

the Savior: March 8, 2010 This Mission Sheets month began January 10th and ends today, March 8th. Today Marie and I are remembering that on March 8th, 1960 our second son, Stephen M. Bratcher, was born in the "Santa Casa de Misericordia" hospital here in Manaus. We praise the Lord for him, his wife, Salete, and their son, Stephen Matthew. The three of them live in Ocala, Florida, U.S.A. You will notice that this Mission Sheets month is actually two months. We have already more than once asked the Lord and now our readers to forgive us. During this period, I preached twenty sermons at the 24th of March Baptist Church where at present I am the only pastor, and two sermons at the



Comunhao Baptist Church, in the absence of their pastor, Dr. Asa Mark Bratcher, and one at the Mount of Olives Baptist Church with Pastor Enedson and one hundred eighty-three others present. The other sermon with twenty present was preached in the home of Sister Joana Rodrigues Braz, an invalid member of the 24th of March Baptist Church. We heard seven others. Five of the seven were preached by Pastor Ediberto, who about a month ago resigned as co-pastor to move his residence to Parana da Eva, to serve as pastor of the New Jerusalem Baptist Church. He will continue for at least six months as president and moderator of the 24th Church. He is also to preach at least once a month. Pray for him as he and his wife live in the interior and their three children will live in an apartment here in Manaus.

On the 21st of February, the church was blessed by Pastor Ediberto baptizing thirty year old Julio in the baptistery of the 24th Church. After the baptism, I asked all the twenty-five members present to remain in the auditorium to celebrate with me the Lord's Supper. Some twenty-four nonmembers went with Pastor Ediberto to hear a sermon by him. Also when I gave the invitation after the sermon and before the baptism, several members made a rededication and a former member, Sister Ana, forty-eight years old, was received again by her statement that she was living as a single person after being divorced. On the 31st of January, a thirty-two year old mother of two daughters made a profession of faith. Pray for Leticia Oriente da Silva as she cannot be baptized at the present.

Also on Sunday, the 14th of February, I preached at both services to a reduced number present. It was the Sunday before Carnaval, a national holiday in Brazil. Many believers in the churches in Manaus leave the city to places for spiritual camps. Carnaval is a time for the manifestations of the flesh with the Lord forgotten about.

Please continue to pray for us and for Dave Parks who labors very much in the interest of Baptist Faith Missions. We are planning to write the next Mission Sheets letter around the 8^{*} of April, the Lord willing. Continue to pray for us and give to the regular fund and our designated offerings.

Hosted Training Retreat ... Visiting Works Around Brazil ...

Dear Brethren, March 17, 2010 Bev and I hosted another training retreat this month. This time we had six more couples in our home.

February was the big youth camp. There were over eighty teens in attendance and half of these were unsaved. There were eleven professions of faith. My son, Andrew, and my son-inlaw, Dauro, head up the team that takes care of camp now. Since they have set up their system, the workload is much smaller on the leaders and things flow much more smoothly. They have had fewer discipline problems as time has gone by.

I have been back to Guajara for a couple more visits. They are filling their little building almost every service. This month they had another five or six professions of faith. There were eighteen baptized in February.

We have also been making more frequent visits to Rodrigues Alves and Pe da Terra. The works are going well, but we are looking for workers for both. I have had several meetings with a number of workers who may be changing location or just getting started as full time workers. Keep praying. Hudson and Eliesio have been down river to check in on our new works. There were several more professions of faith. They are both having some health problems: Eliesio caught malaria, but is recovering. Hudson however, is not well at all. He has been in and out of the hospital with gall stones and severe gastritis. He went back into the hospital this morning for surgery. He lost fifteen pounds in one week. He has really suffered. Pray for him. He is my right hand man on my river trips. My church and my family does not allow me to travel alone anymore. Hudson is almost always with me on the river, so we need to stay healthy.

Things are going very well at church. There were two saved in our last Sunday afternoon service and then three more in the evening service. I have had a terrible cold over the past ten days, but I was still able to preach. Of course, as soon as I come out from behind the pulpit the cough grabs me again. We had over six hundred present Sunday morning when we had our monthly baptism and Lord's supper service. I was going to perform the baptisms, but because of my cold, I asked my son-inlaw, Pastor Dauro, to fill in. Well as it turned out, he broke my record for most baptisms in one service. I had performed fifty-two. Dauro baptized sixty!

Well right now I am in one of those phases when I am working very long hours, but don't seem to be getting much accomplished. I suppose that it will pay off eventually. Continue to pray for Bev and me.

Thanks for all of your prayers and support. God bless you as much as He has us. In Christ, Mike Creiglow

The Calvary Baptist Mission that I am pastoring has shown some growth both numerically and spiritually this past month; for this we praise the Lord. I do have an urgent prayer request for this mission work. Our contract runs out the first of April on the building we have been renting and the owner wants to almost double the rent. We must move and at this point it seems better to buy a piece of property and build rather than continue to rent somewhere else. This work has grown sufficiently the past three years and I do not doubt it will continue on until the Lord's soon coming. We need your help! Most suitable lots are running around \$20,000.00 (twenty thousand US dollars). I know the United States is in a deep economic recession at this time, but our Lord is never in a recession. Dear Friends, March 15, 2010 Our co-pastor, Oseias, recently wrote from Brazil sharing the great news that four adults were baptized and two more surrendered their life to Christ during the baptismal service. He also told us how thrilled he is with the supportive participation of the members in general.

We have received invitations to personally share what God is doing in our part of the world from several churches here in the USA, but we still have some dates available. Contact us at the above location if you would like to have us come share with you or your church.

I am still working with the NFL players on the dates for their visit to Curitiba, Brazil, to share the gospel through football among the upstart Brazilian Football League. This is an amazing ministry opportunity that we want to take advantage of while we have it. Since arriving in the States, I have had a few "adventurous challenges." While working to help my dad in his scrap yard, I accidentally let a three hundred pound metal ramp fall on my shin and foot. I ended up with nine stitches and a foot that was swollen for a few weeks. I also suffered an accident in a newly purchased (used) car a week after the purchase. It was totaled, but thankfully no one was injured. Maybe it's because I have been out of the country so long I have lost touch with how things are done here. I only know that I am thankful for God's constant protection.

Our son, Brennen, has been eating up the opportunity to play soccer in the U.S. He has played in Brazil since he was six years old; he's now twelve. His school team went undefeated and won the championship trophy. Now he is playing for a local soccer club and he really enjoys it. I am the loud and proud soccer dad on the sidelines yelling at the top of my lungs, but we both have had the opportunity to share our relationship with Christ through our contacts at the practices and games. It is one type of "natural evangelism" that we try to teach to our people in our ministries in Brazil.

Mostly Rainy Here In Kenya ... Four Pastors Start Driving School ... the hearts of my hearers and so I will continue

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings from East Africa: March 12, 2010 Hello dear friends in the United States. I understand that many of you have had guite a snowy winter. Well, while it has been snowing on you, it has been raining on us. January is usually rainy here but this year December, January, and February have been mostly rainy. The roads have turned muddy again, my guard dogs sit at the door of the house and whimper to get in, and my car has sprung a leak somewhere, meaning every time it rains the driver's side seat is soaking wet and water drips on me from the roof when I am driving. Am I getting any sympathy? Probably not, given all the many feet of snow most of you have received over the past three months.

Things are going fairly well here. I preached last Sunday on, "The Sheep Which Was Lost" from Luke 15. I would have rather entitled my sermon "The Lost Sheep," but I couldn't figure out how to say "The Lost Sheep" in Swahili because as far as I know there is no adjective in Swahili for "lost." Thus, I had to use the passive voice of the verb and had to say, "The Sheep Which Was Lost." I enjoyed very much preparing for and preaching this message and praved and prayed that: 1) It would be understood by the people that came; and 2) That the Lord would use the message to draw a lost soul to Jesus Christ for salvation. The Lord answered at least half of my prayer as I believe the message was well understood by the congregation. However, as far as I know, no souls were gloriously converted on Sunday. I know, however, that the Lord can still be working in

to pray for those who heard, knowing that God's word does not return to him void but accomplishes the purposes for which he sent it out. I know I'm supposed to be satisfied with God's timing in all things (this is good and proper theology, I know), but does anyone else get discouraged when they don't see God moving in the hearts and lives of people the way you would like to see it? Gracious me, I know that no good missionary is supposed to ever get discouraged, but I sure would like to see God doing great things in the hearts and lives of his people and in the lost. Pray with me towards this end, won't you? (And, of course, pray that I would accept God's timing in all things as well).

The four pastors here have started their driving school to learn to drive their pikipiki (motorcycles). None of them have a drivers license so this was the necessary first step for them to start their taxi business. I think their driving test is sometime next week so by the time you actually get this update they should have already taken and passed their test and received their drivers licenses. After that I will be able to look into getting their motorcycles so that they can start their businesses and bring in an income to support their families. This whole program is one of the necessary steps we need to take to get these pastors and their churches independent of the missionary. I hope to continue working with them over the next nine months to bring them to a place where they can function without missionary support and intervention. I don't mind continuing to teach and guide them but I want them to function as independent, selfsufficient New Testament churches by the time I leave on furlough in December of this year. We still have a lot of work to accomplish to get them to this point, but with the Holy Spirit's help we can do even this.

Dear Co-Laborers, March 8, 2010 I will start by encouraging you to attend the Spring Conference in Lexington, Kentucky. We were able to be there in 2009 for the first time in ten years and it was a great blessing to us.

As Marianne was leaving yesterday, she inquired about our neighbors across the street. They have moved back to Germany. Though they attended for some time, none of them made a profession of faith. Marianne, who is originally from Germany added, "They are much more likely to encounter Christians who will witness to them in Germany than here.' How true this is. The total number of individuals who are members of Baptist churches (of all stripes) in France is about 3,000. Most French people will

not knowingly meet a Baptist person in their lifetime. In Germany there are 300,000 members of Baptist churches. Please pray for the people who live in France. Outside the Muslim countries, France is one of the most spiritually needy countries. In fact, a good number of the Christians in France are not French people, but immigrants.

So, we continue to sow the seeds of the Gospel. Many have heard the Gospel and a few have responded. The believers of the congregation here in Tournefeuille show signs of growth and some are helping with the teaching. As in the United States and around the world, they are not immune from satanic attacks. But, if they are really God's children, greater is He that is in them than he that is in the world. Last week, Veronique, who was saved and baptized three years ago, called to have us come and visit. She had really gotten sidetracked from her walk with the Lord and this was an answer to prayer. What is happening in Mazere, L'Union, Plaisance du Touch, Porto, and Seville, encourages us. These and other places are getting a gospel witness because the Lord has placed us here, opened doors and moved you to support us. Our (you and us) labor in the Lord is not in vain.

Last Friday the family that host the Children's Bible Club in L'Union hosted a pot luck supper for the parents of the children who come to the Bible Club. This gave us the opportunity to get better acquainted with these parents. About half

of them are not saved. The lady who hosts this club also wants us to have a Vacation Bible School at her home this Spring. This lady is saved but not baptized and her husband is not saved.

Judy and I celebrated thirty-seven years of marriage yesterday. It has been a wonderful partnership. It is really wonderful to have a spouse who loves the Lord and is serving along with you. It is also a great blessing to have all of our children actively serving the Lord.

In family news, Carrie and McKenna are continuing well. Carrie continues to go to the district hospital to provide the mothers and babies with supplies that are much needed here. So many have been helped through donations to this ministry, and we thank each of you for your sacrificial giving. McKenna is now almost two years old and really growing and developing. What a blessing it is to be a parent, but also what responsibility is involved in raising her. Please pray for both Carrie and I, that we would be the parents that God would have us to be.

2010 SPRING MISSIONS CONFERENCE

CONFERENCE THEME: "FILLING THE EARTH WITH HIS GLORY!" - Habakkuk 2.14 "For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea."

This exact, precise language is repeated again in Isaiah 11.9: They shall not hurt nor destroy in all My holy mountain, for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea. [You will find other abbreviated expressions of this same theme in Psalm 72.18-19, Isaiah 6.3 and 40.5.]

The prophets are not just using eloquent literary flourishes when they speak with such soaring words like 'as the waters cover the sea.' They are speaking under the inspiration of God's Holy Spirit, and they are communicating to us what God's own covenant purposes are for the message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

They are describing in figurative terms REAL, CONCRETE MISSIONS ACTIVITIES that will have the effect of COVERING and SATURATING the populated world with the KNOWLEDGE OF GOD'S GLORY. God is declaring to them...and to us...that the day is coming when the Good News of His Glory will be witnessed and proclaimed to EVERY NATION ON THE FACE OF THE EARTH. [See Revelation 14.6-7].

This 'knowledge of the glory of the LORD' is the Gospel we have been commissioned by Jesus Christ to preach to every creature under Heaven [Mark 16.15; Colossians 1.23].

It is the Gospel of Christ's Kingdom; it is the Gospel of God's Grace; it is the Gospel of the New Covenant; it is the Gospel of GOD'S GLORY IN JESUS CHRIST.

God has commanded us to FILL THIS DARKENED WORLD WITH THE LIGHT OF HIS GLORY IN THIS GOOD NEWS! 2 Corinthians 4.3-6. But even if our Gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, whose minds the god of this age has blinded, who do not believe, lest THE LIGHT OF THE GOSPEL OF THE GLORY OF CHRIST, who is the image of God, should shine on them. For we do not preach ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord, and ourselves your bondservants for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to give THE LIGHT OF THE KNOWLEDGE OF THE GLORY OF GOD IN THE FACE OF JESUS CHRIST.

If anyone doubts that this Old Testament promise is a MISSIONS MANDATE and another expression of Jesus Christ's Great Commission ['As you are going, MAKE DISCIPLES OF ALL THE NATIONS...'] – then read Isaiah 11.10, which immediately follows God's Missions Purpose Statement in Isaiah 11.9: 'And in that day there shall be a Root of Jesse, Who shall stand as a banner to the people; for the Gentiles shall seek Him, and His resting place shall be glorious.'

What 'day' does Isaiah foresee here? 'In that day' is OUR DAY – THE GOSPEL-DAY – THIS 'DAY OF SALVATION'. We know that promise is fulfilled and enacted by New Testament Gospel missions because Paul interprets it that way in Romans 15.12, [in fact, the whole chapter], where he is relating for us what inspired and motivated him to FILL THE THEN-KNOWN EARTH WITH THE GLORY OF JESUS CHRIST IN THE GOSPEL.

And Paul summarizes his whole ministry purpose, goal, and itinerary: so that from Jerusalem and round about to Illyricum I have fully preached the Gospel of Christ' [verse 19].

Listen to all these powerful MISSIONS MANDATES that propel us into all the nations of the earth to COVER THE EARTH WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OF CHRIST'S GLORY...AS THE WATERS COVER THE SEA. (Matthew 24.14, John 17.17-23, Acts 17.22-34, Romans 1.5; 1.13-16; 16.25-27, Revelation 14.6-7.

So, THAT IS WHAT THIS CONFERENCE IS ALL ABOUT. THIS IS WHAT BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS IS ALL ABOUT. This is what MISSIONS is all about. This is what THE GOSPEL is all about. This is what THE MINISTRY OF OUR CHURCHES is all about. "FILLING THE EARTH WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OF GOD'S GLORY."
