

We have two young ordained men in mind who might be used here. If it is the Lord's will one of them may work out. Pray with us about this. Our goal is to have by the end of the year Brazilian leadership in all of the churches and missions. Also we are working toward the goal that all will be able by July of next year to financially make it without

As some of our missionaries have mentioned the money exchange is really bad and has been for ome time. This makes it very expensive to try and expand the work here in Brazil. The Lord has blessed and we have been able to do a lot with the offerings that recently came in. We are always amazed at the way He blesses.

Right now we are concerned for our oldest daughter, Karin Weaver. She recently had cancer surgery and has had to have another one in the same area. They believe they got it all. Our granddaughter, Tiffany, is in the hospital also with a serious kidney infection. She is eight month pregnant with her first child and our first great-grandchild. I would say without any hesitation that the only hardship we have ever suffered by being on the mission field these thirty years is not to be able to be with family when there is sickness or death. But the Lord has given us grace during these times.

Last of all I make an appeal for the General Fund. It is vital to the work. We thank you all so much for your faithful support. May God bless you is our prayer.

We also wish each of you a very happy New Year and pray that



Asa Mark Celebrates Fifty-One Years ... Thank You For Praying For Asa . . . Thanks For The Continued Support . . .

Once again by faith we greet you from Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil, SA. We were informed by our dear brother in Christ, Pastor Dave Parks that our latest letters did not arrive in the hands of those responsible for their printing. This Mission Sheets month began January 3rd and finishes today. We are remembering that today is "Groundhog Day" in the USA. This Mission Sheets month I preached nine sermons - six at the 24th of March Baptist Church; two at the

Comunhao Baptist Church: and one at Bairro da Compensa Baptist Church. During the same period I heard five messages delivered by five different pastors. Yesterday four of us from the church visited a family of four who live close to the church and attend regularly. The head of the family is Francisco da Silva Cruz, thirty-one years old. He and his wife, Maria do Socorro Braga de Souza, thirty-two, are not legally married and thus cannot be baptized. Our church does not baptize people who are living together as man and wife, but are not legally married. Thus we share with you one of our more than many problems. Pray that our church will cause joy in heaven. (Luke 15:10).

On the fourth of January our son, Asa Mark celebrated his fifty-first birthday. On the fifth, he had surgery for an esophagus correction and gall bladder removal. What we thought would be a twonight hospital stay turned out to be a nightmare and scare for him, his family, church and for us. To make a long story short, he had to have three surgeries in a twelve-day period, each one several hours long. He had to have blood, was not allowed visitors for several days, and his wife and daughter stayed with him day and night. After eighteen days he came home from the hospital. Harold and I only saw him one time in the hospital. He is very thin and still weak, but seems to be getting a little stronger with each passing day. We thank God for this blessing.

Harold and I wish to thank each one of you readers who prayed for him, especially those who attended the Winter Conference in Gotha, Florida. Brother Dave Parks told us by phone that they received Marcia's e-mail and many prayed for him during the conference. We thank all of you who give to Baptist Faith Missions. We do appreciate your prayers.

Glad To Be Part Of The Team ... Good News About Judy ... **Teaching Over The Internet...**

February 2, 2007

Greetings from the Southern France contingency of your team; our team; God's team. Okay, so I saw some advertisements for the Super Bowl and got a little crazy. We are indeed a team. This is a very important fact we all should remember. You are as valuable as we are. So, if you are feeling a little gray and shut in by the winter weather, remember that in a number of places in the world the gospel is being preached, disciples are being made and churches are being put together because you are faithful.

Before communicating other news, I would like to mention that Judy just recently had her annual check up and it showed no cancer. She has now been cancer free for six years. The life partner that God gave me has been such a blessing. She is a major part of the work that the Lord has given us to do here

God, however, uses our weaknesses and our earthly disappointments to enable us to be better "light bearers" to those around us. Our difficulties enable us to show others that there is still hope even when things in our earthly lives are not "peachy keen". About three weeks ago, Mireille, the lady who lives across the street, was putting things in their car and told me that they were getting ready to go to her husband's home town because his father had died suddenly. Death is a horrible end for those who have no hope. This has opened further the door for us to talk to Jean-Luc and his wife. He is terrified of dying. Their oldest son is a disappointment. Jean-Luc is an undercover agent and sees a lot of the dark side of France. He has no hope. We have the message of hope and pray that God will open their eyes and use us as He sees fit in the process.

Recently, I saw a blurb on a book concerning religion in France that has been recently published by a respected French publisher. According to this study, less than half of French people in France claim to be Catholic and only half of those who claim to be Catholic believe in God! France is filled with people who have no hope. That is why we are here. A year and a half ago a couple with two children moved into our neighborhood. As soon as we met them we began praying for them. This is our custom. A couple of weeks ago as I was getting money out of the ATM to pay bills, this neighbor scared me by pretending to hold me up. He then began venting his anger at the local priest who refused to catechize his son. They wanted their son to be catechized before he had "first communion" and the priest informed him that it was their responsibility. A two hour discussion followed about spiritual things. Every time I thought I was making headway, he took off in some wild direction. Only God can open his eyes, but He has placed us here to bear the light. What a privilege and your faithfulness enables us to keep the light shining here.

God has enabled us to have an influence that is larger than just in our neighborhood. This is a result of Bible studies and activities in other places. We are now on our fourth week of Bible Studies in Portugal; Porto, to be exact. Looking at a map of Europe, you will soon see that it is a long way from Toulouse to Porto. As a matter of fact when all goes well it takes about thirteen hours of driving. So, how can we do it every week? We do it "live" over the Internet. When the girlfriend of our Brazilian neighbors' son was here visiting she became very interested in the Bible studies that we have with this family and asked if we could do one over the Internet. So, we have this Bible Study every Sunday afternoon with computer, headphones and microphone over the Internet. This young lady is very interested but lost. However, the Spirit of God has convinced her that the Truth is ortant and she is really paying attention.

Most of the folks who came to services and Bible studies the first two or three years we were here, no longer come. Most of them have moved to other countries. Some have just dropped out. However, some have continued, new ones have started and God has now given us a core of folks who are committed for the long term. They are growing in the Lord and interested in reaching their friends. Joachim and Angela, the German couple that we have mentioned in earlier letters, are growing and serving diligently. When we first met them they planned to move back to Germany by the time their children were in elementary school. Nevertheless, God has changed their minds. They have learned French very well and they are now both teaching Sunday school. In fact, Joachim has accepted the responsibility of leading and teaching in the Sunday service one time next month. We are very encouraged by this. We are also encouraged by the regular attendance of some unsaved folks at services and Bible studies.

So, don't drop the ball and pray for us to not drop it either. We are not just in a game. This has eternal value. Thanks for all your help and may God bless you greatly.

And then, during the Conference, the generous saints of God at Park Ridge, in addition to graciously hosting the Winter Conference, also presented an offering of \$9,180.48 to the Thanksgiving Offering! There were other generous gifts given by dear Giving Friends during the month also.

So, GOD BE PRAISED! The current Grand-Total-To-Date for the Thanksgiving Offering is \$99,246.86, CAN WE EXCEED \$100,000.00?

Very Hot Here In Brazil... Ordaining Two Men To the Ministry... Short Furlough...

February 5, 2007

Here the temperature is HOT . . . and from my conversations with family and friends, it is somewhat cooler there. We are having some blistering temperatures, but it is good for the economy because this is Brazilian tourist season and our people have jobs in this season. The attendance in church is down because of the long hours that people have to work in this season (Dec. to the last of Feb). Even the Sunday School attendance is down because a lot of the parents have their children working to help implement the family income.

Now for some really great updates: Our church, New Life Baptist Church, will be ordaining two men to the Gospel ministry. One of these men is our new son-in-law, Walmir. This past week our church voted to place Walmir in full-time ministry work in the church here in Caraguatatuba. His area of ministry will be overseeing and preaching at the mission points and overseeing the Seminary. He has been doing this work for some six to eight months and now he will have full responsibility of this work. With his degree in Pastoral Studies, he is anxious to get this and other classes started. He requests your prayer as he begins this new ministry. He will begin to recruit new students for the seminary as the classes will begin in February. We started this seminary two-and-a-half years ago to train our church people in church leadership and spiritual growth. It is fulfilling that purpose and more. If Walmire had just this job his hands would be full, so remember him in your prayers. The other man we will ordain is George. He and his wife are leading the newest mission point in Natividade da Serra. This mission point is three hours from our home church. They are doing a great job there and it is his desire to be ordained so that people there will take him more serious.

Our work on the church building in Morro do Algodao is progressing. We have broken the

concrete floor and poured new cement and it is ready to put down tile. The real push to complete the repair work will be in two weeks when we have some American guests who will be coming for the ordination service but will also be helping in the manual labor. For some reason we seem to get more work accomplished when we have friends come and help!!! I now am beginning to believe that we can save this building. While we are on the subject of guest's, our doors are always open, and there is always some project waiting to be done. So come on down friends, guest and future friends. We have just had a group of the aforementioned. There were twelve ladies from three different churches, some we knew and some we got to know, that came down in January and they performed a "miracle. took a house of one of our members and reformed it into a home for a family of three. You ask "What could a group of twelve women do?" Well, let me tell you; we painted the inside and outside of the house, put new screens on the windows, recovered the couch, made and hung new curtains, installed tile on the floor and behind the sink in the kitchen, and while we that were good at this kind of labor were working at this, there were others that are good at Bible studies and they were busy, too. These others held back yard Bible School in the neighborhood where we were reforming the house. The first day the number of kids vas low, but each day grew until the last day there we had sixty-seven in attendance. We had good results in both areas. The home of Maria, Junior and Lucas, was revitalized and there were seventeen children that gave their lives to the Lord in those days. Now this is AWESOME.

We had planned a day trip for the ladies, but we had bus problems and the trip was cancelled so they went to Olaria and did one more day of back yard Bible School, and with just a few visits we started bringing in the children. God always has a plan and when we are open to Him he lets us in on His plan. I had to make two trips with my pickup to bring in the children from some streets farther away and when we arrived at the mission point it looked like those cars at the circus when the clowns begin to get out. There were in access of thirty-eight kids in the seats and in the back of the pickup on one trip. Hopefully next month we will be able to send pictures of the children in the truck. We had sixty-three children at this backyard Bible School and we had seven children who accepted Christ as their Savior. Oh, how His ways are AWESOME.

Speaking of the truck, we purchased this truck in 2001, almost new, with around 25,000 Kl and this

week I had the oil changed and it has 181,620 KI on it. At home there in the States the life of this truck would be over, but it just goes to show us—when God is in it all things are different. I'm planning to get nany, many more Kl out of this vehicle. Not only do we put many Kl on our truck, but the roads are called Swiss cheese. Can you guess why? Because we have holes with a road around the chug holes!

Next month Barb and I will be in the States for six weeks, because she has to have some tests done. Pray for her as she does these exams that God will bless and there will be nothing to report. Well, I'll close for now hoping to be able to see you all in the States, but if not, you are always welcome to come on down and see us here in Caraguatatuba.

Major Water Problems . . . Monkeys On The Phone ... Thanks For Holding The Ropes . . .

We trust that your year so far has been a good one. We are reading that there has been some snow and cold weather there. This is expected

this time of year, so hopefully, you will have a good spring.

In our part of the world it is hot and dry and we have had major water problems. We have had very little rain, so rivers are low and this makes it difficult for the Kenyans to get water. The officials at the Kitale Water Company did not pay the electric bill to the electric company so that water could be pumped to the city, to businesses and homes. There

is so much corruption here and the citizens pay their utility bills, but the money does not make it to the proper sources. For nine days, and even now, there was no water so doing laundry, bathing, are from the citizens cooking, etc., was a challenge. Supposedly, they finally paid the bill after much press here, but some homes, such as Nathan and Carrie's, have only received a very small amount of water. Pam and I did get water as we are on another line. Also, our phone lines are tied together in eight places so this makes it interesting, to say the least, especially when monkeys travel across our lines all of the time. When trials like these come, we are reminded how much that we take for granted and are so thankful that God is ever present and supplies our needs. We are thankful for His faithfulness when people are not faithful.

Pam started teaching in a community about three kilometers from our Imani Church on Thursday and had seventeen women in attendance. She is teaching really basic information about cleanliness, how we get sick, how to care for children, prenatal care, lessons on malaria, pneumonia, dehydration, colds, ear infections, nutrition, etc. There is a Bible application at the end of each lesson so Jarod, one of our pastors, nity development coordinater. Jarod has also found another does this teaching since he is our commu Kenyan nurse, who is a Christian, who will be assisting Pam sometimes in the de-worming clinics and teaching. We started the de-worming clinics back after the holidays and we have been going to a few schools to teach children and parents about these parasites who can do so much harm. We hope to reach out to more communities later on and do teaching so that many diseases can be prevented

I started mentoring our leaders individually now and am really enjoying this. I spend an afternoon per week with each of them and am visiting with them working with those who are pastors on their messages, and just getting to know them better. I am hoping to help them to grow spiritually and want them to find their own leaders in the churches that they can mentor. I really enjoy teaching in our Bible Institute, too. Both of us are teaching Men's and Women's Bible studies now in both churches. So this is additional mentoring. We teach at Bethel Baptist on Wednesday evening and at Imani Baptist on Fridays, and hope to train leaders there to take over and teach later on.

We have started back our Bible clubs on Saturdays after the holidays. Some of our Bible Institute students are working with these children and teens. We hope to reach as many children as we can with the good news of Christ's saving grace and to disciple and mentor them. We want them to be excited about serving our Lord, so pray for us as we start two more clubs soon

That's about all of the news from this side of the world. Thank you so much for your prayers and interest in what God is doing. The challenges of being in a third world country are many, but God is so faithful to provide for us and to answer our prayers. What a privilege it is to be called here and to present His message to so many who are stepped in tradition like witcheraft and are blinded to His truth. Thanks so much for "holding the ropes" for us there so that we can be here. You are definitely a part of what God is accomplishing. May our Lord richly bless each of you in this new year as we work together to bring many into His kingdom while the door is still open.
