TRIBUTE TO GLENN ARCHER



Glenn Archer passed through the valley of the shadow of death – from this life into the Presence of his Lord and Savior – on Friday, January 31. He had suffered from pulmonary fibrosis for the past year or so.

Glenn served his Lord and the missionaries who are supported through BFM as a Director for thirty-four years and as Treasurer for eleven years. He was a pastor of Baptist churches for fifty years, serving church families in Indiana, West Virginia, Kentucky, and Missouri.

For those of us who served with him in the service of our missionaries, Glenn was our friend, brother in Christ, confidante, counselor, and our 'true yokefellow' [Philippians 4.3] in the ministry of the Gospel and missions.

He was always the model of impeccable integrity, a 'sterling character of a man,' and the consummate voice of wisdom, reason, and grace. We could always depend on Glenn to be faithfully insistent on his convictions and principles, and yet be a moderating influence. He was always "easy to be intreated' [James 3.17], and deliberately so. He often quoted the Scripture "Speaking the truth in love" (Ephesians 4.15) as one of his cardinal rules for wisdom and counsel – and he lived by it.

Glenn taught us how to live in the faith...and he modeled for us how to die in the same faith. And, he was a life-long lover of missions and missionaries.

Here is, in full, the daily blog he sent out to many of us for years as he led us through the Bible with his Daily Devotions. Listen to his faith in Christ in his dying days and his continuing love for Gospel missions: Dear Friends: November 4, 2013

Death is an ugly enemy. "The last enemy [that] shall be destroyed [is] death." (1 Corinthians 15:26). However death is ours. "All things are yours: life or death. All are yours." We are in everything to give thanks unto God. How we handle death will either resound to His honor and His glory or to our shame. We can die grumpy old men and women, or we can die count-

ing our blessings, knowing that we have received better than we deserve.

Just now, we are waiting for the adoption, to wit: the redemption of the body. (Romans 8:23). When Christ died, He paid the price of our redemption. This old body that once served sin, has been by the presence of the Spirit of God made to serve righteousness. Yet, we are confined to this body of death (Romans 7:24). It is as though Christ has put us on lay-a-way, but He did so while we are still in this corruptible, mortal body. But this is not the body He bought. The body He bought will greet Him at the resurrection, when this mortal shall have put on immortality, when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption. In that day we will have a body like unto His glorious body (Philippians 3:21). "Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is." (1 John 3:2)

Just now I ask an interest in your prayers, not that I might not see death, but that I will handle this approach to death in a manner well pleasing in His sight. Ask that God grant me the favor of His grace to live for Him during all these struggles. Pray for Judy. She is a gracious soul. Many are her labors because of my sickness. Both of us need the grace of God to carry on for Him. I am glad I am saved.

Don't spend more time praying to keep saints out of Heaven than you do praying to keep sinners out of Hell.

All of the Bible studies and meetings are going well. I am including a picture of a ladies Bible study that meets in the home of Wendy Hinzman on Thursdays at noon. The tall young lady on the right is a member of our congregation who is a chiropractor. Her office is near Wendy's house so the ladies meet there during her lunch break on Thursdays. They have Bible study and then eat their sack lunches together for a time of fellowship. All of the ladies in this Bible study are believers. We are encouraged by the growth that we see in them. Everyone in this Bible study also serves in ministries to children and some are involved in reaching students and other outreaches.

Dear praying friends, February 5, 2014

This prayer letter will share some things that have been on my heart recently in regards to the harvest, as we will see from the book of Matthew. It is hard to believe that we are already into February 2014, as time is passing so fast. It is also hard to believe that our second daughter, Camille, will be turning three years old later this month. McKenna will be six years old in April. Where has the time gone? It seems like they were just babies. Time really does fly.

Recently, as I have studied the Scriptures and examined myself in regards to the harvest, I have been very challenged. Our Lord cares so much for the harvest and those that need to be reached, yet so many times it is easy to develop a cold heart and a forgetful heart in regards to my responsibilities.

Please consider the following challenging verses from Matthew 9:36-38. "But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd. Then saith he unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest."

Let us notice a few things from these verses. The Lord was moved with compassion toward the multitudes. Why? Because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having so shepherd. When I read these verses, I have to ask myself, Do I have a heart of compassion for the lost? For the

multitudes? Do I truly see them as the Lord did, as sheep having no shepherd?

Do I truly pray for the harvest the way that I should? How will I get involved in the harvest? Would I truly "sign up" to be involved in the harvest, even if it meant many difficulties, burdens, challenges, etc? These are questions that I have had to ask myselfwhen I read these verses. I hope and pray that I would. How we need to remind ourselves of verses such as these and see the heart of the Lord. I believe if we truly examine these verses, we will be personally involved in the harvest in some way, whether that is by praying, giving, or going. How is the Lord leading you to be involved in the harvest field? Will we truly have a heart of availabilty? YOUR JANUARY GENERAL FUND OFFERINGS

When you review the Contributions page in this issue, you will note that the monthly General Fund Offerings total given in January is \$26,723.10. First, we thank God and commend every one of you gives to the monthly General Fund. Without your faithful and sacrificial giving, our missionaries would not be receiving month-by-month what we are able to provide for them.

However, that being said, our total

However, that being said, our total monthly commitments to our missionary families – which must be supplied from the monthly General Fund – amount to \$43,300.54. Every month, that same amount must be disbursed just for their essential maintenance. If each of us will remember that number as we give to the monthly General Fund - \$43,300.00 – it will help remind us of the gigantic financial responsibility just to 'keep them on the field,' 'keep the lights on,' and supply their essential living and ministry expenses.

The way we were able to NOT reduce their deposits this month is because last month, the Lord supplied us with an extraordinarily generous monthly General Fund offering. (These were offerings given in December 2013 and disbursed in January 2014.) So, with the 'surplus' we received last month, we carried it over to supply deficits in future months – this month, February, being one of them.

But, when those 'surplus' balances are depleted, if the monthly General Fund Offering doesn't increase to meet the disbursement threshold [\$43,300.00], then we will do what we've had to do before – we will reduce the amount of disbursements to our missionary families by the proportionate amount we did not receive in General Fund offerings.

Now I am not saying that we have a Sunday School full of angels but it is great to see them in church on Sunday mornings, eager to hear about God. We have around forty in regular attendance, but with the holidays we are playing catch up right now. The kids are getting back to their normal routine.

Our church membership is now thirty and growing. This past week we had a baptism with four more new members added and this week we will be having another baptism. Pray for this new work and the new members. Our attendance on Sunday nights, which is our major service, is running from 50 to 80 people. God is truly in this new work.

As it is with many Churches, we have been having much sickness in our membership. We are asking that you join with us in prayer for these in their treatment and recovery. Mrs. Gloria, one of our widows is receiving treatment for cancer, both radiation and chemotherapy. Barb has been taking her to the Dr.'s appointments and treatments from three times per week or more.

Mrs. Jandira has circulation problems in her legs and has been bedfast for about three months. Leo had a moter cycle accident and broke his leg in several places and busted his knee cap. Damion has had surgery on his ear and is having problems with the healing. Cesar had a piece of equipment fall on him at work and has not been able to work for some time. Rosevaldo, our Brasillian Pastor, is having all of his teeth pulled and some of you know what he is going through with that. Maria Ivete has problems with her knees and is having physical therapy. Kiser has had by-pass surgery and is recovering at home. In all of these sicknesses we can only give thanks. Sometimes we think, how awful is this, but we as a church have taken it as a blessing. It has put us in our place, on our knees and looking up! Please join us in prayer for all these that are in need.

Along with Pj and Jenny our Brazillian son Edson has been with us here in Caragua for the holidays. Always great to have him here with us. When the holidays are over he will return to college he will start his fourth year of vet training. How AWSOME is that !!!God is so good.

Our daughter Mary and her family also got to spend some time with us. We got to spoil the grandchildren for almost two weeks. It is always great when they visit. For many of you I don't have to tell you how grandparents feel about grandchildren, they are AWSOME!!!

Well, it would not be another month without car problems, Barb's car needs shocks and the air conditioner is broken. My truck has starter problems and is in the garage with suspension problems. We had to wait two weeks for the parts and when we got them we took it to the garage to be fixed. Last night the mechanic came by the house to tell me that the parts were not the right parts. So now we will be another week without the truck. These cars are fifteen years old and need lots of prayers. Just another month on the field.

This week we went to Sao Paulo to do some work in an orphanage. There were many needs there getting their buildings back up to code. We were able to help with the ceilings, we had to rip out the old ceiling because they were not fire code and the replacement will be fire rated material. Seven men of our Church made the trip. Yes, it was hot, messy and tiring but playing with the children made it all worth while. We were

Baptist Faith Missions is a work of FAITH.

The First Baptist Church of Murray, Kentucky established the Amazon Valley Baptist Faith Missions for the purpose of evangelizing the unreached regions of tropical Brazil. It was a work based on FAITH from the beginning. Joseph F. Brandon began working in western Brazil in 1923. In 1941, the church that was raising his support ceased doing so.

Joseph Brandon entered into a faith covenant agreement with Hafford H. Overbey and Z.E. Clark. Mr. Overbey and Pastor Clark told Missionary Brandon, "If you will return to Brazil, we will raise the necessary funds." Hafford Overbey was then the manager of an A&P grocery store and teacher of a youth class in the First Baptist Church of Wheaton, Illinois. The young students in this Sunday School class became Missionary Brandon's first supporters through Baptist Faith Missions.

Brothers Overbey and Clark sent out letters to supporting (and prospective)



BFM - Our Function

Missions is why Baptist Faith Missions exists. Our FUNCTION is to bring glory to God by taking the Gospel to all the lost people of the world. As children of God and disciples of Jesus Christ in this present world, our mission is to advance the Kingdom of God by preaching the Gospel, baptizing the believers, and teaching them to obey all that our Lord has commanded. Missions is the responsibility of each believer and every church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptist Faith Missions does not ordain, commission, or send missionaries. Baptist Faith Missions enables Baptist churches to send their missionaries to where God has called them to serve. Each missionary works through a Baptist church.

Churches and individuals voluntarily support the missionary work by sending offerings to the General Fund of Baptist Faith Missions. These contributions provide living and ministry funds for the missionaries who are approved by Baptist Faith Missions. This fund is also used to provide housing, transportation to and from the fields, medical insurance, furlough expenses, and retirement. Missionaries associated with Baptist Faith Missions are not burdened with the responsibility of raising money for any of these needs. This assistance enables them to concentrate on the primary mission to which God has called them.

churches and then sent their offerings to Brother Brandon. Hafford Overbey began spreading the news of this missionary ministry through a single mimeographed page which he called "The Mission Sheets."

Brother Brandon organized the First Baptist Church in the city of Cruzeiro do Sul (Southern Cross) in the Brazilian Territory of the Acre. This church has started numerous churches in the states of Acre and Amazonas. Francisco Santiago was the first disciple to be saved and baptized by Joseph Brandon in the western Territory of the Acre. Francisco made the 1,500 mile river trip by canoe from Cruzeiro do Sul to Manaus, Amazonas. He established five churches while making this journey.

In 1935, Richard P. Hallum went by faith to evangelize Iquitos, Peru. Iquitos is located on the mammoth Amazon River in the westMissionary candidates who wish to serve in association with Baptist Faith Missions must be recommended by their home churches and demonstrate unity of doctrine and purpose with Baptist Faith Missions. Each applicant must display good character and have experience in service that qualifies him to be an effective missionary.

The Baptist Faith Missions monthly publication, The Mission Sheets, includes the letters of the missionaries and a public receipt of all contributions received that month. Baptist Faith Missions sends receipts monthly to each contributor and publishes a yearly accounting of all funds received and disbursed. Baptist Faith Missions channels designated funds to the work accounts of each missionary. All of this is possible through the services of the directors.

Baptist Faith Missions does the necessary bookkeeping for all of the services mentioned above and provides the necessary legal paperwork to satisfy the requirements of local, State, and Federal laws in the United States and the countries where the missionaries serve or plan to serve. All of these services and anything else that is necessary is provided because of the cooperation of the churches, missionaries, directors, and individuals who participate in this missions ministry.

em part of South America. Missionary Hallum went to this foreign country with a strange language along with his wife and daughter, Marguerite, when he was already 50 years old. He won many disciples to Jesus Christ and established numerous churches in Peru.

Dozens of other missionaries have gone by faith to the countries of Brazil, Peru, Honduras, South Korea, The Philippines, France, and Kenya, Africa.

By faith, some have died in their lands of ministry or have buried family members in a strange land. Others have suffered deprivations of all sorts. All have left behind family, customs, and comforts. They all went out by faith, having promise of nothing except "if you go, we will support you as God provides the funds." Many others at home have sacrificed by the same faith to give so these could go.
