A PERSONAL APPEAL TO PASTORS, CHURCHES, AND ALL GIVING FRIENDS FROM A DIRECTOR OF BFM

My name is Steve Wainright and I am Pastor of New Life Baptist Church in Lexington, Kentucky. Last year around this time, I was honored to be chosen as a Director of Baptist Faith Missions.

As you may know, BFM administers support for fourteen missionary families in four different countries, and each is doing a great work for the glory of the Lord.

After attending my first Directors' Business Meeting, I was overwhelmed to see what all was involved with the finances. One of the most glaring discoveries is that for BFM to survive, there needs to be an income of \$50,000 per month for the General Fund. At the present, we are averaging \$40,000 per month. The shortfall has previously been supplied by our Thanksgiving Offering.

By giving to the BFM General Fund, all the basic needs to keep our fourteen missionary families on the field are supplied, which includes, but is not limited to: salaries, hospitalization insurance premiums, housing allowances, standard ministry expense allowances, furlough transportation, etc., [to name just a few].

Currently, BFM is supported by approximately one-hundred churches. If each one that is giving would increase their giving to the General Fund by a small amount each month, we could better supply the needs of our missionaries. I am not asking that anyone would put themselves in debt, but if we could all increase a little more, many would reap the benefits which are eternal.

One example of that is a story Brother Draper, missionary to Brazil, told at the Thanksgiving Conference. He had a young man at the age of seventeen that his family took in, and now that young man is in China doing mission work, reaching out to North Koreans. Those who give to the General Fund have a part in that work. It is amazing how the Gospel is going forth and the how Lord is working in spreading forth His fame and His glory.

My simple request is to increase our giving a little more. I challenged our church with this, and they responded by giving \$1000.00 to BFM this past month. Our church, like many others that support BFM, is small in number but mighty in faith and we do believe that little is much when God is in it.

Thank you for giving as you do! "For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love which ye have shewed toward His name in that ye have ministered to the saints and do minister."

THANKSGIVING OFFERING UPDATE

Our Thanksgiving Offering total is: \$23,948.00: That includes all the offerings received by the close of November and listed in this issue of the Mission Sheets - twenty-three offerings to date. We bless God and thank each of you who has given. Others have sent in your offerings this current month and will be added to next month's update. THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING WILL REMAIN OPEN AS LONG AS YOU GIVE. There is no "expiration date" for giving to the Thanksgiving Offering.

If you have not given to our Thanksgiving Offering, we hope you will do so. No one should think that your offering is too small to be significant. NO OFFERING IS TOO SMALL. And our need for your most generous Thanksgiving Offering you can give has never been more critical than it is now.

\$50,000 MONTHLY SOLVENCY GOAL: I am frequently asked: "What is BFM's greatest need?" The answer is always: "THE GENERAL FUND!" Our fourteen missionary families depend on commitments we have made to them from General Fund supplies.

When you support the GENERAL FUND, you are contributing to the salaries, housing, ministry expenses, health care, furlough travel expenses, and other commitments we have made to them. All of these standard commitments are "big ticket items". Every month we disburse from the GENERAL FUND for the benefit of our missionaries: \$23,860.00 for salaries; \$12,400.00 for standard expense accounts; \$8,500.00 for insurance premiums as well as other support services and benefits [like the printing of the Mission Sheets you are reading right now]. ALL OF THESE DISBURSEMENTS, MODEST AS THEY ARE, ARE SUPPLIED FROM THE GENERAL FUND.

When you give to the GENERAL FUND, you are enabling them to serve the Lord daily where they are without the distraction of wondering whether their essential basic needs will be met to keep them on the field.

If you are not giving to the GENERAL FUND, we hope you will commit to giving a monthly offering so we can meet their needs. If you are giving to the GENERAL FUND, would you consider increasing your offering as you are able. TOGETHER, WE CAN DO IT!

POSSIBLE REDUCTIONS TO OUR MISSIONARIES' MONTHLY DEPOSITS: If we

are not able to meet the standard, essential financial commitments we have made to our missionaries from monthly GENERAL FUND offerings, we will have no choice but to reduce their monthly deposits proportionately to the shortfall in that month's GENERAL FUND contributions. That means we will necessarily ask each one of them to bear a proportionate share of the total deficit between that month's GENERAL FUND offerings and the disbursements those offerings supply. We can't disburse funds we don't have.

WE HAVE DONE...AND ARE DOING...EVERYTHING WE CAN DO TO AVOID COMING TO THAT POINT. THIS IS THE ACTION THAT WE MOST DREAD.

Our missionaries cannot afford to do without any of the commitments we have made to them. They already struggle with the challenge of making their personal/family/ministry ends meet on their present budgets, compounded by the continual rise in their costs of living, decrease of the dollar's value against their field currency, and the fluctuating exchange rates they deal with.

Dear Fellow-saints, December 9, 2008

Another month has flown by. It is well with my soul. This physical body is a little more fragile than it used to be. One day we will lay it aside and receive our glorified body. What a future! Sometimes when things are not looking so promising, such as our economy right now, we get very concerned. We cannot become dismayed when we remember what we have in the future in our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We preached in five states this past month. Ursula was able to go with us on all of these trips. This Friday she will go in for

tests on her heart and vascular system. The doctor is concerned due to an irregular heart beat and her dizziness. Her arthritis is always with her, but has not been so bad as to keep her at home these past weeks. I have really enjoyed having her with me as I have traveled.

I have bought the ticket to return to Brazil in January. I just talked to one of our preachers in Brazil and all seems to be going well there. We had a problem at the Novo Diamantino work with the roof leaking on the church building, but I believe that Brother Edvan probably has it fixed by now. This was made possible through the "As Needed" offerings you give to our work in Central Brazil.

We were at the Thanksgiving Conference in Michigan and heard many great messages. We were made aware of the great need to increase our giving. We trust the Lord will supply our needs. He always has.

Contracted Malaria . . . Thankful For Support . . .

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

December 8, 2008

As I'm writing this to you it is the holiday season. However, it hardly seems like the holiday season here in Kenya. It's hot and dry now. There are no Christmas decorations, no Christmas music, no Christmas spirit, no Christmas cantatas at church, no Christmas parties, no festive Christmas food, and no Pre-Christmas sales. In fact, as it gets closer to Christmas, the prices

of everything goes up instead of down. Also, because of the increase of prices and the desire by many Kenyans to provide some small Christmas gifts for their children (like a new set of clothes), theft and robbery increase near Christmas time. So far, it is not the joyous time that Christmas season is in the States. However, we are joyful in our hearts knowing that our God and King is on the throne; and we can celebrate the birth of our Savior in our family and in our hearts, and pray that more and more Kenyans also personally know our great God and Savior. Thanksgiving was nice as we had Nathan. Carrie, and McKenna Radford over to share turkey, mashed potatoes, squash and pumpkin pie as well as sharing thanks to God for his bountiful blessings in our lives. We are even more thankful for God's blessings when we realize how little many Kenyans have. Many of them are struggling to survive right now as the price of flour, corn and other staples has doubled over the past year, probably as a result of burning their own crops down during the riots earlier this year. It makes our Lord's instruction to "pray for daily bread" take on new meaning. Many Kenyans literally do pray every day for their daily bread, especially at the end of the month when all the money and food have run out.

In ministry news, I have been spending a lot of time recently teaching the pastors about the Lord's table. These are relatively new churches and haven't had the opportunity yet to share the Lord's Table with their members. All of the pastors have asked many questions and are excited to follow through with this command of our Lord's that he gave to his churches the night before he was crucified. I bought a little wooden tray that holds cups and a little plate for the bread that the churches can share and each of the churches is scheduled in different weeks in December to partake of the Lord's Table. The first church, Wananchi Baptist (Wananchi means "citizens" in Swahili), shared in the Lord's Table as a church last Sunday. Pastor Evans asked me to administer the service the first time because he had never done it before. I agreed to run the service and administer the elements for him so he could see an example of how it can be done before doing it himself. However, three days before Sunday, I contracted malaria and a bacterial infection and absolutely and completely lost my voice. I was not able to speak above a whisper. It was obviously God's providence that caused this, as Evans was now forced to run the whole service himself. He was a little nervous but he did a good job. I instructed him (through whispers) to just do what Jesus did and he wouldn't go wrong. So, that's what he did and while he and his members shared in the Lord's Table, I just sat in the back and watched. I think the Lord was pleased with the service. Imani (Faith) Baptist will celebrate the Lord's Supper next week and Bethel Baptist the end of December. They are all excited about it as well.

Because of some contributions of some churches I was able to purchase a small 125cc motorcycle to help me get around. It's top speed is only about 50 mph, but it can get down just about any path and saves a lot on gas. All the Kenyans stop and stare as they see a mzungu (white person) on a motorcycle for the first time.

May God's peace and joy be with you.

Dear Special Friends, December 6, 200

Merry Christmas and we hope for you a blessed 2009! As we see the weather getting colder in West Virginia and decorations for Christmas all around us, it reminds us that this is such a special time of year. God gave us His best when He gave us His only Son (II Corinthians 9:15). We will be forever indebted to our loving Father for His marvelous gift of eternal life that was promised when we received His Son as our personal Savior. In the business of this season, may we never forget why we celebrate His birth, and we need to be thankful for His sacrificial gift, so that we can

join Him in heaven someday. What a wonderful God we have and serve.

Pam has had some physical problems, so we have been going to doctors to get help for her. Most of you know that she has a chronic eye condition called blephrospasm where she has uncontrollable spasms in her eyes. This is very debilitating and can only be helped with Botox injections in her eyelids. The Botox lasts about three months, and she does get relief for that period of time, so she had the injections done this past Monday.

She has been having intermittent abdominal pain for about two months, so our family doctor referred us to a gastroenterologist. He did a colonoscopy on her yesterday, which showed everything inside of her colon to be okay, so we rejoice in this. He thinks that the pain may be muscle spasms in her colon, but if the pain persists, he will do other tests. We are so happy that there is nothing seriously wrong and we are thanking our Lord for this good news.

We were able to go to the Baptist Faith Missions Thanksgiving Conference in Michigan, and really enjoyed the preaching and seeing some of our supporting pastors there. Help us to pray that the goal of \$50,000 for the General Fund may be reached, as this is so necessary for the monthly expenses of medical insurance premiums, salaries, expense allowances, and office expenses. Also, \$100,000 is needed for the Thanksgiving Offering so that additional expenses can be met, such as transportation cost for furlough, hospitalization, and other expenses. With the economy doing poorly, it is even more important to be vigilant in maintaining these funds so that missionary work can continue. God is able to provide and we trust Him for these funds so that others will be able to learn of Him in many parts of the world.

We were also able to see our daughter, Sara, her husband, Graig, and our precious granddaughters, Melia and Kaily, at Thanksgiving. Graig and Sara live in Michigan and Graig is a campus missionary at the University of Michigan. He and Sara bring teams to Kenya each year to see the work there. Kaily is fifteen months old now and is doing so well. She was born three month early last year, but is progressing well now. How we thank God for this little 'miracle.' Lord willing, Graig and Sara will be going to Kenya in the spring to adopt either one or two Kenyan children. They have been working on this adoption for three years and it is finally coming together. They want to take one or two Kenyan children into their family to raise them for our Lord. It has been very difficult for them, as the Kenya government does not make it easy for international adoptions to take place.

As we look forward to the New Year approaching, we are excited about the possibility to reach others for our Lord. Pam and I look forward to returning to Kenya sometime in the future, Lord willing. However, we are concerned, because we see events changing and our world getting away from Godly principles. We are noticing that our Christian freedoms are becoming less and less, and this is a big concern. Our time to tell others about our wonderful Lord is coming to a close, so we must be busy about our Father's business while we still have time. Thank you so much for your faithful financial support to us this past year. We know that giving to missions can be a sacrifice and we deeply appreciate you remembering us. Let us vow in the New Year to "lay up our treasures in heaven" (Matthew 6:20), and let go of earthly things that will not last. God's Word is all that matters and we have a world that needs to hear this Good News while there is time. May our Lord richly bless you as we go into 2009. We appreciate you so much!

We hope that each of you enjoyed a blessed Thanksgiving and the Conference sponsored by New Hope Baptist Church was a blessing to all who attended.

We mentioned in our last letter that Ana Paula, one of the two who were baptized this summer, has started a Bible study where she lives in Portugal. This Bible study

is for the purpose of sharing the Gospel with her unsaved neighbors. There are four unsaved ladies participating in this Bible study weekly and it is going quite well. It is exciting to see the maturity of the disciples that God has saved here.

During the next week Judy and I are traveling to Porto, Portugal, to visit Ana Paula and her husband Raphael. He is there in school. We will get to meet the ladies with whom Ana Paula has the weekly Bible study to share the Gospel. From there we are going to Seville, Spain. We will be visiting a family who used to be our neighbors here. Though none in this family made professions of faith they came to Bible studies regularly while they lived here. We still have a Bible study over the internet with Rosana each week.

We thank God for each of you who participate with us in what God is doing here in the Toulouse region of France. Your support helps the spread of the gospel, not only here, but in several other countries. Ruth, a lady who got revived and back on track serving the Lord here, has since moved back to the Isle of Man. She is now leading a Bible study there.

Our goal is to make disciples who are faithful to the Lord and actively serve Him wherever they may move. The Bible study in Mazere continues to increase in attendance. Our services and Bible studies here in Tournefeuille are also going well. There are now seven Bible studies going on each week as a result of your support of the work here. Developing leaders is also an important part of our work. There are now about a dozen leaders who lead Bible studies or teach in the children's classes.

Judy, along with Wendy and Amanda, organized a special Ladies' Day for the ladies in our congregation on the 2nd weekend of November. The purpose was to encourage them, help them grow through personal time with the Lord, have fellowship and a time of praise. It was a great success. All but two were able to come. One of these was out of town visiting a relative who is near death and the other was in the hospital. All who came said they were blessed tremendously. They wanted to have these ladies' fellowships on a regular basis and they want them to be longer!

We thank God for each of you who participate with us in what God is doing here. Let God continue to shine through you to those near you, as well.

Share Gospel With Neighbors . . . Many Professions Of Faith . . .

Dear Brethren,

Since my last long trip up river I have stayed closer to home while we at First Baptist Church worked on a major evangelistic effort here in town.

We mobilized all of our church over a two month period to gear up for a three day project to share the gospel with their neighbors in our homes. We had these home meetings on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights,

(November 6-8). All services at church were cancelled on those three nights. Each night there was a short gospel video, testimonies and music. Some homes had just four visitors, while one family had thirty-five people on the last night!

On Sunday afternoon and night we all brought as many of our visitors to church with us as we could. We had record attendance on November 9th. We had two hundred twentythree in that service and a house full in the evening. I preached the afternoon service then went to preach at Faith Baptist in the evening. There were about three hundred at Faith Baptist and one profession of faith, but I missed out on the fun at my home church.

This same project was being implemented at Thaumaturge and Foz do Breu (on the Peruvian border) at the same time. Pastor Emerson, at Thaumaturgo, reported a great turnout in the homes and forty people have been saved over the past few days. At Foz do Breu, Vando reported ten more people saved.

We had already started to have more professions of faith in October and this has been building through November. There have been a few services with just a couple of folks

saved. We had two services with nine and ten professions of faith. We have even had some in our midweek services. At one of our Friday night prayer meetings we had four more saved. Even these prayer meetings are attended by as many as four hundred people.

We started using our new baptistry the first weekend of November. Pastor did



'inauguration" of the new tank. I had done the first baptism in the old one almost 30 years ago. He baptized fourteen on November 2nd. The next week I baptized fifteen and the next week Pastor Dauro baptized another twenty-five. We have had a number of new requests all this month.

Just last week Zico, our medical missions director, took two dentists to Thaumaturgo for a five day clinic. They did over five hundred procedures and witnessed to hundreds.

Well that is about ALL that has happened around here. After several months of really difficult problems this year, God has brought us through the trials and is now blessing us with another surge of His kingdom in this remote part of the world. Rejoice with us.

Although times are tough please keep giving. He will give you increase in spite of all that is wrong around us. I have some very long river trips in the coming weeks and I depend on your gifts to make sure these trips happen on schedule.

Thanks for all of your prayers and support. God bless you as much as He has us.

The one we got was too tall to circulate in the interior towns because of low power lines. I am happy to report we were able to do so. We are on our way to equipping at least one team with a motorhome and public address system for each of the twenty-six Brazilian states.

A few years ago we began using marriage seminars as a means to make new friends and draw families into our worship services. This year was very fruitful in that effort. We had sixty-four new contacts and many of those are now attending regularly at our church. One very interesting fact about this means of outreach is that more than eighty-five percent of the new families were previously un-evangelized. The couple whom we've trained to lead this ministry is a young man and young lady who came to Christ as kids through our work several years ago. We are so happy to see our spiritual children grow in the Lord and using their lives for His glory.

We will be having a house full of old friends for the Christmas holidays. Thank you for your faithful prayers and support.

Dorm Is Under Construction . . . Mission Points Doing Well . . .

Dear friends

I don't know about y'all, but for me the time is absolutely flying. Now don't say it is only because of age; (but in my case it may be). It's totally amazing to me how AWESOME and gracious is our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. He gives to us these many and abundant blessings, our health, home, happiness, and family. And on top of that He permits us to be a part of His AWESOME work; not needing us at all, but using us just the same. AWESOME! Thanks Father.

Here in our city, Caraguatatuba, the weather is constantly changing and in some cases at the same time. As I was driving into town this week at our home it was clear, one click down the road it was raining, the edge of town the sun was shining, and in town it was completely fogged in and I could hardly see. Needless to say our climate is really changing in relationship to past history and it has been doing so for the past two months. It rains almost daily and it is not the rainy season. However, life goes on and so does the ministry here.

The school is progressing, or should I say the dorm at this time, is under construction and progressing well considering the very wet weather. We have been working on the front of the dorm on the porch area. We are almost ready to pour the concrete floor. While we are in this slow mode we are cleaning some of the machines and doing maintenance. Our block making machine is getting a workout and requires a lot of lubrication and rust prevention, so we constantly do this so we can get the best results when making the blocks.

Our Sunday School ministry is really suffering at this time as we are without a bus to transport the children. We are using the van, but with the limited space we can only transport a limited number. However, the other Wednesday night as we were coming home from prayer service I counted twenty-nine adults and children, (this in a van with the capacity of sixteen) and I am sure that I missed a few small heads. As our ministry here involves several different neighborhoods the bus plays an essential part. As we are saving, shopping and praying for a new bus, we ask for your participation in this project, whether you can be a giver or a prayer warrior because both are needed. The search for a good bus is showing us that the project will be an expensive one, but our Lord solves small problems like that all the time. As I said, the lack of the bus is hurting the Sunday School and I feel that the future of the church is our children so it is critical for us to have a bus. So watch and pray with us and together we will see what a great God we serve.

Our Mission Points are doing well and the Seminary here will complete this semester in two more weeks and will enter into our Summer break. This is the time for the Brazilian people to take vacations as in our summer there in the States. As a result our attendance suffers greatly, but as a compensation we have many visitors in attendance.

I have had the privilege to preach in the city of Sao Paulo this month. One of our sister churches had it's 42nd anniversary and I was invited to preach. The only down side to this is that driving in the heart of Sao Paulo is terrible. It is like being in a go-cart race with one wheel missing from your go-cart. Every car wants to be in the same spot at the same time. I took the van and fifteen teenagers from our church and we made the trip just fine.

Sometimes we forget just how effective our prayers really are. This past week Barbara and I finally got our permanent visa cards for here in Brazil. We have been in this process for eleven years and it is supposed to be a two year process. Now we can minister here without the cloud over our head that at any minute we could be sent back to the States. Thanks to all for the prayers and support over the years in this matter.

Well, as December is beginning and the new year is near we want to wish God's blessings on all and would like to thank everyone personally for your financial help and assistance this year. It is because of your generosity that we can remain on the field. As the following year promises to be even more challenging financially for you, there we want to thank you in advance for continuing to support Baptist Faith Missions as it is through them that we do what we do here.

Again we can only say thanks and God bless you all and Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

As we will be coming home in February we can talk face to face about your trip down to Caraguatatuba this year. I am sure that you will love our second home, Brazil, and you need to see what God is doing here with your mission dollars.
