

accept our thanks. In October we had two dedications. On October 8th, we dedicated the floor and the ministry of Imani Baptist Church to our Lord. If



Some of the members had given toward these projects, so Pam and I decided to finish the floor and add the gutters. Then we had a celebration and invited members from Bethel Baptist to join us. There was a good spirit between the two churches and it was a great day.

On October 15th, we invited members from Imani Baptist to Bethel to help us to celebrate the building that the Lord provided for us. Thanks to so many of you who helped to give so that we have a building to meet in and are not meeting in the pastor's living room anymore, or outside for services. There were about 200 people present that day and we had dinner on the grounds. The women prepared beans and rice and it was a good day. We want to use this building for the Lord as much as possible, especially in reaching the community. One of the ex-prisoners that Nathan had worked with in the prison and his family sang for this special occasion, as well as others.

The day before we had our first competition for our Bible clubs and many, many youth came The kids were quizzed on the catechism that they have been learning, as well as memory verses that they had learned. Some groups sang, others did dramas, some did poems, and all had a good time. We want to encourage as many as we can to be involved in these neighborhood Bible clubs as we want to use these youth in our churches and communities to reach others for our Lord. It is great to see leadership developing among some who attend our Bible clubs and we want to continue to develop this so that we can have young leaders in the future.



BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS THANKSGIVING OFFERING FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions)

1. "WHY DO WE HAVE A THANKSGIVING OFFERING?" We have a Thanksgiving Offering because WE NEED IT to "make our ends meet" for the coming year to meet the financial committ have made to our missionaries for the services and benefits we provide from the General Fund.

2. "WHY IS THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING SO IMPORTANT?" The Thanksgiving Offering is ESSENTIAL to make up for the monthly deficits we incur month by month in the General Fund. This deficit is the difference between the monthly income offerings for the General Fund and the outgoing disbu

3. "WHAT DO YOU DO WITH THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING?" When we receive the Thanksgiving Offering beginning in November of the current year, we put it in escrow in an interestbearing account. Then we draft from it month by month over the coming year to make up for the monthly deficits we incur in our General Fund.

4. "WHAT SERVICES AND BENEFITS DOES THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING PROVIDE?" The Thanksgiving Offering enables us to meet the policy commitments we have made to our missionaries. Those standard commitments include: monthly salaries, monthly standard housing allowances, monthly standard ministry expenses allowances, missionaries' hospitalization premium hospitalization personal deductible reimbursements to the missionaries, reimbursements for missionaries furlough plane tickets, printing and mailing the Mission Sheets (missionaries' monthly letters, reports, updates - and detailed report of all offerings given through BFM that month), expenses for maintaining Stateside office for communication and daily services, providing and maintaining a Furlough Home in Lexington for those missionaries who choose to use it, and an \$8000.00 Auto Allowance provided for each nary every four years

5. "HOW ELSE IS THE GENERAL FUND SUPPLIED?" The standard supply for the General Fund is from monthly offerings which are given to the General Fund. These offerings are listed monthly in the Mission Sheets under "General Fund." These offerings are never sufficient to cover the commitments which are provided from the General fund.

6. "ARE "DESIGNATED OFFERINGS" EVER USED FOR GENERAL FUND PURPOSES?" No. Designated Offerings are designated by the contributor for specific projects and ministry needs the missionaries have. All Designated Offerings are given in total to the designated purposes.

"WHAT HAPPENS IF THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING IS NOT SUFFICIENT TO COVER THE MONTHLY DEFICITS FOR THE COMING YEAR?" In this event, certain monthly commitments which are supplied from the General Fund are reduced proportionately among the missionaries from the General Fund resources which are available that month. WE PRAISE GOD AND BLESS HIM FOR YOUR GENEROSITY, THAT IN THE YEARS SINCE BFM'S INCEPTION IN 1942, WE HAVE NEVER FAILED TO SEND OUR MISSIONARIES THEIR SALARIES. THERE HAVE BEEN VERY RARE INSTANCES IN WHICH THEIR MONTHLY HOUSING OR MINISTRY EXPENSE ALLOWANCES HAVE BEEN REDUCED OR ELIMINATED FOR THAT MONTH.

& "DO YOU EVER USE THE THANKSGIVING OFFERINGS FOR PROJECTS THAT ARE NOT ALREADY PRESCRIBED AND COMMITTED TO OUR MISSIONARIES FROM GENERAL FUND OFFERINGS?" No. We have never had leftover Thanksgiving Offering funds or balances in the General Fund at the end of the current fiscal year after exhausting last year's Thanksgiving Offering. That means we have no funds committed for General Fund services which can be applied ward other discretionary (non-policy/prescribed) uses.
 9. "WHAT WOULD HAVE TO HAPPEN IN THE MONTHLY GENERAL FUND OFFERINGS

FOR YOU TO USE THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING FOR OTHER THAN CURRENTLY PRESCRIBED / POLICY COMMITMENTS, SERVICES, AND BENEFITS?" For that to happen, we would need to increase our monthly offerings to the General Fund sufficiently to "break even" each month between the offerings to the General Fund and disbursements from the General Fund. THAT IS OUR LONG-TERM GOAL. In that event, we could then use our Thanksgiving Offering for "growth initiatives:" that is, either increasing our current missionaries' services and benefits or assuming full-time support for additional missionaries and expanding BFM's outreach to other fields of service.

10. "WHY IS THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING GIVEN AT THE THANKSGIVING SEASON?" The BFM Thanksgiving Offering began many years ago in conjunction with the annual Thanksgiving Missionary Conference in the Detroit-area and has continued that way to this day. Also, the Thanksgiving season is a good reminder of the thanks we owe God for His Indescribable Gift in Jesus Christ, and, the Thanksgiving season and Offering is a good occasion for us to give missionary offerin others, also, may hear the blessed Good News of salvation through Christ ... And, in this way, MULTIPLY STILL MORE THANKSGIVINGS TO GOD.

11. "HOW CAN I GIVE MY THANKSGIVING OFFERING?" If your church receives a Thanksgiving Offering for the missionaries supported through BFM, then we encourage you to give your offering through your church. Most of the Thanksgiving Offerings which are given by churches are made up by the voluntary offerings of individual members who give to the Offering

12. "WHAT IF MY CHURCH DOES NOT RECEIVE A BFM THANKSGIVING OFFERING?" If your church does not participate in the Thanksgiving Offering, you may send your personal gift to the Treasurer of BFM and be sure to designate it "Thanksgiving Offering."

"CAN I GIVE MY THANKSGIVING OFFERING ONLY AT THANKSGIVING... OR DURING NOVEMBER?" No. Most churches and individual Friends of BFM give on or around Thanksgiving Sunday (either the Sunday before or after Thanksgiving Day). However, offerings continue to come in to the Treasurer during the month of December, and sometimes on into January of the next year.

But, all offerings designated "Thanksgiving Offering "go toward the same collective Offering for that year. 14. "HOW IS THE "EVERY FRIEND A GIVING FRIEND" PERSONAL GIVING MINISTRY PERTINENT TO THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING?" We introduced the "EVERY FRIEND A GIVING FRIEND" ministry and plan during the 2003 Thanksgiving Conference. This plan is nothing new or unique; it is just another way to express and articulate what the Friends of BFM have been doing since the inception of the Mission. It is also patterned after the instructions Paul gives us in 2 Corinthians 8 and 9: that is, 1. to purpose in your heart to give an offering; 2. to ask God to supply you with the funds you will need to give the offering; 3. to plan and begin preparing even a year ahead of time (as Paul instructed the Corinthians and the other churches to do); and 4. to give your offerings to the Lord and to the Lord's missionaries willingly and cheerfully and to express your love and obedience to the Lord. We encourage each Friend of BFM to be a Giving Friend and give personal offerings to help supply our missionaries' needs which are met through the General Fund.

"EVERY FRIEND A GIVING FRIEND" challenges each Friend of BFM to personally participate in missions giving over and above the regular tithes and offerings you give to your church to meet the needs of your local church's ministries.

In the "Every Friend a Giving Friend" plan, we also encourage each Giving Friend to make a onal commitment to either begin giving or increase your giving each month to the General Fund. Another month has come and gone so quickly, and there are many important items to update each or you about. My wife and I praise the Lord for good health, ministry opportunities, and the ability to serve Him here in Kenya. This update will tell of new ministry opportunities as well as prayer requests for the future. Last month I announced that my wife would be starting her

ministry to the women's prison. Two weeks ago, she was able to go mail: naterad@yah and announce to the women her plans for ministry as well as share her heart to reach them with Biblical teaching. We praise the Lord that many women were interested ouncement and this past week she officially began her ministry. I was able to accompany in her ann her on her first day to assist her and I was very pleased with the spirit that I saw in the women and the officers that were there. We are excited for her as this new opportunity has become available and she is using it for the glory of God. She is seeking first God's kingdom and the Lord is rewarding her greatly. (Matthew 6:33)

Please pray for us, and the upcoming weeks, that even more women will be able to attend and grow spiritually. Our goal is to see these women grow and desire the Word of God and that it truly would become a lamp unto their feet and a light unto their path. (Psalm 119:105). This Christmas, we are praying about a project that would minister to the women both physically and spiritually. They are given very little in the environment that they reside in and we desire to show them the true meaning of Christmas. We praise the Lord that the money has already been provided for this project and that we already have most of the materials that will be needed. We wish to provide hygiene supplies, as well as gospel tracts in Swahili, which tell them how to be sure they are going to heaven. Please pray for this time, that many women will be saved through this outreach and that we would see much fruit as a result of it. We will be sure to keep you updated after the project is concluded.

The building project has experienced many delays and I am still in the process of buying the materials that are needed. The foundation has been dug and the bricks and sand have been purchased to lay the foundation. My desire is that the building would be completely finished by the end of this month or early December, so please pray that the progress would continue without any further delays. I continue to trust the Lord in this time and know that He will lead and guide me even though delays have taken place. Please also pray that the officers concerned would stay within the budget that has been drafted and that there would be no further expenses. I will do my best to take a picture, if permitted, to show the building after completion. The building will be used for many purposes, such as a meeting place for our Bible school, a Christian library to keep materials that are brought, and perhaps a church in the future, if granted by the prison, so please pray about this as well.

Also this past month through an evangelistic effort of a new class that was formed recently, I praise the Lord that around six prisoners prayed to receive Christ. These new believers must now be equipped in the foundations of the faith and rooted in the Word of God as Satan would love to discourage them. Please pray for this discipleship program to go well with them and that they would desire the milk of the Word of God. I Peter 2:2 states "As newborn babes, desire the milk of the Word, that ye may grow thereby."

Traveling And Building ... Faithful National Couple ... Terrible Conditions At Indian Village ... Dear Brethren November 2, 2006

Over half of this month was spent on the rivers and the other half working on three building projects. Of course all the other work had to be taken careof: business as usual.

My first trip was to Porto Walter. I have been there three times Cruzeiro do Sal, Acre Brazil this year besides a number of other meetings with missionary Mario, to help them get back on track and resume a normal growth pattern. Things are well again. Attendance has more than doubled and quite a few people have been saved. We had four services during this last visit. On Sunday morning I baptized four more.

The next week I was with the congregation at Valquirie. Both of these towns are up the Jurua River. The river has been very low, but God sent just enough rain to bring the river up a little for each trip. We dedicated the brand new brick building on Saturday night. They did most of the building with just a little help from the mother church, First Baptist. There were well over 200 present. Our missionary there is Brother Marinho. He is crippled. He goes there every weekend and holds services in three villages. During the week he also takes care of one of the chapels in Cruzeiro do Sul. Even though he cannot swim he gets in his canoe, travels several hours, then once at Valquirie has to crawl or be carried up a steep bank that is over 100 feet. Besides all these hardships his wife is a leper. She has already lost one leg and has no fingers or toes. Yet they have several children that serve Christ with them. The kids are all healthy and have a great spirit about them. A family like theirs is a joy to serve with. On Sunday morning after the regular service we all went down to the river where I baptized four more.

By Sunday night I was back in the pulpit of my home church, First Baptist. Fortunately I can be

away often because I have three faithful Brazilian pastors who I have trained and do most of the pastoring. Last week I went to visit the works on the Moa River. This time the river was about as low as it can get. By the time I got to Republica the river was so shallow that you could wade across with water just barely ankle deep. This kind of trip is tough not only because of the shallows, but mostly because of the stumps. Some places you wonder whether you can get through at all. I still make most of these trips all by my lonesome. I realize that some of you don't like that, but I am quite comfortable traveling by myself and the Lord is with me always. My visits were to Sao Salvador, Republica and Serra do Moa. We had good crowds at all three

villages and all of them are working hard on this year's general mission project. All of our churches, congregations and missionaries have mapped out the whole upper Jurua River and tributaries (over 20 rivers and streams) to take the gospel to every house on every river. We should be able to reach that goal before the year ends.

The work at the Nukini Indian reservation (Republica) needs your prayers. Our missionary there is brother Rivaldo. He is under great pressure to leave the village. Outsiders, (government, anthropologists, etc.), have been there regularly and are telling the Indians that they don't need a church. Church, according to them, disrupts Indian culture, and they are right! These agitators pushing the Indians to resume using three kinds of drugs, reject monogamy, encourage rape of 12year-old girls and reject Brazilian national laws. The week before I was there the school teacher seduced the chief's 13-year-old daughter. He had already done this at least twice before. The tribal leaders have gone to Rivaldo to tell him that he can stay as long as he allows the Indians to live their way and not teach on sin. Sin is not an Indian concept and thus should not even be mentioned. Where have we heard that kind of talk before? Please pray for Rivaldo and family.

Well time to stop and get ready for my next trip. Before I do though, I need to let you know that Bev and I are finally going to try to fit in a short furlough. We have been on the field for over five years this tour. We plan to leave Cruzeiro do Sul on November 18th and arrive in Detroit in time for the Thanksgiving Conference. We are planning on staying through March 31st. After that we would really like to visit your church and present the work to you. Hope to see you soon.

As I begin writing, Judy is giving French lessons to Rosana, our Brazilian neighbor. This is a double blessing. First, that Judy knows French sufficiently well to give lessons. Secondly, because about half of their lesson consists of reading from the Gospels in French, and discussing what they have read. Rosana studies the Bible in French with Judy twice a week and her whole family comes to a weekly Bible study which we have in Portuguese. She also mentioned this week that Cristina, a friend of hers who teaches literature at the University, is going to return to Bible study. Cristina is a lady about our age that has shown quite an interest in spiritual matters.

We hope that this finds you well and giving thanks to the Lord during this Thanksgiving season We pray that the Lord will bless the Thanksgiving Conference hosted by the fine folks of New Hope Baptist Church in Dearborn Heights. Last year we were able to be at this conference for the first time in many years. It was a real blessing to us. Our health is good and we thank God for the blessings and opportunities that He gives us to serve Him each day.

Three weeks ago I preached a funeral in a Catholic Cathedral. That was a first for me. The priest introduced me at the beginning by saying that the man who had died became a Christian in his forties and was baptized in the Baptist church and therefore the service would be a Baptist service led by a Baptist pastor. He had suggested to me that he make such an introduction at the beginning to explain to his parishioners why it would be a Baptist service and not a mass. I suspect that he wanted to prepare the people for the shock.

The man who had died was ninety and had been in a nursing home for some time. When he died, his stepdaughter, who comes to our Bible study in the city of Mazere, called to ask if I would be

We had the tremendous pleasure of baptizing four new converts while there. One man had been attending our church for nearly a year before accepting Christ as his Lord and Savior. He came from a very

It is so evident that his life has been transformed by the presence of Christ. Valter, who is one of our leadership trainees, had his faith and dedication to God put to the test

last week. He had been working the early shift on his job for a long time and this worked out well for him to be in the Training Center classes and to help lead the youth ministry. The day before the holiday his foreman came to him and told him that he would be moved to the second shift, which would take him away from most of his ministerial training and activities. He went to work on Friday and told his higher up boss that he couldn't work the second shift in good conscience and that if required to do so, he preferred to lose his job. After sharing with his boss his decision he went back to his job assignment. Not long afterward, the foreman who threatened to fire came up to him, shook his hand saying that it had been an honor knowing him and that he himself had been fired. Valter just stood there speechless. He had not intended any ill toward his foreman, but he was amazed at how God resolved his situation. The way that God blessed Valter helped him to see just how real and present God is to bless those who will fully trust in Him. I'm sure that this experience will help Valter remember God's power and grace throughout his life as he seeks to serve Him.

We continue to invest the special offerings that we have received in the continued project of transforming the bus Logos into a fully operational motorhome. This month we got three more rooms closer to completion. The bathroom only lacks the shower stall and the sink top.
