We started emphasizing our need to stabilize our monthly General Fund giving back during the 2008 Spring Conference. We called it MONTHLY GENERAL FUND SOLVENCY. Our goal was - and is - to increase our monthly General Fund giving to supply at least the \$44,000.00 we need each month just to provide our missionaries with their salaries, standard expense accounts, hospitalization premiums, and Mission Sheets correspondence with you, their faithful supporters. We call those commitments ESSENTIAL MAINTENANCE TRANSACTIONS, [EMT, for short], or TIER 1 disbursements.

We knew when we introduced that emphasis that it might jeopardize some of our giving to the Thanksgiving Offering. We hoped and prayed it would not, but we knew that possibility existed. We still continue to pray to God - and appeal to you that we maintain equal and simultaneous focus on both our MONTHLY GENERAL FUND SOLVENCY and our THANKSGIVING OFFERING

We also need a very generous Thanksgiving Offering to supply all the other "TIER 2" disbursements we have committed to our missionaries from the General Fund. Those disbursements amount to an additional monthly average of \$5000-6000 per month.

I have just received and processed our offerings from October. Our giving to the General Fund during October was down significantly. I have just done the preliminary calculations for our missionaries' monthly deposits. I will need to make an additional deduction of \$10,545.55 from what I would ordinarily deposit to their accounts. I will

Dear Friends, November 9, 2011
We are thankful every day of the year for all of God's mercies and gifts, but the month of November reminds us doubly of all that He has gifted us with. We are truly amazed at how mighty He is and how gracious to give us the privilege of living

for Him and serving Him in this calling.

I had a lot of fun since our last report. At our new church construction site I worked with a visiting volunteer from another state of Brazil. He is more of the computer type than he is the physical labor type, but he was game enough to accept an invitation to help prepare our floors for pouring concrete. We had to do some digging in some hard packed rock littered red clay for several hours. Then we had to haul a dumptruck load of sand from one location to another by whee!barrrow. Then we had to level and packdown the floors for final preparation. By the end of one day, our visitor said he couldn't even hold a shovel tight enough to lift it up. He had to spend a couple of days off so that he could use the keyboard again to help us prepare to record a soundtrack for an evangelistic skit we're working on.

We have found a way to get our concrete for our floor much cheaper. It will require some awful working hours and will make it difficult to find available workers, but we can hardly pass up the savings. The concrete company often has a few extra cubit yards of concrete left over at the end of the day. Rather than return to their factory and pour the excess material on the ground to harden and take up space, they prefer to have customers who will accept this material at the end of the day for a fraction of the retail cost. We will have to begin to pour quickly-hardening concrete after 6:00 pm and haul it by wheelbarrow loads to the desired spots because the company only dumps it all at one time in a convenient spot for them to get rid of their load and get back to the company to clean up their trucks.

The savings for us will be tremendous, though, so pray for us to have the strength reserves to go long days at strenuous work.

I want to reiterate my earlier request for football players who would be willing to use the athletic skills for sharing the gospel. I will be meeting with the chaplain for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers tomorrow, November 10th, to discuss the details on how we can have professional and amateur players and coaches use football as a platform to take God's word through their testimonies and attitudes to the fledgling Brazilian Football League. If you know of any young men who might be interested in such an opportunity, please contact me at the numbers above.

Our Project Life evangelistic teams will be out on the highways and into several

Dear friends and family, November 2, 2011

I thought some of you would enjoy seeing a current picture of our son and daughter, Joshua and Leah. Most of our supporters still remember them as young kids, but they are now in their midthirties, each married with "young kids" of their own! This picture was taken in



July while they attended my father's funeral service in Tennessee.

We had two young women place their trust in Jesus Christ as their Savior over the past two months at the Calvary Baptist Mission Church here in the Andes Mountains of Huanuco, Peru. Looking over my records it appears the median age for someone trusting Christ at this work has been between eighteen and twenty-five years of age. This mission work has an excellent group of young folks that are hungry to learn more of God's Word.

Recently I began a Discipleship class on Saturday afternoon at their request. Four young men and four young women attend



and eagerly participate as I teach them how to disciple others in the truths of God's Word. When I told them they would receive a Certificate in Discipleship from the Baptist Institute of Biblical Studies they got excited; until I told them what their final test would be - they had to disciple me! A few of the girls looked petrified but they all rose to the challenge and are working hard. Please pray for this enthusiastic group of young Christians that they will continue to devote themselves to their studies. They are the future of this work.

Anita and I have always been involved in planting new churches during our twentynine years here in Peru. Over the years, we have seen numerous churches in the States as well as some here in Peru flourish for a time, only to split, die or cripple themselves in legalism. I attribute this to pastors assuming that their congregations are sound in doctrine because they have taught

sound doctrine from the pulpit. A fatal assumption for sure! I read somewhere years ago that only fifteen percent of the people are actually tuned in and listening at any one moment during the preaching service. Folks can be looking right at you and be thinking about lunch, football, the naughty child behind them, their aching feet or any number of other distractions. There is a tendency for the human mind to drift in and out while being taught, whether at school or at church. Nothing can properly replace the true learning experience of personal instruction where dialogue and questioning are part of the process. Testing, whether formal or informal, is necessary to insure that knowledge of Biblical truth has been retained. Interactive Sunday School classes, small study groups, or other special teaching venues are crucial for a church to insure its preservation and future growth. In Acts 20:20 the Apostle Paul said he not only taught publicly but also from house to house; he kept back nothing that would have been profitable for their spiritual growth. Teaching and working with small groups of believers week after week may not be as flashy or as fun as big Bible conferences or weekend retreats, but it will insure the lasting and solid spiritual growth of a church.

Enough sermonizing! Anita has begun a cooking class after church service on Sunday afternoons. She uses this venue to



teach them about personal hygiene and the importance of washing the fruits and vegetables and using only treated or boiled water. Most of these poor saints always seem to be sick and know very little about these matters. The bonus is they also have learned how to make cornbread! You southerners will be glad to know that now, in this part of Peru, combread is becoming commonplace on the table! Next week she is going to teach them how to make homemade strawberry jam to go with the combread. She is a marvel and loved by all, especially me!

The need for people to hear the Gospel and be saved, the need for God's people to he faithful in sowing unto the ends of the earth do not change. Another great change is the one that happens in the lives of men and women and boys and girls who believe that Jesus died on the cross for their sins. The marvelous change we have seen in lives during fifty-six years in Brazil is like a continuation of the book of Acts. How blessed we have been to have the joy of telling the old, old Story of Jesus and His love.

PROGRESS ON THE BUILDING IN
ASSAI: This week the builder of the prefab
parts put the roof on the building. Now we
can make arrangements with a builder to
finish the building. Finishing means the
walls, windows, doors, bathrooms and floor.

PRAY FOR ASSAI: This city has about twenty-five thousand inhabitants. Close to seventy per cent are Japanese descent. The name Assai means sunrise in Japanese. After six (seems like ten) years of work here there is one baptized believer. Another family of five were saved and baptized, but moved to another city. One day the work will grow and extend to other parts of the world. There are two girls waiting to be baptized in the next week or two.

WORKS DOING WELL IN URAI: Two adult couples have been saved and baptized recently in the Urai Church. Both of the men are called to preach and are studying in our Seminary in Cornelio Procopio. There are seven seminary students from Urai. The mission points in Susumo and Rancho Alegre are going well. Assai is thirty-five miles from Urai, Susumo is another section of town and Rancho Alegre is twenty miles away.



## Have Temporary Custody of Kenyan Boy... Please Pray For Us... he was being committed to another lovel

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Something quite extraordinary has occurred to our family this month that I would like to share with you all in this newsletter because I think it will be of interest to you. We have had a temporary addition to our family and, no, it isn't a cat, dog, parrot, monkey or any other kind of animal you could get here. And, no, Julie didn't have a baby. Actually, the addition has come in the form of a ten year old Kenyan boy named Philip.

Here is how and why we have temporarily acquired Philip. Philip is from the Turkana tribe here in Kenya and has been living with his sick mother and two year old sister in a small town near the Uganda border. He had never known his father, and his mother was dying of AIDS. His two year old sister, Esther, is also HIV positive. While his mother was in the hospital here in Kitale, Philip was her caregiver in the hospital, and also the soleprovider for his one year old sister during the same time. Can you imagine having this kind of responsibility as a nine year old kid? Well, a year ago, as you can probably guess, Philip's mother died and he was left alone with Esther. Not knowing what to do, he hauled Esther onto his back and carried her twenty miles to the village where his grandmother was supposed to be. He found her and informed her of her daughter's death, and she was going to let them live with her, but then she disappeared; she just abandoned them. This left Philip and Esther alone in the village to fend for themselves for a whole year. The two were finally picked up by Kenyan Children's Services one week ago, and Esther was sent to a wonderful orphanage that is run by missionary friends of ours here in Kitale. In this orphanage she will be well taken care of and loved. But Philip was sent to a center for street children - a very hard and difficult place to live; a place where life will be very difficult and where horrible things can happen. When Julie heard about Philip (which, by the way is a typical kind of story for kids here in Kenya), she was grieved in her heart and after talking to me about his predicament we decided to do what we could to help him. She started calling other friends here in town who run orphanages and found out

he was being committed to another lovely orphanage run by lovely Christian people, but that their newest orphan house wasn't complete yet. We decided to take him in until that house is complete. So, Julie drove to the center for street boys, found Philip, took him (this was legal because she was with the directors orphanage who would eventually care for him), bought him a mattress, clothes, toothbrush, etc., and brought him to our home where he will stay with us until his future home is prepared and ready.

Philip is a lovely and delightful little boy who was very dirty, sick, and anemic when Julie brought him home (you should have seen the water in the bathtub after he was finished with his first bath!). It has been a joy to have Philip in our house and to give him the care and love that he would never find out on the streets. He has had to learn how to use a toilet, brush his teeth and play like a child. These are all "firsts" that he has never done before. He is learning to adjust to living with our family and he is adjusting well and likes to throw the football with Josiah and work on jigsaw puzzles with the kids. He is also recovering from malaria and typhoid and hopefully is getting stronger. We enjoy praying together with all the kids and singing songs about Jesus in English and Swahili before bed (Philip speaks only Swahili, not a word of English, but somehow the kids manage even though they cannot communicate well). He still doesn't speak much but he does now smile a lot. I am saddened when I think of the different lives this nine year old boy and my ten year old son have lived. Just this morning I was thinking about this example: My ten year old son, Josiah, can add, subtract, do long multiplication and long division problems; add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions; understands equivalent fractions; can find areas and perimeters of objects; knows how to read story problems and figure out how to solve them; etc. Philip, on the other hand, can count to ten but has never been taught any other math skills whatsoever. He can't even recognize numbers on a page. However, I think God loves this little boy, is caring for him even now, and has brought him to us for a purpose. I am humbled that he is allowing us to care for him and love him until he can go to a more permanent place where he will also receive love and care. We would ask that you join with us in praying for this little boy, for his care and for his relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

Dear Brethren,

November 2, 2011

Several months ago Brother Archer invited me to supply for him while he and Judy would go on a two week vacation. It was understood that they would already be gone before I would arrive in Kirksville, Missouri, and I would be leaving Kirksville before they returned. It is about a nine hour drive from Lexington, so to make the trip a little easier, I visited my good friends Art and Rhodie Donley, in Harrisburg, Illinois. I preached to The Bible Baptist Church on Wednesday night before moving on, on Thursday.

While in Kirksville, I stayed in the Archer's home and spent the first two days finding my way around the city with the help of my GPS. Glenn had left a long list of information and instructions, but one of the first things I told the congregation on Sunday morning was, things would not get done, as Brother Archer did them, but that they would get done and for the two weeks that followed they did get done.
