

Dear Brothers and Sisters, April 5, 2010 Hope all is well with each of you. We are doing great. The beginning of this year has been a good one and full of new things.

We have made new plans for us here at Alpha and Omega. There has been no decision made from the court. The court was still hearing the testimonies against us. But the persecution is still around. In January there was a lady taking pictures of the kids in the park on Sunday morning. The kids had just arrived on the bus and were playing while waiting for the others to arrive. The person took the pictures to the prosecuting attorney and said that we were taking kids in again. So the city council came to take the kids that we had here illegally. Well needless to say they didn't find any one here illegally. We have five kids here that we have guardian papers for and all the others that live here are families or adults. Since it looks like things are not going to change any time soon we have changed our statute to a social educational association. We are going to work with reaching out to parents and through them reach out to the kids. One of the things is our library. We have many books and the library is a good size. We are going to open it up to the public and along with library have some classes for adults. The classes will range from will also offer craft courses where we want to encourage mothers to come with the kids. We will be buying more books as we can. We have all kinds of books that people can take out to read. We want to increase the number of Christian books available. We are remodeling the area where the school patio

was. We want to fix it up to be used as a multipurpose area, for relaxation, reading and small groups. We are fixing the floor and redoing others with pieces of white marble. Soon we will paint the area and place tables and sofas for the lounge area. The classrooms that we will use for the courses are being cleaned and checked for little things that need to be fixed.

The church is doing great. We have had new adults coming. What we are excited about is the number of teens that are coming. Teens are always the hardest age to keep in church. Also we have been working with the agricultural school in town. They have over thirty kids that are from out of town that live at the school. They have been coming to church. Pray that we can continue to reach out to these kids.

One of our big emotions for this last month was the wedding of one of the first boys who lived with us in our home in Vera Cruz. This is the city where we first lived when we came as missionaries to Sao Paulo in 1986. Luiz Brito came to live with us when he was thirteen years old. He was in third grade and hated school needless to say.



He was on drugs and did anything he could to get his drugs. Well, in 2008, he graduated from law school and this year he got married to a young lady who came to work with us a few years ago. It is very encouraging when you see someone use every chance they have to change their life for the best. God bless them. Luiz leads the music ministry in our church.

Dear Friends, April 8, 2010

I arrived back in Brazil last Friday, though only for a couple of weeks. Before we decided to take some furlough time in the U.S. this year, we had already scheduled a week of Evangelism in the public schools and parks working with the youth ministry of Bell Shoals Baptist Church, so I needed to return during these days of ministry. My wife, Charlene, and our son, Brennen, stayed in Florida since Brennen is still in school. Our daughter, Jessie, will be accompanying the group from Bell Shoals to Brazil as a translator. She is really looking forward to this event for several reasons. She really wants to be used of the Lord to share the gospel with her native Brazilians. She also hasn't returned to Brazil since leaving home in 2008 to go to college in the U.S. and she wants to touch base with her home church and old friends. The group will be made up of over forty youth and adult leaders and we will be taking the Gospel to over 5,000 students and adults during the course of one week. Please pray that God will use, protect and bless these volunteers as they reach out to the lost here in Curitiba, Brazil.

Several pastors have contacted me to invite us to share our work with them and

their churches while we will be in the States. We still have some open dates available, so if you also would like to know more about how God is working through us in southern Brazil, feel free to contact me at the above address/phone information.

Projeto Vida, our itinerant evangelism ministry, had the opportunity to be in many cities this past month. They also hosted ten missionary candidates from sister churches who were seeking training in outreach methodology. This ministry has been greatly blessed of the Lord to take the Gospel to groups and locations that are usually difficult to reach. They travel on busses that have been converted into motorhomes housing and transporting the twelve team members and all their equipment. We now have four teams and three busses. Our fourth team works in the area of our own city while we pray and look for a fourth bus.

Our son, Brennen, after six years of studying in Portuguese, is now having the opportunity of going to school in the USA and studying in English. He began by having to jump right into the middle of the sixth grade in January. He seems to really enjoy school and making new friends. He also brought his soccer abilities with him. In Brazil, soccer is the number one pasttime for male youth and Brennen is no exception. His skills on the soccer field have helped him establish a healthy self-image while dealing with being the new kid in class.

We thank all of you who have been praying for us and have contributed financially so that we may be able to take the Gospel to the lost and train those who believe. May the Lord bless you for your faithfulness.

Begin Another Institute Class... Seven People Killed In Landslide . . .

Dear Friends.

April 8, 2010

March was another hectic month for Anita and me. First I drove to Pucallpa (a town in the central jungle where we lived for seven years), in order to hold a weekend meeting with the Jordan Baptist Church of Pucallpa. This was the first church we started in Peru twenty-two years ago. I enjoyed the time with Pastor Daniel Gonzales and his dear wife, Bertha. It was good to see old, familiar faces once again. Even though I enjoyed seeing the folks there, to be honest, it was very hard to preach while there; it seemed to me that there was a "heavy" spirit hanging over the meeting. We had several decisions for Christ in spite of the difficulty. It was a blessing to be able to drive over the newly paved road for most of the trip. The last time I drove to Pucallpa the road was so bad, the dashboard of my van shook loose and rested on our laps! There are still some bad sections but I made the trip in about eight hours when it used to take fourteen.

After returning to Huanuco on Sunday the 7th, I began another Institute class on Tuesday morning the 9th. We only had thirtyfive pastors show up for the class, but we had a great time. Instead of daily lectures I made the class more of an interactive workshop dealing with "Computers and the Ministry." We spent the week teaching and practicing putting together MS PowerPoint hymn presentations; complete with accompaniment sound tracks. They each got to return to their homes with over one hundred hymn presentations along with a lot more material. It was a great week and Anita did all the cooking as usual. I still think many of them come just for her cooking instead of my teaching!!



In my last letter I mentioned the need of funds for purchasing some property for our newest mission work, the Calvary Mission Church of Huanuco. We have rented a temporary place for three months, just down the street from where we were. This gives us a little more time to locate the property the Lord has waiting for us. We just haven't found it yet!! The need is still great to raise the funds for purchasing the property when the Lord reveals it to us. Please pray with us about this and give as the Lord leads. Thank you.

On April 1st a huge landslide came down upon the small town of Cancejos (about one hour from Huanuco). Seven people were killed and still some others have not been found yet. The road (Central Highway) was blocked and traffic backed up for about five miles on both sides. I was trying to get to Tingo Maria for a special meeting, but after sitting for three hours on the road I realized I would never make it on time, so I turned around and went back home. Friday the



2nd I was able to make it to Tingo Maria and drive through the devastation in Cancejos. The village has about ten displaced families living in tents set up by the Civil Defense. Please remember these folks in your prayers as they struggle with their losses.



While I was in Tingo Maria for the meeting at the Bethel Baptist Church, another massive landslide struck the town of Ambo (twenty minutes away on the other side of Huanuco). Twenty-seven are known dead and close to forty are still missing. Entire two-story homes were completely buried beneath the rock and mud. One of the biggest tragedies in the Ambo landslide was a Christian Missionary Alliance Church that was having a prayer meeting when the mudslide came upon them and buried them all alive. The numbers vary from fifteen to twenty present in the meeting. Anita and I, along with the folks from our mission work, have taken clothes, food and water on two



occasions thus far to the temporary tent cities set up by the Civil Defense. Ambo has about one hundred tents set up for the displaced families. In a few more days we plan on taking personal sanitary items, (soap, tooth brushes and paste, etc.), and underwear. I am also hoping to get several boxes of Bibles to distribute among those that have lost everything. In a few more months we will try and help some of the families build a new home. Please be in prayer for these poor people that disease will not start and spread. The doctors are worried that any day now an epidemic might break out. Until next month

Short Visit To The United States ... Concentrating On Vocational School ...

Dear Friends, April 6, 2010

How wonderful it is to get to see and visit family and friends in the States. Barb and I made a quick trip home in February and got to see a lot of snow. Boy! What a difference in temperature; Brazil 104 degrees and in the States in the low 20's. I was thinking to myself at this time, maybe the trip was to get away from the heat (partially that was right).

We had two ladies visiting us this month. They did back yard Bible schools in two neighborhoods and helped in the two homes that were getting ready for the two widows in our church. They were a blessing to us and to the areas where they worked. Thanks Rebecca and Cathy!!! (See the picture below).



We have been and still are very involved with helping two widows in our church. One is building a new house and the other is remodeling her existing house. Grannies house is about two weeks from completion. This is the house that was below ground level and every time it rained this eighty-two year old lady had to bail water. She has lost furniture and appliances because of this problem. The other lady, Gloria, will be able to move into her house in approximately two weeks. This is the family that has six kids and the father died about one-and-a-half years ago. The mother provides for the family by selling fish.

We are also taking a counseling class in Sao Paulo each month to be able to help the people here through the Bible. Pray for us as the homework and the reading is extensive.

Sometimes we get so involved in the work that we allow "the work" to suffer. So we are trying to balance "needs" and keep the main thing the main thing. But isn't it AWESOME, we are about to move two widows into their new and remodeled homes. We serve an AWESOME God!!!

The reason that these homes have taken more than the usual time to complete is that we have been battling the elements-RAIN. As I am writing this letter we have been in a rain period (continual) for two days. The streets going into the various neighborhoods are covered with water and are only going to be getting more and more wetter. As we were entering into one neighborhood yesterday we passed one woman walking on the street with the water halfway between her feet and her knees. But thanks to God there is no water in Grannies home.

I don't know if I can blame the rain or not but we are in an Internet turmoil as of late. We cannot rely on it as it is maybe ves and maybe no when we want to use it. Oh well, in ALL things give thanks.

This year we are planning to concentrate on the Vocational School and the students that need to have training. We will begin with the dormitory and the finishing of it. It consists of three bedrooms and three baths, living room and kitchen. We have the walls and the roof and the concrete floors finished. We will need to put in the windows and doors and the electricity and the plumbing and the plaster walls and the bathrooms and the kitchen and the tile on the floors. All this will be ongoing with the classes that we will be starting next month. Our classes will include beginning carpentry, basic electricity for homes, and introduction to locksmith. Our first students will be from the surrounding area. They will be transported daily to the school. When the dormitory is completed we will then be able to have students living on site. This is an ongoing project and will fill a great need in this area as young boys fourteen to twenty-one years old need work experience and job training. This training will prepare them for their future.

It goes without saying that Barb and I are blessed beyond measure. We have some of the most AWESOME friends in the world.

We were going over some of last ears accomplishments, construction, the Kingdoms work, and just plain personal growth. All this accomplished through God who gives us friends, churches, and concerned Christians. How AWESOME is He whom we serve! "THANKS EVERYONE." Without you through Him it would be impossible.

We are planning several work groups for 2010 and a couple of backyard Bible Schools. Pray for us and these helpers as they come to work and minister. And mark your calenders because in November of 2011 we are planning a Pastors Conference. We are hoping to have Pastors from all over Sao Paulo State to come to this conference. This will be a great opportunity for outreach. We are asking that you be in constant prayer for this event.

Brethren, April 7, 2010

Here at First Baptist Church we have had different numbers of pastors over the past few years. For a long time I was the only one. Later one more was added. Then another. In 1998 we put on two more. We were at five for a while. One is now working with Bethel Baptist Church. Last month the church added two more: Benjamin and Ezi. So now we have six pastors. This helps keep me free to concentrate on missions, which just happens to be one of the ministries that I head up. I still carry more ministries than the other guys. They each have at least one full time ministry that they account for. Most have three or more areas that they take care of.

We have had great crowds over the past few weeks and three or more saved every Sunday.

On March 27th, we had a special service to promote our IDE projects. IDE, by the way, means "go." This project was

started ten years ago by a small group of volunteers led by Franisco Nunes, nicknamed Zico. He is our mission's director, works directly under me and is one of our staff members at church.

This time ten years ago they started doing dental hygiene, cutting hair, giving used clothing, teaching little kids Bible stories and sharing the Gospel in villages along the rivers and roads. The project has expanded in many ways. They continue all the great things they started out with, but have added medical help, dental help, free medicine, food, craft courses. The number of volunteers has grown to over seventy. The project now reaches whole cities with populations of as many as twenty-five thousand. The expenditures have also grown! One five day project in one of the larger towns can cost as much as \$15,000.00. This money is all raised right here in Brazil. They are now working on getting a pickup truck and a bus. They want to equip the bus for moving the team, but also using it as a mobile clinic. Zico has done a great job in creating and managing this project.

We had over six hundred present for the special service on that Saturday night. The church gave a special offering of over \$1,500.00 that night. Pray for this team as they continue to share the Gospel as they help with people's physical needs.

Thanks for all your prayers and support.

God bless you as much as He has us.

As I write this update, Resurrection Sunday has just passed. We celebrated the resurrection of our Lord with the members at Imani (Faith) Baptist. We enjoyed the service, but the Sunday was much like other Sundays. It is not celebrated with great exuberance here in Kenya. In reality, however, should we not celebrate the resurrection of our Lord with great exuberance every Sunday?

In personal news, Julie and I just celebrated our 18th wedding anniversary. The years go by faster and faster as we get older, but Julie is still as beautiful as the wedding picture I'm looking at right now in my office. Emily also turned fifteen. She turned fifteen while away at school, but after she returned home we celebrated with Nathan and Carrie Radford and our dear Muslim friends Ozzy, Sadaf, Daud, and Shazia. We continue to pray for opportunities to witness to these dear friends of the love of Christ. Josiah is at the point in his life where he likes to play soldier, policeman, knight and superhero with guns, swords and knives. He's too young for the real things and you can't find toy guns, swords and knives in Kitale so Josiah makes his own with sticks he finds in the yard. Then he runs around the yard either saving things or destroying them, whatever seems to be in his mind at the time.

Amy is walking around in her "Little House On The Prairie" outfit.

In ministry news, I have already purchased two of the four motorcycles that I need to buy for the pastors. Again, I am buying them these small motorcycles to use in a taxi business in a rent-to-own program. They will rent the motorcycle from me, use it to earn income on a week by week basis, and when they have paid off the motorcycle they will own it. This is a big, necessary step in helping them to become independent of the missionary. Pray that the program works, beloved.
