## Train Locals To Conduct VBS ... Taking The Gospel To 230 Kids ... Annual Pastors & Workers Meeting ...

Dear Brethren, September 20, 2006  
Greetings from hot and dry Cruzeiro do Sul. Our dry season coincides with your summer time. The past two years have been drier than usual. We have had some pretty regular rains here in town, so the grass is still green and growing, but the river is drier than I have ever seen. Last year was the driest ever, but this year the river is even lower.

A few weeks ago I built a jack plate to put on my small aluminum boat to be able to use my 25HP jet drive motor. This is the only motor that I can use for my trips right now. There are many places that the river is so shallow that even the jet drive has trouble getting through. One place at the mouth of the Jurua Mirim River, the sand bar comes so close to the bank that you can just about jump clear across the Jurua River.

The first trip with the rig setup for shallow water was to Porto Walter. This section of the river used to be navigable year round with a regular small outboard. Not so anymore. This trip would take only three hours in the rainy season. This time it took six and a half hours. It also took three times more gasoline.

I took two of our teachers to train the local women and teens how to conduct Vacation Bible School. The training part lasted from Monday through Wednesday. Then Thursday through Sunday was VBS. Our missionary there is Brother Mario. He is an easy going guy with a great testimony. He is, however, not a go getter! He said he expected that we would have about forty kids. I told him right away that wasn't going to happen. We had 230! Several of the children were saved during the week.

Janete and Fatima did a wonderful job with the training of the local teachers. Five years ago we sent Janete to Goias for three years of training in nursing and children's ministries. She has been passing those skills on to others for the two years since her training. The investment was really a good one.

For the return trip I took the motor off of the boat and made some adjustments to my newly fabricated jack plate then reinstalled the engine (by myself). For some reason those 130 pound motors seem to weigh much more than when I was twenty-five years old! This adjustment made a big difference in speed and fuel consumption. It took only four hours down stream and half the gas. With gas at \$6.00 a gallon I have to choose my trips, equipment and fine tuning carefully!

Taking the Gospel to 230 kids and training more workers is worth all the cost and effort. All things considered, it is just plain fun to be out on the rivers, if you ask me.

We just had our annual pastors and workers meeting. Although we meet at least every two months we have our big meeting at First Baptist Church in the middle of the summer. This year, because of all the activities we were a little late. I didn't see the report on how many workers were present, but we usually have between 80 and 90. Sometimes we have over 100.

As host pastor I always bring a lesson on one specific area of mission methods. This time was about feedback from the field and the importance of keeping stats. At this point we really need this because of the kind of mission projects we are working on together among the churches here. Our coordinated project for this year is to reach every house, on every river and stream from Cruzeiro do Sul to the border. Half of our twenty churches are working together on this project. Each church or, in some cases, group of churches, select which rivers they want to cover, when to make the trip and who is sent. There are the Jurua and Moa Rivers and 18 small tributaries to be reached in 2006.

The project is over half finished. Here are some samples of the results that are in so far. The Ouro Preto River had over 900 people hear the gospel. Forty-six were saved. Between Porto Walter

and Cruzeiro do Sul over 1400 people were presented the Good News. There were forty-nine professions of faith. On the next section of the river almost 2000 people heard the gospel and 97 were saved. These two sections of the river have already received followup visits to confirm and encourage those who were saved. These followup trips are shorter, about a week. The regular trips take from two to three weeks each. Since several churches are working simultaneously on different rivers it has become possible to give this kind of coverage in a shorter period of time.

Just before lunch at the close of our preacher's meeting we presented one of our missionaries with a brand new River Craft aluminum canoe. Brother Raimundo Vieira was grinning ear to ear. The following Monday we presented another one to missionary Rivaldo who works at the Nukini Indian reservation. He got in late for the preacher's meeting, but went back to the tribe with a smile on his face, too. The canoes are built at my son Andrew's boat factory. One of our goals in setting up the factory was to produce boats for the mission work. We built my two boats and boats for four of our missionaries so far. We sell the boats to the churches for the cost of the materials. The churches are going in together to buy these boats for our missionaries. Andrew's factory has produced over 100 boats in the past two years. All of the employees are church members who Andrew has trained. Here is a good investment opportunity for you. Think about that.

You have no idea how pleased I am with the result of three years of hard work meeting with pastors and doing the final planning for this year's mission project. For the past three years I have had to work closely with our pastors to try to get them to stop their fussing and politics in favor of doing missions. I have taken a lot of flack, but it is worth it. It would be easy for me to just say, "Forget you guys. I am just going to go ahead and do the job with my church, which is more than willing to do missions." The churches and pastors are finally starting to awaken to missions. If I can be used by the Holy Spirit to get other churches, pastors and missionaries really moving, then that makes me happy. I sure would like being used by Him to get you more excited about the job at hand. We need you to come on board, too.

God bless you and, as always, thanks so much for your prayers and support.

## David And Pennie Visit ... "Mass" On Sunday ... Bible Studies Continue ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters, October 3, 2006  
Please forgive me for not writing a letter last month. We were so busy enjoying the visit of my brother David and beautiful sister-in-law, ("bellesoeur" - that is how you say sister-in-law in French), Pennie that I forgot to write. When they left, it dawned on me that I had been dilatory in my duty. Thank you for your faithfulness in giving.

We did have a great visit with David and Pennie. They serve at the Igreja Batista da Chapada where David is Pastor in Manaus, Brazil. They had been planning this trip for several years and were able finally to set aside the time necessary to come. The trip took longer for their bags which arrived five days after they had left. One of the places we visited with them is an archeological site on the Mediterranean Coast. This settlement began before the Greek Empire. It was enlarged by the Greeks and later by the Romans. It was a bustling city and center of trade at the time Paul wanted to go to Spain via Rome. It covers at least 100 acres and takes me back in time to the New Testament when I visit there. It was a blessing to have Pennie and David in our services. Our folks enjoyed meeting them and hearing the message David brought to us.

Besides David and Pennie we have had several other visitors in services and Bible studies. About three weeks ago we had three first time visitors in the same service. One of these is a friend of Joachim for whom we have been praying for some time. It is very encouraging to see the folks bringing others with them.

The neighborhood dinner that we mentioned in our last letter went very well. We had the privilege of meeting several new families. It also gave us the opportunity to share about our faith with one of the couples that we met. This family just recently moved into our neighborhood from Paris. One neighbor lady who was at the dinner asked Judy about the "masses" that we held at our house on Sundays. Judy explained to her that it wasn't really a "mass" but a meeting to study the Bible and worship.

Our Bible studies during the week are going well. The one in Portuguese is one of these. The whole Correia family is very interested. The believers who come to the other Bible studies are having opportunities to share what they believe with friends and co-workers. We are also encouraged by the fact that the grade school age children in Sunday School are showing greater interest in spiritual matters.

Please continue to pray for us. We continue to sow the good seed with the expectation that the Holy Spirit will use it to bring to life those who need Christ.

Dear Friends, September 30, 2006  
September has been a peaceful month for Anita and me. I did not have to travel out of the region the entire month. I used my 'extra' time to get material ready for my Monday night Bible class which I started again for the saints of our Huanuco churches. This time we are teaching an introduction to the New Testament. I also started a special weekly class for our pastors and preachers in the Huanuco region to help some of them prepare for their ordination. There are seven to eight that come each week and we have prayer, a time of fellowship, and then some doctrinal teaching using the churches' statement of faith. So far, it has proved to be a real blessing and we'll see if it will turn out to be something permanent in our agenda.

Speaking of teaching and classes; the next Bible Institute class for all of our Peruvian pastors will be the 24-27 of October. I will be teaching the first two days and then I have invited missionary Rodney Spears to teach the last two days. Rodney is a good friend and Baptist Missionary in the capital city of Lima, Peru. My wife, Anita, and I are looking forward to having him with us. Please be in prayer for this class. These Bible Institute classes are always a blessing to us and to the pastors that attend, but they are expensive also. We don't charge anything and we provide meals, beds and all the books and study materials. We do this to keep the cost down for the pastors as they have to pay for their own traveling expenses.

Family News: Several have written and asked about my wife's hands. Anita's hands are much better. She seldom has trouble with them. We thank you for your prayers. Our daughter, Leah, married two years ago and now lives in Columbus, Ohio. She is expecting their first child at the end of January. Anita and I will be grandparents for the second time! We are planning on Anita being with her for about a month and maybe I will go if the Lord provides the funds. Our son, Joshua, married three years ago and is now a captain in the United States Air Force and stationed in New Mexico. He is married and they have a beautiful baby girl, Caroline, fifteen months old. And me; I'm just getting older and uglier every day, but hopefully wiser! God is so good to us! We praise His name!

Some of you may remember a few years ago, Anita telling about a young girl and her mother we met on a plane while flying into Lima. ## Bible Clubs A Blessing ... Put New Floor In Church ... Problems Caused By Former Member ...

Dear Praying Friends, October 2, 2006  
Greetings from Kenya where the weather is getting warmer. The rains are continuing, but getting less frequent. Most of you are heading into winter as we are approaching summer. The Lord has been good to us this past month, but we have also had our share of trials. Trials come because we are at war with Satan and we expect to be assaulted. God has promised grace and victory, so we press on. (1 Peter 4:12-13).

We have been able to reach many with the Word of God when we are doing the de-worming clinics in the rural communities and in schools.

We do the teaching about prevention of these parasites that rob people of their health first, and afterwards, we present the Gospel. Then, when they come to the clinics, we give them booklets of the Gospel of John and Romans in Swahili. In the schools we have been able to get these booklets into the hands of several Muslim children, so we are praying that the parents will read God's Word, turn from their false doctrine, and receive eternal life.

This month we are having our first competition between the Bible clubs that have been started in some communities. The kids have been studying Baptist catechism, so they will be questioned on it and will compete to see which club knows the most. Then, each club will either be presenting a drama based on a Bible story, singing, or reciting a poem. One group wanted to do a song using puppets made from socks, so Pam is working with them to teach them a song about the fruits of the Spirit. They are excited about competing against each other and we will give prizes to each one who comes and participates. Our goal is to get kids excited about learning God's Word and to reach their parents, as the parents come to see what their children are learning. Many of these kids come from very poor families and do not go to church. Also, some of their parents make illicit brew (moonshine in our culture), so we hope to show the love of Christ to them and to visit in their homes afterwards to present the Word of God.

We are finishing the floor in our Imani Baptist Church this week. For those of you who have visited us, you know that we have always had a dirt floor in this church. This is unsanitary and can cause disease. The members contributed some, so Pam and I decided to finish the rest of it. Our pastor and other members also helped. So, Lord willing, we plan to have a dedication of this building on October 8th. On October 15th, we plan to dedicate the Bethel Baptist Church to our Lord and it is our prayer that both buildings will be utilized for God's glory and used more than just on Sunday. We have plans for the buildings to be used for teaching God's Word throughout the week in the future.

Yesterday at our Bethel Church the service was disrupted by a former disgruntled member who incited other former members to cause a major disturbance. This former member does not like the present leadership at the church, so he has gone to other former members and has incited them to join with him to have an election of a new pastor, and new leaders, all from the former Calvary Baptist Church. This man has been causing trouble since we started Bethel Baptist in the new building and has sent repeated e-mails to BFM citing his displeasure with the church and with us. We have never seen a Christ-like spirit in this man and Pam and I are praying for his salvation. He does not like the fact that we have a few prisoners who were under Nathan's ministry in the prison now attending the church. Our leaders have written him a letter that he is being disciplined from the church due to his behavior. We know from the Bible that many saints of God faced this same problem when the Word of God was preached, so we are encouraged that great things are in store for the church as we reach out to the communities with the saving power of the Gospel. Please pray for us that we will have wisdom to handle problems like these and that our Lord will get the glory as we continue on.

It is our privilege to be here representing so many of you in the land that we love. Thanks so much for your encouraging e-mails and prayers for us. May our Lord bless you for your love for missions and for the Lord's people here in Kenya.

Dear praying friends, October 5, 2006  
Another month has come and passed so quickly, and my wife and I thank the Lord for His many blessings to us. Without His help each day, we would be very challenged in the work He has called us to, but we thank Him that He is so faithful to us and assists us in our time of need. This prayer letter will share current progress and development of the ministry, as well as prayer requests for the work here.

My wife and I wanted to write and personally thank both the individuals and churches who have sacrificially given to our building project in the prison. We praise the Lord that we have received what we believe to be adequate funding for this project. Please pray for us, as I will be meeting with the building team at the prison in the very near future to discuss the layout of the building, location, and costs. This is very important as I want the building to be used for the glory of God and for the ministry in the prison. 1 Corinthians 10:31 says "Whether therefore you eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." This certainly also applies to the building project, so please pray that the building would be finished in a reasonable time, within the budget I have set, and would be used for many years to come for the glory of God. Thank you once again to each donor who gave so sacrificially. We hope to send you pictures of the building once it is completed, if allowed by the prison officials.

The new building is definitely needed as there were some problems this past month with the use of the building we are presently meeting in. There was an attempt to turn the present building back into a ward for the prisoners to stay in, but I praise the Lord that this plan has not succeeded to this time. It is expected to receive opposition in the Lord's work and I have continued to pray about these problems. The Lord has taken care of it and I believe will continue to do so as I trust Him. Once the new building is completed, it will be both a necessary transition and needed transition. Please pray for the remaining time I have in the present building we meet in that there would be no further interference and the work of God would continue to go on.

This month is special to my wife and I, as it is both our second wedding anniversary and our one year anniversary together here in Kenya. Also, later this month, my wife plans to begin her ministry to the women prisoners. She will be having a women's Bible study and this is a much needed ministry as there is presently no ministry to the women that I am aware of. We will be sure to keep you updated on her progress and also future projects that we may have, even around Christmas time. What a (Please See Radford Page Three)

The Lord blessed him and the Tabernacle Church. Please pray for my beloved wife, Hattie Marie Moore Bratcher, who is still coughing after three weeks. She is still taking several medications. Charles, my living brother and his wife, Reva, celebrated their 50th Wedding anniversary last month. "Parabens" and congratulations to Charles and Reva Bratcher of Frankfort, Kentucky.

Continue to pray for us because we need the prayers of those we love. Also, continue to contribute to the Regular Fund and we need the designated offerings (personal and as needed) for us as the dollar rate is so low. Our thanks and appreciation. May the Lord bless each one of you, is our prayer.

The new mission point is now a reality. Two weeks ago we had the inauguration service and it being the first Baptist Church in the area we consider it an AWESOME success. We had an attendance of fifty-one people and God blessed with one soul saved. Her name is Fatima and she is the mother of two. Please remember to pray for her. The preacher and his wife have been working in the town for about a

month prior to the opening of the work. Getting to know the town, the people and the officials there. The mayor has offered his assistance in any way that is needed and this is a grand opportunity to get into the schools and the parks to preach the Gospel. The opening of the work was delayed for the cleaning of the building and the painting. The women of the church with Barbara went and cleaned and with the cleaning we saw that it needed some paint. We had five men from Atlantic Shores Baptist Church in Virginia come down and they helped me paint the church and some of the preacher's residences. But the wait was worth it as God sent us Fatima to hear and receive the Lord as Savior.

If you could gauge the growth of the work on the enthusiasm of the workers you would say that this work would be one of the fastest growing ever, because George and Alda are full of excitement about the work. They were visiting and having services in the homes of believers there. Now that they have the building and the people know that there will be someone to preach regularly, there is no stopping them. Just a little about George: He has been involved in our church here in Caraguatatuba for four years and has attended six semesters of our seminary. He and his wife Alda have three girls, two of which are working and studying in another city and the youngest is attending school in Sao Paulo.

Our visitors from Virginia did not stop with just the painting in Natividade da Serra: they also laid tile and grouted the tile in the church building in Olaria. Also they spent some days in the Second Chance Vocational School making benches and podiums for the new works. They also participated in giving food baskets to many needy families in our church.

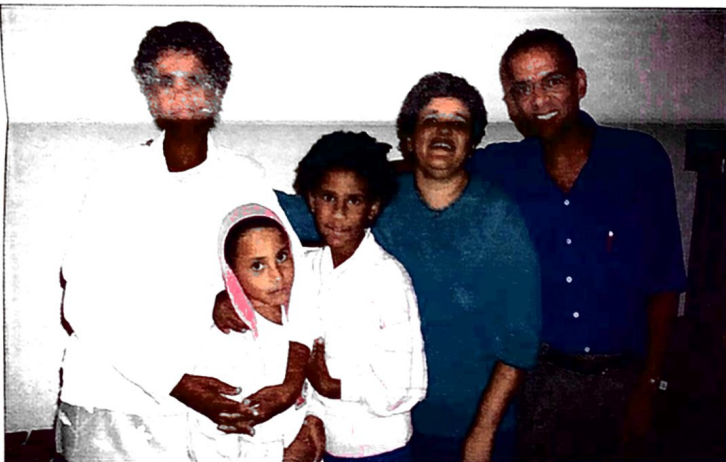
In the neighborhood of Olaria we have five young people working with the children there. The first week they had seventeen children attend their Bible school. The next week there was twenty three; the third, thirty-one; the fourth, forty-seven and the fifth week they had forty-three kids. This work they are doing is showing results even in the main church as the children are coming on Sunday.

## Three Professions Of Faith At Youth Camp ... Project Life In Three Brazilian States ... Need Funds For Motorhome ...

Dear Friends,

October 3, 2006

I'm glad that they didn't have any video games at our recent youth camp. Instead there was a foosball table and ping-pong; you know, "old school" stuff, since I'm pretty old school. I was able to hold my own among the youth. I mentioned in my letter last month that our co-pastor and youth leader were called to a new ministry and that left me taking up the slack. So, youth camp last month was a part of that. It went great with God's blessings. There were three professions of faith and subsequent baptisms. Charlene and I enjoy the time we get to spend with the youth. Their energy is contagious and we are looking forward to seeing them grow spiritually as the group grows numerically.

Our evangelistic outreach team, Project Life, had the privilege of being in three Brazilian states in one month. We began in the southernmost state of Brazil, Rio Grande do Sul. God blessed the outreach there, though we did not get the opportunity to be in the public schools due to a holiday recess. The team presented the gospel in public parks by offering the community services of free haircuts, health checks, family counseling, along with dramatic gospel skits and sharing testimonies. There were well over fifty public professions of faith in Jesus. The city that we were witnessing to hosts the largest Buddhist temple in South America. The Dalai Lama was recently there and the city's mayor gave him the symbolic key to the city. It was our aim to offer those folks the true key to life: God's Son, Jesus Christ. We are assisting a Baptist church recently planted there to continue to reach these needy people.

After leaving the state of Rio Grande do Sul, Project Life traveled on to an interior town of the state of Sao Paulo. In that town the team was able to present the gospel in three public schools to over 1,000 students. In Brazil there is a relatively large number of adults who study at night classes and it was to these classes that our team had the most opportunities to share Christ. While still in this town, but on the weekend, the team gave a public presentation in a city park. It began to rain quite hard during the presentation, but the residents of the town opened their umbrellas and remained standing in the rain until the end while the group did gospel skits and shared testimonies. When an invitation to accept Christ as Lord and Savior was given, eighty-five persons responded publicly. What a mighty God we serve! The team got soaked to the skin, but they were happy that God saw fit to use them to bring so many to salvation.

We would like to share with you the blessings of this past month. Time passes fast and it seems impossible that this month we complete fifty-one years as missionaries in Brazil.

Two weeks ago we attended a seminar on the Second Coming of Jesus in Marilia along with the students of our seminaries. Brother Mike Creiglow from Cruzeiro do Sul taught the book of the Revelation. There were many from thirteen other churches of our mission in the State of Sao Paulo. This occasion was the incentive of pastor Gilberto Stefano of the church in Marilia. It was concluded with a special all day meeting with people from all the churches from the States of Parana and Sao Paulo. Needless to say there was good preaching and good food.

The special event on that day was the ordination of Marcio Moraes to the Gospel Ministry. Marcio has been the pastor of the congregation in Urai since July of 2005. Marcio and his wife, Carol, are from the works we started in Duartina and Garca thirty years ago. They are very godly and their first child is eight months old. The ordination was wonderful with 450 persons present.

Helena and her son, Timothy, met us at the airport in Sao Paulo and took us to their home in Sao Jose dos Campos. That evening she had a surprise party for Alta and invited Tom and Dianna Turley and daughter, Charity, and our grandson Zinho and Carrie, his wife. With them were their two children, Jady and Mordecai, our great grandson. It was our first time to see him. Zinho preaches on Sunday mornings to an English speaking group of their church. During the week he teaches English in a language school and also works as translator in preparing materials for "Walk Through the Bibles Ministries." It was a Happy Birthday Surprise.

On September 15, we arrived at missionaries's A. J. and Barbara Hensley's home. Alta went to the Ladies Retreat with Barbara and spoke during the three days. On Sunday I spoke at both morning and evening services at New Life Baptist Church where A. J. and Barbara are doing a great work. Epitacio Barros is the pastor. We hope everyone enjoyed our visit; we sure enjoyed being there.

NEW MISSION IN ASSAI: Sunday, October 1, 2006, will complete two months since our opening service in the city of Assai. The name Assai means "rising sun" in Japanese; Urai, where we live, signifies "setting sun." Both cities have a large Japanese population. We have rented a large building on the main street. It will seat about 200 people.

New works are difficult with much opposition from existing religions. In Duartina the story was that we were going to hang a man from the rafters on the day we dedicated the new building. In Galia they told the children that we were taking blood from everyone that went in. In Garca the priest told mothers we were kidnappers of children. The enemy has not changed.

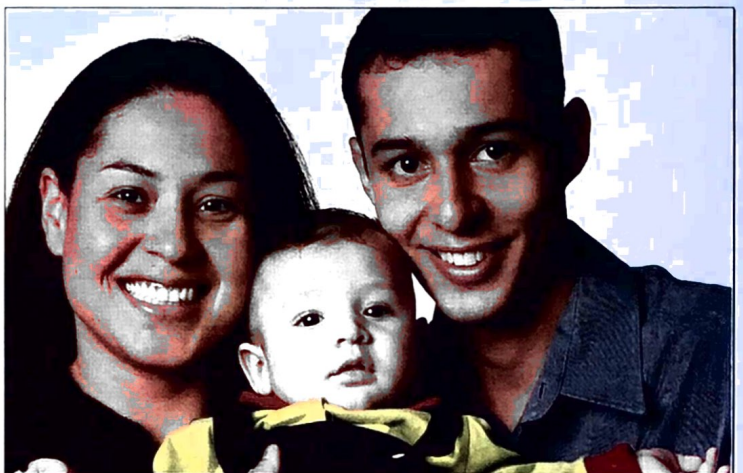
The second week of services in Assai, two ten year old boys, David and Leandro, came in and listened as I told them about Jesus. David trusted the Lord and manifested his joy. The next week they ran from us as if we were wild beasts. Their parents had forbid them to come.

There were forty-two present at the initial service, twenty-two from Urai. The twenty from Assai were all Pentecostal or Methodists. Since that first service we have had from zero to seven present. When Jesus said the "gates of Hell shall not prevail against His church," the enemy opened those gates and sent the demons to fill the mouths of false teachers and preachers: "For such are false apostles, deceitful workers transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works" (2 Corinthians 11: 13-15). "Ye also helping together by prayer for us, that for the gift bestowed upon us by the means of many persons thanks may be given by many on our behalf" (2 Corinthians 1:11).

Idolatry and Pentecostal teachers dominate the scene. The battle promises to be hard and long; but, the battle is the Lord's and victory will come; praise His Holy Name.
