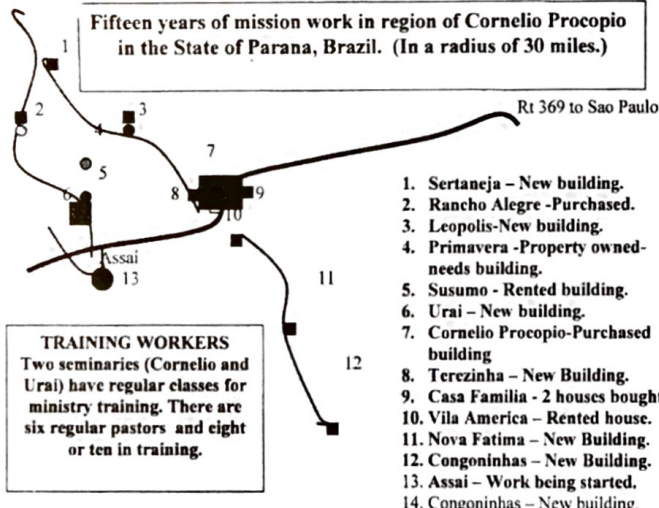

Dear Friends,
June 27, 2006
Thank you for your prayers and support. We thank our Lord for your faithful help through the fifty-one years we have been here in Brazil. We do not run as fast but are still running the race. Daily, we offer ourselves to Him, body and soul, for we have been bought with a price.

This month two books written by Alta were printed; three thousand copies each of *HOW TO REAR CHILDREN* and *DEPRESSION, ITS CAUSES AND CURE*. These books have been and are being a great blessing to many.

Since we have been here in the State of Parana, (fifteen years), twelve works have been started, six houses and properties for missions have been bought and five new buildings have been constructed. For the last three weeks Alta and I have gone to the city of Assai three times and have looked for property or building to rent. Last week a ninety-one-year-old man trusted Christ as Savior. There are three lots together we are going to price and one building we are going to see about renting temporarily. To buy or build will depend on our gifts and offerings.

Two seminaries (Cornelio and Urai) have regular classes for ministry training. There are six regular pastors and eight or ten in training.

Three persons have been baptized since my last letter. Marcio, the new pastor of the Urai Church and his wife, Carol, are working at three places: Urai, Rancho Alegre and Susumo. Pray especially for Alta and me as we begin the new work in Assai.

We would like to stop but there is too much to lose to quit. There are too many who have never heard of Jesus who died for them.

how God is using Valter in such a positive way. He has a real passion to glorify the Lord wherever he goes. At the same time, he is being persecuted by a member of a cult who is a fellow employee at his job. Pray that Valter will be wise in how he deals with the trial to his faith.

Several folks have asked me to give an update on equipping Project Life's number two motorhome called Logos. We received a few special offerings which allowed us to get the first two stages of the transformation process done. We now have the upper deck stage completed and the sound system bought and installed. We have been using that motorhome in the metropolitan area of Curitiba, since we still haven't been able to complete the kitchen, bathroom, bunk beds, and projector and screen. If you are prayerfully considering a very effective place to invest in the spread of God's word, here is a wonderful opportunity for you. For example, with our other motorhome, Alpha, which is fully equipped, we were able to take the gospel to nine public schools and parks during the month of June. There were 143 persons who publicly professed Jesus Christ as their Lord. When we get the Logos motorhome finished we will be able to virtually double our outreach efforts. As God leads you, please designate your offerings to Project Life, and we will apply them to completing the transformation of the bus into a fully operational ministry tool.

Many of you already know that we live in a region that experiences the opposite seasons that you experience in the northern hemisphere. Presently we are in the early part of our cool winter. Few of the homes or buildings here have heating, so when it's below freezing outside, it isn't much cooler inside. This isn't unbearable, but it does affect the people's health. Our son, Brennen, has a constant battle with throat and respiratory infections as do many other

We encouraged the couples from our church to invite as many unsaved married couples as they could to a romantic dinner. We had a very good turnout. More than half the crowd were unsaved friends and family of our members. We prepared a romantic environment in a local social hall and had a delicious buffet served for our dinner. After getting to know the new couples, we gave a message on how to have a happy and lasting marriage and presented the gospel as the only true source of genuine happiness and peace. After that event, we have had some of these couples come to our regular worship services. We pray that these folks will come to know Christ as their Lord and Savior.

In our training center we recently finished giving a practical course on personal evangelism. Our participants are learning how to share their faith in God's grace and love with their fellow workers, family and friends. Last night, after the Sunday night worship service, Valter, a young trainee shared with me the opportunities that he is having on his job of sharing the gospel. It was exciting to hear

July 4, 2006

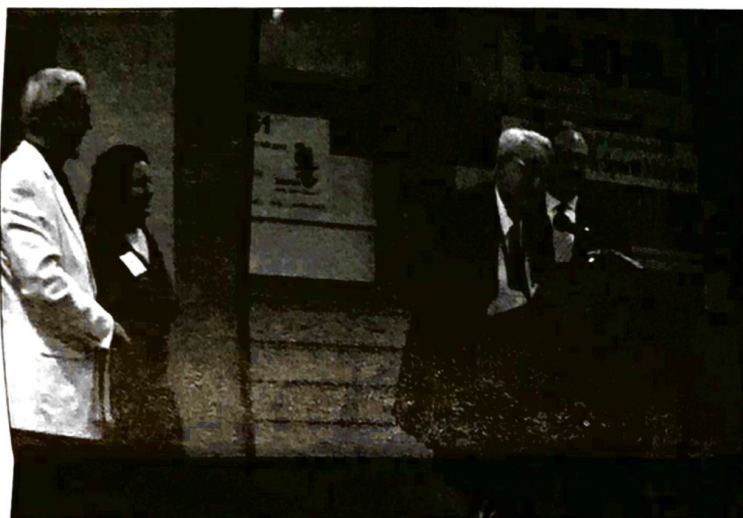
I just got home last evening from North Carolina. I had a wonderful time with the saints there in Winston-Salem. I am weary. This morning I noted that we have been in five States and in ten churches this past five weeks. Maybe that's the reason I am a little tired. It has been wonderful visiting the churches and dear saints of God. We are beginning to wind it down. We will go back to Brazil sometime next month if all goes as planned. Tomorrow Ursula and I go up to Breeze, Illinois, for Ursula to get her colon test. She had surgery in this hospital on her colon five years ago and they want to check it. As far as we know all is well.

As we make preparation to return we also are making plans for the work there in Brazil. We want to finish up the sanctuary at the Altos do Coxipo church. Some churches have expressed interest in helping with this. I can't give an exact estimate on how much we will need in finances to complete this until I get there and do some checking on the price of building materials. Also we hope to build four classrooms for Sunday School at two of the missions.

We just got a call today from one of our Brazilian brethren saying that all is going well there. One of our faithful workers, Luis Antonio, is near death in his battle with colon cancer which has spread all over his body. He is just waiting for the Lord to come for him. He probably will be gone before we get there, but we will meet again under much better conditions. If I didn't believe that I'd be in bad shape. As Job said, I know my Redeemer liveth and I shall see him face to face in my new body! Praise His name!

We will write one more letter here from the States probably before leaving out for Brazil. We will need a little time after we quit traveling the end of this month to get packed and organized to leave. Do pray for us as we make our preparations to return to the field. We are not old, but we've got a lot of miles on us. Ursula suffers a lot with her arthritis. God bless you all.

God Bless America ... First Lost Luggage in 47 Years ... Stephen Visits ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Blessed Savior:

July 4, 2006

"God bless America, land that I love. Stand beside her and guide her through the night with the light from above. From the mountains to the prairies, from the oceans white with foam, God bless America..." That was our home, (Marie and myself) for many years before Brazil became our home sweet home. Thus I felt like greeting you, the readers of the Mission Sheets, because today is Independence Day in the U.S.A.

This Mission Sheets month is two months late due to the fact that I forgot to write the Mission Sheets letter in May. Forgive me, brothers and sisters! During the month of May I preached eight sermons, all at the 24th of March Baptist Church and I heard nine sermons here in Manaus. The June Mission Sheets month was from June 3 until July 3. During these days I heard six sermons and preached ten.

Now we bring you an update about the two pieces of missing luggage. One bag, which is mine, is still missing. Marie's came after seventeen days. Now that the airline company, Lloyd Aereo Boliviano, has moved out of Manaus, they told Asa Mark that they had no idea where the missing suitcase is. Marie had a pair of sandals in the bag and the rest was my things. We believe that the suitcase was stolen. In the forty-seven years of being here traveling back and forth, this is the first time we have had such a problem and loss of our personal things.

Last Saturday morning at 7:10 the two of us, Stephen's mother-in-law and our driver Brother Chagas, left the house here to travel to Parana da Eva to attend the 11th anniversary of the Ladies WMU there. We were royally received and were entertained in four different homes. I preached in the two churches. There were good crowds at all the services.

Our son Stephen arrived at 3 p.m., June 27. His plane arrived thirteen hours late. So we were very glad to see him. Asa Mark picked him up at the airport and they have been together quite a bit. Yesterday he went with his brother-in-law to Parana da Eva so that he can fish some. He has been to the 24th of March Baptist Church twice and preached Sunday night at the Comunhao Baptist Church. He has invitations to preach in more churches before his departure later this month.

We thank all of you who pray for us and support us in any way. We still pray for Bro. Jim Orrick, Bro. Marvin Summers and for Bro. Homer Crane. May God bless each one of you is our prayer.

Thankful For Prayers ... Receive Prison Permit ...

Dear praying friends,

July 4, 2006

Another month has come and gone so quickly, and there are many important items to update you about. Today is such an important day in the history of our country and I pray that each of you will have the opportunity to celebrate with your friends and family. My wife and I thank the Lord for continued ministry opportunities, good health, and the many blessings He provides for us each month as we serve Him here in Kenya. This prayer letter will give a current update as well as share answers to prayer.

This past week I was finally given the permit needed to continue with the prison ministry here in Kitale. This was a major concern, as the government officials concerned with the permit changed and there were other changes in the prison system. Thank you so much to each of you who sent letters to me personally telling me to be patient and that you were praying for me. Many times it is hard to trust the Lord when we don't see results, but my faith in Him was challenged and has grown dramatically as a result of this experience. We are told to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17), and this is difficult to do at times when we have to wait on the Lord. I praise the Lord for His faithfulness to provide and His timing is many times very different from our own timing.

This month we have a group from our home church, Calvary Baptist Church in West Virginia. There were five that made the financial sacrifice and also the sacrifice of leaving friends and family to come and see what the Lord is doing here. Yesterday we were able to visit both the men and women's respective prisons as a team. Each side of the prison ministered to us in a special way, and we were also able to minister to them as well. The conditions in the prison are very difficult, but I praise the Lord for the new believers in the Bible Theological School, as well as their desire and hunger to learn the Word of God. Several gave testimonies yesterday of the work that God is doing in their lives and how God has changed them from their former way of living. We praise the Lord for the spiritual changes we have seen in the prisoners and we ask you to pray that we would have even more opportunity to expand in the future. We are also praying that the Lord would burden new staff to come out and work with us, as the work is overwhelming and the workers are few. In Isaiah 6:8, it says "Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I, send me." Can we truly respond as Isaiah responded to the call of God? A wise missionary said "the greatest ability is availability." Can we say we are truly available and ask the Lord to send us to fill a vital need in His harvest field? I pray that we would.

Please continue to pray for us as the challenges here are great, but we desire to be faithful to the work God has called us to. One of the current classes that is being taught in the prison is on Biblical stewardship, and I am challenged more than ever as I teach of the need to be faithful to the Lord and the ministries God has entrusted to us. May we be challenged to fulfill His call wherever that may be. We would love to hear from any who would like to write. God bless you and we will update you next month.

Visitors From Home ... Helicopter Ministry In Danger ... Problems With Worms ...

Dear Special Friends,

July 2, 2006

June was a very busy month for us as we had visitors from the States. Visitors are a blessing to us; they always encourage us and help in the ministry here. Bethany Rawley came to see us for two weeks from Dallas. Her father had led Pam's first husband, Ron Radford, to Christ, and her family has always been so supportive of us. Bethany wants to be a missionary herself, so her time with us was such a blessing.

Currently, we have a team of five from our home church, Calvary Baptist in Hurricane, West Virginia, with us. They have been doing so many ministries with us and have also been a great encouragement to us. During the month of June, we were able to make four trips into the bush, two with Bethany, and two with the team now. Our home church team, as well as Bethany, have also been involved in the community projects, ministering in our churches, helping to do some repairs at Imani Baptist, etc. It is an inspiration to us as we see young people who want to serve Christ and will leave their "comfort zone" to come here to be a blessing to us and our people here.

The building at Bethel Baptist Church is coming up nicely. We want to use it for a worship center, our Bible Institute, and a place to teach classes in community development and evangelism. Unfortunately, we still need about \$3,500 more dollars to complete it, as we need to put on the roof and put in the windows, doors, etc. Many have contributed and we want to thank each one who gave. We have had many unexpected expenses, as the city municipality cut off our water to the site one time and we have had to get several permits to be able to build since it is a permanent building. We decided to make it a brick building, as it is located on a main road leaving Kitale and many people pass by it every day. Also, bricks are maintenance free, so it will save us money later on by not having to paint it.

The helicopter ministry is in financial trouble because it lost its main donor and the price of gas went up. We are hoping and praying that they will not have to shut down like they have in other countries where they have ministries. They have been in Kenya for over 25 years. However, Pam and I love this ministry in the bush and have contacted African Inland Mission (A.I.M.), as they have a ministry of flying missionaries to remote places to do evangelism and medical ministry. In fact, we used one of their planes with our team from our home church and it worked out very well. We went to a site in the bush and held a clinic under a tree. This area has no church, except for a Catholic Church in the area, so the men on our team presented the Gospel and we are praying about continuing. So, we would ask you to pray for us for clear direction from God if we are to continue to reach these tribal people.

As a result of our community projects, we now have four Bible clubs with children and youth in four different locations. These clubs are in conjunction with our two churches and four of the men from our Bible Institute are teaching them. Also, we have some of our youth involved in teaching these clubs, too. Our people have been very busy working in the communities around our churches, going house to house, meeting with the leaders in the communities, and holding community meetings telling them about our projects and presenting the Gospel. As a result, attendance at both churches has increased. Imani Baptist is restarting and we have seen many new faces in the past couple of weeks. When our former pastor left we lost almost everyone, so now we are restarting with more people coming. There is a community de-worming project planned at two public schools this month. This gives us an avenue to reach the communities, as everyone here has problems with worms. The communities are always asking for more teaching, as malaria is a problem, as well as sanitation, etc. Each lesson has a Bible lesson incorporated into the physical lesson, so we are reaching people spiritually and physically.

However, Satan is not asleep when we are doing these things, so we have had opposition. These trials keep us closer to Christ and help us to mature in our faith, so we appreciate your prayers and encouragement. Let us hear from you and know that we deeply appreciate your interest and prayers.

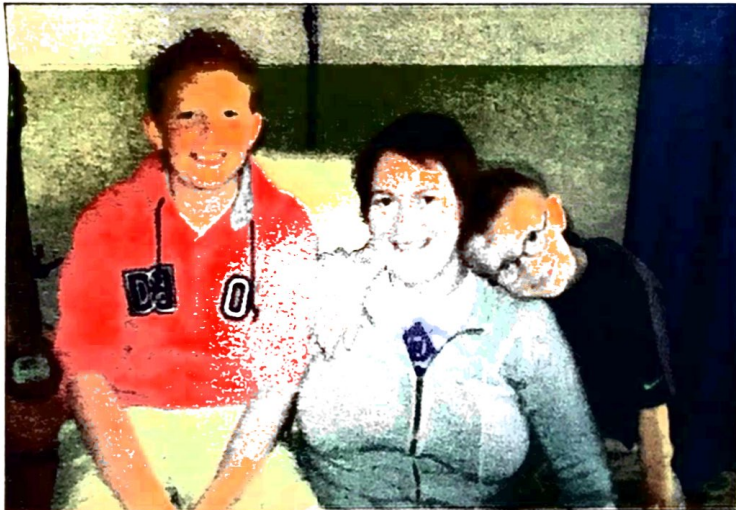

Suffer With Kidney Stone ... Back "Home" In Brazil ...

Greetings from Caraguatatuba,

July 3, 2006

Home again! As we were packing to travel back to Brazil we discovered that we had more "things" than we were allowed to carry on the plane. Needless to say, we paid for extra baggage, so goes life.

On the trip home I had one of the worst flights that I have ever had, and it had nothing to do with the plane or the pilot. Around four o'clock in the morning way up high in the sky I started passing a kidney stone. There was absolutely no way that I could get comfortable. Not standing up nor sitting down nor walking around the plane nor going to the restroom. After two hours or so of excruciating pain we landed, then we had another hour of getting through customs. When we got out of customs our planned ride back to Caraguatatuba was no where in sight. We called them and they were another hour out so I camped in the restroom in the airport while Barbara called another missionary friend in the next town to arrange for me to go to the hospital. When our ride finally got there the arrangements had been made and we were on our way for another hour ride to the hospital. On this ride I began to get some relief and when we arrived at the hospital I was no longer in pain. The doctor that attended me there in the hospital was the son-in-law of our past Portuguese teacher. This is just one more proof of our Lord being in control of everything in our lives. Sometimes it is just amazing as to how little our world is.

Well with that horror story over with we traveled on home with the visitors that had traveled with us from the States. Barbara and Lonnie Steadmon from Virginia Beach came to spend ten days with us here in Caraguatatuba. Lonnie is a fireman and we have become great friends over the past ten years. We were able to show them our mission field here in Caraguatatuba, and also the big city of Sao Paulo.

I want to share with you that we have started some minor work on the mission point that was damaged by the rainy season and the standing water from the river near by. We have removed the bathroom that was attached onto the side of the building and have started some digging. We are now waiting on the engineer to be able to continue. The mission is continuing to hold services behind the building as they are afraid to have many people in the building. The attendance is not going down but is going up. Praise God for this.

While we were away the principle church has continued to grow. We will be baptizing five new members in the following Sundays. Now this is what it is all about!! It is not about us at all; it is about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The Sunday School program is continuing to grow also. This Sunday we had 200 people in Sunday School. God is AWESOME!!!

As Barbara and I are ministering here in Caraguatatuba we would like to invite you to visit our mission field and see what the Lord is doing in another part of the world.
