This should be my last letter from the States. Beverly and I are set to return to Brazil on March 31st. We have every reason in the world to be anxious to get home, not the least of which is the COLD weather! We have enjoyed our visits to churches and friends, but it is high time we got back to work.

Two weeks ago Andrew conducted the yearly carnaval (Mardi Gras) camp for the youth. They had fifty-two teens besides the fifteen team members. The theme he chose was, "The Countdown." It was about our lives having a beginning, middle and end. They had a great time. Some of the pranks the boys played on the girls and vice versa were hilarious. The best news though is that three teens were saved.

The joint mission project that our churches have planned for 2007 is already underway. This year we will be reaching all the Jurua River downstream as far as the city of lpixuna in the state of Amazonas. The project includes all the tributaries along that stretch of river. Most of the planning was done without my help and all that has been done so far has been in my absence. I am more than pleased that our churches are already doing the job on their own. I probably won't retire because of it, but it sure makes me happy to see them become self-sufficient. So far they have made two trips to Ipixuna. The first was to gather the necessary stats and make some initial contacts. The second trip was to actually preach in every village and home on the Jurua. I will relay some numbers to you as soon as I have them.

From the time of this writing we have just over three weeks until we return to Brazil. We are still praying that we will be able to get the funding for the motor (35HP short tail shallow drive, \$4,500.00) before leaving the States. Naturally by the time you read this we will be back on the field, Lord willing. Even so, it is not too late to help us with this and, of course, the added gasoline money we need every month to continue our mission efforts along the rivers. Help as the Lord leads you.

Thanks to everybody for the great hospitality. Thanks for the generous offerings. Thanks to all of you who continue to pray for and support us, even though we have not been to visit you in years. Unfortunately a longer furlough is not possible. Even if it were, we still could not visit all of you. May God bless you for your grace to us and your faith in continuing to support the work.

Here at First Baptist Church we just finished a twelve lesson


course on soul winning, and last weekend there were eight or nine teams of two, that went out on

SO, WHAT IS IN THE GREAT COMMISSION? WHY IS THE GREAT COMMISSION



WE COMMIT TO: the PERSONAL AUTHORITY for our churches and our mission endeavors: He is Jesus Christ. Matthew 28.18. WE COMMIT TO: the PURPOSE of our churches and our mission endeavors: that is, TO MAKE DISCIPLES OF JESUS CHRIST. WE COMMIT TO: the POWER of our churches and our mission endeavors: He is, again, JESUS CHRIST and His Personal Presence with us...and the Power of His Resurrection Life living in us and working through us — and the PROMISED POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. Still Having Water Problems . . . Former Worker Causing Problems . . . Working In The Bush ...

Dear Praying Friends, March 3, 2007
February has been an interesting month for us in sunny hot Kenya. We are in the middle of our summer, so the weather has been hot, but nice. It has been very dry but now the rains are starting to come, so people will be planting their gardens soon. Already many

M when the truth came out, it seems that the officials at the water company had not paid their electric bill, so that the pump which pumps the water from another place was not working due to no electricity. The officials had taken the money that people had paid when they paid their water bill and had misused it so there was no money for the electricity. It had been a huge problem here all over in all of the businesses, restaurants, etc. Finally, we understand that last week the president of the water company was jailed when he refused to show up in court when he was summoned. The health department intervenced so he is now in prison and there will be a new president of the water company we are told. This inconvenience reminds us that our God is always faithful and loves and cares for His children unlike many who seek to prosper

from circumstances.

We have had to trust God this month, too, as our worker had his life threatened from one of our former leaders this month. Moses is an ex-prisoner who supposedly was saved while in prison and he headed up our community programs. He seemed to be doing a good job, but then he began to lie to us starting in December. He told us that his mother had died, so we gave him money to attend her funeral. He used the money we gave him to buy his girlfriend a mobile phone, but never told us that his mother had not died. He was cheating on the tests in our Bible Institute and began to go back to his old ways of using drugs and drinking alcohol. I tried several times to confront him with his sin and to mentor him, but there was no remorse. He was sorry, but only that he got caught. His brothers are in prison for brutally killing a man in January. Moses came to see us this month demanding that we move him from his apartment as the landlord had asked him to leave. Because of his continued drug and alcohol abuse, we did not give the landlord had asked him to leave. Because of his continued drug and alcohol abuse, we did not give Moses the money, but gave it to our worker to get the moving truck for him. Moses left our house with our worker to get the truck, but about half of a mile from our house. Moses threatened the life of our worker if he did not give him the money. He has threatened other people who know him and has been making calls to us asking for more money which we refuse to give. He came to see us about two weeks ago dressed like a hoodlum and became very angry and yelled at us when we refused to give him more money. We have taken precautions to protect ourselves and God has been faithful to watch over us. Please do pray for Moses as we hate to see this man who is so talented waste his life on drugs and alcohol. We are praying for his salvation and true repentance.

Our Bible clubs are growing and we are blessed as we see those who are in our Bible Institute ministering to others. We are bringing children from two of our clubs to our Imani Baptist Church every Sunday so that they can learn more about God's Word.

The community ministries are continuing as we do more de-worming clinics, and teaching on health issues. Lord willing, Pam and I will be going up into the bush region next month with a team who will be visiting us from North Carolina. We are very anxious to return to these tribal areas to do Min of whith deviating as indirection in North Carolina. We are very anxious to return to these tribal areas to do medical clinics, but also to reach them with the Word of God which will save their souls. We are using African Inland Mission (A.I.M.), which has an aviation part of their ministry in which they fly missionaries into remote areas to do clinics and to reach others with the good news. We are hoping to teach and disciple some of the village leaders so that they can prevent many of the diseases that we see and also so that we may one day start a church in a remote area there.

We have just finished teaching an evangelism class in both of our churches and are hoping to be able to restart the door-to-door visitation programs soon. We had stopped for awhile, but are anxious to begin to get our people involved in reaching others for Christ.

There is more to report, but I must close. Thank you so much for your prayers for us and your interest in what God is doing in this part of His world. May our Lord richly bless each of you for your faithfulness to Him and for "holding the ropes" there for us. We appreciate you.

Death Of Barbara's Father... Preachers Ordained... **Interesting Pastoral Visit...**

I sometimes have a hard time trying to figure out where to start when writing these monthly letters because there has been so much that has occurred. So when it comes to this entire month, I'll just say it has been AWESOME! Here are some of the highlights first: we had a baptismal service, an ordination service for two new pastors, two weddings and then to top it off, I want to tell you about one of the visits the Pastor and I made.

The church held its first baptismal service of 2007, but unfortunately we missed it because Barbara's father, retired pastor H. W. Baker, went to be with the Lord. He was eighty-nine years old and had a wonderful life of service for the Lord. He will be greatly missed in my life because I could always call him for the Biblical questions I needed the answers for and suggestions when I needed some help. Even as Barb and I were trying to make arrangements to get home, our Lord and Savior had it all worked out. Preacher Baker went into the hospital Sunday morning and some time around noon he had passed away. During the time he was in the hospital and we were uncertain about Preacher Baker's condition, we were able to rearrange the prior travel plans Barb had so that she could be back in Lexington the next day. Then when we received word that Preacher Baker had passed. I also needed to rearrange my tickets. Well, to make the story short, what might have taken hours on the phone and lots of hassle only took thirty minutes and both Barb and I had our flights rebooked and were able to be on our way in the air heading for the States. We arrived in Lexington, Kentucky, Monday morning to be with her family. How AWESOME and wonderful the Lord is!

Right after the funeral on Wednesday, I made a quick return in order to be in Brazil for the ordination service. For the first time in the history of New Life Baptist Church, two young men who have surrendered to the gospel ministry were ordained. One was our son-in-law, Walmir Quaresma, and the other was Jorge Candido. Jorge is already serving in one of our mission points approximately three hours from our town, (Natividade da Serra), and Walmir is now leading our church's seminary and has charge of all our mission points, local and distant. We were blessed with several special guests from the States for this ordination service. This was a personal delight for me to have friends present for a very AWESOME event. Those friends of ours were Dr. Mark Miller and his wife Diana, Dr. Chirag Shah and his wife Sveena, Don Zimmerman, P. J. Thompson, Tony Thompson, Barry "Bear" Thompson, Oakie Smith, and Anita Mills. Four of these men sat on the council for the ordination service. Just as it was a blessing for me to have these men here sitting on the council, I know it was an equal blessing for them be part of this historical moment. Even now as I write this letter, I am planning a message for this Saturday as our Pastor, Walmir and I, are going to the interior of the state of Sao Paulo to participate in another pastoral ordination. This young man's name is Serginho. He has proved himself to be a very worthy servant. I have worked with him in Garca and he and I ministered together and started another mission work while in the city of Jacarei. It was nothing short of AWESOME to be a part of his ordination on Saturday, March 3rd.

During this Mission Sheets Month, I preached seven sermons - six at the 24th of March Baptist Church and one at the organization of the Perseverance Baptist Church and the ordination of the pastor, Brother Ricardo Henrique de Lima. During the same month I heard six sermons preached. The most eloquent sermon I heard with my beautiful wife of

Harold_bratcher@yahoo.com fifty-two years, Marie, at my side, was preached by our son, Dr. Asa Mark Bratcher. It was preached at the wedding of a young couple both members of the Communhao Baptist Church where Asa Mark is the pastor. As usual the bride arrived late. This was on February 23rd.

On the 24th, we (the parents, Asa Mark and Lucianilda), and the grandparents, (Marie and I), were

made sad at Marcia's departure. Marcia is Asa and Lucia's oldest daughter. She is now living in cold Connecticut where she is continuing her education working on a Masters Degree. Thus our three grandchildren are now living in three different states in the USA. Lucy Marie is studying at a college in Houston, Texas. Our youngest and only grandson, Stephen Matthew, fourteen, lives with his parents, Stephen and Salete in Ocala, Florida.

Starting To See More Interest And Results ... Celebrate 34th Wedding Anniversary . . . Serving God In Brazil And France As A Team ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It hardly seems possible, but yesterday Judy and I celebrated our 34th Wedding Anniversary. What an adventure it has been. God gave me just exactly what I needed when He gave me Judy. When I was yet a young child, my parents encouraged their children to pray for the person God wanted us to marry. I remembered praying somewhat regularly from the time I was ten years old for God to give the wife He wanted me to have. He answered those prayers. God knew

that I needed a wife and partner in ministry and He gave me one. God has gifted some of you with the ability, wisdom and strength to minister as a single person. I have great respect for you and encourage you to faithfully do what God enables people like you and the apostle Paul to do. If you are married or planning on getting married may God enable you to have a fruitful partnership with your spouse.

Six weeks after Judy and I were married, we moved to Manaus Brazil. A city that was much more rustic then than it is now (and it's not a piece of cake now). I was going home. Judy was leaving home for the first time. She had a lot of "firsts" during the year and half that followed. I pastored Tabernacle Church and another mission, taught a double load of science, preached about ten times a week, taught night classes until about 11 pm each night, was director of the schools, and did the bureaucratic work of adding a teacher preparatory secondary school to what was already in existence.

I am saying all of this to say how stupid I was. That is not a good way to start a marriage.

Judy cried some, but rarely when I was around. Since she didn't see me very much she launched into rning Portuguese, started teaching a full load of English in the school, gave piano lessons to girls at church who wanted to learn, and cooked, cleaned house etc. No, we didn't have maids. For those of you who are just getting married, I do not recommend that you treat your bride the way I treated mine. Judy, ever, now says that God used this time to help her really trust completely in Him.

Judy is not just my wife; she is a full partner in the ministry to which God has called us. Much

of what we do here could not be done if she were not involved: ministry to women in various ways; children's ministries; daily prayer together; making contacts in the neighborhood as we walk; through her donating English teaching in the public school; and by dinners, etc.

Judy and I are both grateful for all of you who give faithfully so that we can live and serve here in France. This morning a lady made a profession of faith. Veronique is the twin sister of a lady who comes regularly to Sunday services. Last year, Veronique came to a Bible study for a short while. Last Sunday she trusted Christ as Savior. She told me this morning that she now sees how God was working all around her and cannot believe how blind she was

Also during the past month God gave a breakthrough with Clement who comes regularly with his parents on Sundays. This young man of eighteen years of age has not shown much pleasure in coming and has been quite closed. A few weeks ago he began bringing his Bible and about three weeks ago he really opened up and I was able to have a serious conversation with him following the Sunday service about spiritual matters. The various Bible studies are going well. We are encouraged by the interest of those who have not yet made professions of faith, the growth and application of the Word in the lives of those who are saved, and their witness to those they encounter.

During the second week in April, (soon after you receive this), Judy, Amanda and Angela will be holding our annual Vacation Bible School. Would you take time just now to pray for God to bring the children, enable the ladies, and give understanding to those come?

May our heavenly Father strengthen encourage and enable you to abound in good works as you enjoy the presence of His Spirit in you.

Well, Walmir - Mary's husband and newly ordained pastor - has begun this work and because of him others are now interested. It is awesome when you can see God's hand and guidance in so many different areas of ministry and in individual lives

With all these things going on construction is happening on the two mission churches here in our city. I really took advantage of these men while they were visiting (abused them to be very truthful about the matter) and we accomplished a lot of work on these buildings. As a result of their help the church building in Olaria will have its inaugural service on the 10th of March and the church building in Morro de Algodao, though not completely finished, will be able to resume having services. To refinish this church we lack the bathroom, floor tile and paint. Here is an excellent area where you can help financially.

Well, the weddings have been many the past several months and I think the last two for a while happened this month. At the beginning of the month, one of our church's musicians and former student of the vocational school, Leo, married his love, Marcia, and this past Saturday the 24th, one of our church's pianists, Joyce, and her love Rodrigo, wed. Counting from our daughter's wedding last November that

makes five weddings in our church. What a blessing these new couples will be in the work of our Lord.
Well, about that visit the Pastor and I had. We went to visit a family who is in regular attendance of our church. This family had two different families visiting with them (two ladies and four children). couples in the church, went to the Iguacu Falls on a mission trip. Of the forty people that went eighteen were from Alpha and Omega. In the mornings they lead Bible School for the children and put on programs at night. Those who weren't involved in Bible School and programming worked renovating a house of a family from the church. The family had been living in ruins; their house, furniture, and clothes were all trash. They had a roof but no ceiling, rats and cockroaches breeding in the closets. The family had been broken for a while. The father had an accident five years ago crippling him and he went into depression and began drinking. He





became an alcoholic and his wife along with him. Three years this went on and then Pastor Edson started a church down the street. When this man had no one to turn to, Pastor Edson was there helping him when he was too drunk to think. He became a Christian soon after and has been very faithful in attendance ever since. It was a journey to stop drinking and get his life straight, but now he and his wife are walking with the Lord. When our group arrived we went to the house originally just to paint. However, when we saw the state it was in we knew we couldn't leave it the same

way. We had already spent all the team money on paint and other expenses so that night we took an offering amongst the group and came up with 700.00 more reais. With this we were able to go to a used furniture store and buy a couch, stove, sink/cabinets, wardrobe, one double bed with a cushion, and two single beds with cushions. The last day we took out all the old furniture, clothes, and dishes, and cleaned everything and waited for the new furniture to arrive. While we were waiting the trash collector arrived. We had so much

were waiting the trash collector arrived. We had so much to throw away (furniture included) we were afraid that they wouldn't accept it all. However, they backed up the truck and twenty people all started throwing trash while the whole neighborhood stood in awe. In ten minutes we successfully threw away two wardrobes, a couch, two old beds, mattresses and ten more bags full of trash. Through it all, not one heart came back to Garca untouched. It was really amazing to see God working through our group and hopefully the word of the blessings God gave that one family will reach others.



Another blessing happened at our mission point in Lupercio headed by Pastor Silvio, who went to work as a pastor after leaving Alpha and Omega. A while back, a counselor from the town of Lupercio, came to bring a little girl to the home for help. Unexpectedly he himself found help. After conversing with

Pastor Odali and seeing Alpha and Omega, he began going to church in Lupercio. With the help and discipleship of Pastor Silvio he has gotten married and is now serving with his whole family in church. A few weeks ago he was ordained as a Deacon. Here at the home so many people pass through, whether it's a child to live, an adult to work, or an American to help. We know His hand is truly on this place because so many leave touched and changed. (Not that we promise anything when you come here!). FROM SOUTH ON 1-75: Get off at Exit 104 (Athens-Boonesborough). Turn west toward town You will be on Athens-Boonesborough Road / Richmond Road Extension. As you approach Lexington, the road will become Richmond Road around Jacobson Park. Continue straight into Lexington. Richmond Road will become Main Street. You will pass the Rupp Arena-Lexington Convention Center on your left. Turn left at the next traffic light. This is Jefferson Street. Turn right in the middle of the overpass bridge onto Manchester. About one mile down Manchester, turn right on Thompson Road and come to the top of the hill.

FROM NORTH ON 1-75 OR EAST / WEST ON 1-64; 1-75 and 1-64 merge for a few miles on the north/northeast side of Lexington. Come to Exit 115 on 64/75. This is Newtown Pike (State Route 922). Special Prison Services . . . American Team Coming . . . Hope To Start Other Ministries Soon . . .

Dear praying friends,

Another month has come and passed so quickly and it is hard to believe we are already in the third month of 2007. May we each make a renewed commitment to use our time productively and wisely and truly "redeem the time" that the Lord has given us to serve Him. (Ephesians 5:16). This prayer letter will give current progress on the ministry, share prayer requests, and inform you of the current ministries here in Kitale, Kenya.

This coming Saturday is a very special day for the prison ministry, as there will be a special service for the official opening of the new building in Kitale main prison. It has been confirmed that the head chaplain over all prisons in the country of Kenya will be coming to the service. This is a special honor and I hope that those coming will truly be blessed by the ministry that is currently in progress. I hope to be able to take pictures and send them to supporters and to those that gave so sacrificially for this building to be completed.

There are so many uses for this new building and we have many plans for it. The main plans now are evangelism, discipleship, leadership training for those who qualify and other uses as the Lord leads. We are also praying for its possible use as a church most likely next term if the Lord opens this opportunity. I continue to wait and pray and seek guidance from the Lord and I would appreciate your prayers for these requests as well.

I thank the Lord also for the three main chaplains within Kitale main prison who have allowed this ministry to continue since 2002. There is a special permit from the main office in Nairobi that is needed each year and I thank the Lord for their cooperation in allowing this ministry to continue for the past several years. Please pray that there would be continued cooperation and that this ministry would be allowed to continue smoothly with no outside interference. How Satan would love to destroy what has begun in the prisoners lives, but I continue to wait and pray and trust the Lord to continue to lead and guide the ministry. Philippians 4:13 has been such a comfort to me, which says, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." Although there will be opposition, as Satan opposes the work of God, I can be sure that the Lord will continue to help and protect the ministry. Psalms 46:1 says, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." These verses have comforted and encouraged me as I know upon moving into the new building there will be challenges. Please pray that my faith would be strengthened in the Lord and I would trust Him each step of the way in the prison ministry.

My wife continues to do very well in her ministry to the women prisoners. She recently gave an exam to the students and they excelled in their exam. Each prisoner will be given a reward to encourage them to do well in their studies. These women have literally nothing, even the children, and we continue to pray that the Lord would guide us with future direction in this ministry. What a blessing and asset my wife is to this ministry. She truly is so valuable to me both in the ministry and personally. Proverbs 31:10 says, "Who can find a virtuous woman? For her price is far above rubies." This is certainly true for my wife and I am blessed to have her as part of the team to reach the prisoners of Kitale.

There is a team from America coming to visit the ministry later this month and I will be sure to update each of you on their time here next month. There are also some other ministries here in Kitale that we are praying about pursuing which I hope to give a better update about in the near future.

God bless each of you and I will be sure to keep you updated on the ministry here as always. Thank you for your prayer and financial support, for without your help, it would not be possible to do the ministry here. You are each a special blessing.
