Betty departed from this life to enter the Glory side of the valley of the shadow of death on Monday morning, June 1st. As their son, Mike, described it: *"This morning at 10 o'clock, Mom slipped from our arms into His loving embrace. Thanks to all of you who prayed and are praying. God bless you all. Love, Mike"*

Betty and Bobby were faithful and fruitful missionaries in Brazil for thirty-three years, from 1960-1993. Since returning to the States, they have continued their diligent service to the Lord's Kingdom encouraging and challenging the Lord's churches and people to support and advance the preaching of the Gospel into the nations of the world. These almost fifty years of continuous service in missions have been in association with Baptist Faith Missions. We bless God for their friendship and fellowship with us.

They served the Lord together in Brazil, first in Cruzeiro do Sul [Acre] and then in Cuiaba and Varzea Grande [Mato Grosso]. Many churches were established and are still multiplying from their labors.

Betty was a true 'missionary-wife' - NOT just 'the missionary's wife' - but 'missionary-wife.' She was every bit the missionary Bobby was, and is, only with different responsibilities, functions, and activities.

Bobby and Betty were inseparable in life - and in her death, Bobby lovingly and personally attended her to the day she died.

"Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of His saints" Psalm 116.15. "Then I heard a voice from Heaven saying to me, Write: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on. Yes, says the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors, and their works follow them" (Revelation 14.13).

On December 25, 1997, she fell, breaking her leg, and from that day forth the Alzheimer's disease slowly took over, and on June 1, 2009, she went home to be with the Lord she loved so much. In her last hours she suffered no pain, and after four days of sleeping, she just stopped breathing and went home. All of our children, and some of the grandchildren, were able to be with her during her last days.

Many of you have been praying for us for a very long time and I would like to thank all who have not only prayed, but have helped, or offered to help along the rough road. Your prayers have been answered. My prayers were also answered in that I wanted to care for her at home as long as she lived.

Mike and Beverly are here with me and will stay as long as I need them. As for me, I think I am doing very well under the circumstances, and am just waiting to see what the Lord wants to do with me now. When I came out of the water of baptism on January 29, 1956, the congregation was singing, "Wherever He leads, I'll go." I have tried to live by that and will continue to do so.

Dear Friends,

June 9, 2009

The apostle Paul wrote to the Corinthian Christians these words: "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." Anita and I have been busy in the Lord's work during the month of May. I started the month off with a revival meeting in the mountain town of Huariaca. Only the Lord knows if revival was accomplished in this small mission work we helped get started several years ago. There were many rededications, two asking for baptism and one young woman trusting Christ as her Savior. We give the Lord thanks for His graciousness to those dear saints that live high up in the Andes Mountains where the air is cold and crisp.

The next weekend I preached two nights for the youth group of the Calvary Baptist Mission Church here in Huanuco. It was not as well attended as I would have liked, but I did have a good time with the kids that came. Brother Enrique Castillo is our youth minister and he does a tremendous job with these young folks. We had four trust Christ as their Savior during the month and they are now in discipleship training. We had hoped to baptize these four, but their parents are not in favor of their being baptized at this time. These kids come from a rough area of Huanuco and their parents do not attend church. Since these youths are between thirteen and seventeen we ask

the parents for permission. This shows respect for the parents and helps keep the door open for continued witnessing to them.

On the fourth weekend I traveled to the high jungle town of Oxapampa where Brother Carlos Gonzales is the mission pastor. It takes eleven hours on the bus over terrible roads to get to this town. But the Lord blessed and we saw the church strengthened, evidenced by the decisions made.

You might remember that Carlos lost

his wife to cancer a few years ago and he is now in need of an operation to remove a large gall stone. Please remember to pray for him and the work in Oxapampa.

June the fourth, Anita and I were in the capital city of Lima in order to receive Andy Morris, a young university student from the States that has come down to work and help us for a few months. He has already been a great blessing to us. Andy has designed a template in Microsoft Access for a library data base. He is in the process of cataloging and organizing my entire library and when he is finished I will be able to search all my books, pamphlets, microfiche, and electronic books just by typing any word, topic, or author. Pastors, he is good, maybe some of you in the States would like to have him come and do the same for you!

This past Sunday, the seventh of June, Anita and I celebrated thirty-five years of marriage. We had a wonderful day rejoicing in the Lord by reminding ourselves of the many, many wonderful things HE has done for us over the years. The Calvary Church surprised us on Sunday night with a special gift and anniversary cake. Sunday morning I also had the joy of baptizing a young man, Alan, into the fellowship of the Calvary Mission Church.

Andy and I will be traveling to Lima this weekend to receive a mission group from the Berea Baptist Church of Hiddenite, North Carolina. The group will be coming to help us build a security wall around the property of the Grace Baptist Church here in Huanuco. Anita and I are staying very busy making the preparations for this group. They will be in Peru for two weeks and we pray the Lord will greatly bless their time here with us.

We were saddened this past month to hear of the passing of Brother Wallace York and Sister Betty Creiglow. They both were great examples of service to our Lord and they will be greatly missed by all who knew them. Write us or call. We always enjoy hearing from those we love.

We thank the Lord for those who have given to the Annex Building Project at the prison. We hope to begin to start contracting the project soon as the Lord leads and guides. Please pray for this project, and also for the builders, that they would be committed to the task and finish quickly, realizing it is the Lord's work. We will be sure to give you an update on this in the future.

Concerning our family, Carrie has been staying busy taking care of McKenna and also busy with the hospital ministry. She has been able to go and teach the mothers, provide the mothers and babies with much needed supplies, and also give out Bibles and tracts. There are also abandoned babies who are brought in who we try to assist. Psalm 82:3 says, "Defend the poor and fatherless: do justice to the afflicted and needy." We thank each one who gives to this ministry, for we could not do it without your help. Because of your prayers and generosity many needy people are being assisted. May God bless you for your heart for His work overseas.

Please also continue to pray for the ministry in the village of Rafiki, which is about a ten minute drive out of Kitale town. As I said previously in a prayer letter, there are many villages in the surrounding areas of Kitale that are yet to be reached. It is my goal to have a preaching point in this area, but the people need to be taught the foundations first. Many in this village have a need to have a foundational understanding of the Word of God. I am presently in a course entitled, "Firm Foundations - from Creation to Christ." I have been teaching the people beginning with Creation in the Garden of Eden, and showing them from the Bible the effects/consequences of sin even in our day today. We have seen how we are all sinners and have an inherent sin nature. Later in the course, Lord willing, we will learn much about our Lord and also study concerning the need we each have for a Savior.

Please pray for me as I teach and also that the Lord would bring those who love Him and have a desire to sincerely follow Him. Please also pray that the Word of God would work in the hearts of the people and that they would make any changes necessary to follow the Lord. I have attached a recent photo of this ministry so you can remember us in your prayers.

In closing, we do covet your prayers, as there are many challenges and obstacles to ministry on the mission field. However, we know that when people pray for us and we pray faithfully, nothing is too difficult for the Lord. A friend of D.L. Moody once said, "I wish to testify that he was a far greater prayer than he was preacher. Repairing Church Buildings . . . "Boys Surgery" Funds Needed . . .

Dear Friends, June 5, 2009
Here today the weather is wonderful, awesome. It is about seventy-two with a slight breeze with sunshine. How AWESOME is the Lord.

We have been visiting schools for the last two-three weeks getting a schedule organized for the group from Virginia Beach. What we will be doing in the schools is evangelism! Yes, that is right, the program this youth group will be doing is singing mimes, some tumbling/gymnastic and preaching the Word. Yes, we will be giving an invitation for the people to accept Christ. What an awesome opportunity the Lord is giving us here to spread the Word. What a wonderful help these young people are for our ministry here in Caraguatatuba. Here in Brazil you usually win a family starting with the children, and then the parents come.

As you know we are still in need of a bus for our ministry here. Well, before we came home in February, Barbara started a project for the ladies in the church to help with the purchase of the bus. We were given some scrap material and Barbara purchased some rubber backing and we went into the throw rug business. When we got back from the States the ladies had already made and sold \$R700 reais worth of throw rugs. It is catching on and now behind the pastors some men are also helping. My "throw rug" is about 2/3 finished (I'm thinking about auctioning it off) ha!!! Keep praying as having a bus here is a necessity for this ministry with the children.

By the way, when we were visiting the schools, the principal in one of the schools offered their school facilities for us (the church) to have a Bible School there for a whole week. This school is in the neighborhood of one of our mission points and this will be really great for the ministry in that neighborhood.

Our home, needless to say, has lots of projects to complete but all is in His time. The interior is about ninety percent complete and the outside looks pretty much like all the neighbors, unfinished.

We will be returning to work on the school property probably in the latter part of this month. We got a donation for finishing the dormitory and after the summer ministry projects we will be full force again.

We have been back for over a month now and either my S-10 or the van have been in the garage this whole time. First the steering pump on the van then the muffler and tail pipe. Then the air on the S-10 and now all the tires need rotating and balancing. While there in the States we really enjoyed your good roads. Here it is a necessity to balance and rotate your tires every 5,000 miles. So monthly there is a need to go over the vehicles and tighten everything up-or loosen it. Just before I came home, one of the shocks broke on the van right in the middle of the road and the tire just turned under the van. So just like others here repair work is accomplished in the middle of the road.

We have also been working (repairing) our church buildings. The humidity here is extremely hard on buildings. The one mission point that has been condemned is waiting for some group to come and tear it down. Do you want to be this group??!!

Our Pastor at Sallesopolis, Luis, and his wife, Dane, have two boys. The smallest is in need of surgery because he is drowning during the night when he sleeps. But the socialized medicine cannot get to this little boy until November.

We have had \$500 dollars given for this surgery, but we need \$500 more. If you would like to help with this need mark your donation, "Boy's Surgery." I will keep you updated on this situation.

Well, as always, we would like to invite ALL to come down and see the Lord's work here in Caraguatatuba. Call ahead and we will put a mint on your pillow.

First Year In Kenya... We Ask For Continued Prayers...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, June 6, 2009
Greetings from East Africa. I was sitting in my Swahili lesson just this morning with my Kenyan teacher, Jared, and he asked me how long I had been in Kenya now. I looked at the date on my watch and it dawned on me that just today we have been in Kenya for exactly one year. We left language school in Tanzania and flew into Nairobi

exactly one year ago today. So, while I've been in Africa for almost a year and a half, I have now spent my first year on Kenyan soil, the country that God sent me here to minister to. So, being faced with my one year anniversary of being in this country, I have been forced to address the question in my own heart.

What have I accomplished over the past year here in Kenya? I struggle with this question as probably many of you do too when you look back at your own lives. In my own eyes it looks like I've done so little. I look back and see things that have been done and progression that has been made. We've moved into our own house and started up a school. I've progressed in my Swahili considerably although I still feel pathetic in that arena. I've been teaching for almost a year in the Bible Institute and have seen the pastors learn much about the Lord and about God's Word. I've helped fix problems that have come up in the churches. I've visited with the pastors and seen a few people saved. I've overseen and helped in the construction of a church building. I've built some relationships and learned some culture (and gone through a difficult time with culture fatigue). And next week I'll finish teaching through the book of Philippians in Swahili at one of our village churches. Of course, anything I am able to do I can only do through the power and assistance of the Holy Spirit. But you know, in the service of the Lord, there is often so little tangible things you can put your hands on and say, "Okay, see how we've progressed?" It can get frustrating at times. As a new missionary I had such big dreams about all that the Lord would do here. It wasn't exactly visions of multitudes of people coming out in droves

Prayers Work... Baptize Three Young Men...

Dear Friends, June 9, 2009
Prayer works! Your prayers work. Yes, we know that it is God who does the work, but the "effectual fervent prayer of the righteous" does avail much. And we are very grateful to you who pray for us. The sharp edge of winter weather has arrived in Curitiba, Brazil. To remind some and inform others, on the south side of the Equator, the seasons come at the opposite time of year than the north. So now, while you are enjoying (or suffering) the summer heat of the northern hemisphere, we are beginning to feel the pinch of winter. We live at 3,000 feet above sea level, so our winters are brisk. This is compounded by the fact that there is no insulation or heating in most of the buildings and houses, including our churches. So when I say that your prayers work, it is directly related to this reality that I am referring. Despite the cold weather and the sicknesses that are usually related, we continue to have packed services and responsive crowds.

Last month we baptized three young men into our fellowship. I'm going to reveal my growing up on the farm background by saying that they are "chomping at the bit" to be involved in sharing their new found Life with others. All three who were baptized came to me separately asking for the opportunity to be involved in our evangelism ministries. We have them "plugged in" now and they are demonstrating a true love for the Lord and for the salvation of the lost.

Our three Project Life outreach teams were on the highways this past month. Each of these teams travels by busses converted into motorhomes/traveling mission bases. They are manned by twelve full-time workers and, often, one to four volunteer workers. During the month of May, these three teams shared the gospel in public parks and schools with over 6,400 people. Many of those who heard the gospel surrendered their life to Christ. We have begun four new churches through the efforts and results of these teams and hope to begin many more in the months and years to come. Of course, not all our efforts meet with success or, at least, visible positive results. But, I figure if you want to hear bad news, you can turn on your TV sets and watch the evening news at home. We don't deny or ignore the fact that there is a lot of bad stuff happening, we just choose to focus on the truth that God is alive and well and still in control of this world and is bringing about the fulfillment of His purposes. We are thankful for His word and His grace to guide us and help us do that part which He has privileged us to do in that plan. We thank Him that He uses you to aid us by your prayers and support. May we all do it for His glory and praise.

On July 1st we will complete thirty-two years as missionaries to Brazil. The Lord has been so good to us. We thank Him for the privilege of serving Him in the great land of Brazil. We thank Him for providing for us through His dear blood bought saints. This month we lost Brother Wallace York and Sister Betty Creiglow. We are thankful that we had a good deal of contact with these two precious saints. Brother York was one of our teachers in college and a good friend. We served together for over two years in Central Brazil with Bobby and Betty Creiglow. They will be missed, but we wouldn't want them to come back to this present evil world.

We are developing a new work in Cuiaba in a neighborhood called Dr. Fabio. It is a very poor part of town and we have been working there for over two years. We are now building a small building there. Your "As Needed" offerings are the primary means for this along with the New Works and Special Offerings. We have also moved a new preacher onto the field at the Primavera do Leste work. Our work in Novo Diamantino is growing. We have almost doubled the population there due to two new factories being built there. This has also put a strain on the water system. Sometimes our preacher and family go four or five days without water. This creates a hardship on them and the church. Pray that this will be corrected. We once went six months without water coming into our house in Northern Brazil. It is no fun. Every day when I take my shower here I thank the Lord for being able to do it. So many people in our world do not have this privilege. We pray that they will at least have the opportunity to hear the Gospel which produces living water!

Ursula just had gall bladder surgery last week. She is recovering well. She goes on the 16th for a test on her neck to see if she will need more surgery on it. She already has two metal plates and six screws in her neck in that area. We are praying she won't need surgery at least for now. My sister will be tested tomorrow to see how soon she can receive the bone marrow transplant. She will know in a couple of days how successful the chemotherapy has been. We are waiting on her situation before returning to Brazil as I wrote in last month's letter. I believe we will know soon about this.

We thank you all for your faithful support. God bless you all.

Dear Brethren, June 7, 2009
The best highlight this month is a family seminar that we held at First Baptist Church that led to the salvation of several people out on the Jurua River!

Last year we made a contact and invitation with Brother Jaime Kemp to conduct one of his family seminars for us. He is the best known speaker and author on this subject in South America. His schedule is so busy that it is very hard to get him. Well we managed to get three days in late April. The seminar was a huge success. He had to go back to Sao Paulo after the Sunday morning service, but we had another very large crowd in the evening service. The preacher was just the old hometown guy, as usual. We had a few more folks saved that night.

Here is the connection to the river ministry. During our long, long trip the previous month to Eirunepe, I encouraged the pastor of the church there to come to Cruzeiro do Sul with some of his people for the family seminar. We wanted him and his evangelists to come for the seminar and also some more training in missions. Pastor Anastacio and six of his men hired a boat and came all those 722Km up river just days before the meeting. The time together was very profitable. A few days after the seminar was over, my traveling buddies, Hudson and Eliesio, loaded up and went back down river with the team from Eirunepe. The plan was to make at least two stops at large villages between Cruzeiro do Sul and IPIXUNA to show and share with them how we do our mission work on the rivers. The visits were to larger villages. Our guys have preached several times in these communities, but this time they went house to house, person to person again, with our visitors from Eirunepe alongside. There were fourteen people saved in those two villages! They were excited, to say the least.

Hudson and Eliesio got off their boat at IPIXUNA and waited for a plane to show up so they could get back to Cruzeiro do Sul. They then reported back to the home church.

Well right now Bev and I are in the United States. About three weeks ago I got an urgent email from Dad telling me that my mother had taken a sudden turn for the worse. Bev and I left Cruzeiro do Sul as quickly as possible. After we arrived here Mom rebounded a little. Then last week she fell asleep for a few days. She did not awaken. On Monday, June 1st, she just quit breathing and went on ahead of us to her home. We are spending some time with Dad and will be taking him to see some of his friends that he has not seen for a long time. Pray for him.

In about three weeks we plan to go back to Brazil. As soon as possible we are hoping that Dad will be able to go to Brazil to spend some time with us. Pray.
