TRAVEL DIRECTIONS

FROM SOUTH ON 1-75: Get off at Exit 104 (Athens-Boonesborough). Turn west toward town. You will be on Athens-Boonesborough Road / Richmond Road Extension. As you approach Lexington, the road will become Richmond Road around Jacobson Park. Continue straight into Lexington. Richmond Road will become Main Street. You will pass the Rupp Arena / Lexington Convention Center on your left. Turn left at the next traffic light. This is Jefferson Street. Turn right in the middle of the overpass bridge onto Manchester. About one mile down Manchester. Manchester, turn right on Thompson Road and come to the top of the hill.

However on the other side we have renewed many old friendships and made some new friends. We have been in contact with several new churches this trip and are glad to say that God is providing some new support. Pray for us as we have changed the oil several times and this tells you how many miles we have put on the van and our bodies. With all this traveling we are beginning to feel the effect of the gas prices. But these prices are still two times lower than prices in Brazil.

While home we have tried to get all our checkups done well we have been poked

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The short rains have kicked in here in Kitale. It rains every day again. These rains are needed so that the ground is ready for the farmers to plow and plant. These rains last only a couple of weeks, though, and then the dust season should return for a while. The skies are rumbling with thunder far off even as I speak. The rain is nice as it washes the dust off of everything and is refreshing. Thinking about rain reminds me about one of my favorite verses in Isaiah. Isaiah 55:10-11 says, "For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, And do not return there, But water the earth, And make it bring forth and bud, That it may give seed to the sower And bread to the eater, So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it." What a great promise to remind us that God shall accomplish all his purposes here in Kenya. The work that we do and the words that we speak in his name are not for nothing. He will take our feeble efforts and our ineffective words and somehow make them serve his purpose of bringing light and salvation to lost and dying people. If that is the case then I say let the rain fall on us in torrents and floods.

The works here are progressing, maybe not exactly according to my plan but certainly according to God's plan. (Just returned to my computer after a short hiatus. I needed to take to rescue Josiah's pet goat. Pet goats are one of the "benefits" of living

in Africa). I love to worship God with the Kenyan people and teach them from the Word of God. In recent lessons I have taught them about some of the basics of a relationship with God: Salvation, baptism. prayer, daily devotions, and the functions of a church. Some people know a lot already and some know practically nothing. Most are willing to follow the teachings of any man who calls himself a pastor. One of the cultural things that is taught here is that instead of immersing a person in water when baptizing, the person can just walk under a flag. I'm still not sure where that came from or the significance of it, but it is still a common practice. Another strong cultural practice is to receive a baptism card when baptized. While there is nothing inherently wrong with receiving a baptism card, in Kenya these cards can be used for identification, job applications and so on. This makes a person want to be baptized just to receive that card and not because he is identifying himself as a follower of Christ. These and other errors can only be corrected by teaching them to live their lives according to the Scriptures and not according to man-made rules of religion. It is a long, uphill battle that we face.

Finally, my family and I are excited about the upcoming visit from my parents, Norm and Mary Tate. They will arrive in Kenya just five days from today. This will be their second visit to Kenya since we arrived in 2008. On their first visit in February 2009, the Tate family here in Kitale was about to enter a long, difficult battle with culture fatigue. My parents witnessed us falling off the cliff and into the dark abyss of depression and fatigue. Hopefully, they will not have to witness this plunge again this time. It will be so good to have them here with us for the month since we so very much miss ALL of our friends and family from the States.

Until next month, beloved. May God's peace and joy be with you.

and prodded and now we are going home with a clean bill of health. I have wound up with new glasses, hearing aids (I am getting used to hearing many new things again) and new medications. It is AWESOME how God takes care of you through everything.

We would like to ask you to pray for my brother John Hensley as we just learned this morning that his wife Wanda Faye Hensley has gone on to glory. She had been ill since late November and God took her home this morning. Though this is a sad time it too is a glad homecoming.

I was able to go to a fire department retiree's dinner this trip back and got to reconnect with several old comrades and talk about the past. I could remember most of the faces but was unable to recall the names. My old computer is not what it used to be (lol).

In Brazil after the holidays the attendance is returning to normal. Last Sunday in Sunday School we had 101 in attendance and for the evening service we had 112. Our youth had a great retreat over the carnival holiday. What we try to do is give the young people and their friends something else to do over carnival that is uplifting and not carnal. They went to the hotel where the ladies of the church had their retreat last year and had a wonderful time in the baptisms and we baptized ten more people into the membership. And like all good Baptists there was a feast afterwards. When we came home to the States we were very busy with discipleship and it seems as though God is keeping on blessing and blessing in this area. We have much to do when we get back.

At the Pastors Conference that we had on the 1st through the 4th of November we encountered a mission work in Sao Paulo with the Jews that was in need of some help. And God instantly brought to my mind my brother in Texas and his pastor, Pastor Edge. He studied in Jerusalem for eleven years and teaches Hebrew in a University in Texas. His specialty is the Dead Sea Scrolls. So when we went to visit his church there in Bastrop, Texas, I presented him with the idea to help out this Brazilian brother. He graciously accepted doing a seminar there for them. Isn't God AWESOME!!! Pray for the planning for this seminar as we have tentatively set a date for September 2013.

Well the weather here is something different to say the least. But with six inches of snow this last weekend it is finally starting to look like winter and it is March. Go figure that. We have had fall type weather until now. The Bible speaks of these types of things. This makes me even more aware of the urgency to get out there and preach the gospel to all.

Well we will be going home to Brazil on the 2nd of April and will be ready to receive visitors right away, so get your passage and come on down. I think Barb will have time to get the beds ready and put a mint on the pillow. Come down and see what God is doing with your diligence of praying and giving to Baptist Faith Missions. Keep up the good work.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The tornadoes and storms through which many of you are going have been in the news here. We think about you and pray that the Lord will protect you from harm. This relates indirectly to one of our Bible studies this week. This study is in the book of the Revelation of Jesus Christ. The judgments on the lost world symbolized by the blowing of the seven trumpets draw our attention to the folly of human behavior.

Many people are concerned about protecting themselves from climate changes and the effects that these might bring on them. It is debatable whether we can do much to avoid these disasters. However, anyone can avoid the greatest disaster of all by trusting Christ and being eternally saved from all physical disasters. This is something that anyone, anywhere in the world can do. Yet, few are willing to surrender to Jesus Christ. Nevertheless, our mission here, and your mission there, is to bring to the attention of folks around us that Jesus is the only sure hope. May our Lord help us to do the job effectively.

I want to mention three individuals for whom I am very grateful as we study the Word of God with others. The first two are my parents who are still serving as missionaries in Brazil at eighty-six years old. They taught me and, by example, encouraged me to read through the Bible and then continue reading through the Bible. This lifelong practice has helped me to see God's revelation of Himself in a more complete and well rounded fashion than what is appropriated by reading most books and theological treatises and by listening to many well known preachers. Please, do not receive this as a condemnation of books or preachers. I am simply underscoring the value of knowing God's word thoroughly

and reviewing it regularly in its full scope. Thanks, mom and dad.

The other person who has had a great influence on me in understanding God's revelation is Edward Overbey. As my pastor during my college years, he helped me greatly to work toward a correct exegesis of biblical texts. His patient and peaceful manner provided me with an outstanding example of applying Christ like principles in my interaction with others. Thanks, brother Overbey.

All of our Bible Studies are going well. We now have ongoing studies in Colossians, Revelation, II Timothy and the Gospel of John. God continues to open doors and we do the best that we know how in sowing the good seed. Last year three people who had professed faith followed the Lord in baptism. We would like to see many more saved and baptized, but our job is to display the light of the Gospel, sow the good seed, and disciple those who trust Christ.

As a boy, I was a charter member of the first church established in the work of my father in Manaus. Three baptized in one year would have been a banner year. Now that church, which has started many other churches, baptizes 50 – 100 hundred people every month. Last month they baptized 300 newly saved folks. These are folks who are serving the Lord and being discipled. I have been there among them. They are faithful to God's word. So, what starts small can multiply just as the Lord taught. This encourages us to keep working and trusting God.

Thank you for participating with us in the work of the Lord. Your praying and giving is not in vain. Many of you supported the planting of that little church in Manaus.

Today, Judy and I celebrate thirty-nine years of married life serving the Lord together. It is a wonderful life. I asked God to give me the wife He wanted me to have. He gave and I have never been sorry for asking. Judy is a wonderful gift.

Two Trust Christ At Calvary Mission ... Coming To States In May ...

Dear friends and family. March 10, 2012 Mardonio and Liberata came for membership in the Calvary Baptist Mission-Church; the newest mission work that I am currently pastoring. This couple clearly represents a new socio-economic phenomenon that has developed in Peru during the past ten or more years. For centuries the Quechua speaking, Andean Mountain people have been dedicated to agriculture. Their custom is to live in small rustic villages with common wall, condominium style homes built out of adobe mud bricks with small windows and doors, covered over with a tin roof. During the day, they go out and attend to their 'chacras" (small farms) that surround the village. In the region of Huanuco, the main agricultural crop is potatoes

About the time Anita and I came to Peru in 1983, the government began trying to build elementary schools in these rural areas, all over the country. The government mandate was that the teaching given in these schools must be in the Spanish language and not in Quechua (the ancient Inca language). Soon the idea of speaking Quechua was considered "lower class" to



these dear folks and they do not want to be heard speaking Quechua when in the cities. All parents want the best for their children and soon the mountain folks began leaving the "chacras" and moving to the bigger towns and cities for better education opportunities for their children. The socioeconomic phenomenon is that Huanuco and many other cities like it are growing rapidly during this transition period. For those of you that have been to Huanuco in the past the mountains that surround our town are being covered in adobe brick homes. I would guess another five or six years and they will reach to the top of the hills.

Along with the population growth comes the hunt for jobs. It seems that most of them find the quickest way to make a living is investing in the small, threewheeled taxi vehicles imported from India.



The streets of Huanuco are now seemingly impossible to cross because of the constant traffic and lack of traffic enforcement. The noise level is at an all-time high. The good news because of the growth is that there are more people with which to share the gospel! I now see the feasibility of several more churches strategically located in the mountains surrounding Huanuco. Remember us in your prayers as the Lord brings us to mind. The field is still white unto harvest and the laborers are still few.

Two have trusted Christ this past month at the Calvary Mission. One young man named, Hitler, trusted Christ and has been very faithful in his attendance. He had a motorcycle accident about a month



ago and the operation to fix his foot was not done correctly, so now poor Hitler is waiting for a second operation to fix the first operation. It sounds strange to ask people to "pray for Hitler," but that is what I'm doing!

My counseling load has increased a lot lately and one young fifteen-year-old girl trusted Christ as her Savior last week. She made a serious attempt to take her own life recently and ended up in the hospital for three days. I had not seen a smile on her face in a long time but when she gave her life to Christ the biggest smile appeared! It was beautiful to see. I am seeing more cases like hers all the time. Christ is the only real hope for inner peace and joy this world has. He continues to change lives here in Peru just as he does all over the world. Serving the Master is a very rewarding life!

Thank you all for your constant prayers and support for this part of the Lord's work here in Peru, South America. We are seeing much fruit as a result of the labor and you folks make the labor possible. Anita and I are looking forward to seeing you soon when we come to the States for furlough in May. God bless you all! Until next month.

I nearly didn't get this letter prepared! I have a group of fifty-three youth and adults coming in from the Tampa, Florida, area tomorrow and, with all the preparations involved, I almost forgot to share with you what the Lord has been doing around here this past month. I mentioned last month that we were going to hold a family camp during Brazil's Carnaval holidays. That camp went really well. We had a very good turnout and we were especially happy to have some families participate with whom we have been sharing the gospel for a while. These families were very receptive to everything we taught from God's word and have seemed increase their interest in things relating to the Lord.

We had our missions training seminar near the beginning of the month followed up by a practical missions trip to four different towns. The Lord provided us with tremendous opportunities for sharing the gospel through dramatic skits, personal testimonies and Bible preaching. There were over 3,500 people present at our meetings during the extended holiday and many listeners professed faith in Jesus Christ. We have begun regular Bible

studies with sixty-nine of those and hope to see them baptized and growing in their relationship with Christ soon.

The construction at our new church work continues steadily. All the plumbing should be working by the time you read this report and we have had a steady increase in attendance at our meetings. We are very grateful to you who have contributed to this new church plant. God has used you to do several things that we are aware of, and probably many others that we aren't. Our own team members have given graciously, but they have been further encouraged by seeing that they are not alone as they economize in their family budgets. Having the joyful news that other brothers and sisters care and also want to see God's name glorified in spreading the gospel is very motivating as they feel the pinch of tightened resources from their giving toward the new work. Now they are praising God for using you to assist them in making Him known. Thank you very much.

Like I mentioned at the beginning of this report, tomorrow a group of fifty-three is arriving to work with us. We will be taking the gospel to six public schools during the course of a week and reaching out also in public parks and squares. We are especially happy that our daughter, Jessie, will be coming with the group as their translator guide. My team and I will be very, very busy during the course of this week, but we are very excited about the fact that many thousands of people will hear of our Lord Jesus Christ from folks who have made a great effort to come share His love. We pray God will be glorified and many will come to know Him personally.

Keynote Speaker At Seminar ... First Baptism Of Year On March 3rd ...

Dear Brethren.

March 7, 2012

One of my trips this month was much longer than usual, but was not a river trip. While still in the States I received an invitation to be the keynote speaker at a seminary in southern Brazil. At the time I didn't know that we were going to be in the States longer than anticipated, nor did I realize how cramped for time after returning to the field. Anyway, I took out ten days to speak to an average of two hundred students and local pastors at Maranatha Bible Institute in the state of Parana. It was their 50th anniversary celebration. The conference was four days and I spoke seven times. All the lessons and theme were from John 3:30. Although my speaking style is much different from what they are used to, I am hoping that the Holy Spirit uses it to enlarge His kingdom.

The return trip was exhausting. One nine hour leg by bus, followed by a fifteen hour flight from Sao Paulo to Rio Branco, and a twelve hour layover before the one hour flight home.

Things are going great here. There have been a number of folks saved and several

requests for baptism. One couple from our small group was saved and made a profession of faith in the Friday night prayer meeting at church. My son Andrew is the leader of our group, which meets every two weeks. Andrew pastors me in this group. He also pastors my son-in-law, Dauro, who is one of our local pastors, too. The group is already twice as big as it is supposed to be. We usually have over twenty people.

We held our first baptism service of the year on March 3rd. There were twentynine people baptized. One more person was saved and there were other requests for baptism the same day.

We are working hard on the annex. It is already in limited use. We can use the garage and some of the second floor. We have been in desperate need of more space for some time. I have been devoting quite a bit of my time to getting the next floor poured. As soon as that is finished I plan to build the metal structure and roof for the third floor. What we really need to do is relocate, so pray that something will open up.

We are praying for you. We know that things have become extremely tough financially in the U.S. I can definitely say that I feel your pain, because our support has dropped dramatically over the past five months. So, as God blesses you, please try to bring up or bring back your offerings to the General Fund of Baptist Faith Missions. Thanks for all of your prayers and support. God bless you as much as He has us.

52nd ANNUAL SPRING MISSIONS CONFERENCE CONFERENCE THEME: "THE FUTURE AND HOPE OF BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS" WHAT IS 'FUTURE AND HOPE'?

God gave this promise to Israel to assure them that He was not done with them, and that His kingdom purposes and plans were still very much on task, on target, and on time – and that, in truth, greater service and effectiveness was yet in store for them in their future. The struggles they were going through at that time were driving them to depend more on God, call more on God, and look more to God. They must just follow God into the future He was giving them – and hope only in Him.

God's 'thoughts' that He thinks toward us are His purposes and plans. God doesn't think fleeting, passing thoughts. His thoughts are His plans, the eternal counsels of His own will [as in Ephesians 1.1-14]. And, whatever God thinks, purposes, and plans – that He will do [Isaiah 46.9-11].

So, when God assures them [and us] that His plans are to give them [and us] 'an expected end,' He is promising them a FUTURE and a HOPE—and He will make it happen. Our King James translators have given us an alternate reading on 'an expected end.' It is 'Heb. end and expectation.'

- 'End' is 'FUTURE' where God is taking us, what God is going to give us, what God is going to do with us.
- 'Expectation' is 'HOPE'. Hope is not mere wishful thinking. Hope is a certain assurance and confident expectation that God will do what He has promised to do and give us what He has promised to give us.

WHAT IS OUR FUTURE AND HOPE?

Jesus Christ has promised to give His kingdom to us, His churches. When He established His church, He gave us 'the keys of the kingdom of heaven' [Matthew 16.18-19]. He commissioned and sent us into every nation of the world to preach and proclaim 'the gospel of the kingdom' [Mark 1.14 & Matthew 24.14]. When unbelievers receive the Gospel and God saves them by the Cross of Christ, the Holy Spirit calls them and births them into God's kingdom [John 3.1-8]. Then, Jesus Christ sets them in His churches as it pleases Him.

This is how the kingdom of God grows and increases in the world. This is how the will of God is done on earth as it is in Heaven [Matthew 6.9-13]. And, this is the FUTURE AND HOPE Jesus promises us when He says, "Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Jesus promises this FUTURE AND HOPE to His churches - and Baptist Faith Missions is a voluntary fellowship of such churches who are partnering together to preach His Gospel of the Kingdom in all the world as a witness to all the nations [Matthew 24.14]. We have been mutually committed to this purpose for the past 70 years - and we are committed to continuing His mission until He returns

The harvest is truly great and the reapers are not very abundant. We need laborers, urgently. People are needy, people are hurting and the only answer to their needs is Jesus.

This past month Alta and I have gone to the city of Assai each Sunday and needless to say, we, and the few who attend, have been thrilled to have the new building that was graciously built by the Chapada Baptist Church in Manaus.

On February 20th, about forty-five persons came from the Duartina Baptist Church and spent two days in fellowship with the Ural and Cornelio Proeopio churches. It was a great two days of Bible study and recreation. The Duartina Church was one we started in about 1976. Marcio Moraes, the pastor of Urai, was saved there.

One morning the phone rang and a brother asked if he could come and talk to me. He is a saved person, but his life is worse than that of the Samaritan woman. He has been married, separated and courted three others. God has been working in his life and he has come to realize his problem is there has not been any emptying of self and surrendering to the Lord. He has made some serious commitments to the Lord and he seems to be growing in grace.

Another similar case was a medical doctor who asked me to sit down and listen to his case. He is a professing believer. This is a summary: "I have all that a man could desire. I have a great family, I have all the material things a man could want or need. I have money and I am not happy. I am very unhappy." When we leave our first love — Jesus— and confide in things the world offers, this is the result. The Manual for Joy is 1st John—that your joy be complete.

There is a small circus here in town. Yesterday morning I visited it to talk to the people about the Lord. They stopped and listened with attention and some were moved. I gave them some books of John and Romans. Pray with me that some of those families will be in Heaven.

Dear Brothers of the Blessed Lord and Sisters of the Savior:

Once again we (Asa Mark and I) greet you from the Amazon Valley of Brazil, South America. The two million residents of Manaus, the capital of the state of Amazonas, are enjoying the pleasant weather of not quite so hot, due to the frequent rains. This rainy season we have had two city wide blackouts, several rains that flooded the city and they are predicting this year the river will rise to record heights.

During the month of February each Sunday morning, evening and Wednesday evening, I have left my house and home and gone by the taxi of one of our members, Brother Raimundo, of the 24th of March Baptist Church, where I either preached or heard a sermon by another preacher. Last month the church voted for an evangelist from the Beautiful Garden (Belo Jardim) Baptist Church of Manaus, to serve the 24th of March Baptist Church as my assistant pastor, during three months at

least. Pray for Brother Williams Mendes, forty-nine years old, and his family.

This Mission Sheets month began January 11th and finishes today. During this period I preached nineteen sermons, all at the 24th of March Baptist Church where I serve as the pastor. I have during this period heard a total of nineteen sermons preached at four different places. Also, I was able to cross the river and travel by car about an hour to dedicate the new building of the mission at that community. I heard Pastor Sebastiao de Oliveira, the blind preacher from Minas Gerais, preach to a full house.

I praised the Lord for her almost eighty-four years on this old earth, and our fifty-six years together, almost fifty-two here in Brazil. Sweet memories until we meet again.

I am praying that during this new year of 2012 that the missionaries of Baptist Faith Missions will receive their full salaries and benefits.
