### Please Pray For Us . . . Final Trip To Nairobi . . .

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, August 3, 2009

Greetings from East Africa. As I write this the six year old son of one of our pastors is looking over my shoulder, (at least I think he is six). I just asked him and he doesn't know. Age to Kenyans is not important and many don't even know the date of their birth. He is fascinated with my laptop. I don't think he has ever seen one. I showed him a picture I took of his dad and he just laughed and laughed and said, "baba yangu," (my father).

Two of my trips to Nairobi are finished and I have one more to go in a couple of days. Emily and I went a couple of weeks ago to attend the wedding reception of our Muslim friends. It was quite an experience. The reception turned out to be much more "western" than I ever expected. The Asian Muslims here are much more western than the Kenyans. Although the reception was western, there was still some traditional aspects as well. The wedding costumes were extraordinary. If you have seen the movie "One Night With the King" about the story of Esther and you have seen the costumes worn by the women when they come before the king, then you have an idea of the costumes Emily and I saw that day. Our friend, Shazia, looked just like queen Esther.

My last trip to Nairobi for a while comes in a couple of days. I will return our friend Lewis to the airport so that he can return home to Ohio. Lewis is a sixteen year old young man that I have known all his life, since he was one day old. He used to minister with me when I was associate pastor back in the States and he came to minister with me here for a couple of weeks. I have tried to give him a full Kenyan experience. We've been doing spiritual and physical work together.

We worked on the fence at Wananchi Baptist Church together with Pastor Evans. We got to hack up bamboo with a machete into five foot sections that we wired into the fence to make it stronger. Hacking up bamboo with a machete is hardly work for a sixteen year old. To him, it's fun. Also as I write this, he is outside at Bethel Baptist with Emily doing some work with a slasher. Luckily for me I have to write a report so no slasher work for me this morning.

The bigger impact for these two weeks however is the spiritual work we've been doing. We've visited out in the villages. It still gets to me every time I see the way 90% of Kenyans live - in mud huts with practically nothing. I asked Lewis if he would be able to live that way and he confessed it would be difficult. I confess it would be difficult as well. Three people have made professions of faith in Jesus Christ this past week. We praise God for this and pray that these three people would grow to maturity in Christ.

We also went to a deworming clinic put on by our churches. It didn't go as well as planned because the Kenyan vice president was speaking about two kilometers from where we were positioned and most of the people in the village wanted to see the VP instead of getting rid of their worms and hearing the gospel. We were able to help and speak to a few people though.

We went to a Bible Club at one of our churches where I showed the Jesus film in Swahili using a car battery for electricity. It worked well until my DVD died. I guess I still have some kinks to work out of the system. Later that day we visited some AIDS patients in a local village. This is a heart-wrenching ministry, but one of the patients was one of the three people that made professions of faith in Christ. She may not have long to live, but if her profession was real, she will live forever with our Lord and Savior.

On Sunday, Lewis taught Sunday School through a translator. He was nervous but did a good job. How many of us would have had the courage to teach Adult Sunday School in an African church at sixteen years of age? Certainly not me! Lewis is quite the young man! I haven't worked him to death, though. We have had some fun and even visited some local caves up on Mt. Elgon about 25 kilometers from Kitale. We are all so blessed that he was able to come.

Please pray for the work we've done here for the last couple of weeks that God would bless our efforts immensely. May God's peace and joy be with you.

But we are asking each church and individual to go \$1.00 farther—that is—on a weekly basis add this \$1.00 more to your mission contribution. If a church with fifty members would do this, it would mean \$200.00 more per month and \$2,400.00 more per year.

Imagine what this would mean to the General Fund if sixty, seventy, eighty or one hundred members added the extra \$1.00 each week: **OUR GENERAL FUND COULD GROW BY \$120,000!**

Please pray and try to meet this goal over what you now contribute. If we each sacrifice something small, then God can do something mighty.

## 2009 THANKSGIVING OFFERING

Every year, we make as direct and personal an appeal as we can to every one of our GIVING FRIENDS to give as generous an offering as you can to our THANKSGIVING OFFERING.

### CHANGING OUR CULTURE OF THINKING

We have changed the direction of our culture of thinking with respect to our THANKSGIVING OFFERING and MONTHLY GENERAL FUND OFFERINGS. We used to say: "We need your THANKSGIVING OFFERING because we incur deficits every month between our giving to the General Fund offerings and the disbursements for the services and benefits we have committed to our missionaries which are supplied from the General Fund. We need the THANKSGIVING OFFERING to make up those monthly deficits."

We cannot operate that way any longer. So, this year, we have revised our financial operating model to balance each month between our GENERAL FUND RECEIPTS and our GENERAL FUND DISBURSEMENTS. We call it: **GENERAL FUND MONTHLY SOLVENCY**. This is how it works: We have divided up the General Fund disbursements we make to our missionaries into two groups:

**TIER 1 / EMT DISBURSEMENTS:** The first disbursement group is ESSENTIAL MAINTENANCE TRANSACTIONS (EMT) - or TIER 1 DISBURSEMENTS. These are the disbursements which are most directly given to the missionaries each month for their essential maintenance. They include: salary [\$23,860.00], standard expense allowances for housing and ministry [\$12,450.00], hospitalization premiums [\$9151.00], and Mission Sheets publishing and mailing [\$1623.00]. All of these services are provided each month to the missionaries from the General Fund. THESE DISBURSEMENTS MUST BE SUPPLIED BY THE MONTHLY GENERAL FUND RECEIPTS FOR THAT MONTH. We have called this 'GENERAL FUND MONTHLY SOLVENCY.' This is the only way we can continue to operate fiscally.

**TIER 1 RECEIPTS:** These EMT/TIER 1 disbursements must be supplied from [1] MONTHLY GENERAL FUND OFFERINGS, [2] MEMORIAL OFFERINGS, and [3] from your offerings given to specific missionaries by name designated for 'salary' or 'support.' All of these offerings go toward supplying our missionaries' ESSENTIAL MAINTENANCE TRANSACTIONS for that month.

What if our Monthly General Fund offerings from all these sources do not cover that month's Essential Maintenance Transactions disbursements?

IF OUR MONTHLY GENERAL FUND RECEIPTS DO NOT COVER THE ABOVE-LISTED EMT DISBURSEMENTS, THEN WE MUST GO BACK TO THE MISSIONARIES' MONTHLY DEPOSITS AND MAKE A FURTHER PROPORTIONATE DEDUCTION FROM EACH MISSIONARY'S TOTAL DEPOSIT TO COVER THE DEFICIT THAT NEEDS TO BE MADE UP.

When this happens, our missionaries must make further sacrificial personal contributions to their own Essential Maintenance for that month.

We had to do that last November and December 2008, but the monthly General Fund offerings increased during the first months of 2009, so that I have not had to make any further reductions from their monthly deposits during 2009...UNTIL THIS MONTH [August].

What if we receive MORE Tier 1 receipts during any month than we need for that month's EMT disbursements?

IF WE INCUR OVERAGES IN ANY ONE MONTH, THEN I WILL CARRY OVER THAT OVERAGE INTO THE FOLLOWING MONTHS TO COVER ANY DEFICITS THAT MAY OCCUR LATER ON.

AUGUST DEPOSITS: I am preparing the monthly deposits for August right now as I write this article. July's General Funds offerings were down. I will apply the remaining overages from previous months' TIER 1 RECEIPTS to this month's deficit. BUT THERE WILL STILL BE THE NEED FOR FURTHER DEDUCTIONS FROM THE MISSIONARIES' MONTHLY DEPOSITS.

### So, what are we doing with the THANKSGIVING OFFERING?

**TIER 2 / PRN [AS NEEDED] GENERAL FUND DISBURSEMENTS:** Besides the Essential Maintenance Transactions we disburse to our missionaries regularly each month, there are other services and benefits we give them which are also supplied from the General Fund receipts. For example: the expenses related to the daily operations of administration, furlough transportation, maintaining the furlough home, four year \$8000 Auto Allowance [if we have it to give]...and other benefits.

We call these services **PRN DISBURSEMENTS** [they are disbursed 'AS NEEDED']. The 'overhead' operating expenses are monthly, but the other benefits are provided during the year as they are needed - IF WE HAVE IT TO GIVE.

WE SUPPLY THESE TIER 2 / PRN SERVICES FROM THE THANKSGIVING OFFERING. We are now in the month of August and are sort of 'limping' and 'eking out' way to the end of November when we begin to receive our 2009 THANKSGIVING OFFERING.

But, THE MISSIONARIES' MONTHLY ESSENTIAL MAINTENANCE TRANSACTIONS MUST STILL BE SUPPLIED FROM OUR MONTHLY GENERAL FUND SOLVENCY FUNDS...EACH AND EVERY MONTH.

### TWO URGENT APPEALS

So - again we must make TWO URGENT APPEALS to EVERY GIVING FRIEND: [1] INCREASE YOUR PERSONAL OR CHURCH'S CONTRIBUTIONS TO OUR MONTHLY GENERAL FUND SO WE CAN SUPPLY OUR MISSIONARIES' ESSENTIAL MAINTENANCE. [2] PRAY...PLAN...AND PREPARE FOR AS LIBERAL AND GENEROUS A THANKSGIVING OFFERING AS THE LORD ENABLES YOU TO GIVE. We hope you have already been laying aside your 2009 Thanksgiving Offering since giving your 2008 offering. But, if you have not, THEN DO SO RIGHT NOW!

Ask the Lord what He wants you to give. Then, ask the Lord to give you what He wants you to give. 2 Corinthians, chapter 9.

Dear praying friends,

August 5, 2009

Another month has come and passed so quickly, and it is hard to believe that we are now over halfway through the year 2009. Time passes so quickly and may we be more committed than ever to the work of the Lord. We thank each one of you so much for your prayers, letters of encouragement, and emails. It means so much to us, as many times here it gets difficult, and we really do enjoy hearing from you. This update will share current prayer requests as well as ministry updates.

Thanks so much for each one who prays for us, as we really feel this is needed in our ministry here. 1 Thessalonians 5:17 says, "Pray without ceasing." I have really seen the need for prayer daily here in Kenya, as there are many challenges to ministry here. There are also health concerns and safety issues when traveling throughout the country. Each day has its own demands and challenges, and what a blessing it is to be able to spend time with the Lord, desiring Him to lead and guide us in the work here. Psalm 37:5 says, "Commit thy way unto the LORD; trust also in Him; and He shall bring it to pass." We commit your prayers for us in the work here and thank each of you who diligently and faithfully pray for us. It means so much to us.

The ministry in Rafiki continues and we thank the Lord for your prayers for this ministry. I have attached a photo of the people to this letter so you can remember them and pray for them. There have been many challenges for the people here in Kenya, as there are many hunger and job issues throughout the country. Also, some people get distracted and sidetracked and sometimes there is a lack of commitment to study the Word of God. Please pray for the people, for their faithfulness, commitment, and also for the Word of God to



bring desired effects into their lives. There is much profit from the Word for their lives, as it has the answers to every question of their lives. It is the truth that will bring freedom to their lives. John 8:32 says, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." The Word of God also exposes the sin in our lives, therefore, many do not desire to study and know it. D.L. Moody, in reference to the Bible, once said, "This book (the Bible) will keep you from sin or sin will keep you from this book." We will keep you updated of the progress of this work and we thank each of you so much for praying for the people of Rafiki. After the current foundations course, I desire to have a preaching point in this village, so I would appreciate your prayer for this also.

Please also pray for the Annex prison. The men are so thankful for the building that has been constructed and also the chaplains and leaders of the prison wish to express their gratitude as well. Please pray for this work, that the men would continue to grow in their knowledge of the Word of God, and also those to be reached with the "good news." We will keep you updated of this work as well.

Carrie and McKenna are doing very well. God has truly blessed me with a faithful wife who loves the Lord and desires to serve Him, wherever God calls us. Missions is extremely challenging and difficult at times, but I thank the Lord for my wife, who encourages me, prays for me, and assists me in so many ways here. I also thank the Lord for a beautiful daughter who the Lord has entrusted to Carrie and I. Please pray for McKenna, and also for us as parents, as we desire to teach her and rear her in the ways of the Lord.

We will be sure to keep you updated of the work here. Thanks again so much to each one who writes, calls, or sends a letter of encouragement. May the Lord bless you so much. Please pray for our safety, health, and ministries. Please also pray for us as we combat issues such as loneliness, culture shock, etc. God bless you all.

## A Special Report Of God's Success Story At The Chapada Baptist Church In The City Of Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil . . .

The Chapada Mission was begun in 1956. It was the first mission point in Brazil of John and Alta Hatcher. The Chapada Baptist Church was founded in 1961 with twenty-four members. It was located on the outskirts of the city of Manaus, in the jungles.

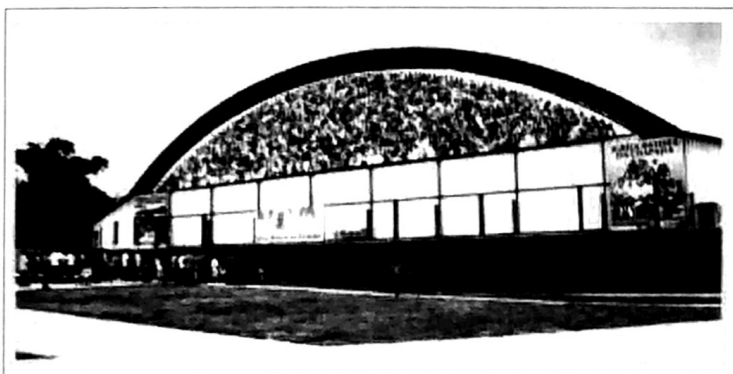
Its first building was a wood house with a thatched roof made of palm leaves; (see picture below). Among the children in this picture there are four future preachers in the front row: David, Isaías, Paul (on crutches) and John Mark. Lynn stands in the center, Alta is on the right in the back row, and Kathy is fourth from the left in front row.



The second building, (see picture below), was built on the same spot. The pastor was Wanderlei Melo, saved from BFM work in Cruzeiro do Sul. David Hatcher became the pastor following Wanderlei. The work grew and three services each Sunday were needed to accommodate the number of people attending. With an average weekly attendance of one thousand six hundred, a new building was projected.



On July 12, 2009, the new building, (pictured below), was dedicated to the service and glory of the Lord. About two thousand six hundred attended the dedication.



The history of this church is similar to a story in the New Testament where a little boy gave five loaves and two fishes to Jesus. Jesus can feed the thousands when we give the little we have into His hands.

I hope that this has been inspiring and encouraging to

our supporters and shows just how much your support and prayers have an effect on the missions.

August 10, 2009

During this Mission Sheets month, which began July 9<sup>th</sup> and finishes today, August 10<sup>th</sup>, I heard eleven sermons preached by six Baptist pastors and I preached eight sermons all at the 24<sup>th</sup> of March Baptist Church, where I am once again pastor. On Wednesday night, the 15<sup>th</sup> of July, we attended the special service at the Comunhao Baptist Church, Dr. Asa Mark Bratcher, pastor. The service was in recognition and honoring us (Marie, I and Asa Mark) for the fifty years of ministry in Brazil. Asa Mark was three-and-a-half years old when we arrived early in the morning of July 15<sup>th</sup>, 1959. There were over three hundred in attendance, with nineteen pastors and twenty-two churches represented. We heard much beautiful singing by the Comunhao choir, members of the church and others. We received many words of praise and gifts. We thank the Lord and "to God be the Glory." On the first day of July we were honored at a reception at the 24<sup>th</sup> of March Baptist Church where Pastor Ediberto lead the service and declared me again senior pastor of the church. Each Sunday since we arrived, Marie heard me preach eight sermons there. During this Mission Sheets month we have received some nineteen different people on five different days visiting us. The last two Fridays beloved brother Raimundo Rodrigues Braz has made visits with me. We have received telephone calls and e-mails from our son, Stephen. Last Saturday, we were blessed by a telephone call from Steve and Eva Blake of Lexington, Kentucky. We have received e-mails messages from Wes and Winnie Bratcher, Ann Burris, Wayne Howard and Dave Parks. We do appreciate all the news. Thank you very much.

We are slowly, and we trust surely, getting adjusted to a life very much different here in Manaus. It continues to be the land of eternal summer and since we arrived, mostly very hot and dry. After bringing the message the last two Sunday mornings at the 24<sup>th</sup> of March Baptist Church, I have taught the new members class to five and then four. Yesterday was Father's Day in Brazil. As a father with some fourteen others, we were honored after hearing a challenging message from a pastor-father. Please continue to pray for us and as the Lord leads to give to the Regular Fund and to our House Repairs Fund. Asa Mark helped us very much during our last days in the USA and is still helping us here in Manaus since we arrived. We still need to buy at least one more fan and several small kitchen things. Also we have not replaced the best bed that we had. We are thankful for all who have helped in this way. God bless each one of you is our prayer.

One of their daughters was also saved. In all, there have been over one hundred professions of faith. There have been more requests for baptism, also. Attendance has been a little lower on Sunday morning, which seems to be the norm for the summer months. Over all things are progressing steadily.

Over the past few weeks I have had a number of meetings with different ministry leaders and groups. One of these meetings was a celebration/fellowship with the leaders and helpers of our women's small groups. We had thirty present. They had many good reports. They have grown from eleven to fifteen groups. They are ready to start some more, too. The youth groups have grown from nine to twenty over the past few months. They are having a training retreat next week and already have over seventy signed up and not even half of the groups have gotten in their names!

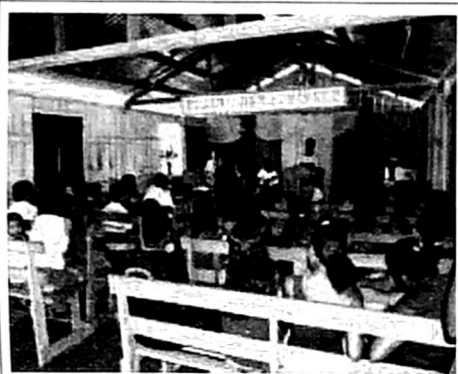

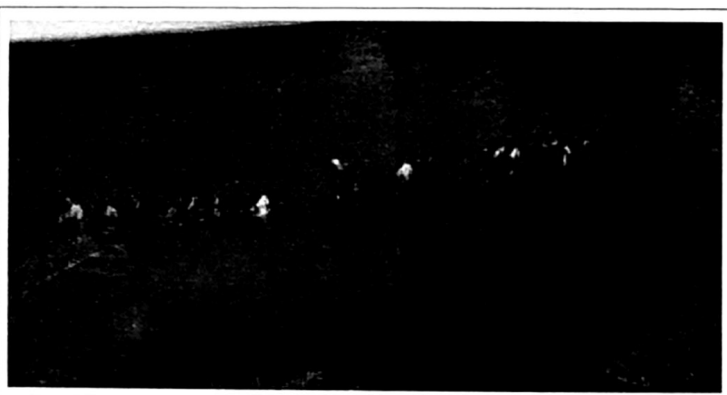

So, people usually go to their home areas or somewhere else for about a month in the Summer. Despite this, we have had excellent participation in the meetings here during the past month. We have had a full house each Sunday even though some have been out of town each week.

We have also had visitors each Sunday. Some, who had drifted away, have been back. And, those who were here gave reports of how God has opened doors of opportunity for them to witness. Amelia, the first person to make a profession of faith, mentioned two of her friends that asked her about the change in her life. They are going through challenging times in their own lives and her good testimony of joy and peace has spoken to them. She had the opportunity to tell them about trusting Christ and suggested that they start reading their Bibles. One of these friends was in town visiting her and came to the Sunday meeting with her. This is what we like to see.
