jesus said to him, "If I will that he remain till I come, what is that to you? **"YOU FOLLOW ME!"**

Our Conference Theme: **"YOU! FOLLOW ME!"** will continue to promote the ministry of INDIVIDUAL PERSONAL PARTICIPATION AND INVOLVEMENT IN MISSIONS...and especially as WE FOLLOW OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST.

Jesus said in John 12:26: *"If anyone serves Me, let Him follow Me; and where I am, there my servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor."* If we follow the Lord Jesus Christ, then we will be where He is.

We are sure where He will lead us...and where we will find ourselves as we follow Him. WE WILL BE IN THE FIELDS OF MISSIONS — both the fields all around each of us, and those which are farther away...even to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). This is not only where He commands us to go — but where He leads us to go and goes with us (Matthew 28:20).

Matthew 9:37-38: *Then He said to His disciples (followers), "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers INTO HIS HARVEST."* HIS HARVEST is where the Lord of the Harvest is and where He will be. And, that's where we will be also, IF WE FOLLOW HIM.

During the course of our Missions Conference, we will challenge us all to CULTIVATE FOLLOWING THE LORD'S STEPS INTO MISSIONS. We will especially emphasize these FOUR STEPS or RULES FOR FOLLOWING THE LORD JESUS CHRIST INTO MISSIONS:

Step 1. Missions MINDSET. MINDSET means: your convictions, core values, non-negotiable personal principles. Of course, for us Christians, our MINDSET is THE MIND OF CHRIST (1 Corinthians 2:16). We must continually, constantly be RENEWING OUR MINDSET until we are conformed to God's will: how He thinks, what He wants (Romans 12:1-2). And when it comes to FOLLOWING CHRIST, we are specifically commanded to "LET THIS MIND(set) BE IN YOU WHICH WAS ALSO IN CHRIST JESUS" (Philippians 2:5-8). His MINDSET was a MISSIONS MINDSET. He took upon Himself the form of a servant and was made in the likeness of men TO SAVE HIS PEOPLE. His MINDSET was to obey and serve and give whatever it took to please His Father and complete the work the Father had given Him to do.

Step 2. Missions MEDITATIONS. MEDITATIONS means: your thought patterns, the actual thoughts you think. But MEDITATIONS are more than just your random thoughts that pop into your mind. MEDITATIONS are deliberate thoughts... thoughts you think on purpose. Thoughts you train your mind to think. Like Philippians 4:8 commands, we must deliberately ponder and MEDITATE on

Bev Writes About Mike's Illness...

Dear Fellow Laborers, February 18, 2006

Yesterday was Mike's birthday. He's 58 years old now. It was not a good day for him. Let me start with Sunday: He woke up thirsty and feeling like something wasn't right. He was weak, but taught Sunday School anyway. We came home right after services. Usually we have lunch at a friend's. He had warned the others pastors that maybe he wouldn't be able to preach that night. Well, he did anyway, but feeling very sick. Right afterwards, he laid down on a bench. We decided to go up to the hospital to have a malaria exam done. It came back negative. The next morning he wasn't feeling too bad, but in the afternoon, his temperature shot up. I took him to a laboratory to have another exam done. At first they didn't want to, because the kits they use require 3 days of symptoms, (it was only 2). They did one anyway and Andrew picked up the results yesterday morning. Guess what? Malaria! The incubation period is 2 weeks. He had been up river then. He had a tent, but he and the pastor had stayed up until real late, talking. It was then I'm sure he was bitten. It's the same kind he had two years ago after a trip up river. That time he didn't sleep in the tent because it was so hot. Back to yesterday. He spent most of the morning in his recliner. Two of the other pastors came by to check on him and bring him a gift. Around 11 am he got up to go to the bathroom. I heard him say something and when I went to find out what it was, he was sitting on the floor in the hallway, white as a ghost. He lay down and stayed there about an hour before he could get up. Even then I had to stay with him. He told me later he felt like vomiting and almost fainted, even while sitting on the toilet. At one time he told me to hang on to him. It must have been then. He then lay on the

floor in the hallway for quite sometime. I had called the doctor and he said I could take the test results without Mike going in. He looked at it and wrote the prescription. The malaria medicine is free anywhere here. They can not charge for it. Yesterday he took four pills and today another three. He is feeling better, but it will take sometime to get over it completely. We have two kinds here. The kind he has is Falciparum. Mike says it's the better of the two to get, if you have to get it. Reason why, is that you kill it off completely or it kills you. The other kind, Vivax, stays in your blood stream and you never get rid of it. Any little extra effort before you are completely well and it comes back. So I guess that's why he says it's better to get Falciparum. He had Vivax, as a teen and had a setback after he went to CBC in '68. Also, you can never donate blood. I have been here almost 35 years and thankfully, never have gotten it. We don't have any cases right here at our place. It is bad though in the rest of the area.

Keep Mike in your prayers. He has a trip planned for up river in less than two weeks to build a church building at the Indian tribe in Peru. The doctor said he should not go. I hope I can convince my hardheaded husband to listen. As of a week or so ago, the wood was not ready. I hope it won't be so he will not even think of going.

Open New Mission . . . Printer Problems . . .

Dear Friends,

March 2, 2006

Praise the Lord, the new mission work in Acomayo is underway. We were able to rent a house for a full year just two blocks off of the main plaza of town. Acomayo is about thirty minutes away from Huanuco. Anita and I are excited about being able to get back into church planting once again. Brother Cesar Apolinario is working with us as the national pastor. He is married (wife Suzanna) and has three teenage children. We certainly appreciate your prayers for Cesar, his wife, and the new work. Terrorism has already made its presence in this town; Anita and I only go in the daytime. Brother Cesar and his family are also there for the other weekly activities and services. We

are still praying about getting a new work going on the North end of Huanuco, but so far the Lord has not given us the leadership in this endeavor. Please pray with us about this also.

I had another Bible Institute class planned for the second week of March, but in the midst of printing the material I will be giving to the one hundred and twenty plus pastors my Risograph broke down and I could not finish the printing. I checked with a local printer around the corner from us and he wanted over one thousand dollars to finish the project. Photocopying was going to cost about seven hundred and fifty. I decided I would rather invest that kind of money into repairing the Risograph and finish the project myself. Anyway, I spent a good part of the day on the phone calling pastors from all over Peru telling them the class has been postponed. Now I need to crate the Riso and get it to the capital city of Lima, to get it fixed. Something else to pray for!!

Anita's hands are better but she still has trouble with them. We believe your prayers are having an effect so please keep it up. Thanks. We have been in some much needed fixing up and remodeling around here during the month of February. For those of you that have been to our place before, you will be happy to know we now have a beautiful ceramic tile floor in our big room where we have classes and dining for large groups. After the tile was put in we had to repaint the place. Everything looks great. We have been pushing so hard to get everything done before the Bible Institute class started and then the Riso broke. So we have decided that since we are now in NO rush we needed to organize our offices. This alone is taking me two or three days! But it is worth it! I have found neat stuff that I haven't seen in years buried under piles of papers and in drawers! We are giving away tremendous amounts of "stuff" that we have managed to accumulate. God bless each one of you, we love and appreciate you all. Thanks for your prayers and support. Until next month.

Four More Baptized . . . Project Life Shares Gospel . . . Carnival Youth Camp . . .

Dear Friends,

You will certainly want to rejoice with us with the news that four more persons have committed their life to Christ and were baptized this past month! God is so good. One of these four is a young man who had been addicted to drugs for several years. Since coming to our church he immediately began bringing former drug buddies. His name is Ronaldo, and he embodies the text in Luke 7:40-47, where Jesus said to Simon the Pharisee, "which of them will love Him more?" Simon answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more! And He said to him, "You have rightly judged." Ronaldo is very aware of how great God's mercy to is to him, therefore he loves Him much.

We finished another course in our theological training center with 21 trainees successfully completing the course out of a total of 27 enrolled. This number was especially encouraging to our leadership team because the months of January and February are predominantly vacation months in Brazil. They fall in our mid-summer. We are beginning a course in Personal Evangelism this week and are looking forward to having an even higher number of participants. It is our aim to make all our courses as practical and applicable as possible.

Our pioneer evangelistic team, Project Life, was in the interior of our state (on motor home Alpha) sharing the gospel in three different cities. We had the privilege to be in ten public schools and several public parks. The gospel was shared through drama, song, testimonies and preaching to approximately 3000 persons. There were just over 200 who professed publicly that they were accepting Christ as their Lord and Savior. God is so good. Our second motor home, Logos, is working in and around our base city while we continue to fully equip it for interior service. We have received help from some generous brothers and sisters from the US and have applied it to Phase I of the bus transformation. (It was a commercial travel bus and we are converting it into a self-contained multifunctional motor home/traveling gospel base). We have installed the stage platform on top and have begun to purchase part of our public address system. If you are led of the Lord to help, we have several more stages to do before the motor home is fully completed. In order not to take too much space in this publication with a lengthy description, you may contact me at the above addresses or phone number to obtain exact costs on each phase of the equipment needed. We are grateful to God for you who have already given so that this blessed ministry may continue and abound. May God bless you for your generosity.

During the Carnival holiday this past month our youth went on a spiritual growth retreat. One of the participants in this retreat was a young man from Bell Shoals Baptist Church in Brandon, Florida. His name is Tyler Flores. I met Tyler five years ago when he was just 15 years old. He has come to Brazil with the youth group which his father leads for the last four years. In my interaction with the group I sensed there was a calling from God upon Tyler for missionary service. I invited him to come work with me (for a period of internship) in mission training and he accepted. While here, Tyler participated in the four day Carnival retreat with 27 Brazilian young people. Below I have included a firsthand report he gave me of his "cross-cultural" experience.

This past weekend I had the privilege of attending Carnival youth camp as an intern, participant and missionary in training. In the week leading up to camp I had been attending Portuguese language classes and have picked up a small amount of the language, both in the class and my previous week long mission trips to Brazil. The camp was an exciting experience for me first of all because it was my first time alone in the culture here, but more importantly, it was stimulating to see God at work in a society outside of my own.

Throughout the weekend and the ensuing days, I noticed the sincere attitude of Pastor Anderson in his attempts to lead the students into a greater knowledge of God's will for their life. Although I only understood a smattering of what was going on, the emotional response and behaviors pouring from the young people spoke volumes more to me than words. It was obvious that this small group of young believers had a desire to learn what was written for them in God's word. They were able to concentrate on the events at hand through well-planned events and an organized schedule. The environment was ideal for any youth pastor and articulated again the efforts put into getting the Word of the Lord to the students. Most importantly, God was lifted up and in that, I believe that the camp was a success and it was most assuredly an immense encouragement to my spiritual walk."

We thank God for the privilege to have this dedicated young man with us and pray that he'll be used even more fully in Kingdom work by his having been with us while in training.

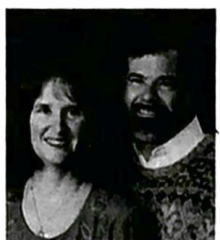

thoughts which are true, noble, just, pure, lovely, of good report, virtuous, and praiseworthy. Of course, these MEDITATIONS will be inspired by our keeping company with Jesus Christ, being where He is and abiding in His word. And, again, these MEDITATIONS will inevitably steer and direct our minds toward MISSIONS.

Step 3. Missions MOTIVATIONS. MOTIVATIONS means: our incentives; the reasons we do what we do. If you follow the Lord Jesus, your MOTIVATIONS will be the same as His: to obey what the Father had commanded Him to do, to please the Father, to finish the works He had been given to do. We, too, must have the same MOTIVATIONS. Paul prescribes the incentives which should MOTIVATE us in all we do. 2 Corinthians 5:9: *Therefore we make it our aim, whether present or absent, TO BE WELL PLEASING TO HIM.* Verses 14-15: *For THE LOVE OF CHRIST CONSTRAINS US, because we judge thus: that if One died for all, then all died; and He died for all, THAT THOSE WHO LIVE SHOULD LIVE NO LONGER FOR THEMSELVES, BUT FOR HIM WHO DIED FOR THEM AND ROSE AGAIN.* When THE LOVE OF CHRIST MOTIVATES you, then you will LOVE HIM and LOVE THE THINGS HE LOVES. When you MAKE IT YOUR AIM to be well-pleasing to Him, then what pleases Him will MOTIVATE you. When you no longer live for yourself, but for Him who died for you and for others, then THAT MISSIONS MOTIVATION WILL INSPIRE YOU TO INVOLVE YOURSELF IN TAKING THAT MESSAGE TO EVERYONE IN THE WORLD.

Step 4. Missions MANNER OF LIVING or METHOD. MANNER OF LIVING / METHOD means: the conduct and activities by which you act on your MINDSET, MEDITATIONS, and MOTIVATION. It is never enough just to talk a good missions talk; you must also walk a good missions walk. We can be followers of Jesus Christ in name only...and we will be if we are not following Him where He is, and where He is going. FOLLOWING JESUS INTO MISSIONS will lead us to (1) value those who are lost apart from God and dying in their sins; (2) witness to those who are closest to us whom we can reach; (3) pray for the Gospel of Christ to be witnessed in all the nations of the world; (4) give personal offerings for the support of those who are going where we cannot go.

And, of course, we would love for every FRIEND OF BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS to make either fresh or increased commitments to give personal offerings to help meet the ever-increasing needs of our missionaries.

DIRECTIONS TO OUR CHURCH FACILITIES. Coming from South on I-75: Get off at Exit 104 (Athens-Boonesborough). Turn west toward town. You will be on Athens-Boonesborough Road or Richmond Road Extension. As you approach Lexington, the road will become Richmond Road around Jacobson Park. Continue straight into Lexington. Richmond Road will become Main Street. You will pass the Rupp Arena / Lexington Convention Center on your left. Turn left at the next traffic light. This is Jefferson Street. Turn right in the middle of the overpass bridge onto Manchester. About 1 mile down Manchester, turn right on Thompson Road and come to 320. Coming from North on I-75 or East / West on I-64: I-75 and I-64 merge for a few miles on the north/northeast side of Lexington. Come to Exit 115 on 64 / 75. This is Newtown Pike (State Route 922). Turn south toward Lexington. Follow Newtown Pike until you come to Main Street. (If you have made reservations at the Quality Inn, it is located on your left just before you get to the Newtown Pike / New Circle Road interchange). Go straight across Main Street. This short street is Cox Street. Follow Cox Street to the dead-end. Turn right on Manchester. Follow Manchester about 1 mile. Turn right on Thompson Road and come to 320.

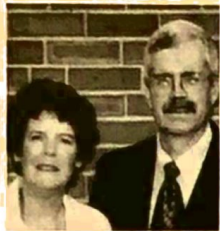

March 4, 2006

Elizabeth, as well as Doug's dad, John Brook, visited us. Also, Roger and Julie Tate, and their daughter, Emily, came with the Brook family to visit. Roger is assistant pastor at Emmanuel Baptist, where Pastor Darrell Messer is the Senior Pastor. Roger and Julie have been interested in overseas missions for a long time, so this was their first trip on a plane and outside of the U.S. It was a delight for us to host all of them and to see how they were impacted by the ministries that God has given us. We are praying that God will send someone else to help with the ministry here as there is still so much more to be done. So, we are asking God that if it is His will, Roger and Julie and their family may join us here to minister with us sometime.

We had a great time with them. All of them went by plane into the bush with us for Pam to do a medical clinic. Sharon assisted Pam with seeing the sick tribal people and Julie helped Mike with the pharmacy. Seeing the tribal people in their native habitat was quite an experience for all of them. They were also burdened about the need to reach these native people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Also, they ministered with Dennis, our oldest orphan who now works with us. Dennis has a Bible Club at a public primary school that is close to Imani Baptist. Sharon is a dental hygienist and she taught the students how to take care of their teeth and then we passed out toothbrushes that Doug had bought for them. This school ministry is really growing and Dennis and Jared, our newest pastor, meet with the students in grades 4-8 every Wednesday afternoon to share God's Word with them. Dennis is also doing a neighborhood Bible club near Imani Baptist on Saturday afternoons. Jared is teaching the teens also on Saturday at our other church property where we are beginning our newest preaching point. The group observed these Bible clubs, too, and were blessed by them.

Roger, John, and Doug taught classes to our Bible Institute students and Roger preached the morning message at Imani Baptist. Sharon and Julie and their children taught the children's classes, while Doug taught the adult Sunday School class. After church, everyone including the children, went out with our team to do soul winning evangelism in homes. They were blessed as they watched our people, many of them who are teens, tell others about the saving faith of the Lord Jesus Christ.

All of the adults went with us and Nathan to see the prison ministry and we watched as Nathan taught one of his Bible classes to the prisoners there. These men eagerly listened, took notes, and asked questions, and there were 56 in his class. Some sat on the concrete floor as there was not enough seating for everyone. At the end of the class the men sang, "I Know My Redeemer Lives," and all of us were brought to tears as we saw their sincerity and joy. They are in captivity, many of them for crimes they did not do. They are away from their families, living in very primitive conditions with an open sewer running through the prison, poor sanitation and food conditions, disease and sickness, etc. The conditions are despicable, but yet, these prisoners see past their circumstances and thank God for the opportunity to hear His Word. Three of the men that Nathan has taught have been released and live in the Kitale area and are attending Imani Baptist Church regularly. One of the men, Moses, was first in the class on evangelism that was recently taught and he goes out faithfully to witness to others about Jesus Christ. The Brooks and Tates were such a blessing to us and we hope that what they saw will continue to impact them.

Last Sunday was our last time at Imani Baptist as we are opening up a new preaching point on our property that we bought in the year 2000. Most of you remember that we had to close Calvary Baptist Church, our first church, in June of last year, due to a problem with the boundary of the fence around our property. The correct boundary actually went 15 meters into the church building and we did not know this when we built the church. So, in order to comply with the government, we took the church down and had a proper survey done. Since then we have been transporting over 30 people each Sunday from Calvary Baptist Church to Imani Baptist for services. We wanted to lay a firm foundation for the new church and Imani, so we spent many weeks teaching the members about our faith in the Baptist catechism classes. They had to be saved and pass the test in order to be a member and many will need to be baptized. So, last Sunday Laban preached and all of those who were planning to join us at the new preaching point came forward. Some of the men from Imani prayed for us and these who are going with us as we will be sent out from Imani Baptist.

After church, we all left to go to the new site and met in Jared's living room. Jared lives on the church property as a caretaker. He is one of our Bible Institute students, and feels that God has called him to preach, so I will be discipling him to be our next pastor. There were over 25 who met in his house and it was crowded. On Wednesday evening, we met there again for a prayer meeting and 15 came. So, we are getting a good start, but we will need to make preparations for a temporary structure to meet in until we get the money to build a church building. It is now rainy season, so we hope to put up a tent-like structure to prevent rain or sun from bothering us and we will use Jared's house for Sunday School classes for the children. Please help us to pray about getting the money needed to build a permanent building on this site. I want to continue to train those that God has called out into the ministry in our Bible Institute and Lord willing, plant more churches in the future.

Pam is excited as she got word this week that she will be able to fly by helicopter into the bush twice this month. The helicopter was down for most of last year being repaired, or waiting on parts for the repairs. It has been fixed and is doing well, so the flights into the bush areas have resumed. Both of us are anxious to go again to help the tribal people in these remote areas spiritually and physically. She has also been asked to go up twice in April and twice in May. Please pray that there will be more opportunities for us to go into new areas where the nationals have never heard of Christ. We would love to start Baptist churches there, if this is God's will.

As with anything that one is doing for Christ, there is opposition. So, we would ask you to pray for us as we are facing some trials. These requests are unspoken, but we thank each of you for your love and prayers and your encouragement. We would ask you to pray for us for God's wisdom with this young church and for those who minister with us. Please keep in touch with us as you have time and thanks for all that you are doing in your corner of God's harvest to further His kingdom. We appreciate each of you, for without you and your support, we could not be here. Until next time...

I truly believe that this trip was life-changing for them and that the team truly understood ministry in a cross-cultural context. March 3, 2006

For many of you readers of the Mission Sheets we (Harold and Marie) are praying for you. If you are not saved we pray for your salvation. If you are saved, we pray for your sanctification that you may "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be glory both now and forever, Amen." 2 Peter 3:18.

During this "Mission Sheets Month" which began February 1, and ends today, March 3, 2006, I preached eleven sermons in three Baptist churches here in Manaus. Eight were preached at the 24th of March Baptist Church where I serve as pastor and Marie and I are members.

Two (Sunday the 12th) were at the Comunhao Baptist Church during the absence of the pastor, Dr. Asa Mark Bratcher, and one at the Igreja Batista Biblica. I brought a message on missions at the request of the president of the Brazilian BFM. Marie heard me preach all eleven. Besides hearing some two messages, I attended one pastors meeting and one meeting of the Brazilian BFM. We also celebrated the birthdays of the members of the 24th of March Baptist Church, among them, Antonio da Silva Costa's 85th and of his wife of many years, Maria de Araujo Costa's, 90th. They are the church's oldest members. We also ate supper with Evangelist Ricardo with some other eleven present, celebrating his 36th birthday. Each Thursday I made visits on the church field with pastor Ediberto and some three or four others of the church. Also, I am trying to learn to "sing unto the Lord a new song." See Psalm 96:1 and 98:1. My teacher is the pianist of the Comunhao Church, Professor Teixeira. I do not know many of the hymns in the "Cantor Cristao" the Portuguese hymnal that we use at the church.

During the month one lady asked for baptism and one boy requested to be received by letter from a sister Baptist church. We are praying (pray with us) that our church will cause more joy in heaven, Luke 15:7-10. Tuesday the 28th was a holiday in Brazil, Carnaval. Many, the majority, walked after the flesh and not after the Spirit. Many of these started celebrating Carnaval four or five days before the holiday "sowing to the flesh." Many of the believers went on retreats or camps outside of town. Marie and I were in the Lord's house on the Lord's day the 26th and stayed home the 27th and 28th. The Lord willing, we shall be celebrating my 79th birthday and the church's 7th with special services the 22nd through the 26th. You who contribute to BFM do well. Continue we ask you in the name of our Savior to contribute. "Give and to you shall be given." Brothers and Sisters, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit Amen. Galatians 6:18.

Previously, I taught a leadership class from America aimed at building a leader from the various wards, or the idea of multiplication. (2 Tim. 2:2). My goal is for the work to expand and multiply, as I believe this is taught in Scripture repeatedly. The visitors donated the financial assistance that was necessary to buy the 23 Bibles, so the Lord is continuing to show us that He will provide for us in response to prayer and seeking His will. (Psalms 32:8) We praise the Lord for this answer to prayer and look forward to seeing the fruit that comes as a result of the generosity of our visitors. I will be sure to keep you updated on this progress.

Please pray for us, as there are so many items to accomplish and such little time. The time is short, and we are to "redeem the time, because the days are evil." (Ephesians 5:16) May we each use our time wisely, as our lives pass so quickly and only what is done for the Lord will last. May we ever be mindful of the words: "Only one life will soon be past, only what is done for Christ will last."
