Home For Short Furlough . . . Report On Exciting Mission Trip . . . Special Need . . .

Dear Brethren:

December 5, 2006

Greetings from a way below freezing place called Lexington,
Kentucky. Yes, Beverly and I are now in the States. After five and a
half years on the field we finally got away for a short furlough.
A couple of weeks before leaving Brazil I was back up river on

A couple of weeks before leaving Brazil I was back up river on one of my mission adventures. This trip was to beyond the border hissionaries, Brother Hudson, went with me. The first leg of the trip is a releaven hour. It get dark just as we arrived at the regide and the legt.

into Peru. One of our native missionaries, Brother Hudson, went with me. The first leg of the trip is over 200 miles and took us over eleven hours. It got dark just as we arrived at the rapids and the last ten miles is all shallows and rapids. That one section took us about three hours. God was with us and we made it without breaking anything.

The next day Hudson took one of our aluminum canoes and headed for two small tributaries further up river. I stayed and visited with our congregation at Thaumaturgo. We started the foundations for the new brick building there. A church in Louisiana bought the materials for the first wooden building when we started the mission there. Now the congregation has grown and they have purchased all the materials for the big building we just started. The new building will seat over 400. Back in 1992, Horn Lake Baptist Church provided the funds to jump start the work in Thaumaturgo. Now the work there is self sufficient. Even though Horn Lake no longer supports us, we are grateful for how they helped get this work going. This is a good example of how the work should be conducted. A church in the States provides funds to get started, then we teach the Brazilians to carry on. The congregation at Thaumaturgo has already started two new mission points.

Two days later I went on upstream to visit our work at Foz do Breu. Brother Jose Maia is filling in there until we can find a replacement for our former missionary to that location, Aesio, who did a great job there for six years. When I arrived Jose was smoking a goat. We had smoked goat, boiled goat and boiled goat tripe for the next three days. Thank the Lord for goat. The mission there is doing fine and growing a little. The village is small, but we are winning them over a few at a time.

During the week I took out a day to go visit our work at Tipisca, Peru. Our worker there is Brother Tito. He was saved at Contamana, baptized by a Baptist missionary, trained for a while in our Bible institute in Iquitos, when the Lord called him to go as a missionary to Tipisca. Our church has just decided to take him on as another of our full-time missionaries. He is our ninth. We already have all the lumber and roofing ready to put up our first building there. That will have to wait until I get back down home after our furlough.

The river was very low when I went up stream. Then the rains came. It rained fourteen hours one day and twelve hours the next. The river came up over thirty feet. The logs started floating down and made navigation a little difficult. It is still better to have lots of water. The trip back downstream was, pretty fast.

Hudson and I met up again at Thaumaturgo. He went to the last house on the Caipora River preaching from house to house (eleven in all). There were four people saved. He also visited forty-six homes on the Sao Joao River and fourteen more were saved. We now have only four more rivers to cover to complete our goal of taking the Gospel to every home on over twenty rivers of the upper Jurua River in 2006.

This letter is already longer than it should be, but let me give you one more challenge before I close. Baptist Faith Missions provides me with \$500.00 every month for my expenses. In November I made two trips. Those two trips cost me over \$800.00. Gasoline is costing from \$5.80 to \$6.00 a gallon in Cruzeiro do Sul. These trips are absolutely necessary. Some months I have to decide which trip will be made and which trip doesn't get made for lack of funds. You need to know that the motors I use are more fuel efficient than the ones the natives use, but mine still have to have gas to go. The distances I cover are huge, too. My only source of funds for these trips is the offerings you send. When I go over budget, like in November, the extra has to come out of my pocket. That is fine, but sometimes that is not possible. Most of you already give sacrificially to hold up the General Fund: Thanks. Maybe, just maybe, a few could find a way to help out more each month to help us get the Word out there. Please pray with us about this.

Thanks so much for all your prayers and financial support. We still have a few dates open if you would like for us to present our work to your church. We will be in the States until March 2007. The phone here at the mission house is: 859-277-3716. My email is mdcrieg@aol.com

Daughter Marries ... Very Rainy Here ... Missions Doing Well ...

Dear Friends:

December 2, 2006

November has been an extremely busy month here in Caraguatatuba. Mary, our daughter, got married and we were blessed with twenty-two friends from Gardenside Baptist Church coming for the wedding and to do some mission work. Our Brazilian daughter, Silvia, and her husband, Terry, also came from the States for the wedding. We were sorry that we had a limited time to visit with this group, but they were able to see lots of the work here.

The wedding went wonderful and the new couple are settling into their first home. They will be living on the property of the Second Chance Vocational School. They will be working with us there in the school and in the ministry. We are planning Walmir's ordination on the 17th of February. He has completed a four-year seminary degree in Sao Paulo and expresses his call to be a full-time pastor. Pray for their new life together and their ministry for the Lord.

We didn't write last month so I will try to get you caught up. It has rained a lot for the past few months. This has caused construction to come to a halt except for the things that you can do inside. We are praising the Lord because the electric post has been set on the property in Olaria. So now we will be able to get the wiring done inside the building and get the building finished and ready for use. Everything in God's timing. The lack of a place to have meetings has not stopped the five young people that started a children's program on Saturdays there in Olaria. They are having up to about fifty-four in attendance. This is reflecting in our growth on Sunday mornings as the children are also coming to the main church on Sundays. We have had some problems with getting these children to church on Sundays because of the needed repairs on the buses. We had to buy tires as we had a blow

out and this blow out tore out the battery box. So when we went to put the spare tire on the bus we found that it was not usable. So we had to buy not one but two tires and the cost was \$1800. We also had to work on the transmission to the tune of \$5000 and the battery support is still in progress So

you can see that we have had a hard two months with our buses, but they are both back in working order and are on the road Sundays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays. They are essential for our Sunday School program so we gladly continue to do the repair work. We have to baby them a little as they are in their senior years (1975 and 1978), but we are looking for many more good years out of them.

Our mission points and home churches are going very well. Salisopolis is doing well. We have been in this town for slightly more than one year. Our regular attendance there is 30+. Remember that this is a very tough Catholic town, but there is no other Baptist church in town. But we have been told that the S.B.C. is getting ready to build here. We need desperately to find a building to buy or land to buy so we can build. Our missionaries tell us that the hold back in their work is that it is in their house and the people of this town are country people and do not like to go through a home to get to the church. So pray that we can find something and can get the help needed to buy or build. Luis and Danni are trying to adopt a little boy and they covet your prayers in this matter. They are able to have him in their home for the past two months and are working on the paperwork. So pray that God moves in this matter.

Natividade de Serra is going and growing wonderfully. George, the pastor there, came and gave a report to the church and in the past two months they have averaged between fifteen and twenty-five in regular attendance. Also, this is what is really exciting, seven people have accepted Christ as their personal Savior. AWE-SOME! This is a rural town with approximately 10,000 people and has thus far been very open to the gospel.

The lady we are renting from there is very excited about George and Alda being there. She says that she loves the God we are preaching and is afraid of us not staying there to preach. So she says she is looking for some property to donate to the church for

Time Passes Quickly ... Missions Need Pastors . . . Quick Trip To The States . . .

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ. December 1, 2006

It is hard to believe that this is the last mission letter we will write in 2006. The year has passed so fast. We have been blessed so much this year in so many ways. I'm sure you feel the same way. Our work here in Brazil for the most part has grown both in number and spiritually. As is always the case we have a couple of trouble spots. We are looking forward to see how the LORD WILL WORK THEM OUT.

One is our work in a city of sixty-five thousand people called Primavera do Leste. We have been without a preacher there for over a

year. One of the men of the mission there, Dr. Pedro Silva da Costa and wife, have been taking care of the services and Sunday School and doing a great job. He is a lawyer there and one of the founders of the city which is only about twenty-five years old. In January, Brother Osmar and wife and two sons will go there by faith to take over the work. This mission is under the authority of the Good Hope Baptist Church here in Cuiaba. Your "As Needed Offerings" are helping to make possible this family to go and work in this so needy of a place. Also, your help is needed as we are by faith starting to build two Sunday School rooms there.

Another needy place is the Altos do Coxipo Baptist Church here in town. We are without a pastor again. Brother Marcelo and family have moved over to the Chacara dos Pinheiros Baptist Church to help out. The pastor there has had open heart surgery and is not able to do a lot yet. This church has never been able to find a Brazilian pastor who really had his heart in the work. Both of the pastors they have had so far were more interested in material things than the work of the LORD. Consequently, the church has suffered. Presently we are having a young preacher who was saved many years ago in the work here and has surrendered to preach this past year. His name is Elisel. He is a bricklayer and carpenter. He has built several church buildings for our works here the past eighteen years. He does not feel his calling is pastoring but wants to help out while the ch for a pastor. I do a lot of the preaching here but have to be involved in the new works as well. We also want to finish up the church auditorium here by the end of 2007 if possible.

In our January report we will give a quick rundown on all of the work that is going on here. This th we are having to make a quick trip back to the States for Ursula to see her heart doctor. She has a bad heart valve which causes shortness of breath at times and she feels faint at times. I am not letting her drive in this crazy traffic here in Brazil. The extreme heat is also hard on her. She has an appointment on December 19th. We will try to be back here by the third Sunday in January. Brother Elisel and Pastor Paulo Ricardo of the Good Hope Baptist Church will be taking care of our work while we are gone for this short time. Pray for Ursula's health. Her arthritis really makes it difficult for her to live a normal life. We have a physical therapist come here to the house three times a week and her doctor has suggested that she start exercise therapy in a heated pool.

We thank the Lord for all of you who make possible our work here in Brazil. We are now in our thirtieth year and our Lord has been and continues to be faithful. God bless you all.

Anita and I hope all of you are enjoying the blessings of the Lord

in your lives. November was a month of blessing for the ministry here in Peru. I helped with the organization of the mission work in Chilian (about two hours from Huanuco). This work had been a mission for twenty-three years! It is in a very small community supported mainly by growing coffee. The Lord has blessed this small work with

a fine young man as pastor, Jose Berrocal. He has shown a genuine calling to the ministry and will probably be ordained sometime next year. We appreciate your prayers for him, his wife and two babies.

As many of you know I do a lot of one-on-one counseling here in Huanuco. I firmly believe in the power of God the Holy Spirit to heal broken lives and hearts, oppressed spirits, and wounded souls. However, in some cases people suffer from organic problems or medical maladies, and sometimes these are triggered by traumatic emotional experiences. Such is the case of a fifteenyear-old young man here in Huanuco. He has been diagnosed with passive schizophrenia. He dialogues with imaginary voices and goes in and out of deep depression. There is a history of this with male members of his family tree. He has started taking medication for his symptoms and they are helping, but his main problem is still spiritual due to a traumatic experience in his life a few years ago. He trusted Christ as his Savior at the age of nine but was traumatized three years later. Please pray with me for Deivis, that God will restore this young man to a victorious life in Jesus. Anita and I have seen the power of the Lord miraculously change so many lives over the past several years. Thanks for your prayers.

On a personal note, we were able to spend several days in Lima (the Capital of Peru) with Jason and Rebecca Reinhardt and the twins, Kathy and Carol. Anita and I had custody of the twins for seven months in 2005 until the Lord provided Jason and Rebecca (a young couple) to be their parents. We went to the zoo one day and had a great time. They are now two years old and four months, jabbering all the time and very, very, happy. What a blessing it was for us to see how they have grown and matured. What a blessing it is to see how much they are loved by this fine young missionary couple. Anita and I are now the adopted grandparents, (Papaw and Nene). Though seeing the girls was our motive for traveling. Anita wound up in the dentist chair most of the week with some very unexpected (and expensive) dental work! But we praise the Lord that her dental problems were discovered in time and corrected! HE is so good!

We hope all of you have a very blessed and happy holiday season this year! May the Lord continue to bless each and every one of you as you remain faithful to HIM.

nainly because the buildings where we are holding the services are being repaired. We are always wanting to have more and more people hear the gospel so we are constantly concerned about attendance.

With the mission works expanding and our school in its infancy, we are in need of more means of transportation. We have been looking at a minibus. We have a pastor friend in Sao Paulo that has one and would sell it to us on payments. With a down payment of \$10,000 reais he would partial out the remaining \$18,000 reais. I have outgrown my truck for transportation in about all areas of the ministry. Entering into neighborhoods that is some distance from the church to evangelize this mini bus would be a real asset for our ministry. Getting people to church for choir practice, going on visitation, getting the students to school, and Barbara also could use it in her ladies ministry, these are just some of the uses for this bus. Pray with us about this need and if God leads you to help, make your payments to the "bus fund."

Thanks so much for your prayers and encouragement that we have received this year. As this year is coming to a conclusion we wish to thank everyone and wish all a Merry Christmas and an AWESOME New Year.

The thought that comes to my mind as I begin this letter is not comforting to me and I hope God will make it discomforting to you. Where are the men who should be going? Do we imagine that God's work is done? Are there no more to hear? Do we think that God will get the job done just anyway? Is it possible for us to become sound in doctrine and heretics in our works? Does God not still ask, "Whom shall I send, who will go for us?"

Dear brother and sisters, have we forgotten the love of our Master as we desire for our families and our sons and daughters a fine standing in this world that crucified Jesus and continues to bad mouth Him and reject His word? Where its godless schools and universities teach that we are the product of godless evolution and brings our existence to be the product of amoebas and monkeys? Is God not worthy to receive our sons and daughters, not worthy of our wealth? Is His love and death

This past week I received a very pleasant surprise as I was on my way downtown. What surprised me was that God was answering a prayer of mine that I'd been praying for several years. During this time, I imagined ways in which I thought God might answer my prayer. And then, here I was in the middle of what seemed like an ordinary process of work, and I realized that I was staring God's answer in the face without

recognizing it as His response. When I finally saw the answer for what it was, I laughed out loud alone in the car because it should have been obvious to me much earlier as being from the Lord.

The prayer request I'd made for so long was that we might be able to send missionaries from Brazil to other countries around the world. I have been working on strategies that I thought might be used effectively, but most of them involved tremendous costs and time and were outside of our present abilities to perform. The desire to accomplish this had not diminished, so I was certain that the Lord had laid the burden on my heart. I just wasn't sure how to go about it in a really efficient way. We started working on the possibility that came available of Brazilians going to other countries in cultural exchange programs as students and workers. One of our Christian friends, Pricila, became interested in this program and we began to search for an opportunity for her to participate. A door of opportunity opened and she will be going to Denmark next week as a live-in caretaker in the home of a Danish family. We worked on ways for her to be prepared to do personal evangelism in a non-formal setting. She will not be preaching, but can use her "tent making" to find opportunities for sharing the gospel. One very unique aspect of this strategy is that she will be paid for her trip and services rather than our having to finance the costs of sending her. That is why I laughed when I realized what God had done. I had been looking at the financial aspect as a major obstacle for sending missionaries internationally and now we see that God totally eliminated the barrier. What an amazing God we serve!

Our pioneer evangelism team, Project Life, just concluded their last long distance mission trip of the year. The Brazilian school year ends the first week of December and the public schools are our main venue for presenting gospel messages. We will still be working in public parks and street corners during the summer holidays closer to our home base and then we'll return to the interior towns and cities in February. The remodeling job of the two motorhomes is still underway. We are getting more done each veek as funds permit. We thank you who continue to contribute to this effective ministry. As we look back over the year we see that God tremendously blessed during the year of 2006. The team presented the gospel to over 100,000 people and there were nearly 2,000 public professions of faith in Christ. Also,

there were more than 100 laypersons which were trained in evangelism through this ministry.

Charlene continues to do a great job with the ladies and children's ministries. We have seen some marked spiritual growth in the lives of the adult women in our prayer groups. From what they share in their conversations it is evident that they spend time in God's word and that they are putting it into practice in their daily lives. Charlene is a wonderful example to these ladies. God has used her very effectively in the twenty-one years that we have been in Brazil. I pray that she'll continue to be blessed and a blessing to those whose lives she touches. She is a marvelous companion in the work of the Lord and I thank Him for her.
